

TIP-OFF

- No. 3 seed Kansas (25-8) will face No. 5 seed lowa State (22-11) in the title game of the 2019 Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship, March 16, at 5 p.m. (Central) on ESPN. KU advanced to the finals with an 88-74 win against No. 10 West Virginia in the semifinals, March 15.
- KU advanced to the finals for the 22nd time in conference postseason tournament play, including the 14th time in the 23-year history of the Big 12. KU is 11-2 in Big 12 tourney title contests, 15-6 all-time. (More info on KU in Big 12 Champ. on pg. 11.)
- Kansas and Iowa State are meeting for the 12th time in conference tournament history, including the sixth time since the Big 12 began in 1996-97. Kansas and Iowa State last met in the 2015 championship game with ISU winning 70-66. Kansas is 6-5 against lowa State in conference tourney play, including 3-2 in the Big 12 era.
- Kansas is the No. 3 seed for the Big 12 Championship for the third time with the others being in 1999 and 2004. Kansas won the 1999 Big 12 Championship behind Most Outstanding Player Jeff Boschee. In 2004, the Jayhawks lost to Texas in the Big 12 semifinal. This year ended a 10vear run as No. 1 seed for KU.
- Kansas is defending Big 12 tournament champion and has won 15 conference postseason tourney titles and 11 in the Big 12 era, which began in 1996-97. Kansas (11), Iowa State (4), Oklahoma (3) and Oklahoma State (2) are active league members with Big 12 tourney titles.
- Since the Big 12's inception in 1996-97, Kansas 46-11 in the league tournament. KU is 21-3 in its first games, 1-0 in opening-round games, 19-3 in the quarterfinals, 14-6 in semifinals and 11-2 in finals.
- Kansas is 1-1 against Iowa State this season with a 77-60 loss at Ames on Jan. 5 and an 80-76 win in Allen Fieldhouse on Jan. 21. Kansas leads the overall series with Iowa State, 94-17, which includes a 6-5 mark in conference tournaments (3-2 in the Big 12 Championship).

ABOUT KANSAS

Ranked No. 17/18 nationally, Kansas is 25-8 overall and finished 12-6 in Big 12 play. In all games, Kansas ranks in the top three in the Big 12 in scoring offense (second at 75.7), field goal percentage (third at 46.5) and field goal percentage defense (third at 40.6). KU has a +2.5 rebound margin and also averages 7.4 3-pointers made, 13.4 assists, 6.8 steals and 3.9 blocked shots per game. Through two Big 12 Championship games, KU is averaging 76.5 points, with a +11.0 scoring margin, a +9.5 rebound margin and 13.5 assists, 7.0 steals and 6.0 blocked shots in its two victories.

Redshirt-junior F Dedric Lawson is coming off his 16th 20-point effort of the season after his 24 points, with eight rebounds against West Virginia (3/15). Lawson leads the Big 12 in scoring at 19.2 ppg, rebounding at 10.4 rpg and with 20 double-doubles. The Big 12 Newcomer of the Year and All-Big 12 First Team selection, Dedric Lawson is the only player in the league averaging a double-double. A three-time Big 12 Player of the Week (11/12, 11/26, 12/26) and five-time league newcomer of the week (12/3, 12/17, 1/14, 1/28, 2/11), Lawson leads KU with 35 blocked shots and his 1.1 blocks per game are sixth in the conference. Lawson is 10th in the Big 12 with a 49.3 field goal percentage.

Freshman G Devon Dotson is averaging 15.0 points, 5.0 assists and 4.5 rebounds in the Big 12 Championship. He averaged 12.3 ppg, 3.9 rpg, 3.8 apg and 1.3 spg in Big 12 play. An All-Big 12 Third Team honoree, Dotson ranks 16th in the Big 12 in scoring (11.9), sixth in assists (3.6), 13th in field goal percentage (47.6), ninth in steals (1.3) and eighth in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.5).

Freshman G Ochai Agbaji has seven games of 10 or more points, including three 20-point efforts. Agbaji has five games with multiple 3-pointers. Agbaji pulled his redshirt prior to the TCU game (1/9) and averages 8.8 points and 4.7 rebounds per contest.

Freshman G Quentin Grimes is averaging 15.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 2.5 steals with six 3-pointers made in the two Big 12 Championship contests. His 18 points against West Virginia (3/15) were his third most this season. He is 17-for-35 (48.6 percent) from 3-point range in his last six contests, including a 5-for-8 effort from beyond the arc against WVU (3/15). Grimes is second on the team with 51 3-pointers made this season. He averages 8.3 points and 2.6 rebounds per contest.

Sophomore G Marcus Garrett scored 11 points against West Virginia (3/15) with five rebounds. He pulled down a season-high eight rebounds with five points against Texas (3/14) in the Big 12 quarterfinals. Garrett ranks fourth in the Big 12 with 1.5 steals per game. He scored 8.8 points in Big 12 play and overall averages 7.3 points and 3.8 rebounds and has 53 assists.

Other KU regulars include freshman F David McCormack (3.7 ppg, 2.9 rpg), redshirt-sophomore G Charlie Moore (3.0 ppg, 19 3-pointers), redshirt-sophomore G K.J. Lawson (2.9 ppg, 1.9 rpg), and junior F Mitch Lightfoot (2.5 ppg, 2.8 rpg). McCormack has

started each of the last 10 games and is averaging 10.0 ppg and a team-leading 8.5 rpg in the Big 12 Championship. He is 8-for-10 from the field in the tourney and has averaged 12.5 points and 6.8 rebounds in his last four contests and is 22-for-30 (73.3 percent) from the field in that span.

THE SERIES

Kansas leads the all-time series with lowa State, 182-65, dating back to 1908. The two teams split this season with ISU winning 77-60 on Jan. 5 in Ames and KU winning 80-76 on Jan. 21 in Allen Fieldhouse. Kansas holds a slim 6-4 series edge in the last 10 meetings. lowa State won two of those contests in the Big 12 Championship (88-73 in the 2014 semifinals and 70-66 in the 2015 title game). Prior to the recent closeness in the series, KU posted an 18-1 record versus the Cyclones from 2006 until 2014.

Since the inception of the Big 12, Kansas is 37-14 against lowa State with a 34-12 record in regular-season play and a 3-2 mark in the Big 12 Championship. KU head coach Bill Self is 27-9 all-time versus lowa State, including 26-9 while at KU, while ISU's Steve Prohm is 3-5 against Kansas. Eight of the last 12 meetings have been decided by seven points or less and six of those by five points or fewer.

Make Kansas 26-8 give KU 26 victories for the fifth-straight season and 12th time in the 16-seasons under head coach Bill Self ... Give Kansas its 12th Big 12 Championship title and its 16th all-time postseason conference tournament title ... Make Kansas 12-2 in Big 12 Championship title games, 16-6 in all-time conference tourney championship games ... Make KU 6-0 in neutral-site games this season and 16-1 over the last two seasons ... Improve Kansas to 77-27 in league tournament play and 47-11 at the Big 12 Championship ... Make Kansas 42-9 all-time in Sprint Center, including 4-0 this season ... Make the Kansas-lowa State series 183-65 in favor of the Jayhawks, including 7-5 in conference tournament meetings, 4-2 in the Big 12 Championship ... Make Bill Self 473-104 while at Kansas, 680-209 overall, 28-9 all-time versus lowa State (27-9 while at KU) and 42-12 all-time in conference tournaments (33-7 while at KU) ... Make Kansas 2,274-857 all-time.

Make Kansas 25-9 ... Make Kansas 15-7 all-time in conference tournament finals, including 11-3 in Big 12 Championship title contests ... Hand KU its first neutral-site loss this season (5-1) and just its second neutral site loss in 17 games (15-2) over the last two seasons ... Drop Kansas to 76-28 in league tournament play, including 46-12 in the Big 12 Championship ... Make Kansas 41-10 all-time in Sprint Center, including 3-1 this season ... Make the Kansas-lowa State series 182-66 in favor of the Jayhawks, including 6-6 in conference tournament play, 3-3 in Big 12 Championship meetings ... Make Bill Self 472-105 while at Kansas, 679-210 overall, 27-10 all-time versus lowa State (26-10 while at KU) and 41-13 all-time in conference tournaments (32-8 while at KU) ... Make Kansas 2,273-858 all-time.

LAST TIME OUT

Impressive shooting nights from Dedric Lawson and Quentin Grimes helped push the No. 17/18 Kansas Jayhawks past the West Virginia Mountaineers, 88-74, Friday night in the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship semifinal contest at Sprint Center. The No. 3-seeded Jayhawks advanced to meet No. 5 seed lowa State in the tournament final on Saturday, March 16 at 5 p.m. (CT).

Down 30-23 with 6:07, Grimes caught fire from beyond the arc late in the first half and the Jayhawks flipped the momentum before the halftime buzzer sounded. The freshman out of The Woodlands, Texas, hit four triples over the final 4:15 of the opening frame, which included converting on a rare and-one opportunity from deep. Grimes' four-point play gave the lead back to Kansas at 38-36, still with 2:28 before the break.

After a pair of Marcus Garrett lay-ups to keep the Jayhawks' furious finish to the first half going, Grimes rose up from well beyond the arc and swished his fifth 3-pointer of the night just before time expired. The basket capped a 16-4 KU run to close the half and gave Kansas a 48-40 advantage as the two squads headed to the intermission.

The break from action did little to halt the KU momentum. Lawson scored nine points in the six minutes following the restart and aided the Jayhawks to a 16-6 run after coming out of the locker room. The stretch saw KU push its lead to 18 points, going up 64-46 on Garrett's lay-up at the 14:29 mark. Kansas' bench then got into the scoring action as Mitch Lightfoot and Charlie Moore combined for six points during a 9-1 Jayhawk spurt that saw the KU lead reach its largest of the night at 23 points, 75-52, with just over eight minutes to play in regulation.

The Mountaineers made one final push to get back in the game as the No. 10 seed went on a 10-0 run over the next two minutes and slashed the Kansas advantage to 13 points. But Dotson had an answer after a Bill Self timeout. The freshman point guard cut to the rim for a lay-up and kicked off an 11-4 stretch that got KU's lead back to 20 points and handed the final knockout blow to the Mountaineers.

Lawson finished the night with his 16th 20-point scoring effort of the season, posting 24 points on 9-of-13 shooting. Grimes added 18 points which included five 3-pointers, all of which were in the second half. He also pulled down eight rebounds and collected four steals, both of which were season-highs. Dotson contributed 13 points to the KU scoring effort and added six assists and five rebounds in 30 minutes of action.

WEST VIRGINIA LEFTOVERS & NOTABLES

- KU moved to 5-0 in neutral-site games this season and 15-1 over the last two seasons.
- The win improved Kansas to 76-27 in league tournament play and 46-11 at the Big 12 Championship.
- The victory made Kansas 41-9 all-time in Sprint Center, including 3-0 this season.
- The win also made the Kansas-West Virginia series 12-5 in favor of the Jayhawks, including 3-0 in Big 12 Championship history

- Kansas used a 13-2 run to erase a 34-30 deficit into a 43-36 lead with lead
- Over the final three minutes of the first half and the first 5:30 of the second, KU outscored WVU 32-10 in that span.
- KU went 10-of-10 from the free throw line in the first half marking the first time Kansas has shot 100 percdent from the line in a half with a minimum of 10 attempts since Kansas went 13-of-13 against Kansas State in the second half on January 29, 2018
- West Virginia's one made 3-pointer in the second half was the fewest by a Jayhawk opponent since the Mountaineers made just one in the first half of February 16 contest earlier this season.
- KU's 88 points were the most by the Jayhawks at the Sprint Center since Kansas tallied 98 in a victory over Purdue on March 23, 2017, in the NCAA Tournament. The point total was its most in a Big 12 Championship game since KU defeated lowa State 88-73 on March 15, 2013.
- Kansas shot 52.4 percent from the field marking the 12th time this season the Jayhawks have shot 50 percent or better. KU is 12-0 in those contests with a 250-9 record in the Self era.
- Redshirt-junior F Dedric Lawson recorded his ninth multiple 3-point field goal game of the season as Lawson went 2-of-3 fot the game.
- Freshman G Devon Dotsonn has 394 points this season, putting him ninth in the Kansas freshman single-season record book as he moved past Darnell Valentine who scored 392 points in 1977-78.
- In Dotson's two games in he Big 12 Championship, has posted an assist-to-turnover ratio of 10:1.
- Dotson's 30 minutes logged moved him past Brandon Rush who tallied 1,047 minutes in 2006 for fifth all-time in minutes played in a single season as a KU freshman. Dotson has now played in 1,070 minutes this season.
- Dotson committed just one turnover on the night marking the eighth straight game he's had five or less turnovers.
- Junior F Mitch Lightfoot blocked three shots in the first half for the second-consecutive game.
- Lightfoot swatted a season-high four shots in 15 minutes played and has eight blocked shots in his last three games.
- Freshman G Quentin Grimes' 5-of-5 clip from 3-point range in the first half matched the most by a Jayhawk in a half this season. Charlie Moore hit five in the second half against South Dakota on December 18, 2018.
- Grimes has made 51 threes on the season as he moved past Sherron Collins who made 47 in 2007, Mario Chalmers who made 48 in 2006, Billy Thomas who hit 49 in 1995 and Brandon Rush who made 50 in 2006 for fifth all-time in threes made in a Kansas single season by a freshman.
- Since the calendar turned to March, Grimes is 14-of-29 from beyond the arc (48.2 percent).
- Sophomore G Marcus Garrett tallied 11 points along with five rebounds and two assists. His 10+ point game marked Garrett's first since he scored 16 against Iowa State on January 21, 2019.

KANSAS AT THE PHILLIPS 66 BIG 12 CHAMPIONSHIP

- KU's 11 Big 12 Championship titles are more than any other school in the league. Iowa State is second with four titles, while Oklahoma (3) and Oklahoma State (2) are the only other current schools to have won a Big 12 tourney. Kansas won the first three events 1997-98-99, then the 2006-07-08-10-11-13-16-18 titles. KU is 11-2 in tourney title games, having only lost the 2002 title to Oklahoma and the 2015 title to lowa State.
- Kansas is the only team to have won at least 40 games in the Big 12 Championship. The Jayhawks are 46-11 (80.7 percent) in the event. Texas (26-23, 53.1), Oklahoma State (23-20, 53.5) and Oklahoma (22-20, 52.4 percent) are the only other schools above .500 in the event.
- With a 32-7 (82.1 percent) record, KU head coach Bill Self has the highest winning percentage in Big 12 Championship history with more than one tournament (Frank Haith went 3-0 at Missouri in 2012).
- Kansas has been the No. 1 seed 15 times (1997-98-2002-03-07-09-10-11-12-13-14-15-16-17-18), No. 2 seed four times (2001-05-06-08), No. 3 seed three times (1999-2004-19) and was the No. 5 seed in 2000.
- Kansas has won 21 of its 23 first games in the Big 12
 Championship with the 2009 loss to Baylor and 2017 loss to TCU being the only blemishes. The Jayhawks are 1-0 in opening-round games and 20-3 in quarterfinal contests. In 2000 KU was the No. 5 seed, won its first game and lost in the quarterfinals. All of KU's other first games were in the quarterfinals.
- Including 2019, KU has reached the semifinals in 20 of the 23 Big 12 Championships. The Jayhawks did not reach the 2000, 2009 or 2017 semis.
- Kansas has won eight of its 11 Big 12 titles as the No. 1 seed –
 1997, 1998, 2007, 2010, 2011, 2013, 2016 and 2018. KU was the
 No. 3 seed in its 1999 title run and the No. 2 seed in 2006 and
 2008. The lowest seed to win the event was a No. 4 seed lowa
 State in 2017.
- Kansas has had 46 conference championship all-tournament selections, including 29 in the 22-year history of the Big 12 Championship. Last year, Malik Newman was Most Outstanding Player of the event.

KANSAS IN KANSAS CITY

Kansas City has been a second home for KU over the years. The Jayhawks' first-ever game -- a 16-5 loss to Kansas City YMCA on Feb. 3, 1899 -- was played in Kansas City. The March 16, 2019, Big 12 Championship title game will mark KU's 311th all-time game played in Kansas City, and its 51st in Sprint Center. Excluding exhibition contests, KU is 41-9 in Sprint Center including winning the 2008, 2010, 2011, 2013, 2016 and 2018 Big 12 Championships in the venue and the 2012 and 2016 CBE Hall of Fame Classics.

MORE ON THE JAYHAWKS IN KANSAS CITY

- Beginning in 1984-85, Kansas has played at least one regularseason game, be it in a tournament or a home contest, in Kansas City in 30 of the last 33 seasons. KU only missed 1987-88, 1990-91 and 1996-97 and in those seasons the Jayhawks played league tournament or NCAA Tournament postseason games in KC.
- KU is 227-83 in games played in Kansas City.

- KU played 106 games in Kemper Arena with an 81-25 record. Kansas went 26-4 in Kemper Arena from 1997 until 2006, when it played its last game in the venue. Included in that run were Big 12 Championship titles in 1997, 1998 and 1999.
- Kemper Arena was the host of the 1988 NCAA Final Four when the Jayhawks won the national championship.
- Kansas has won a mind-boggling 27 conference tournaments (13 holiday conference tourneys and 14 postseason league titles) with 25 of those in Kansas City. The lone two titles not in KC were in 2006 in Dallas and 2007 in Oklahoma City.

Highlighted by Big 12 Newcomer of the Year Dedric Lawson, Kansas is well represented on the men's basketball 2018-19 All-Big 12 Team selected by the conference coaches, the league announced March 10.

Lawson was selected the Big 12 Newcomer of the Year and a unanimous selection for All-Big 12 First Team. The redshirt-junior forward was joined on the all-league team by KU guard Devon Dotson, who was third team honoree and also selected to the Big 12 All-Freshman Team. Sophomore Marcus Garrett was named to the Big 12 All-Defensive Team. Coaches were not allowed to vote for players from their own team.

Kansas is 13-3 all-time in games on March 16

March 16, 2007: No. 1 seed Kansas advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament defeating Niagara, 107-67, at the United Center in Chicago. Sophomore Mario Chalmers sparked the victory with a team-high 19 points, while sophomore Julian Wright posted a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds. As a team, the Jayhawks shot 54 percent (40-of-74) and 11 different KU players scored in the victory. Kansas went on to top Kentucky and Southern Illinois in the ensuing rounds of the NCAA Tournament before falling to No. 2-seed UCLA in the Elite Eight in San Jose. KU finished the season at 31-7 with titles in both the Big 12's regular-season and tournament.

Newcomer of the Year as Malik Newman earned the honor in 2017-18. Dating back to the Big Eight Conference, Lawson is the 10th Kansas player to be named its conference's newcomer of the year.

In the 23-year history of the conference, Kansas lays claim to a league-best 119 All-Big 12 selections which includes first-, second-, third-, honorable mention, all-defensive, all-freshman and all-newcomer team honorees. Texas is second with 94. Lawson gives Kansas a first-team selection for the 19th-consecutive season and the 21st time in the history of the league. Kansas has 22 All-Big 12 First Team choices in the 16 seasons under head coach Bill Self.

LOOKING BACK AT "THE STREAK"

With Kansas failing to win this season's Big 12 regular-season title, it will bring an end to one of the more remarkable streaks in the history of collegiate basketball. From 2005-18, the Jayhawks won or shared 14-consecutive league titles, a mark which topped UCLA's previous collegiate record of 13-straight league championships. Here are some "nuggets" from Kansas' NCAA record 14-straight conference titles:

- Kansas won the title outright 10 times and shared it four times (2005, 2006, 2008 and 2013). Overall, Kansas has won 18 of the 23 Big 12 regular-season titles (78.2 percent), with those four seasons being the only ties. Texas is second with three titles (13.0 percent), Iowa State third with two, while Kansas State, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State have one each.
- In the 14-year streak, including the four ties and the two-game edge in 2018, Kansas won the Big 12 regular-season title by an average of 1.4 games. Twice, in 2009-10 and 2016-17, Kansas won the Big 12 regular-season title by four games.
- In the 14-year streak, 89 Jayhawks saw action during conference play, helping contribute to the run of titles. That list includes five players on this season's roster: Udoka Azubuike, Silvio De Sousa, Mitch Lightfoot, Lagerald Vick and Chris Taahan
- In Kansas' national championship season, 2007-08, the Jayhawks won the fourth of the 14-straight Big 12 Conference titles
- Matt Kleinmann, Landen Lucas, Brady Morningstar, Travis Releford, Tyler Self, Jamari Traylor, Conner Teahan and Jeff Withey each won five Big 12 regular-season titles, as they were redshirts during their KU careers. Teahan is the only KU player in the streak to have been on two Final Four teams in 2008 and 2012.
- In 2005, George W. Bush was beginning his second term as the 43rd President of the United States. Barrack Obama, the 44th President, would serve two terms and current Commander-In-Chief, Donald Trump, the 45th President, giving the streak three sitting U.S. commanders.
- The last time Kansas failed to claim the regular-season Big 12 title (2004), Facebook was less than a year old, Twitter had not yet been launched, current KU football coach Les Miles was at the helm at Oklahoma State and current KU freshman guard Ochai Agbaji was three years old.

KU NAVIGATING THE TOUGHEST SLATE IN THE NCAA

The NCAA Evaluation Tool ("NET") has shown that, not only have the Jayhawks endured the strongest schedule in the nation, but have tallied some of the more impressive wins among the 353 teams in Division I. Kansas's strength of schedule ranks No. 1 in the latest NET breakdown (March 10), with the Jayhawks playing opponents that have an average NET ranking of 60th, a figure that leads the nation.

The Jayhawks have also collected some impressive wins during this gauntlet of a schedule, claiming 10 wins against teams in "Quadrant 1" (Home 1-30, Neutral 1-50, Away 1-75). KU is one of only four teams in the nation with double-figure Quad 1 wins (Michigan State - 11, Virginia - 10, Kentucky - 10).

LAWSON COLLECTION OF NATIONAL ACCOLADES GROWS

Redshirt-junior Dedric Lawson has had a quickly growing collection of accolades that have him among a small list of players on watch for national awards come season's end. Here is a quick rundown of the recent announcements that included Lawson:

- Lawson was named to the 2018-19 Sporting News All-America Second Team, the publication announced March 10. It marked the third-straight season a Jayhawk was named to a TSN All-America Team
- On March 9, Lawson was named to the John R. Wooden
 Award presented by Wendy's final ballot by the Los Angeles
 Athletic Club. Kansas has had representation each of the last
 two seasons at the Wooden Award ceremony as Frank Mason
 III won the award in 2017 and Devonte' Graham was a finalist
 last year. Lawson is vying to become the third Jayhawk to win
 the honor with Mason in 2017 and Danny Manning in 1988.
- On Feb. 6, Lawson was named one of 12 to the Oscar Robertson Trophy Final Midseason Watch List by the USBWA. Like the Wooden, the Oscar Robertson Trophy recognizes the national player of the year. Frank Mason III was the first KU player to win the Oscar Robertson Trophy in 2017.
- On March 6, Lawson was one of 10 semifinalists for the Naismith Trophy, by the Atlanta Tip Off Club. KU's Frank Mason III won the honor in 2017 as did Danny Manning in 1988. The Naismith Trophy will announce its four finalists on March 10
- On March 7, Lawson was named one of five finalists for the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award by the Naismith Hall of Fame. Established in 2015, the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year will be named April 12, 2019.

KANSAS STREAKING AT HOME (AGAIN)

The Jayhawks are once again building an impressive winning streak on their home court, something that has been a common occurrence in Lawrence over recent decades. KU has won 21-straight home games, 20 of which have come at Allen Fieldhouse (Dec. 8, 2018 win at Sprint Center considered a home game). The streak currently ranks as the fourth-longest active among NCAA DI schools. KU's last home loss came to Oklahoma State on Feb. 3, 2018.

Kansas has now posted home-court winning streaks of 20 games or more 15 times, with 11 of those streaks coming at Allen Fieldhouse. The program record is 69-straight home wins from Feb. 7, 2007 to Jan. 22, 2011. That streak is a Big 12 record and the 11th-longest in NCAA DI history.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE MACHINE

After his 23 points and 14 rebounds against Baylor (3/9), redshirt-junior F Dedric Lawson posted his Big 12-leading 20th double-doubles this season, including four straight, nine of his last 14 contests and 12 in his last 19 outings. Lawson entered the 2018-19 season with 36 double-doubles in his two seasons at Memphis. He had 17 as a freshman in 2015-16 and 19 as a sophomore in 2016-17.

Lawson's 56 career double-doubles are fourth on the NCAA Division I active list. Lawson is the only non-senior on the NCAA Division I top-10 list.

Lawson is also already making his impact on the Kansas single-season double-double chart. His 20 DDs are fifth on the school's top-10 list of single-season double-doubles. Thomas Robinson holds the record with 27 DDs in the 2011-12 season.

KANSAS VS. TOP-25 TEAMS

With its win versus then-No. 23 Kansas State (2/25), Kansas is 8-3 against top-25 teams in 2018-19. Under Bill Self, KU is 98-48 against AP-ranked opponents. In his first 16 seasons at KU, Self's Jayhawks have collected four wins or more over top-25 ranked foes in 13 of those seasons, which includes a 43-19 record from 2014-present.

KU's record against top-10 ranked opponents is even more impressive. KU is 18-5 against foes ranked inside the top-10 of the AP poll since 2013-14, including 2-1 this season and 4-1 in 2017-18. Last season, KU's top-10 wins included Kentucky, West Virginia, Texas Tech and Duke. Since Bill Self's first season, the Jayhawks are 13-3 against AP top-10 teams inside Allen Fieldhouse, which includes KU's current streak of nine-straight home victories against top-10 foes.

AZUBUIKE. MOORE NAMED TO ACADEMIC ALL-BIG 12

Kansas men's basketball junior Udoka Azubuike and redshirtsophomore Charlie Moore were named to the Academic All-Big 12 First Team, announced by the league office on Feb. 28.

This is the second-straight season Azubuike, from Delta, Nigeria, has been named Academic All-Big 12 as he was a second-team selection in 2017-18. Moore, from Chicago, is earning the honor for his first time, which is also the first time he was eligible.

Kansas has a league-leading 59 all-time Academic All-Big 12 honorees since the inception of the conference in 1996-97. Texas is second with 54 and Oklahoma third with 50. KU has 44 Academic All-Big 12 First Team honorees and 15 second-team selections.

TOUGH COMPETITION

Many talk about how tough the Kansas schedule is for 2018-19. One look at KU's nonconference opponents shows that six foes were preseason selections in their respective league races, with an additional five picked for second-place finishes. Five teams went on to finish to win at least a share of its 2018-19 league title.

TOP-10 TRIUMPHS

The loss at then-No. 8 Kentucky on Jan. 26, ended one of the more remarkable regular-season streaks in the nation. The Jayhawks won 13-straight regular-season games over teams ranked in the top-10 of the AP poll, which included two wins this season (92-87 vs. then-No. 10 Michigan St., 87-81 vs. then-No. 5 Tennessee). Since the 1996-97 season, no other team in the nation has strung together more than seven regular-season wins over top-10 foes. Prior to the Kentucky loss, KU's last regular-season loss to a top-10 came to then-No. 1 Kentucky in the 2014 Champions Classic (11/18/14).

Even more impressive, prior to its Champions Classic loss to the Wildcats in 2014, the Jayhawks amassed a streak of seven-straight regular-season top-10 victories. This means that Kansas is an astounding 20-2 in its last 22 regular-season contests against top-10 ranked squads. Since Bill Self took the reins of the Jayhawks in 2003, KU is 40-20 against top-10 teams, which includes postseason play.

KU SIGNS TWO IN EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

Combo guards Issac "Mackey" McBride and Christian Braun signed a National Letter of Intent to play men's basketball at Kansas, KU coach Bill Self announced Nov. 14. A 6-foot-1, 180-pound guard from Little Rock, Arkansas, McBride has rewritten the record book at Baptist Preparatory School. In guiding Baptist Prep to three-straight state championships, McBride set the school's single-season scoring record with 707 points his sophomore year in 2016-17. As a junior, he broke his own mark by scoring 883 points in 2017-18, which included a school-record 46-point game. In that, McBride averaged 24.5 points, 4.0 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 1.6 steals per game in 2017-18.

McBride is a two-time all-state selection and was the most valuable player of the last two state tournaments his sophomore and junior seasons. A four-star recruit who is ranked 109 by Rivals. com, McBride is the highest-ranked player in the state of Arkansas. He plays AAU basketball for the Arkansas Hawks.

Originally from Burlington, Kansas, Braun (6-foot-6, 180 pounds) moved to Overland Park, Kansas, his freshman year high school and has won back-to-back 6A state championships his sophomore and junior seasons at Blue Valley Northwest High School. A four-star prospect who is ranked No. 112 by Rivals.com, last year Braun averaged 14.2 points, 5.1 rebounds and 3.1 assists as a junior at Blue Valley Northwest. Braun plays for MoKan on the AAU circuit.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2018-19

- Dedric Lawson is making his mark on the KU record books, now with 20 double-doubles as a Jayhawk. That figure ranks fifth on the school's all-time single-season list. Thomas Robinson holds the single-season record with 27 double-doubles during the 2012 season.
- Lawson has also pulled down 952 career rebounds (624 at Memphis and 328 at Kansas) in 96 games, a mark that ranks him 15th on the NCAA DI active list. He is one of two active players in the top 20 to have 800-plus rebounds in under 100 career games.
- Lawson's 9.9 career-rebound average is eighth on the NCAA Division I active players' list.
- KU will look to feature a consensus First Team All-American for the third-straight year, something that has not occurred in the program since 1922-25. Since 1990, only six NCAA DI programs have boasted a consensus First Team AA in threestraight seasons.

- In a race that came down to the final game, Kansas State and Texas Tech were crowned Big 12 men's basketball regular-season co-champions.
- The Big 12 regular-season trophy is the second for K-State and the first for TTU. The Wildcats shared the 2012-13 crown with Kansas. It marks the 21st all-time conference title for K-State and the 13th for the Red Raiders.
- K-State had the tiebreaker edge over Texas Tech and enters the Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Championship as the No. 1 seed while TTU will be the No. 2 seed.
- The Big 12 is one of just two leagues (Big East) in which every team has at least 12 wins on the season. The Big 12 was the first league to have 80% of teams reach 15 wins and joins the BE as the only leagues to have 80% of teams at 16+ victories.
- The Big 12 has had at least six 20-win teams the past 12 consecutive seasons. Texas Tech, Kansas, K-State and lowa State have all reached 20. Baylor, Oklahoma and TCU need one more victory.
- The Big 12 is the only league with 80% of its teams in the top 47 of the NCAA "NET" ratings and has all of its teams within the top 110 - 9. Texas Tech, 20. Kansas, 23. lowa State, 24. K-State, 36. Baylor, 39. Texas, 40. Oklahoma, 47. TCU, 82. Oklahoma State and 110. West Virginia.
- Big 12 teams have a total of 48 Quadrant 1 wins and 101 combined Q1 and Q2 wins.
- Kansas is one of just four teams with 10 Q1 wins, while Oklahoma is the only school nationally that has not played a Q4 team this season.
- Six Big 12 teams since 2014 have made the NCAA Championship field with a below .500 record in conference games. Since 1983, a national total of 43 teams have received at-large NCAA berths with a losing record in conference games. Kansas (1st), Texas (6th), Oklahoma State (7th), West Virginia (1lth) and Oklahoma (18th) are ranked in the top 25 for strength of schedule. All Big 12 teams are in the top 55.
- Among conferences, the Big 12 ranks fi rst in the NET rankings with an average NET ranking of 43.0 and the lowest average strength of schedule rating at 24.6.
- 40 of 90 (44.4%) conference games have been decided by 7-or-fewer points with 52 of 90 (57.8%) determined by 10-or-less points.
- The Big 12 is one of the nation's best defensive leagues, allowing 67.7 ppg.
