



- Since seeding in the NCAA Tournament began in 1979, this is the fifth time Kansas entered the event a No. 4 seed. KU was also a No. 4 seed in 1994, 2001, 2004 and 2006 with the last two in the Bill Self era. The Jayhawks are 7-4 all-time as a No. 4 seed.
- This year marks the 19th-straight season that the Jayhawks have earned a top-four seed in the NCAA Tournament.
- This season, Kansas has faced 14 different teams in the 2019 NCAA Tournament field with a combined record of 13-7.
- This will be Kansas' first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance in Salt Lake City as well as the state of Utah.
- Kansas has won its last 12 NCAA Tournament first-round games, a string which started in 2007.
- Only two active players Marcus Garrett and Mitch Lightfoot have played in NCAA Tournament contests. Both were members of last year's Final Four team and Lightfoot was part of KU's 2017 Elite Eight run.
- With its No. 17 ranking this week, Kansas has now been inside the top-25 of the Associated Press poll for 200-consecutive weeks, a streak which began on Feb. 2, 2009. North Carolina holds the next-longest active streak at 100 weeks.
- RS-Junior Dedric Lawson, the Big 12's Newcomer of the Year as well as a *Sporting News* and USBWA All-American, is one of only two players participating in the NCAA Tournament to be averaging 18-plus ppg and 10-plus rpg (Dylan Windler of Belmont).

ABOUT KANSAS

Ranked No. 17/17 nationally, Kansas is 25-9 overall and finished third in the 2019 Big 12 race with a 12-6 record. Kansas his coached by Bill Self who was inducted into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame in 2017. Self is 472-105 in his 16th season at Kansas and 679-210 in his 26th season overall.

In all games, Kansas ranks in the top three in the Big 12 in scoring offense (second at 75.4), field goal percentage (third at 46.2) and field goal percentage defense (third at 40.8). KU has a +2.5 rebound margin and also averages 7.2 3-pointers made, 13.3 assists, 6.9 steals and 3.9 blocked shots per game. In three Big 12 Championship games, in which KU finished runner-up, the Jayhawks averaged 73.0 points, a +8.0 rebound margin, 13.3 assists, 7.3 steals and 6.0 blocks.

Redshirt-junior F Dedric Lawson was named to the Big 12 Championship All-Tournament Team where he averaged 19.3 points, 7.3 rebounds and 2.0 steals in three games. On most every All-America team and national player of the year list, Lawson leads the Big 12 in scoring at 19.1 ppg, rebounding at 10.3 rpg and with 20 double-doubles. The Big 12 Newcomer of the Year and All-Big 12 First Team selection, Dedric Lawson is the only player in the league averaging a double-double. He also leads KU with 36 blocked shots and his 1.1 blocks per game are sixth in the conference.

Freshman G Devon Dotson joined Dedric Lawson on the Big 12 Championship All-Tournament Team where he averaged 15.7 points, 4.3 assists and 4.0 rebounds in the three games. He averaged 12.3 ppg, 3.9 rpg, 3.8 apg and 1.3 spg in Big 12 play. An All-Big 12 Third Team honoree, Dotson ranks 15th in the Big 12 in scoring (12.1), sixth in assists (3.6), 13th in field goal percentage (47.9), tied for 10th in steals (1.3) and eighth in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.5).

Freshman G Ochai Agbaji has started the last 14 games for Kansas and has seven games of 10 or more points, including three 20-point efforts. Agbaji has five games with multiple 3-pointers. Agbaji pulled his redshirt prior to the TCU game (1/9) and averages 8.7 points and 4.8 rebounds per contest.

Freshman G Quentin Grimes had a solid Big 12 Championship where he averaged 13.3 points, 4.3 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 2.0 steals with six 3-pointers made in the three contests. His 18 points against West Virginia (3/15) were his third most this season. Grimes is second on the team with 51 3-pointers made this season. He averages 8.3 points and 2.5 rebounds per contest.

Sophomore G Marcus Garrett also had a solid Big 12 Championship where he averaged 7.7 points, 9.3 rebounds and 2.3 assists. Included was a career-high 15 rebounds, with seven points and four assists in the title game against Iowa State (3/16). Garrett ranks fourth in the Big 12 with 1.5 steals per game. He scored 8.8 points in Big 12 play and overall averages 7.3 points and 4.2 rebounds and has 57 assists.

Other KU regulars include freshman F David McCormack (3.8 ppg, 2.9 rpg), redshirt-sophomore G Charlie Moore (3.0 ppg, 20 3-pointers), redshirt-sophomore G K.J. Lawson (2.8 ppg, 1.9 rpg), and junior F Mitch Lightfoot (2.4 ppg, 2.8 rpg). McCormack has started each of the last 11 games and averaged 8.0 ppg and 6.3 rpg in the Big 12 Championship.

ABOUT NORTHEASTERN

Located in Boston with an enrollment of 21,489, Northeastern is 23-10 and finished second in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) with a 14-4 record. The Huskies won the CAA Tournament and bring a seven-game winning streak into the Kansas contest. NU has won 12 of its last 13 contests dating back to Jan. 26. Northeastern is making its ninth NCAA Tournament appearance and its first since 2015. The previous participation in the event was in 1991.

Northeastern is coached by Bill Coen who is 224-96 in his 13th season as a head coach, all at NU. The Huskies average 76.1 points per game with a +5.8 scoring margin. Northeastern pulls down 31.8 rebounds per contest and has a 48.2 field goal percentage. NU makes 9.8 3-pointers per game, which ranks 24th nationally, and its 38.8 3-point field goal percentage is 16th in NCAA DI. The Huskies also average 14.3 assists, 6.2 steals and 2.2 blocks per game.

Redshirt-senior G Vasa Pusica leads Northeastern in scoring at 17.8 points per game which ranked fifth in the CAA. Pusica, who was the CAA Tournament Most Valuable Player, also has a team-high 110 assists and he is second on the squad with 57 3-pointers made and 38 steals. A first-team all-conference selection, Pusica pulls down 3.9 rebounds per game. Redshirt-junior G Jordan Roland has made a team-high 97 3-pointers and he also leads the Huskies with 39 steals. Roland, a third-team All-CAA honoree, averages 14.7 points per game. Junior G Shawn Occeus has made a big impact in his 14 games played as he scores 10.1 points per game with 23 3-pointers made. Occeus joined Pusica on the CAA all-tournament team. Junior G Bolden Brace is a starter who leads NU with a 6.0 rebound average. He has made 56 3-pointers and has 88 assists and 31 steals. Redshirt-junior G Donnell Gresham Jr. averages 9.8 points and 4.8 rebounds and is second for Northeastern with 104 assists. Gresham and Pusica are tied for second on the team with 38 steals. Senior C Anthony Green is another starter who leads the team with 26 blocked shots to complement his 8.9 scoring and 5.4 rebound averages. Other NU regulars include sophomore F Tomas Murphy (8.2 ppg, 3.5 rpg), redshirt-freshman Jason Strong (3.5 ppg) and senior F Jeremy Miller (2.4 ppg).

KANSAS TRAVEL PLANS

On Tuesday, March 19, Kansas will practice in Lawrence, before flying to Salt Lake City, departing Allen Fieldhouse at 1:30 p.m. (Central). KU's communications office will be represented by Chris Theisen (theisen@ku.edu; cell-785.331.9356) and Brad Gilbert (brgilbert@ku.edu; cell-785.424.4008).

KANSAS INTERVIEWS

Beginning Wednesday, March 20, at 12:35 p.m. (MT), the Kansas locker room will be open to the media with two KU players in the news conference, followed by head coach Bill Self at 12:50 p.m. (MT). The locker room will close at 1:05 p.m. (MT), and KU will have its open practice at Vivint Smart Home Arena from 1:15-1:55 p.m. (MT). Any additional requests for head coach Bill Self should be directed to Theisen or Gilbert. Following each game of the NCAA Tournament, the KU locker room will be open for 30 minutes, with Self and a minimum of two players attending the postgame press conference.

NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

Kansas is making its 48th NCAA Tournament appearance and has a 107-46 record in the event. The Jayhawks have advanced to 31 Sweet 16 contests, 15 Final Fours and three of their five national championships have been in NCAA Championship format (1952, 1988, 2008). Kansas' 30-consecutive NCAA Championship appearances, beginning in 1990, is the longestactive streak and the longest consecutive in NCAA tourney appearances history.

TELEVISION

No. 4 seed Kansas (25-9) will face No. 13 seed Northeastern on Thursday, March 21 at approximately 3 p.m. (Central) or 30 minutes following the Auburn-New Mexico State contest, which tips-off at 12:30 p.m (CT). The game will be televised on TNT. Should Kansas win, it would face the Auburn-New Mexico State winner on Saturday, March 23 (time and TV are TBD).

KANSAS IN SALT LAKE CITY FOR THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

Kansas will be playing its first NCAA Tournament game in Utah and just the third game in the Beehive State. KU last played a game in Utah on Dec. 20, 1968 against Utah State in Logan. The Jayhawks won 67-61. The only other contest for KU came on Dec. 20, 1960 when Kansas fell to BYU, 80-70, in Provo.

THE SERIES

Kansas and Northeastern are meeting for the first time in men's basketball. KU has only faced two current members of the Colonial Athletic Association and has a combined 4-0 record against the league. KU is 3-0 versus Towson with the last meeting in 2013, an 88-58 KU win in the Battle 4 Atlantis. Kansas is 1-0 against Hofstra (101-65 on Nov. 13, 2009 in Allen Fieldhouse).

Make Kansas 26-9 and give KU 26 victories for the fifth-straight season and the 12th time in the last 13 seasons beginning in 2006-07 ... Give KU its 13th-straight NCAA Tournament first-game victory, which started in 2007 ... Make KU 34-2 in its last 36 NCAA Tournament round-of-64 games, beginning in 1981 ... Make KU 1-0 all-time against Northeastern and 5-0 against current membership of the Colonial Athletic Association ... Make KU 6-1 in neutral-site games this season ... Make Kansas 108-46 all-time in NCAA Tournament games ... Make Bill Self 473-105 while at Kansas, 680-210 all-time and 48-19 in the NCAA Tournament (38-14 while at KU) ... Make Kansas 2,274-858 all-time.

A KANSAS LOSS WOULD...

End Kansas' season at 25-10 ... Give the Jayhawks 10 losses in a season for just the second time in Bill Self's 16-year tenure in Lawrence ... End a Kansas 12-straight first-round NCAA Tournament win streak which started in 2007 ... Hand the Jayhawks just their third loss all-time in the Round of 64, moving their record to 31-3 ... Drop KU to 7-5 all-time as a No. 4 seed in the NCAA Tournament ... Make Kansas 6-2 in neutral-site games this season ... Make Bill Self 472-106 while at Kansas, 679-211 alltime and 47-20 in the NCAA Tournament (37-15 while at Kansas)... Make Kansas 2.273-859 all-time.

BIG 12 CHAMPIONSHIP LEFTOVERS

- KU advanced to the final for the 22nd time in conference postseason tournament play, including the 14th time in the 23-year history of the Big 12. KU is 11-3 in Big 12 tourney title contests, 15-7 all-time.
- Kansas is the only team to have won at least 40 games in the Big 12 Championship. The Jayhawks are 46-12 (79.3 percent) in the event. Texas (26-23, 53.1), Oklahoma State (23-20, 53.5) and Oklahoma (22-20, 52.4 percent) are the only other schools above .500 in the event.
- With a 32-8 (80.0 percent) record, KU head coach Bill Self has the highest winning percentage in Big 12 Championship history with more than one tournament (Frank Haith went 3-0 at Missouri in 2012).
- Redshirt-junior F Dedric Lawson and freshman G Devon Dotson were each named to the Big 12 Championship All-Tournament Team. It marked the third-straight year two Jayhawks were named to the all-tourney team and the 13th time in the 23-year history of the Big 12 multiple KU players were selected.
- With Lawson and Dotson named all-tourney, Kansas has had 48 conference championship all-tournament selections, including 31 in the 23-year history of the Big 12 Championship.
- Dedric Lawson became the fifth Jayhawk to claim top-scoring honors in the Big 12 Championship. Lawson scored 58 points (19.3 ppg) in his three outings in Kansas City.

KANSAS VS. THE 2019 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP FIELD

Kansas has faced 14 NCAA Tournament teams in 2018-19 with a 13-7 record. Those include No. 2 seed Kentucky (0-1), No. 2 Michigan State (1-0), No. 2 Tennessee (1-0), No. 3 Texas Tech (1-1), No. 4 Kansas State (1-1), No. 5 Marquette (1-0), No. 6 Iowa State (1-2), No. 6 Villanova (1-0), No. 7 Wofford (1-0), No. 9 Baylor (2-0), No. 9 Oklahoma (1-1), No. 11 Arizona State (0-1), No. 12 New Mexico State (1-0) and No. 13 Vermont (1-0).

KANSAS IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

- This year marks Kansas' 48th NCAA Tournament appearance, which ranks third nationally: Kentucky (57), North Carolina (49), Kansas (48), UCLA (47).
- Kansas' 30-straight NCAA Tournament appearances, from 1990-2019, is the nation's longest active streak and the best all time. North Carolina is second with 27 straight from 1975-2001.
- Under head coach Bill Self, Kansas is 37-14 (72.5 percent) in the NCAA Tournament with 10 Sweet 16s, eight Elite Eights, three Final Fours, one NCAA National Championship and one NCAA runner-up finish.
- The average seed under Self is 2.0 with eight No. 1 seeds, three No. 2 seeds, two No. 3 seeds and three No. 4 seeds. Kansas was a No. 1 seed in the last three NCAA Tournaments and, prior to this year, was a 1 or 2 seed each of the last nine events.
- In the last 17 NCAA Tournaments, Kansas has a 46-16 (74.2 percent) record with one NCAA National Championship (2008), five Final Fours (2002-03-08-12-18) and 10 Elite Eight (2002-03-04-07-08-11-12-16-17-18) appearances.
- Kansas sports an all-time NCAA Tournament record of 107-46. The Jayhawks' 107 wins trail only Kentucky (128), North Carolina (124) and Duke (112).
- The Jayhawks will play their 154th NCAA Tournament game on Thursday. The Jayhawks' 153 games in the event rank third alltime in NCAA history, behind Kentucky (180) and North Carolina (179).
- KU's NCAA Tournament winning percentage of 69.9 percent ranks sixth all-time for a minimum of 20 games played.
- Kansas coach Bill Self is making his 21st-consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament as a head coach, which is the fifth-best consecutive string in tourney history by a head coach: 24 Mike Krzyzewski (1996-2019), 23 Dean Smith (1975-97), 22 Tom Izzo (1998-2019), 21 Bill Self (1999-2019), 20 Roy Williams (1990-2009), 17 Rick Barnes (1996-2012). Self, Krzyzewski and Izzo are the only active streaks.
- KU is one of nine schools that has won at least three NCAA Tournaments. The Jayhawks won the NCAA crown in 1952, 1988 and 2008. The other schools are: UCLA (11), Kentucky (8), North Carolina (6), Indiana (5), Duke (4), Connecticut (4), Kansas (3), Louisville (3) and Villanova (3).
- Kansas has appeared in the Final Four 15 times, making KU one of just six schools to reach the Final Four 10-plus times: North Carolina (20), UCLA (17), Kentucky (17), Duke (16), Kansas (15) and Ohio State (10).
- Five different Jayhawks have been named NCAA Championship Most Outstanding Player, including B.H. Born in 1953 and Wilt Chamberlain in 1957, who both won the award even though KU lost in the title game. Clyde Lovellette (1952) and Danny Manning (1988) also won the honor. Mario Chalmers won the Most Outstanding Player Award for the 2008 NCAA Championship.

SEED NOTES

Since seeding in the NCAA Tournament began in 1979, this is the fifth time Kansas entered the event a No. 4 seed. KU was also a No. 4 seed in 1994, 2001, 2004 and 2006 with the last two in the Bill Self era. The Jayhawks are 7-4 all-time as a No. 4 seed. Kansas is 4-1 all-time against the No. 13 seed with the only blemish being the last time it faced the No. 13 seed, Bradley in 2006.

CRADLE OF TOURNAMENT COACHING LEGENDS

There are 11 head coaches who have advanced to the NCAA Tournament who graduated from the University of Kansas. In fact, the 126 combined NCAA Tournament wins by those coaches are easily the most by graduates of any one school: Phog Allen (KU 1906, 10-3), Tad Boyle (KU 1985, 1-4), Tim Carter (KU 1979, 0-2), Frosty Cox (KU 1930, 2-4), Jerod Haase (KU 1997, 1-1), Dick Harp (KU 1940, 4-2), Danny Manning (KU 1991, 0-1), Ralph Miller (KU 1942, 5-11), Adolph Rupp (KU 1922, 30-18), Dean Smith (KU 1953, 65-27) and Mark Turgeon (KU 1987, 8-8).

KANSAS AP RANKED FOR 200TH-STRAIGHT WEEK

With the release of the Associated Press' final 2018-19 top-25 on March 18, the Jayhawks found themselves among those ranked for the 200th-straight week. That streak ranks as the longest-active in NCAA DI and is 100 weeks clear of the next closest school.

Kansas' current streak began on Feb. 2, 2009 when KU reentered the AP ranks at No. 21. Since that week, the Jayhawks have not been slotted outside the top-20.

TRIO OF JAYHAWKS EARN ALL-BIG 12 HONORS

Highlighted by Big 12 Newcomer of the Year Dedric Lawson, Kansas is well represented on the men's basketball 2018-19 All-Big 12 Team selected by the conference coaches, the league announced March 10.

Lawson was selected the Big 12 Newcomer of the Year and a unanimous selection for All-Big 12 First Team. The redshirt-junior forward was joined on the all-league team by KU guard Devon Dotson, who was third team honoree and also selected to the Big 12 All-Freshman Team. Sophomore Marcus Garrett was named to the Big 12 All-Defensive Team. Coaches were not allowed to vote for players from their own team.

Lawson is the second-consecutive Jayhawk to be named Big 12 Newcomer of the Year as Malik Newman earned the honor in 2017-18. Dating back to the Big Eight Conference, Lawson is the 10th Kansas player to be named its conference's newcomer of the year.

In the 23-year history of the conference, Kansas lays claim to a league-best 119 All-Big 12 selections which includes first-, second-, third-, honorable mention, all-defensive, all-freshman and all-newcomer team honorees. Texas is second with 94. Lawson gives Kansas a first-team selection for the 19th-consecutive season and the 21st time in the history of the league. Kansas has 22 All-Big 12 First Team choices in the 16 seasons under head coach Bill Self.

LOOKING BACK AT "THE STREAK"

With Kansas failing to win this season's Big 12 regular-season title, it brought an end to one of the more remarkable streaks in the history of collegiate basketball. From 2005-18, the Jayhawks won or shared 14-consecutive league titles, a mark which topped UCLA's previous collegiate record of 13-straight league championships. Here are some "nuggets" from Kansas' NCAA record 14-straight conference titles:

- Kansas won the title outright 10 times and shared it four times (2005, 2006, 2008 and 2013). Overall, Kansas has won 18 of the 23 Big 12 regular-season titles (78.2 percent), with those four seasons being the only ties. Texas is second with three titles (13.0 percent), Iowa State third with two, while Kansas State, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State have one each.
- In the 14-year streak, including the four ties and the two-game edge in 2018, Kansas won the Big 12 regular-season title by an average of 1.4 games. Twice, in 2009-10 and 2016-17, Kansas won the Big 12 regular-season title by four games.
- In the 14-year streak, 89 Jayhawks saw action during conference play, helping contribute to the run of titles. That list includes five players on this season's roster: Udoka Azubuike, Silvio De Sousa, Mitch Lightfoot, Lagerald Vick and Chris Teahan.
- In Kansas' national championship season, 2007-08, the Jayhawks won the fourth of the 14-straight Big 12 Conference titles.
- Matt Kleinmann, Landen Lucas, Brady Morningstar, Travis Releford, Tyler Self, Jamari Traylor, Conner Teahan and Jeff Withey each won five Big 12 regular-season titles, as they were redshirts during their KU careers. Teahan is the only KU player in the streak to have been on two Final Four teams in 2008 and 2012.
- In 2005, George W. Bush was beginning his second term as the 43rd President of the United States. Barrack Obama, the 44th President, would serve two terms and current Commander-In-Chief, Donald Trump, the 45th President, giving the streak three sitting U.S. commanders.
- The last time Kansas failed to claim the regular-season Big 12 title (2004), Facebook was less than a year old, Twitter had not yet been launched, current KU football coach Les Miles was at the helm at Oklahoma State and current KU freshman guard Ochai Agbaji was three years old.

KU NAVIGATES THE TOUGHEST SLATE IN THE NCAA

The NCAA Evaluation Tool ("NET") has shown that, not only have the Jayhawks endured the strongest schedule in the nation, but have tallied some of the more impressive wins among the 353 teams in Division I. Kansas's strength of schedule ranks No. 1 in the latest NET breakdown (March 17), with the Jayhawks playing opponents that have an average NET ranking of 57th, a figure that leads the nation.

Should Kansas win, it would face the winner of the No. 5-seed Auburn vs. No. 12-seed New Mexico State game on Saturday, March 23 (time and TV TBD).

THIS DAY IN KANSAS BASKETBALL HISTORY



Kansas is 7-1 all-time in games on March 21

March 21, 1991: Kansas stormed out to a 26-6 lead against No. 3-ranked Indiana and never looked back as the Jayhawks defeated the Hoosiers, 83-65, in the NCAA Sweet 16 in Charlotte, North Carolina. KU hit 13 3-pointers on the night and held Bobby Knight's Indiana team to just 27 first-half points. KU's Terry Brown led the Jayhawks with 23 points as No. 3 seed KU committed a season-low nine turnovers in the win over the No. 2 seed. Kansas went on to defeat No. 1 seed Arkansas two days later to earn its first Final Four bid under third-year head coach Roy Williams. The Jayhawks finished the season 27-8 and advanced to the NCAA final, falling to Duke, 72-65.

The Jayhawks have also collected some impressive wins during this gauntlet of a schedule, claiming 11 wins against teams in "Quadrant 1" (Home 1-30, Neutral 1-50, Away 1-75). KU is one of only four teams in the nation with 11 or more Quad 1 wins (Michigan State - 13, Virginia - 12, Duke - 11).

LAWSON COLLECTION OF NATIONAL ACCOLADES GROWS

Redshirt-junior Dedric Lawson has had a quickly growing collection of accolades that have him among a small list of players on watch for national awards come season's end. Here is a quick rundown of the recent announcements that included Lawson:

- The USBWA named Lawson to its All-America Third Team on March 18. The announcement made Lawson the third-straight Jayhawk to earn a spot on one of the USBWA's AA teams.
- Lawson was named to the 2018-19 Sporting News All-America Second Team, the publication announced March 10. It marked the third-straight season a Jayhawk was named to a TSN All-America Team.
- On March 9, Lawson was named to the John R. Wooden Award presented by Wendy's final ballot by the Los Angeles Athletic Club. Kansas has had representation each of the last two seasons at the Wooden Award ceremony as Frank Mason III won the award in 2017 and Devonte' Graham was a finalist last year. Lawson is vying to become the third Jayhawk to win the honor with Mason in 2017 and Danny Manning in 1988.
- On March 7, Lawson was named one of five finalists for the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award by the Naismith Hall of Fame. Established in 2015, the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year will be named April 12, 2019.
- On March 6, Lawson was one of 10 semifinalists for the Naismith Trophy, by the Atlanta Tip Off Club. KU's Frank Mason III won the honor in 2017 as did Danny Manning in 1988. The Naismith Trophy will announce its four finalists on March 19.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

Kansas has one of the youngest teams in the nation having started four freshmen in each of its last eight games. In KU's 18 conference games, the Jayhawk freshmen have accounted for 47.1 percent of the minutes played and 43.7 percent of the scoring.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE MACHINE

After his 23 points and 14 rebounds against Baylor (3/9), redshirtjunior F Dedric Lawson posted his Big 12-leading 20th doubledoubles this season, including four straight, nine of his last 14 contests and 12 in his last 19 outings. Lawson entered the 2018-19 season with 36 double-doubles in his two seasons at Memphis. He had 17 as a freshman in 2015-16 and 19 as a sophomore in 2016-17.

Lawson's 56 career double-doubles are fourth on the NCAA Division I active list. Lawson is the only non-senior on the NCAA Division I top-10 list.

Lawson is also already making his impact on the Kansas singleseason double-double chart. His 20 DDs are fifth on the school's top-10 list of single-season double-doubles. Thomas Robinson holds the record with 27 DDs in the 2011-12 season.

KANSAS STREAKING AT HOME (AGAIN)

The Jayhawks are once again building an impressive winning streak on their home court, something that has been a common occurrence in Lawrence over recent decades. KU has won 21-straight home games, 20 of which have come at Allen Fieldhouse (Dec. 8, 2018 win at Sprint Center considered a home game). The streak currently ranks as the fourth-longest active among NCAA DI schools. KU's last home loss came to Oklahoma State on Feb. 3, 2018. The Jayhawks recently wrapped up their 20th undefeated season at Allen Fieldhouse and its first since 2015-16. Since Bill Self took the reins in 2003-04, Kansas as posted seven unblemished records on James Naismith Court. The Jayhawks have won more Big 12 regular-season titles (14) than have lost home games (13) in that span.

Kansas has now posted home-court winning streaks of 20 games or more 15 times, with 11 of those streaks coming at Allen Fieldhouse. The program record is 69-straight home wins from Feb. 7, 2007 to Jan. 22, 2011. That streak is a Big 12 record and the 11th-longest in NCAA DI history.

- Kansas has 2,273 all-time victories, second most in NCAA Division I history (Kentucky - 2,290).

- Kansas won its 1,100th all-time conference game with a 72-67 win against Oklahoma State (3/2/19). The Jayhawks won their 300th Big 12 game vs. Oklahoma (2/19/18).
- Each KU senior class since 1986-87 has won at least 100 games. Last year's fourth-year seniors Devonte' Graham and Sviatoslav Mykhailiuk amassed 121 wins.
- Entering 2018-19, Bill Self has won 25 or more games in each of his last 13 seasons as a head coach.
- Kansas is the only team in the Big 12 to have a .500 winning percentage or better series record against every conference foe.
- Kansas is first in the conference in wins with a 314-70 record in Big 12 regular-season games. Texas is next at 233-151. Including the league postseason championship, Kansas is tops at 360-82, while Texas is second at 258-174.
- KU is the only Big 12 school to have won a regular-season championship with two different coaches (Roy Williams and Bill Self).

LAWSON AND DOTSON NAMED TO ALL-DISTRICT TEAM

Kansas redshirt-junior Dedric Lawson and freshman Devon Dotson have been named to the 2019 U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) All-District VI Team with Lawson earning the district's player of the year, the USBWA announced on March 12.

This is the third-straight year a Jayhawk has been named the USBWA District VI Player of the Year as Devonte' Graham was last year's recipient and Frank Mason III the 2017 honoree. Mason went on to win the 2017 Oscar Robertson Trophy, the USBWA's national player of the year award.

Voted on by the 900-plus USBWA membership, the USBWA District VI includes NCAA Division I players from the states of Iowa, Missouri, Kansas, Oklahoma, Nebraska, North Dakota and South Dakota. The 2019 USBWA District VI Team, consisting of 11 players, includes seven players from the Big 12 Conference.

KANSAS VS. TOP-25 TEAMS

With its win versus then-No. 23 Kansas State (2/25), Kansas is 8-3 against top-25 teams in 2018-19. Under Bill Self, KU is 98-48 against AP-ranked opponents. In his first 16 seasons at KU, Self's Jayhawks have collected four wins or more over top-25 ranked foes in 13 of those seasons, which includes a 43-19 record from 2014-present.

KU's record against top-10 ranked opponents is even more impressive. KU is 18-5 against foes ranked inside the top-10 of the AP poll since 2013-14, including 2-1 this season and 4-1 in 2017-18. Last season, KU's top-10 wins included Kentucky, West Virginia, Texas Tech and Duke. Since Bill Self's first season, the Jayhawks are 13-3 against AP top-10 teams inside Allen Fieldhouse, which includes KU's current streak of nine-straight home victories against top-10 foes.

AZUBUIKE, MOORE NAMED TO ACADEMIC ALL-BIG 12

Kansas men's basketball junior Udoka Azubuike and redshirtsophomore Charlie Moore were named to the Academic All-Big 12 First Team, announced by the league office on Feb. 28.

This is the second-straight season Azubuike, from Delta, Nigeria, has been named Academic All-Big 12 as he was a second-team selection in 2017-18. Moore, from Chicago, is earning the honor for his first time, which is also the first time he was eligible.

Kansas has a league-leading 59 all-time Academic All-Big 12 honorees since the inception of the conference in 1996-97. Texas is second with 54 and Oklahoma third with 50. KU has 44 Academic All-Big 12 First Team honorees and 15 second-team selections.

TOUGH COMPETITION

Many talk about how tough the Kansas schedule is for 2018-19. One look at KU's nonconference opponents shows that six foes were preseason selections in their respective league races, with an additional five picked for second-place finishes. Five teams went on to finish to win at least a share of their 2018-19 league title.

TOP-10 TRIUMPHS

The loss at then-No. 8 Kentucky on Jan. 26 ended one of the more remarkable regular-season streaks in the nation. The Jayhawks won 13-straight regular-season games over teams ranked in the top-10 of the AP poll, which included two wins this season (92-87 vs. then-No. 10 Michigan St., 87-81 vs. then-No. 5 Tennessee). Since the 1996-97 season, no other team in the nation has strung together more than seven regular-season wins over top-10 foes. Prior to the Kentucky loss, KU's last regular-season loss to a top-10 came to then-No. 1 Kentucky in the 2014 Champions Classic (11/18/14).

Even more impressive, prior to its Champions Classic loss to the Wildcats in 2014, the Jayhawks amassed a streak of seven-straight regular-season top-10 victories. This means that Kansas is an astounding 20-2 in its last 22 regular-season contests against top-10 ranked squads. Since Bill Self took the reins of the Jayhawks in 2003, KU is 40-20 against top-10 teams, which includes postseason play.

KU SIGNS TWO IN EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

Combo guards Issac "Mackey" McBride and Christian Braun signed a National Letter of Intent to play men's basketball at Kansas, KU coach Bill Self announced Nov. 14. Both concluded their senior seasons as Gatorade Player of the Year in their respective state.

A 6-foot-1, 180-pound guard from Little Rock, Arkansas, McBride has rewritten the record book at Baptist Preparatory School. In guiding Baptist Prep to three-straight state championships his freshman through junior seasons, McBride set the school's singleseason scoring record with 707 points his sophomore year in 2016-17. As a junior, he broke his own mark by scoring 883 points in 2017-18, which included a school-record 46-point game. As a senior, McBride averaged 28.9 points, 4.5 rebounds and 4.1 assists per game in 2018-19.

McBride is a three-time all-state selection and was the most valuable player of the 2017 and 2018 state tournaments his sophomore and junior seasons. A four-star recruit who is ranked 109 by Rivals.com, McBride is the highest-ranked player in the state of Arkansas. He plays AAU basketball for the Arkansas Hawks

Originally from Burlington, Kansas, Braun (6-foot-6, 180 pounds) moved to Overland Park, Kansas, his freshman year high school and won three straight 6A state championships his sophomore, junior and senior seasons at Blue Valley Northwest High School. A four-star prospect, Braun averaged 27.8 points, 9.3 rebounds, 3.8 assists and 1.8 steals his senior season at Blue Valley Northwest. Braun plays for MoKan on the AAU circuit.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2018-19

- Dedric Lawson is making his mark on the KU record books, now with 20 double-doubles as a Jayhawk. That figure ranks fifth on the school's all-time single-season list. Thomas Robinson holds the single-season record with 27 double-doubles during the 2012 season.
- Lawson has also pulled down 974 career rebounds (624 at Memphis and 350 at Kansas) in 99 games, a mark that ranks him 15th on the NCAA DI active list. He is one of two active players in the top 20 to have 800-plus rebounds in under 100 career games.
- Lawson's 9.8 career-rebound average is eighth on the NCAA Division I active players' list.
- KU will look to feature a consensus First Team All-American for the third-straight year, something that has not occurred in the program since 1922-25. Since 1990, only six NCAA DI programs have boasted a consensus First Team AA in threestraight seasons.

NOTES

- Bill Self was named the eighth coach in Kansas basketball history on April 21, 2003.
- In September 2017, Self was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.
- Self won his 600th career game on Dec. 6, 2016, with KU's 105-62 win against UMKC. He became
 the 46th coach in NCAA Division I to accomplish the feat and the ninth fastest.
- While at Kansas, Self has won a national championship, a KU- and NCAA-record 14-straight regular-season Big 12 Conference titles and eight league tournament championships.
- At Kansas, Self has won more regular-season league titles (14) than he has home losses (13) in Allen Fieldhouse. With KU's win versus Siena (11/18/16), Self became the winningest coach in Allen Fieldhouse, posting his 207th victory in the venue.
- In his first trip to the Final Four in 2008, Self's team won the title. Self is one of 11 active coaches in NCAA Division I to have won a national title. Kansas' 14-straight conference titles (2005-18) is the longest streak in NCAA Division I history.
- In Self's first 15 seasons at Kansas, he has coached 11 NBA Lottery selections including Andrew Wiggins and Joel Embiid, the No. 1 and No. 3 overall selections in the 2014 NBA Draft. Wiggins was the second-ever Jayhawk to go No. 1 with the other being Danny Manning in 1988.
- Self has guided his teams to 20-straight 23-win seasons dating back to 1998-99.
- Self's teams have won 18 league crowns in the last 20 years, including the 2018 title. The other two seasons resulted in runner-up conference finishes.
- Kansas' four-straight 30-win seasons from 2009-10 to 2012-13 are the most consecutive 30-win seasons in NCAA history (note: Memphis did it from 2006-09 yet later vacated the 2008 season).
- Self was the head coach for Team USA's U18 team that competed and won gold at the 2018 FIBA Americas Championship held in St. Catherines, Canada, in the summer of 2018.
- Self is one of five coaches in NCAA Division I history to have led three different teams Tulsa, Illinois and Kansas - to the NCAA Elite Eight, including seven times with KU (2004-07-08-11-12-16-17). The other coaches are: Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Rick Pitino and Eddie Sutton.
- A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kansas in 1985-86 under head coach Larry Brown. He then returned to his alma mater as an assistant for seven seasons under coaches Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton. His first head coaching job was at Oral Roberts in 1993-94, then Tulsa (1997-98), Illinois (2000-03) and Kansas (2003-present).



# Kansas vs. Michigan State score: The Jayhawks sure looked like the No. 1 team in their victory vs. the No. 10 Spartans

**INDIANAPOLIS** -- The ending was shaky, but all told, Kansas looked like the part of a No. 1-ranked team inside Bankers Life Fieldhouse on Tuesday night.

The Jayhawks opened their season with a 92-87 win over No. 10 Michigan State at the Champions Classic. In the buildup to the 2018-19 college hoops campaign, Kansas had grown into the most popular pick for the top spot in the sport. Through one game, all looks fairly well with Bill Self's team. Kansas was effective and diverse from the onset against a Michigan State squad not short on length, experience or shooting.

And welcome to college basketball, Quentin Grimes.

The Jayhawks' freshman shooting guard put on one of the better freshman performances in the history of the Champions Classic with his 21-point showing on 6-of-10 shooting from beyond the arc. Grimes led KU in scoring.

"He's not that good a shooter is he?" one Michigan State coach asked in the locker room afterward.

Well, he might just be.

Here are three takeaways from Tuesday night's Jayhawks win over the Spartans:

1. Kansas' size is going to be its weapon of choice this season

Between Grimes' shooting, Udoka Azubuike's borderline-unstoppable prowess around the rim and Dedric Lawson's solid showing in his first game as a Kansas player, things graded out fairly well for KU. Grimes was ready for the big lights, but it was the big guys who helped get Kansas a large first-half lead that ultimately proved necessary to get the W.

Lawson, a playmaking power forward who averaged 17.5 points and 9.6 rebounds in his first two seasons at Memphis, finished with 20 points, 14 rebounds and six assists. And really? This was a B-level game for him. I could easily see him notching three or four triple-doubles this season (which few players have ever done in a single season).

That's what makes Kansas' outlook scary for most other teams in college basketball. Remember, KU's coming off a Final Four appearance, lost three of its five starters from that team (including a consensus First Team All-American in Devonte' Graham) and already looks like it will be even better this season. Kansas appears to have a lot -- if not all -- of the requisite parts to win a national title.

Azubuike looks stronger, a bit leaner and overall better working the block. Now, as Michigan State cut into KU's lead late, Azubuike missed some foul shots. Hack-a-Doke was in effect. He shot 41 percent from the foul line last season. I asked Self after the game if he plans to take Azubuike out in close games this season; Self said no, probably not, citing that he's never believed that taking out your best players in crunch time is a winning scenario.

2. The Spartans salvaged themselves late

For Michigan State, there's a lot to work on ... but this wasn't a flop. A methodic rally late put MSU within three with less than 20 seconds remaining. The Spartans are again the preseason pick to be the best team in the Big Ten. If they're to live up to that, they'll need more consistent 3-point shooting from senior Matt McQuaid. The good news is Josh Langford's 18-point night. Langford, who might become a top-30 defender in college basketball this season, was confident and aggressive in his shot selection.

Ultimately, Kansas is a better, more talented team than Michigan State. The Spartans' coaches know that. They would have had a better shot if they'd been able to capitalize on turnovers -- MSU had 18; KU had 11 -- and been more physical down low. But easier said than done.

The good news for MSU is it's not going to have but one or two more games this season against a frontline like Kansas'. Stay patients, Sparty fans.

3. Silvio De Sousa's ineligibility remains a mystery

I spoke with Self afterward and he told me he's unaware of if, or when, the NCAA might clear Kansas sophomore power forward Silvio De Sousa for competition. In federal court, wiretapped phone calls and admissions of impermissible payments were detailed regarding De Sousa's recruitment to Maryland and then Kansas.

The university was reactive to those reveals by placing De Sousa on suspension.

Kansas won't need De Sousa on the floor to win a national title, but if a scenario happened wherein he actually did return this season, it would convincingly give the Jayhawks the best frontcourt in the country. But Self told me any forecast on that is unknown. Could be in two weeks, could be in two months, could be never.

# KU basketball wins overtime thriller over No. 5 Tennessee

**BROOKLYN, NY** — At a program like Kansas, it's expected that top-level teams will be on the schedule every year, which makes a matchup with No. 5 Tennessee in the NIT Season Tip-Off final not much of a surprise.

Even so, Kansas' 87-81 overtime victory that crowned the Jayhawks NIT Season Tip-Off champions, capped off by redshirt junior Dedric Lawson's second-straight doubledouble, was anything but routine.

"You get nervous, you get jitters," Lawson said. "But when the lights get bright, it's time to show up. You always have to cherish the game and moments like this."

Things started off fairly normally for the Jayhawks, as ever-reliable senior guard Lagerald Vick nailed a three-pointer from way downtown following the opening tip.

Not only that, but freshman guard Devon Dotson kept his momentum and impressive play from Wednesday against Marquette going early on Friday, with a tough finish on a transition layup and some well-placed passes to junior center Udoka Azubuike for a couple early highlight dunks.

Yet this game was close, as Kansas committed some early turnovers and Tennessee played to their ranking from the beginning, keeping the game within striking distance.

The Jayhawks committed nine turnovers in the first half, finishing with 16 in the game.

Kansas' sloppiness, most notably on offense, continued throughout the first half, and was one area that Tennessee was able to capitalize on, taking a 28-25 lead with 3:19 to play in the first half thanks to back-to-back buckets from redshirt junior guard Lamonte Turner.

Turner finished the half with eight points, shooting 3-for-7 from the floor, including two three-pointers, giving the Volunteers a 33-31 lead going into the break.

Had it not been for redshirt sophomore Charlie Moore's acrobatic finishes or Lawson's court vision, Kansas would have been in a far deeper hole at the break.

Both Lawson and Moore led the Jayhawks in scoring at halftime with seven points each.

On the other side, Tennessee's tried-andtrue stars in junior forward Grant Williams and senior guard Admiral Schofield both had a quiet first half, scoring a combined eight points in the half.

Coming out of the break, Tennessee was aggressive, with Williams dropping dimes and the Volunteers hitting back-to-back buckets to start the second half.

Dotson did hit a tough layup and corner threepointer, but the momentum clearly had swung in favor of the Volunteers, who took a 45-38 lead at the under-16 minute timeout.

Williams' passing came alive in the second half, as he contributed five assists on the night, with junior guard Jordan Bone dropping 14 points and shooting 5-for-6 from the floor to lead the Volunteers in scoring.

As the game wore on, the tension in the Barclays Center continued to rise, as Kansas faithful seemingly went on an emotional rollercoaster ranging from "Figure it Out!" to transforming the arena to Allen Fieldhouse Northeast with "Let's go Jayhawks!" ringing from the rafters.

Still, though, Kansas continued to be a step behind, with the Volunteers clinging on to a four or five point lead for the majority of the second half. Some may look as that as a side effect of officiating — Tennessee actually reached the bonus in the second half before Kansas — or the questionable handful of possible goaltending violations.

The Volunteers wore this Jayhawk team down, taking advantage of little mistakes — Tennessee outscored Kansas 16-10 off turnovers — and looking like the more poised team.

At least, until Vick came back alive.

Vick scored eight straight points, including back-to-back threes, to give Kansas a 61-56 lead with 5:52 to go in the game. The senior finished the game with 13 points.

"He was great for us in that moment," Kansas coach Bill Self said.

Things continued to get interesting as Azubuike fouled out with 4:26 to play, while Williams picked up his fifth foul with 1:24 to go.

Regulation wasn't enough to decide this one, though, as Kansas and Tennessee went into overtime, tied at 69-69.

But thanks to Lawson's double-double with 24 points and 13 rebounds, mixed with Dotson's game-changing speed and 17 points of his own, the Jayhawks came out on top 87-81.

"I just wanted to be aggressive," Lawson said. "I really just wanted to win badly. I did everything I could to seal the deal."

The Volunteers proved their top-5 ranking, but fell just short in the extra period, as Kansas was crowned champions at the talent-packed NIT Season Tip-Off.

"It's OK to win ugly," Self said. "We won a game where we didn't artistically look good. But we've had plenty of games like that over the years."

# Dedric Lawson adjusting to new role with Udoka Azubuike back

At the beginning of the season, Dedric Lawson had a tough time with his new role.

No, it wasn't anything unfamiliar for him to play the four — even though he was featured at the five often with the Memphis Tigers, his previous team. Instead, Lawson was adjusting to playing with so many other talented pieces around him at KU, one of which returned to the starting lineup on Saturday.

"I think the offense will move more freely with Doke [Udoka Azubuike] being out there," said Lawson after KU's 87-63 win over Eastern Michigan. "It's another guy you have to pay attention to, you have to scout for and run defensive schemes for."

And so too will Lawson have to adjust.

After scoring 20 points in the seasonopener against Michigan State, Lawson posted the first scoreless outing of his career and then scored 19 points against Louisiana, but Bill Self noted after the third game his big man hadn't played all that well. Azubuike, of course, was active for all three contests.

Eventually the duo hit their groove — or at least Lawson began to play significantly better.

The power forward scored 50 points with 25 rebounds between the following two games in New York. He then followed that up with a 24-point, 15-rebound double-double and then added four more 20-pluspoint outings in his next five games.

After scoring 30 points and adding 14 boards against Arizona State, Lawson was held to only eight points, five assists and four rebounds against Eastern Michigan. Azubuike, on the other hand, erupted for 23 points and nine rebounds.

Of course, there was something else that went against the norm. And it had to do more with KU's opponent on Saturday rather than the Jayhawks themselves.

"It was different because we were in a zone [offense]," said point guard Devon Dotson after the game. "You know, Dedric can play the high post, and Udoka is out at the block, so once we get it, Dedric, he can dump it off to Doke for the lob. So I mean I feel like we did that because of the zone and it worked out real well."

With it, came a new role.

Lawson, who was leading KU in points, assists and rebounds for much of the year — but has since relinquished the assists lead to Dotson — was featured in the highpost, where he fed the ball to Azubuike and passed all around the perimeter.

Despite the lesser chances to score, Lawson tabbed four first-half assists. He did, however, slow down, only adding one more in the second half and playing just 22 minutes for the game.

"He had four assists the first half and should've had more. He didn't play very well the second half at all; a lot of that is my fault," Self said. "We were playing OK. In a game in the Big 12 I'm not going to play him 11 minutes in a half when he's not in foul trouble. [I] just wanted to give everybody a chance to play." He continued.

"When you have Doke and him in there together, he's got a big guy he can throw it to," Self said. "When you play small, he doesn't have a big guy to throw it to. It makes him a better passer whenever Doke is in the game."

And for the record, that's a role Lawson is comfortable filling.

Self has previously called Lawson the best passer he's ever coached — of any position — and Lawson has racked up high assist totals in plenty of past games at the collegiate level.

Even removing his six assists in the season opener against Michigan State, Lawson had six games with six-or-more assists as a sophomore at Memphis.

He also had six games with five-or-more assists as a freshman.

"I'm very comfortable [in the high post], that's something I've been playing my whole life, things like that," Lawson said after the game. "At Memphis teams played a lot of zone [against us], and those [games] were when I got my high assist games, like eight-nine assists, things like that. So that's something I'm very comfortable with."

Lawson's five assists tied for the most he'd had since the Michigan State game to open the year. He had just three total assists in the four full games Azubuike missed.

"Big-guys-that-can-pass' comfort level be very high in the zone because you're just picking apart the zone," added Dedric's

brother and fellow Memphis transfer K.J. Lawson, before commenting on his offensive game. "But it kind of made him passive with the zone because you've got limited options and you've just got to take the shot that the defense gives you. [But] it was pretty comfortable."

While Self gave Dedric Lawson an out by taking the blame, the junior big man still critiqued his own performance after the contest, saying he should have continued to force the issue to get teammates involved.

Dotson, on the other hand, had plenty of praise for the junior big man and national-player-of-the-year candidate.

"He was in the high post making reads, making different plays whether its passing or shooting that little jumper at the top. He was great for us," Dotson said. "That doesn't bother him [not having a big scoring total]. He's all about winning. As long as we get the win, I'm sure he's happy."

Sure enough, Lawson was his thoughtful self when he spoke to the media on his performance after the game.

He agreed with the prior assessment that there would be an adjustment with Azubuike returning into the swing of things, and he also noted things would be different than the Eastern Michigan game, since it was the first time an opponent had consistently played zone defense against KU.

"I just get back to playing how we were earlier in the year, that high-low action," Lawson said. "Guys come up, [I] drive, knock down open shots when given, things like that."

Of course, the zone action might become more common for opponents that can't match up with the size of the Jayhawks.

One way to beat a zone is shooting, and while the Jayhawks made only 7 of 21 3-point attempts on Saturday, Dedric Lawson, despite his low percentage on the season, is capable of hitting them.

In fact, his brother, K.J. Lawson, was asked which of the duo was the better shooter.

"I guess me statistically, but I guess I've got to take more shots and he's just got to knock them down when they're open," K.J. Lawson responded.

(Dedric Lawson, through 12 games, is 4 for 20 on 3s, while K.J. Lawson is 5 for 13.)

All of that being said, the Jayhawks will need to figure things out — against any defense — because the two-big looks aren't going away.

"We need to see Dedric and Doke play together, because that's going to be the guys that are out there together for the vast majority of the minutes," Self said. "I think it's our best offensive team, to play two bigs, and I think it's arguably not our best defensive team, so we'll probably just have to wait depending on situation." He elaborated.

"This was a good team for us to match up with [Eastern Michigan] because at least probably 70 percent of the time they played two bigs themselves. We haven't trapped the post all year really and we were able to practice that and do some things which I thought we were actually pretty good," Self said. "Like OU, that will be a lot harder to guard because they'll play [Brady] Manek at the four, so now ball screens become a factor and things like that. We'll see how that plays out."

Conference play for the Jayhawks will begin Wednesday against Oklahoma.

# Udoka Azubuike to have surgery on torn hand ligament; out for season

**LAWRENCE, Kan.** -- Fifth-ranked Kansas will be without center Udoka Azubuike for the remainder of the season after an MRI exam Sunday revealed the 7-footer tore ligaments in his right hand during practice.

Jayhawks coach Bill Self said in a statement that X-rays taken after Friday's practice did not show the severity of the injury. The MRI exam revealed the tendon tear, which is similar to a torn tendon Azubuike had in his opposite hand in December 2016 that sidelined him the remainder of his freshman season.

"The surgery date will be set early this week," Self said. "The doctors expect a complete recovery and Udoka will be able to resume full basketball activities at some point this summer."

The injury is a significant blow to the Jayhawks' interior depth, not to mention their national title aspirations. The nation's preseason No. 1 already has been playing without sophomore forward Silvio De Sousa, whose eligibility

remains in question after his name surfaced in the FBI probe into apparel company adidas.

Self said recently that there has been no change in De Sousa's status.

The Jayhawks (12-2, 1-1) lost 77-60 to lowa State on Saturday in their first game without their bruising center from Nigeria. But that was a byproduct of 24 turnovers and some patchy work on defense rather than any issues in the paint, where Kansas had a dominant plus-15 advantage on the boards.

"We've been living on the razor's edge a lot," Self said. "Granted, we don't have a lot of where we can go to guarantee us having a great possession. We really don't have good ball-handlers right now."

Azubuike had been rounding into the sure thing before his injury.

After missing time earlier this season with a sprained ankle, he had been on a tear the past couple of games. He had 23 points and nine boards in a blowout of Eastern Michigan, then had eight points and nine more rebounds in a comfortable win over No. 23 Oklahoma to

begin defense of the Jayhawks' Big 12 title.

The only other true center on the Kansas roster is relatively raw freshman David McCormack, which means Self could be forced to use smaller lineups again. He prefers to run with two big men but has leaned on four-guard lineups the past couple of seasons because of the configuration of his roster.

The starting lineup Self used Saturday featured Dedric Lawson in the post, with Marcus Garrett joining starters Lagerald Vick, Quentin Grimes and Devon Dotson in a four-guard backcourt.

Whether that sticks when Kansas returns to the floor against TCU on Wednesday night remains to be seen.

"We've got a lot of stuff we've got to hammer out," Self said, "and hopefully we can do it relatively soon. .... There's no question, eventually you're going to play like you practice. So certainly, we've got to be better in practice, I think, and that will probably translate to better performances in the games."

# KU working toward resolution with Silvio De Sousa

Silvio De Sousa has yet to play a minute for the KU men's basketball team in 2018-19 after it was announced shortly before the Jayhawks' first exhibition game that he would be withheld pending a review of his eligibility by the NCAA.

De Sousa's name was brought up in the NCAA's investigation into alleged college basketball corruption. During a trial in New York surrounding the case, he continued to be mentioned, leading to the decision by KU to hold him out.

"Information was presented during the current trial in New York — some of which we knew, some of which we didn't," KU coach Bill Self said in a release at the time. "We have decided to withhold Silvio from competition until we can evaluate and understand the new information. We have already discussed trial developments with the NCAA and will continue to work with NCAA staff moving forward."

The latest update, per Self, is that there is

no update to the NCAA's investigation into De Sousa. There is also no timetable that he has been given.

"No, no, there is not — at this point in time that I know about," Self said at his Monday press conference, asked about any potential progress to the situation. "But I know that the University is working hard trying to put something to bring a resolution to it, but that hasn't occurred yet. I'm not privy to all the information on timetable and stuff like that. When I ask my daily deal, [the response is:] 'Working on it,' which is 100 percent accurate and we know that to be the case."

Previously, Self had noted that redshirting was not a realistic option for De Sousa — at least back in mid-November. Two months later, however, things are still very much up in the air.

"He's crushed. He's crushed. And he'll be more crushed now because his partner can't play and he knows his role could be bigger," Self said, referring to Udoka Azubuike, who was recently announced out for the season with a ligament tear in his hand. "Whether Doke plays or not, that is totally isolated from Silvio, totally different. We would want him to be available and have the chance to [play] regardless of Doke's situation. You could think it could be a little more magnified now. In my world and my eyes, it's not. It's still the same situation that we are in. People are trying to move forward with it. It's just not as quickly as we had hoped."

Previously, Self had noted De Sousa was doing as well as could be expected considering the lack of movement — at least publicly — surrounding his case.

"His attitude has been terrific," Self previously stated. "He has stayed positive and he is working his tail off and he is doing it playing on the second unit because you can't give him all the reps on the first unit because we don't know when it's going to happen. But he's getting a vast majority of his reps with the second unit. He's got a great attitude, staying very positive."

The Jayhawks will return to the court Wednesday against TCU.

# KU's McCormack 'sorry' Azubuike is out for season, 'but now it's time to step up'

David McCormack didn't actually see fellow Kansas big man Udoka Azubuike's painful hand injury at practice on Friday.

"I was in a different drill, a little bit farther away. Once he said it was nagging him, bothering him (after getting it hit), I was there for emotional support, asking him if there was anything I could do to help," said McCormack KU's 6-foot-10, 265-pound power forward out of Oak Hill (Va.) Academy.

The freshman once again was there for 7-foot, 270-pound junior pivot Azubuike on Sunday, when it was revealed that the Delta, Nigeria native would miss the rest of the season because of a torn ligament in his right hand.

"I told him, 'We are here for you of course for any emotional support, to hang out, anything," a concerned McCormack said.

While feeling sorry for fellow McDonald's All-American Azubuike, McCormack also realizes injuries are part of the game of college basketball and the show, as they say, must go on.

He said he's prepared for an increased role Wednesday when the No. 7-ranked Jayhawks (12-2, 1-1) take on No. 25 TCU (12-1, 1-0) in an 8 p.m. tipoff at Allen Fieldhouse.

"I'm sorry of course it happened, but now it's time to step up. The team needs to be even more collective, be more of a group," said McCormack. He has averaged 2.5 points (on 51.9 percent shooting), 2.4 rebounds and 7.2 minutes played per game.

"We got together, had a meeting," McCormack revealed of the KU team, which is seeking a 15th straight Big 12 regular-season title. "It was general ... just to step up as a team. When any one person goes down in any type of organized team, everybody has to become one unit even closer just to fill in that gap. That's what we talked about."

Of his own role, McCormack stated: "I think I've been productive in the time I get out there, but now when I get more time, I'll just keep that same consistency, stay productive and do what I can to bring energy that I always do."

Whether coach Bill Self decides to go big with McCormack or 6-8 Mitch Lightfoot (2.0 points and 2.4 rebounds per game) playing next to 6-9 Dedric Lawson — or goes small with 6-5 Marcus Garrett starting at the 4 spot — KU's coach will be asking multiple players for increased productivity.

"It'll be a collective effort by everybody. Everybody could do more," Self said. "This is not a lost deal by any means, but certainly not the ideal situation to kind of have to revamp who you are after conference play starts."

KU enters the TCU game 9-0 in games in which Azubuike appeared; 3-2 in games without the 7-footer, who missed four games because of a severely sprained right ankle as well as Saturday's loss to lowa State because of the hand injury that will keep Azubuike off the court until this summer.

"Doke didn't give that verbal leadership or anything like that. He did give us a security blanket when he was out there," Self said of Azubuike, KU's third-leading scorer (13.4 points per game) and second-leading rebounder (6.8).

"We've got to have somebody willing to get out of their comfort zone and attack it," Self added.

Self mentioned freshman point guard Devon Dotson as "probably the best prospect to do that."

Dotson, who has averaged 11.3 points and 2.9 assists, said he and several of his teammates

are ready to embrace the upcoming challenge.

"I mean really it's next man up," Dotson said. "As a team you have to have the mindset of next man up. It could be anybody. Anybody could step up (for the team) to move forward.

"I feel we all can have a moment where we can bring guys together," Dotson added. "It doesn't have to be one person all the time. It can be a team thing, just come together as one, all of us playing together."

McCormack said KU's big men now must concentrate on "rim protection." Azubuike had 14 blocks in nine games played; Lawson has 14 blocks, Lightfoot eight and McCormack six.

On the offensive end, McCormack said he's been taught by assistant Norm Roberts "many ways to just slow down, look around and see what's going on. Once he tells me, I can feel it in the game and that becomes a bit more evident. That (slowing down) helps my game as well as the ball movement on the court."

Azubuike hit 55 of 78 shots this season for 70.5 percent. Lawson has cashed 50 percent of his shots and Lightfoot 55 percent to McCormack's 51.9.

"Our low post presence has been eliminated in some ways but not totally," Self said. "We've got to get David and Mitch where they are doing a good job in executing what we are trying to do. We can do that."

TCU, which has won nine straight games, opened conference play with an 85-81 win over Baylor on Saturday in Fort Worth, Texas.

The Horned Frogs lead the Big 12 in field-goal percentage (49.9) and also in assists (20.2), thanks to distributor Alex Robinson, a senior guard who averages 8.7 assists a game to go with his 13.5 scoring average.

"The ball is in his hands and he's really, really fast. He's experienced," Self said of Robinson.

# **KU's McCormack 'sorry' Azubuike is out for season, 'but now it's time to step up'** [Cont.]

Junior guard Desmond Bane averages 14.4 points and 5.5 rebounds. Junior guard Jaylen Fisher, who did not play against Baylor because of a knee injury, averages 12.2 points and has cashed 30 threes in nine games played. Sophomore forward Kouat Noi contributes 13.2 points per game.

"Their guards are good," Self said. "If you look at the matchup on paper, you may say that may be a situation that, obviously, we need to be concerned with. They've got enough guys that you've got to defend the post, but primarily they are spreading it and they are putting the ball in Robinson's hands and letting him make plays. That's hard to guard," Self added.

"The thing about it is it is certainly a big game. We are playing another top-ranked team. We are playing a team at home."

KU will travel to Baylor on Saturday for a 3 p.m. tipoff, then plays host to Texas on Monday in an 8 p.m. tip. That's three games in six days, all without Azubuike.

"We do not need to say we are shorthanded any more. We do not need to say, 'Well you don't have Doke. You are playing shorthanded.' We are not shorthanded. This is who we've got. We've got it in us. This team has a lot of pride. We've got it in us," Self said.

# Freshman PG Devon Dotson indispensable for KU

He's neither the type of player to bewilder observers with explosive scoring nights nor one to rack up eye-popping assist numbers. But freshman point guard Devon Dotson might be the most indispensable player on the Kansas basketball roster.

His teammates and coaches will tell you Dotson possesses more competitive drive than any player on the team, and the freshman from Charlotte, N.C., reminded every one of them, as well as the 16,300 fans inside Allen Fieldhouse, of that yet again Monday night in both the opening minutes of the second half versus Texas, as well as the final minute of the nail-biter, 80-78 Kansas victory.

With the Jayhawks doing all they could to maintain a three-point lead with the game clock ticking down toward 30 seconds, Dotson defended the most athletic man in the building, Kerwin Roach, on the perimeter and then showed the wherewithal to do his best to contest a potential game-tying 3 from Courtney Ramey once Dotson forced the ball out of Roach's hands.

Despite those efforts, Texas had a chance to get out of Lawrence with a victory in the game's final seconds. But Dotson defended Ramey (2 of 4 on 3-pointers) too well for the UT guard to get off a would-be game-winner, forcing him to pass to Jase Febres, who misfired on a 3.

Dotson's play proved just as crucial earlier on. With KU trailing at intermission for the sixth time this season, the 6-foot-2 freshman opened up the second half by regaining the lead for KU, knocking down a 3-pointer from the left corner with the shot clock winding down. Seconds later, Dotson blew past UT's transition defense the next trip down the floor, creating space for a rhythm 3-pointer by Quentin Grimes and a 4-point KU lead.

On possession No. 3 of the half, Dotson encountered 6-foot-9 Texas big Dylan Osetkowski trying to check him on the perimeter. The speediest ball handler in KU's four-guard lineup sped by the senior forward only to encounter a longer Longhorn, 6-11 Jaxson Hayes, at the rim. Dotson attacked the shot blocker in the fashion a much older lead guard would, and drew a foul to get to the charity stripe. Hayes had to find a seat next to his head coach, Shaka Smart, on the UT bench, with three fouls on his stat line and more than 18 minutes to play.

After a first half in which the Jayhawks couldn't figure out a way to sustain any separation from Texas, KU's freshman point guard turned a 2-point halftime deficit into a 5-point lead with ease. And even though Dotson didn't parlay that into a dominating second half, his brief takeover was just the spark KU needed in what went down as another victory for the No. 7-ranked team in the nation.

Putting up 10 points (3-for-6 shooting) for the 11th double-figure scoring outing of his young career, Dotson continued to show against the Longhorns (10-7 overall, 2-3 Big 12) his legitimate scoring potential for this season, as well as glimpses of even greater star potential to come for the remainder of his KU career, however many seasons that ends up being.

The third-leading KU scorer on the season when you don't include now injured Udoka Azubuike, Dotson rarely forces shots, preferring to rise to the occasion on cue.

Again fooling onlookers who don't know him

into assuming he's a veteran, Dotson scored his first basket of the night with a smooth fastbreak layup in the first half, timing his takeoff perfectly to allow his defender to fly past him before he scooped it off the glass.

While Dotson has only led the team in scoring once this season (16 points versus Oklahoma), there will be more of those to come as he becomes even more assertive as a driver and shooter.

Already KU's best free-throw shooter (53 of 68 on the year), Dotson of late has made active efforts to get to the foul line (3 of 4 against UT) and make easy points a regular part of his arsenal. Much like — dare one even say the name — Frank Mason III a couple of seasons before him, Dotson is not afraid to draw contact and end up on the court with a fresh floor burn or bruise.

If you were looking for a knock on the freshman point guard it would be that he's not yet a natural at setting up his teammates the way an old-school, pass-first point guard would. Dotson's career-high for assists is six and that came against South Dakota. He entered the week averaging 3.1 assists per game. But that playmaking for others will come in due time. He dished four versus UT without turning the ball over.

So, too, will come Dotson being the type of player to demand the ball when the other team is fouling late in the game.

For now, KU is fortunate to have as talented a point guard as Dotson on this team. It's difficult to envision the Jayhawks (15-2, 4-1) winning so often without him.

# Lagerald Vick reaches 1,000 career points on his birthday

Saturday's win in Waco was a special one for KU basketball's lone senior.

Lagerald Vick, who was presumed gone after his junior season, instead made a surprising return to the team over the summer and has since posted some of the best games of his career. Vick has already crossed the 30-point mark this year twice and the 25-point mark an additional two times.

Perhaps most important, however, has been his shooting. Vick has hit at least two 3-pointers in 12 of the Jayhawks' 16 games in 2018-19. He also has four games where he's hit at least six 3s. Saturday's game was one of them.

"First 36 minutes I thought he was great," said KU coach Bill Self of Vick after Saturday's KU win, 73-68 — as shown on the ESPN+ broadcast. "He made shots, I thought he played well. Made a couple of hard shots at the end of the shot clock. He played really well. You know, he didn't play like a senior down the stretch, but I thought he was pretty good today." That final comment — about playing well down the stretch — was made after Vick committed two turnovers in the final 50 seconds of Saturday's game. Regardless, the Jayhawks, ahead by more than 20 in the second half, held on for the fivepoint win.

Before the game, there was a funny interaction between Self and Vick, as was noted by big man Dedric Lawson in the post-game press conference. In the post-game setting, Lawson was asked about Vick knocking down so many 3s.

"That's what he's been doing all year," Lawson said of Vick's shooting. "Ah, he went six for eight? Man, I didn't know he made that many. That's something he do. Coach told him to make seven in the first half for his birthday. I told him to come out shooting. I said, 'Shoot it."

Well, it was close enough.

Vick finished the game with 18 points, three rebounds, two assists and a block. He ended up hitting six 3s — not quite seven — but did his coach really ask him for that?

"I told him to make seven in the first half," Self confirmed. "Why? Because I said. 'Why don't you

be unselfish? Everybody is saying it's about you, it's your birthday. Why don't you do something for me and make seven?' And so he did his part. He played pretty well."

Fittingly, it was on one of those 3s that Vick reached the 1,000-point mark for his career. Asked to put it into perspective, Self went back to his Oklahoma State days.

"I played with a guy at Oklahoma State named Brad Livingstone and he was just short of 1,000-point club. He was 950 points short. I was 900 [away] so we were kind of in the same group," Self joked. "But I would think that would be kind of a measuring stick for a really good career. If you can score 1,000 points, you're a good college player. And he's obviously a good college player so I'm happy for him for that."

As for Vick, the senior also spoke after Saturday's game, as was shown on the ESPN+ broadcast.

"It feels great; more to come," said Vick, who noted he only learned he was nearing the milestone when his mother told him a couple days earlier. "I just stay humble."

# Devon Dotson is off to a fast start running the point at Kansas

LAWRENCE, Kan. — It was the fall of 2009 when Sonny Parker got a call from Dana Dotson about his fourth-grade son, Devon. Parker played six seasons in the NBA and is the father of Chicago Bulls forward Jabari Parker. Every Saturday morning, Sonny opened the gym at Washington Park District on the south side of Chicago and put some of the best young players in the area through drills. He also helped his brother, Mike, with his grassroots program called Chicago Select. Dana liked the way the Parkers taught the game and wanted Devon in their program.

"Where you stay?" Sonny asked Dana, trying to get a feel if Devon would be a fit. "We stay in the suburbs," Dana replied.

"You can bring him out," Parker told Dana. "But I don't know. Our guys are tough. You're talking about some serious, tough dudes."

Sonny's skepticism came from an assumption that is deep-rooted in basketball circles. City guards have a different level of toughness. It's not the only place to find guards, of course, but it's usually a good place to start, and the Parkers had little reason to expand their reach to the suburbs.

Dana was not worried. Devon Dotson started playing tackle football when he was 5, his parents fibbing about his age so he could play a year up. He embraced contact so much that they called him Bam Bam. His toughness was born out of being a little brother — Dalen Dotson, who plays at William Carey University in Hattiesburg, Miss., is three years older. In their finished basement, the Dotsons built a mini full court with Fisher Price goals on both ends. They played two-on-two with a couple of neighborhood brothers and sold tickets to their parents. "Really cute," Angie Dotson says. "I miss those days." But when it was just the Dotson brothers going one-on-one, things got heated. "I kid you not, every single day someone would come up with a bloody nose," Devon says. "Mom, he did this. Mom, he did that. It was nonsense down there."

Devon was advanced on the basketball floor from the time he first dribbled a ball, Dana taking both boys to a Saturday morning skills session called French Fry Basketball when Devon was just a toddler.

At 4, he played in his first rec league. The other players were allowed to run with the ball. The officials called the game tighter for Devon, because dribbling was no issue. On the day of the championship, Devon was sick with a stomach bug. He was not going to miss that game, so his mom put him in a pull-up just to be safe.

Dana left out most of those details when he called Sonny, other than the football part, but he assured him that his son would have no issues competing against city kids. Sonny agreed to have him out for what would essentially be a tryout. Mike Parker will never forget that day.

"Oh, my god, what have I obtained?" Mike remembers thinking. "It was apparent at his young age that he was special. I'd never seen anything like it."

Kansas coach Bill Self likes his point guards ornery, tough and fast, so he and his assistants are always looking for those attributes when scouting the position. Dotson checked every box.

The payoff has been immediate. The 6-foot-2 Dotson is off to the best start of any freshman point guard in the Self era, averaging 11.0 points, 3.2 assists and 1.5 steals per game.

KU assistant coach Norm Roberts first saw Dotson at an Under Armour camp in July 2016 between Dotson's sophomore and junior years of high school. By that time, he and his family had moved to Charlotte. Roberts had never heard of Dotson, but he could not take his eyes off of him. Someone who knew Dotson approached Roberts in the stands. "Who you watching?" he asked him.

"I'm watching that little guard," Roberts replied. "Man, he's tough."

"He reminds you of Frank (Mason), doesn't he?"

"Yeah, he does," Roberts said. "A lot."

"Yeah, that's Devon Dotson," the man said. "He's really, really good."

Roberts was sold, so he brought Self to watch Dotson later that summer. Self loves speed, and the way Dotson attacked also reminded him of Mason, who played for the Jayhawks from 2013 to '17 and was the National Player of the Year as a senior. Then once he watched the interactions between Dotson and his grassroots coach, former NBA guard Jeff McInnis, Self knew that was the point guard he wanted. "Jeff was on his butt and he took it," Self says. "That showed me right there, this kid is going to be fine."

Dana was always after the best tutelage for his boys. After the family moved to Charlotte when Devon was in seventh grade, he took Devon and Dalen to train with former Hornets point guard Muggsy Bogues twice a week. "He was a kid who saw the play before it even happened," Bogues says. "He loved to make plays and make guys around him better at the same time. Seeing that at an early age was unique."

Bogues was so smitten he recruited Dotson to attend United Faith as an eighth-grader, where Bogues was the high school varsity coach. Dotson started on the high school JV team and moved up to varsity halfway through the season. "I knew he was going to be a big-time player the moment I laid eyes on him," Bogues

says. "He had the 'it' factor."

At every stage, it was the same experience for Dotson: He was fast and fearless and his coaches loved him from the start.

It wasn't just basketball, either. Dotson was a star on the football field in elementary school. He also played baseball and a year of hockey, and in fourth grade he spent time on the soccer pitch after his mom demanded he take a year off from football. His team won the league championship. "Every sport he excelled," Angie says, "and they all wanted him to do the travel thing."

Whatever sport Dotson was playing, he would become obsessed with it. "Whenever he was playing football, my wife and I had to tell him to stop diving on things," Dana says. "Stop trying to tackle us while we're walking through the mall. Get up off the ground. What are you doing? He would take on that persona."

After moving to Charlotte, Dotson gave up football and baseball to focus on hoops exclusively, and he developed into one of the best guards in the country. During his first two years in his new home, Dotson teamed with Leaky Black, now a freshman at North Carolina, on the CB Spiders, and the team finished in the top 10 at AAU nationals both years.

"He always wanted to stop his man and always wanted to destroy his man," says Jason Stowe, who coached the CB Spiders. "Doesn't matter if we were in practice or whatever, he always wanted to be the best, always worked the hardest. You knew he was going to be that guy."

When McInnis landed Dotson during his freshman year on Team Charlotte, which played on the Under Armour circuit, he started him on the under-17 team (the top age group in grassroots basketball).

Playing up was nothing new. He was used to going against his big brother and his buddies

in neighborhood games, and Dana got him placed on Dalen's team when Dalen was a seventh-grader and Devon in fourth grade.

Devon figured out his ticket to getting on the floor was his defense. Playing with and against kids three years older, he was the sixth man on the team and often closed games. "I was just trying to find a way to make an impact," Devon says. "I figured out this is something I could be really good at. Since then, I've always prided myself on the defensive end."

In Dotson's first year, Team Charlotte made it to the championship game of Under Armour's end-of-summer national tournament and faced Canada Elite, which was led by Thon Maker and Maryland-bound Justin Jackson. McInnis told Dotson he was going to put him on Jackson, a 6-7 wing who was already built like a grown man. Dotson looked at McInnis sideways, but he accepted the challenge.

"Devon is strong," McInnis says. "They scrapped their whole game plan and tried to post Devon up. I told Devon to front the post. He had two or three steals in the first quarter. It messed their whole strategy up. They never recovered from it."

The following school year, Dotson transferred to Providence Day, where he joined forces with then-senior Grant Williams, the current Tennessee star. Providence Day already had a good team, as Williams was in a class with two other Division I prospects, but coach Brian Field did not hesitate giving the keys to his sophomore point guard.

"He has one speed, and it's faster than everyone else on the court speed," Field says. "He can just go. It changed us. Because it gave us the ability to attack in transition unlike we had before. That kid is not afraid of anybody."

Providence Day won the state title that year, knocking off Highpoint Christian, which was led by Bam Adebayo, who starred at Kentucky and now plays for the Miami Heat. Providence Day also rose into the top 10 of national rankings.

"When those guys graduated, he became the alpha dog," Field says of Dotson. "His role changed. He had to score. That's what he became his junior and senior year, a highscoring point guard, but at the same time he loved to pass the ball and get his teammates involved."

When Self and Roberts visited the Dotsons in their home, Devon told them that he wanted to attend a school where he could start right away and win a national title.

The path was clear at KU, which was graduating All-American Devonte' Graham, but neither party knew exactly what it was getting.

A few weeks ago, Self installed a new defense that Dotson was struggling to comprehend. He kept messing up, and Self was on him hard. "I swear he thought I'd been here for four years," Dotson says. "He was saying, 'How do you not know this defense?' I just got here. I don't know it."

Roberts and Self remind Dotson that this is what he wanted when they recruited him. "It's hard to be good," Roberts says. "Like, this ain't easy, man. You don't become a great team, and it's easy. You don't win at this level and it's easy. It's not easy to perform at this level." What Self likes about Dotson is that he doesn't cower when he is coached hard. The day after he struggled to pick up the defensive scheme, the Jayhawks started practice with it and he had it down.

Most coaches will say that every player has to be coached differently, but Self is usually demanding, especially so with his point guards. That's why a veteran typically holds down the spot. Dotson is the first point guard since Tyshawn Taylor a decade ago, and only the second overall, to start at point guard for Self at Kansas.

The uncertainty of starting a freshman point

guard can be a concern, but Dotson helped ease everyone's worries on opening night against Michigan State. One of the best point guards in the country, Spartans junior Cassius Winston put up a double-double against KU (13 points and 11 assists), but Dotson's pressure bothered him. Winston turned it over five times and had one of his worst shooting games. Plus, he could not keep Dotson in front of him. Dotson's speed changed the game, and he scored 16 points in the Jayhawks' victory.

The numbers support his case as one of the best freshmen in the country. KU's defense is six points per 100 possessions better when Dotson is on the floor, per hooplens. com. And Self has allowed Dotson to play through mistakes, because he's noticed that his temperament rarely changes. "His highs are a step above his normal," Self says, "and his lows are a step below his normal." Mostly, though, Self loves the way he attacks downhill. Dotson learned to play that way from watching Derrick Rose. He used to attend Rose's camps when the family lived in Chicago, and if not for the relocation, he wanted to attend Simeon Career Academy, Rose's alma mater. Dotson's closet was lined with footwear from Rose's shoe line, and he wore kneepads to mimic his look. He even adopted Rose's free-throw routine.

But unlike most admirers, Dotson displays a game that has some resemblance to his idol's. The way he attacks the rim is vintage Rose. Not only can he get by his defender, but he's also so strong in his core that it's difficult to knock him off his spot.

When Providence Day had its first practice this season, Dotson's former teammates told Field they were relieved they didn't have to guard him anymore. "I'm like, 'What do you mean?"" Field recalls. "They said, 'Coach, every day you get in the locker room, and your ribs hurt from every time he goes by you. He makes contact with you, and I'd be bruised up and down.""

McInnis occasionally scrimmages with his players and can usually dictate where he

wants a guy to go with his old-man strength. Not so with Dotson.

"His center of gravity is really low," McInnis says. "Some guys are quick, but you can bump them off their spots. When I play against him, he's so low to the ground and he's so strong, it's hard to bump him off his spot."

Dotson is still just an average finisher — he shoots 64.7 percent at the basket, according to hoop-math.com — but part of the reason for his lower percentage is the degree of difficulty on some of those attempts. With his strength and concentration, he has the potential to become an elite layup maker. He never takes his eyes off the rim when he's challenged by a defender, which is a staple for all great finishers.

And his speed is still his greatest weapon. He leads the team in transition points (78), according to Synergy's tracking, and he's still learning how Self wants him to run the team. "That is Coach's big thing with point guards," Roberts says. "He wants them to think the game, think about what's going on. Don't just play the game, think the game, know what's going on out there and then you'll react better."

Much like Mason early in his career, Dotson defers to older players. He has the second-lowest usage rate among KU's starters — it was the lowest when Udoka Azubuike was still healthy — and he hasn't been as aggressive in the half court. Of the possessions he finishes, 35.2 percent come in transition, which is 11th-best among players with at least 50 transition opportunities, according to Synergy.

Part of that is Dotson's hesitancy to shoot from outside. Some would argue his jumper is a hole in his game that he'll need to fix to become an elite scorer. Dotson disagrees. "I know the amount of work I put in," he says.

He has made a respectable 14-of-34 (41.2 percent) from 3, although the limited attempts

would suggest he's not overly confident. Here, perhaps, is another parallel. Mason was a player who went from an average shooter to an elite one. He made only 18 3s as a freshman and shot 32.7 percent from deep, but he improved each season and made 82 3s on a 47.1 percent clip as a senior.

This could be the path for Dotson if he sticks around long enough, but his mom and his coach want more right away.

"I feel like he's holding back," Angie says. "I feel like he could do more. He is a little lacking confidence right now. There's things he could be doing and we know he could do. A little lack of confidence, which is the first time I've seen this."

Angie corrects herself. She saw a similar approach when her son started with Team Charlotte and most of his teammates were two years older. She wants to see him be more aggressive and dunk the ball like D-Rose. "He can jump," Angie says. "He doesn't have the vertical like Derrick Rose, but he can do a lot of that. He just won't show it. I don't know. I don't know what's holding him back. He's just being a little timid. Hopefully, he comes out of it because they're going to need him to."

Sometimes parents and coaches see things differently, but it's safe to say this is what Self wants as well. He has encouraged Dotson to take charge and not worry about his age when it comes to leadership. And any sort of passiveness is met with immediate disdain. Last Wednesday against TCU, when Dotson turned the corner and then jumped into the air with nowhere to go and threw the ball out of bounds, his eyes met Self's and the coach shouted, "C'mon Devon! Be a player!"

Self is constantly pushing his buttons and has already figured out what motivates his freshman point guard. A mere mention of backup point guard Charlie Moore usually does the trick. "All I've gotta do is say, 'Hey, Charlie, keep busting his ass,' and that gets

him going," Self says. "That's the only time he has an ego. He doesn't like for anybody to say that somebody's better than him."

Self really never knows the limits of a player until he gets him on campus. His point guards usually gain his trust and admiration with time, but he already has a sparkle in his eye when talks about Dotson.

You know this when he mentions the freshman in the same sentence as former Jayhawks point guard Sherron Collins. Spend enough time around Self, and it's evident that Collins is his all-time favorite and he believes the best freshman he ever coached. "Sherron was so advanced," Self says. "I thought he was the best guard in the country. He was so physically strong and had it on a string and could get his own and was smart. Devon, obviously, has a lot of those same characteristics." With Collins, Self knew right away. The day Collins stepped foot on campus he dominated a pickup game, showing a core of players who would become part of the 2008 national championship team that he belonged. "So when I watched Sherron play, it really didn't surprise me," Self says.

Self wasn't as sure about Dotson. But one day this season, McInnis got a call from one of KU's coaches who told him, "You've done a good job with this kid. Coach Self is hard on him, and he doesn't flinch."

And in crunch time of KU's biggest games this season, that's what Self has noticed. "I'm like going, 'This little kid is getting good. He's getting really good," Self says. "And the sky's the limit for him because he's so fast."

# Quentin Grimes is on his way...soon

Two days into the New Year, Kansas welcomed Oklahoma to Allen Fieldhouse and embarked on its annual quest to capture the Big 12 title.

After 14 years, Kansas' streak has become something of a college basketball cliche. The last time a team other than the Jayhawks won the conference, Georgia Tech was in the Final Four, LeBron James was a rookie in Cleveland and Donald Trump was starring in the first season of The Apprentice. Now, the streak is older than some of the high school prospects Kansas is beginning to recruit.

But streaks, like rules, are meant to be broken. No team can dominate indefinitely. And with under three minutes left against Oklahoma, the Sooners appeared to have Kansas on the ropes. They were down by six points but on a 9-2 run during which Kansas' offense had stagnated. To generate some scoring, the Jayhawks ran an offensive set through freshman Quentin Grimes on the right wing. But as Grimes rounded the corner and drove into the lane, Oklahoma guard Aaron Calixte popped the ball loose. For a brief second, it seemed like the latest disappointment for Grimes.

The most highly touted prospect of Kansas coach Bill Self's spectacular 2018 class, the 6'5", 210-pound guard began his Kansas career with an incredible splash. He dropped 21 points on 14 shots against Michigan State in the Champions Classic, and then followed that up with 10 points and 10 assists against Vermont. But the rest of 2018 was something of a struggle. Grimes only scored in double figures two more times in 10 tries. His offensive rating coming into the Oklahoma game was a paltry 82.2, according to kenpom.com, making him the only Jayhawks starter with a mark south of 100. And this was his third turnover of the night.

Then, as quickly as he lost the ball, he forced

it loose again. In the ensuing scramble, he dove to the floor, slid between the legs of an Oklahoma forward and somehow, with two Sooners crashing into him, slipped a pass to his point guard, Devon Dotson. Dotson drove in for an and-1, and the Jayhawks coasted to the win. After the game, Self called Grimes' effort "the best play he's made all year."

After losing a road game against unranked lowa State on Jan. 5 and losing center Udoka Azubuike to a season-ending wrist injury, Kansas needs Grimes more than ever.

"I expect for him to impact every possession in some shape or form," Self says. "And that's a compliment to a guy. There are some guys who can only impact certain possessions in certain ways. And he can impact by passing, by vision, by IQ, by plugging himself in. Anything less than that is unacceptable and not pushing him to be who he is. He didn't come here to play half-assed. He came here to do something special."

Those who know him best insist that Grimes has a killer instinct that's ready to be revealed. Now the question is: Can it emerge in time for Kansas to keep its Big 12 streak alive? Could Quentin Grimes help Kansas return to the Final Four?

Marshall Grimes and Tonja Stelly, Quentin's father and mother, each played college basketball. Grimes played point guard at Santa Clara in California and later at Louisiana Lafayette, and Stelly played two seasons of forward at Fort Hayes State in Kansas before quitting basketball and transferring to KU. Together, they shared in the early joys of watching their toddler take to the sport they both loved. Despite their backgrounds, Grimes and Stelly agreed that Quentin shouldn't specialize in one sport too early. There was just one problem: Quentin had no interest in anything besides basketball.

Stelly asked him to try out for soccer every year of elementary school, but he wouldn't so much as step foot on the field. And his football

career lasted less than a week. He tried out at the behest of one of his best friends, Mike Woods, who now plays wide receiver at Arkansas. Woods' dad was the assistant coach on a pee-wee team, and he encouraged Grimes to join.

"He made it three practices," Stelly says now. "He didn't even play a game before he was gone. Basketball has always been Quentin's love."

Marshall never coached Quentin, but he did help his son build his game in the backyard. Marshall began by showing Quentin the greats of his generation. They'd watch full games featuring Magic Johnson and Michael Jordan, whose basketball primes ended years before Quentin was born in 2000. When either father or son saw a move that intrigued them, they'd walk outside into the Houston heat and practice until it was perfected.

But his favorite player was one he'd watched live: Kobe Bryant. Marshall and Quentin studied the Lakers star from head to toe, analyzing everything from his footwork to his shooting stroke.

"Everybody respects the older generation and how good they were," Quentin Grimes says, "but I don't know if they watch them like I do. I'm trying to work my way up to that Mamba Mentality. It'll take a while to get to that level, but I'll make it one day."

By middle school, Grimes had developed a local reputation, but his national status was still uncertain. A 2014-15 preseason blurb about College Park High School in the Houston Chronicle noted that as a freshman, he was "expected to play an important role, potentially developing into an impact player early in his career." He put up a respectable 8.8 points and 3.4 assists per game as a starter, but the pressures of that first season and a coaching change in his AAU program shook his faith in the game a bit. On the Sunday morning of Memorial Day weekend that year, Grimes told his parents he didn't want to play

basketball that summer.

"Quentin was miserable," Stelly says. "The light had gone out. I'd never seen him like that. Basketball is his whole life. It's what he loves and he's passionate about it. As a parent, it was, 'Oh my gosh, what has happened?' We weren't quitters, and he had to fight through the battle. It was so bad I was looking into sports psychologists. I was like, 'Something is wrong, and if I can't get it pulled out of him, then I need a professional.' We decided not to play that season."

Grimes rediscovered his passion for the sport by returning to the process with his dad. And he found the fun again by playing pickup games. He balled out with former college and NBA players in the Houston area in games organized by his dad, and together, he and Marshall ran the floor at the 24 Hour Fitness by his house.

"I'm a little past my prime," Marshall jokes, "but I can still play some. And when teams needed a player, they'd start asking Quentin to play with them. At first, I thought they were doing me a favor, being nice to my boy. It took me a little too long to realize they weren't helping me out. They were trying to win games."

After one game at the end of the summer, a stranger told Marshall that Quentin was good but really needed to get stronger. Marshall looked at his son—then a 6'2", 165-pound rising high school sophomore—and wondered, Could he really be behind? Then the man asked Marshall when Quentin was leaving for college that fall. And Marshall knew his son was ahead of schedule. In his second season at College Park, Quentin posted 16.6 points and 3.6 rebounds per game. That next summer, he jumped to a new AAU team, Basketball University, and broke out.

"Most 16- to 18-year-olds like to play video games, chase girls or drive their cars," says Clifton McNeely, Quentin's high school coach. "Quentin wasn't that way. He went to work not only on his skills and playing but also on developing his body. What separates the elite kids is not only the natural athleticism but also the work it takes to develop that. There's no glory in the weight room, but Quentin had a different drive. He just gave everything to basketball."

McNeely likes to tell Quentin that the only repayment he needs when Grimes makes it to the NBA is a new microwave. And Tonja Stelly likes to tell her son that she misses him in her house but she's thankful to have her weekends back. When Quentin was in high school, Tonja would spend her Sundays chopping, searing and steaming healthy lunches and snacks for him to bring to school during the week. And so rather than eat in the cafeteria, Quentin would go into the coaches' office and heat up what his mother had cooked for him.

"It was funny," McNeely says, "because he was so polite. Every day, he'd knock before he came in. And every day, he'd say thank you when he left. Even though he knew he was welcome. The only things anyone ever got upset about was when the tennis coach, who is a Wichita State grad, found out he was going to Kansas—or when he [had] fish and stunk up the office for the rest of the day."

For Grimes, a methodical approach to meals mirrored his take on the game. When he realized he needed to improve his agility, he started working out at Dynamic Sports Training, a gym known primarily for improving the skills of baseball players. When he needed to narrow his recovery window as he played more and more minutes, he started going to a cryotherapy chamber twice a week with his mother. And when he was asked to play more often off the ball after a childhood of playing point guard, he went back to the film room with his father and picked up more moves from Bryant.

"I'm a natural scorer," Grimes says, "so I feel like if I'm a shooting guard, it makes it look better if I have a nice pass, because I'm supposed to be off ball. If I'm on ball, it's the same when I score. When I was younger, I could score, but I was kind of small, so they classified me as a point guard. But then I just kept growing and growing, so they labeled me something different. Whether I play on the ball or off the ball, it doesn't matter to me. I really feel like I'm just a guard."

It was that measured approach to building his basketball career that led him to stay at his high school all four years, despite prolific offers from prep programs. When Hurricane Harvey hit Houston in August of 2017, Grimes was glad that he hadn't left, so that he could be part of the relief effort in his hometown. His parents' houses hadn't been affected, but he didn't have to go far to see the devastation the storm had caused. One afternoon, a few days after Harvey had passed, Grimes went to his room and stared at the stacks of sneakers, backpacks and clothes he'd been given on the AAU circuit. Much of it had never seen the outside of the box—much less the outside world. He and his parents packed up their SUV with thousands of dollars worth of premium basketball gear, and spent the day delivering it to relief distribution centers.

A few days later, he went to shootaround at Legends Sports Complex, a gym near his home in The Woodlands, and found it had been damaged by the hurricane, too. He asked the director there how he could help, and he told Quentin he could dig. So Quentin found a shovel and began clearing the debris. Only after an afternoon of manual labor did he head inside to do the work he'd originally intended to do on the court.

"I've had college coaches ask for years, and now I've got NBA scouts doing their background checks," McNeely says. "They always ask: 'Where's the flaw? What aren't you telling us?' The truth is, there's nothing. He's a great player and a great person."

The only thing coaches have ever wanted from Grimes is more. And his production progressed with each year at College Park. As a junior in 2016-17, he averaged 28.1 points and 8.0 rebounds a game. And as a senior, he

averaged 29.5 points, 8.6 rebounds and 4.9 assists per game. In one game that season, McNeely pulled him late in a game without realizing that he was at 48 points. After a timeout, Grimes created a clandestine plan with teammates to check himself back in without his coach's permission. Grimes got in, got the ball, got the bucket and got right back to the bench.

Last year, he became a McDonald's All-American, a Jordan Brand Classic participant and the Gatorade Texas Player of the Year. And that was all before playing for his future coach, Bill Self, in the FIBA U18 Americas Championship, where he won a gold medal and was named the tournament's MVP.

"Quentin fools people on the court sometimes still," Marshall Grimes says. "He seems like a nice kid, but when he smells blood in the water, he'll put you away."

At that competition in Canada, Grimes felt more confident than ever in his college decision. No matter how well he played in any game, Self would pull him aside to watch footage afterward and show him scoring opportunities he'd missed. And when Grimes didn't perform a fundamental—like a lob pass to the post—perfectly, Self would make him stay in position until he got it right.

"I told him later on," Self says sarcastically, "Wouldn't you hate to play for a coach who wants you to score every time you touch it, or wants you to make a play every time you touch it? That'd be awful to play for a coach like that, wouldn't it?' And then he understood where I was coming from." Late in the summer, Stelly worried that her son might have taken on too much. After all, his schedule was so slammed that he only had a five-day window when he would be able to get his wisdom teeth removed. But what she saw next reassured her. Everyone had always wanted more from her son, but she could see he was still glad to give it. On the day after his operation, in the one week off he had during the summer, Quentin grabbed his car keys and headed to his old high school gym to shoot hoops.

Quentin Grimes couldn't have asked for a better college debut than his performance at the Champions Classic, but much of the rest of the season has been a struggle. His numbers have improved in conference play after a quiet December—his effective field goal percentage is in the top 20 in the Big 12, and his two-point percentage is in the top five—but he knows that's not enough.

"People have always told me to be more aggressive," Grimes says, "but I like to go out there and figure out the game and figure out the flow. People want me to go out there and be in attack mode. My coaches have always said the same thing: 'We want you to shoot, and we want you to score.' I'm real unselfish on the court, so I had to figure that out. It took me a while to learn that. I'm going through that here with Coach Self. They brought me here to be a scorer, and they tell me every day to be more aggressive. I'm progressing."

Self still has full confidence in Grimes, too.

"Quentin is probably the most well-rounded

young guard we've ever had here," he says. "When you think about guards, his handle, explosiveness, strength, range, vision, toughness—he checks a lot of boxes. But still, that doesn't mean it's going to happen for him. That doesn't guarantee anything for him, but I'd still rather have those things than not have those things. I hope he can play to the talent level I think he has."

To break through the slump, Grimes is doing what he's always done: returning to the process that made him great in the first place. A few years ago, Kansas built McCarthy Hall, an \$11.2 million dorm for its basketball players. The building has a full court. And every other night, after he's gone to workouts, practices, classes and study halls, Grimes grabs the rebounding gun and begins shooting. He doesn't play music because he likes to listen to the ball rip through the net. He shoots until he's made 300 three-pointers. There in the quiet, he makes sure he's ready for the next big moment. He knows how far this process has brought him, and he knows it'll take him to the next level, too. He feels like it won't be long now.

#### Marcus Garrett's recent offensive success due to his growth as a finisher

Entering the season, Kansas fans probably would have scoffed at the notion of sophomore Marcus Garrett getting an offensive play called for him in the final minutes of a Big 12 contest.

But that's exactly what happened during KU's 80-76 win over Iowa State Monday night in Allen Fieldhouse. With 1:17 left in the game, freshman point guard Devon Dotson passed the ball to Garrett on the left wing.

Dotson followed the pass, while Garrett drove hard with his right hand. It forced the two ISU defenders to bump into each other. Garrett got a high-post screen from Dedric Lawson, which gave him all the separation he needed to get to the rim for a layup.

Garrett finished with 16 points on the night, which marked his third consecutive game in double figures.

"Marcus is playing at a pretty high level," KU coach Bill Self said. "We shouldn't judge him on how many points he scores. We should judge him on if we win or not, because that's who he is. He makes winning basketball plays, and he did a lot of those tonight."

Over the last three contests, Garrett is averaging 17.0 points per game for the Jayhawks. He's shooting 22-of-35 from the floor, while also grabbing 3.0 rebounds and 4.0 steals per outing. He's finished as a top-two scorer for Kansas in all three games.

The secret to Garrett's recent offensive success was on full display against Iowa State.

All 16 of his points came via eight layups, including five in the second half. Garrett was getting to the rim with ease, and finding a way to finish a majority of his opportunities. After the game, Garrett credited Silvio De Sousa for his recent growth as a finisher.

"In practice, I just attack the rim and don't shy away from contact," Garrett said. "Silvio can't play, so he helps me out a lot. It is just finishing over and through Silvio, things like that."

According to hoop-math.com, Garrett is shooting 58.1 percent on shots at the rim. That mark is better than only one player on the team, though he's been much better in this particular area over the

last few games.

"When Silvio plays on the scout team, he tries to block every shot," Self said. "It would obviously help you try to finish over an athletic guy."

However, De Sousa isn't the only KU teammate responsible for Garrett's distinguished driving ability against ISU.

Many of Garrett's layups were set up by Dotson in some way. Dotson forced defenders to help over on drives, creating better angles for Garrett when he got the ball. Garrett often attacks with his right hand, but has shown the ability to make a play with his left hand, as well.

As a result, Garrett has become a player who has to be on the court at all times. Over the last three games, Garrett has played 108 of the possible 120 minutes, becoming one of the most important players for Kansas.

"He's getting comfortable with the college game," Lawson said. "Once you get comfortable with it, it is over with. He's turned into a player with confidence. Back-to-back games with double figures, we don't look for nothing less now going forward."

## 'Terrific' Ochai Agbaji providing spark for KU basketball

Ochai Agbaji has made a sizeable impact in his short college career. In his debut, he played 25 minutes and even played his way into the crunch-time lineup. In his first road game, he didn't blink. He scored 10 points.

As much as the 6-foot-5 freshman has helped KU with his outside shooting off the bench — he's 4 for 10 from deep there is another area that Bill Self has seen Agbaji affect things.

"He has helped [bringing energy]," Self said at his weekly press conference Thursday. "I think we're more athletic and more energetic since he started playing, without question. He's been a big bonus. The other day [vs. lowa State] he was terrific."

Agbaji's performance against Iowa State was one with highs and Iows. Agbaji made two 3s and grabbed a career-high five rebounds but fouled out in only 16 minutes of action. Despite a shortened game, he made an instant impact in his first three possessions.

Immediately after he came into the game for the first time, Agbaji got the ball, drove into the lane, and finished with a tough floater over his man. On the next defensive possession, Agbaji grabbed a rebound and fed the ball to Devon Dotson. Dotson pushed and gave the ball back to Agbaji, who then confidently rose up and drilled a 3.

The freshman has shown zero hesitation shooting the ball when he gets it. He also hasn't necessarily been a player that has come off the bench in the past.

With that in mind, does his first shot after entering a game from the sidelines feel any different?

"Not really," Agbaji said. "But I just don't really think too much when I'm in there. You know if I'm open I'll shoot it. I just don't really think. I just do it."

Agbaji is 3 for 5 from the field in his first attempt of the game. Yet as much as Agbaji has served as an offensive sparkplug with his shooting and as a lob threat, he likes to center his efforts on something else.

"I just try to bring anything I can to the table when I get in," the freshman said. "But I always think it starts defensively for me getting stops, getting steals, deflections rebounds. That's what I try to focus on when I get in."

Agbaji has recorded a steal in three of his five games. He has posted a block in two and has snatched four or more rebounds three times. For some perspective as to how active Agbaji has been on the defensive end, Agbaji already has more steals, rebounds and blocks than K.J. Lawson, Charlie Moore and Quentin Grimes in Big 12 play.

And when it comes to that mindset, it's something that the 16th-year KU coach can certainly appreciate. He'd like to see more of it.

"He comes in firing," Self said of Agbaji. "You would think that everybody would have that mindset to come in and be aggressive like that. It's easier to do that when the ball goes in the hole, but that was nice to see right off the bat."

One sequence against Iowa State showed just how active Agbaji is when he's on the floor.

Agbaji looked for his shot, and admittedly took a bad pull-up 2, but he followed his shot and beat everyone else to his own rebound. From there, he set up in position for a lob and called for it twice. He did so once when Lagerald Vick had the ball and once when Lawson did.

Eventually, the ball rotated and found its way to Agbaji who had his hands ready for a shot and took a 3.

The sequence didn't go his way — the shot missed — but it's a good example of how active Agbaji is. That activity is something that KU needs on both ends of the floor.

#### KU forward Dedric Lawson has responded by being much tougher on the glass since his dud at Baylor earlier this month

At the time, during a road game at Baylor back on Jan. 12, the Jayhawks were playing for just the third time this season after learning that junior center Udoka Azubuike would be sidelined the rest of the way.

So, it's possible that Kansas junior Dedric Lawson was still adjusting that day.

If that's the case, consider Lawson fully adjusted. Never was that more obvious than Saturday night, in Lexington, Ky., where Lawson recorded yet another double-double and did everything in his power to make sure Kansas competed on the glass with the bigger, stronger Kentucky front court.

Lawson finished Saturday's loss to the Wildcats with 15 rebounds - 4 offensive and 11 on the defensive end - outdoing the combined total of KU's next three leading rebounders in the game.

It wasn't that way back in Waco, Texas, where Lawson finished with just three rebounds against Baylor on a day when Kansas got whipped on the glass, 49-30.

After the game, Lawson immediately questioned

whether it was the worst rebounding game of his career and Kansas coach Bill Self also had no problem calling Lawson out for his poor effort on the glass that day.

Evidently, that's all it took for Lawson to get things fixed.

In KU's four games since that Baylor victory, Lawson is averaging 12.3 rebounds per game and has reached double-digits three times. 15 against Kentucky. 15 against Iowa Stat. 11 at West Virginia and 8 in a home win over Texas.

While those types of efforts have been big for Kansas in all four of those games, his willingness to go to war on the glass was absolutely huge on Saturday against Kentucky.

"We're obviously very light in the butt, to put it mildly," Self said after the loss. "And going against big, heavy bodies, and men, a fifth-year guy (Reid Travis) and P.J. Washington's beyond his years, physically, and Nick (Edwards) is, as well. Basically, we've got one guy really ready to go against that, and that's an awful lot to ask from one guy."

Lawson didn't mind. Instead of making excuses or whining about not getting help, the junior transfer simply said situations like those required players stepping up to the plate and finding a way to get the job done.

Lawson's doing that. And Self believes doubledigit rebounding efforts might be a little easier to come by in the weeks ahead provided Lawson continues to bring the energy and focus that he's had since that Baylor game.

"Our league has some length," Self said. "But they don't have length like Richards, at least since it seems like all the big guys in our league are getting hurt."

Next up, Kansas will face Texas at 6 p.m. on Tuesday night in Austin, Texas, and Lawson will look to make it four out of five double-digit rebounding efforts in that one.

In KU's first meeting with the Longhorns, which came two days after that outing against Baylor, Lawson grabbed 8 rebounds, all on the defensive end.

#### Quentin Grimes' flashes of potential raise familiar question

As the Kansas basketball team keeps trying to leap up and reach its seemingly elusive ceiling, a recurring question persists: When will freshman Quentin Grimes become the assertive, effective perimeter player the Jayhawks need him to be?

Every time Grimes puts up double-digit points, one can't help but wonder if this particular performance will be the game that catapults him into consistency.

Such is the case at this crucial juncture of the schedule, with 11 games to go in the regular season and that countdown clock for the postseason ticking a little louder by the day.

Grimes was KU's second-most impactful offensive player Saturday night at Kentucky, providing 13 points off 5-for-9 shooting and — of utmost importance for this team, with its dearth of sharpshooters — connecting on 3 of his 5 attempts from 3-point range.

Though it wasn't nearly enough to beat the Wildcats (16-3 overall, 5-1 SEC) at Rupp Arena, Grimes' night had to be a welcome development for the freshman, his teammates and his coaches, especially when looking at the context of what happened for him earlier in the week. Grimes had his third 0-for-the-game shooting day of the season, went scoreless for the first time as a Jayhawk — and, let's be honest, probably ever — and played only 19 minutes in KU's home win over lowa State.

Grimes recovered by making 3-pointers at UK when the Jayhawks (16-4 overall, 5-2 Big 12) needed them. KU cut Kentucky's lead to 2 in the second half when he knocked down his first 3, to 3 when he buried his second and to 6 when he drained his third, with 4:33 to go. Each was essential in keeping Kansas in reach of a UK team doing its best to put sou its Big 12 visitors away.

In Grimes' previous five outings, he shot a combined 9 for 28 from the floor (5 for 17 from deep) and averaged 5.2 points per game. His upsurge at Kentucky is the latest instance of promise following prolonged doldrums. You may recall his four-game stretch of single-figure scoring games in December, or a similar four-game run transpiring from mid-November to Dec. 1.

Each time Grimes emerged with a more promising night — 14 points against Wofford in early December and 16 points against Eastern Michigan to close 2018 — Jayhawks spoke of their hope that this would be the turning point.

And so it was in Lexington, Ky., after KU came up short in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge.

"He played solid. He played a good game today," teammate Marcus Garrett said of Grimes. "I think that'll help him out going forward. He was able to knock down shots, see the ball go in."

It was a familiar refrain, and, no question, one that both Grimes and everyone else within the program hope he doesn't have to repeat any time soon.

A 6-foot-5 prospect with McDonald's All-American pedigree and the physical build of an NBA guard, it's difficult to watch Grimes and not see his potential. It's there, and the Jayhawks would enjoy nothing more than seeing him play to it each and every game.

Perhaps his 21-point debut against Michigan State in the season opener set expectations too high. But when Grimes is rolling offensively — taking and making 3-pointers with confidence, sprinting wide down the sideline on the break or taking advantage of his frame and size inside versus a smaller guard — you don't have to squint too hard to envision a guard who has the tools to be a reliable scoring

source for KU.

True, it would be even more beneficial for the Jayhawks' trajectory if Grimes could improve in every facet of the game. Take his perimeter defense up a notch. Utilize his strong lower body to help Dedric Lawson clean the glass. Regularly set up teammates for high-percentage shots. Attack off the bounce to score in the paint or get to the foul line. All of these are in the realm of possibilities, in theory.

In reality, he's not likely to check all of those boxes every time KU plays. But a more commanding offensive approach should only bolster Grimes' allaround game. So why not use that as a jumping-off point?

Everyone knows Lawson (19.5 points per game) can and will score. Typically, Lagerald Vick (14.8 points) can be relied on for 12 to 18 points or so, with greater outbursts on hot shooting nights never to be ruled out. But what if Grimes (8.5 points) became just as reliable? He wouldn't have to put up 20 points a game the rest of the way, or even 15. If he could somehow get to a place offensively where he doesn't disappear for stretches and regularly gives KU 12 points or more with a couple of 3-pointers, it would quickly become one of the more important developments of the season.

It's an iffy if, when looking at the highs and lows of Grimes' season so far. But becoming a perimeter scoring option to complement Lawson isn't asking too much of him.

Everyone who keeps up with Kansas basketball repeatedly wonders when it will happen. We'll see Tuesday at Texas whether Grimes can turn one promising performance into two as a starting point for a turnaround. Or whether the same old questions will cycle back to the forefront. #### Lightfoot helps assure KU's home victory over K-State: 'You protect the cathedral'

Appreciative Kansas basketball fans leapt to their feet with 49 seconds left in the Jayhawks' 64-49 victory over Kansas State on Monday night at Allen Fieldhouse.

They reserved a special, lengthy standing ovation for junior forward Mitch Lightfoot, who exited the game for good with nine points, five rebounds, three blocked shots, two assists and one charge taken on defense in 31 productive minutes.

"Man, to grow up a Kansas fan ... I'm not going to lie I got goosebumps a little bit," Lightfoot said, referring to his reaction to the fans' applause. "It's so cool to be a piece of something so much bigger than me," added the 6-foot-8 Lightfoot, who was born in Kansas City and moved to Arizona when he was 6.

Lightfoot on Monday came off the bench to score eight points in 15 minutes the first half. His effort and energy certainly helped KU grasp a 34-27 halftime advantage.

Early on offense, he sped by K-State senior forward Dean Wade for a layup in which he was fouled (missing the free throw). Lightfoot also nailed a three-pointer and hit a second inside shot. On defense, Lightfoot took a charge from Makol Mawien. He also had a fierce rejection of a Barry Brown shot.

"When he (Lightfoot) came in, it was almost like

you couldn't take him out," said KU coach Bill Self. Lightfoot subbed for starter David McCormack with 14:38 left in the first half, KU trailing 7-3. Lightfoot played the rest of the half, then started the second half in which he scored one point with three rebounds and two blocks in 16 minutes. KU outscored K-State 30-22 in the final 20 minutes.

"When Mitch plays with that energy it does something to our fans that some other players, when they do the same thing, can't accomplish. He changes the mood in the building the way he plays," Self added in praising Lightfoot on Tuesday night's weekly Hawk Talk radio show.

"I would say it probably means as much to Mitch to play well against K-State maybe more than anybody on our team. They've got guys like that, too. Dean Wade obviously. Everybody has somebody like that."

Lightfoot helped hold senior power forward Wade to eight points on 2-of-7 shooting in 25 minutes. KU's double teams helped force Wade into four turnovers. Wade, a native of St. John, Kan., had scored 12 points with nine boards in K-State's 74-67 victory over KU on Feb. 5 at Bramlage Coliseum in Manhattan.

"It was a blast," Lightfoot said of Monday's victory. "It's a huge rivalry. We all took it to heart. It means so much to so many people. We just wanted to show that."

KU, which has a 10-5 record in the Big 12 (KSU is 11-4 and Texas Tech started Tuesday 10-4), improved to 15-0 at Allen Fieldhouse this season and 8-0 in

league home games.

"You protect the cathedral. This place is sacred ground of basketball," Lightfoot said of Allen. "People come in here and it's not an easy place to play."

Lightfoot on Monday may have been so fired up that he botched an assignment to start the second half. The mistake had KU coach Self smiling, but only after the game.

"Mitch is one of those guys you can't help but love him," Self said, "but we talked at halftime how we were going to get a stop on the first possession (of the second half). It's their ball first possession. We're out there, Mitch thinks it's our ball and he doesn't guard anybody. He thought it was our ball going to the wrong basket, but that's Mitch. He was like, 'Oh, my bad.' You've got to feel so happy for him," Self added of Lightfoot contributing heavily to KU's 13th consecutive home win over KSU.

Lightfoot and Dedric Lawson wound up combining for 27 points and 19 boards. Lawson had 18 points, 14 boards and five assists.

"Mitch played great. he brought energy, protected the rim (three blocks). That's something we need from Mitch on a consistent basis," Lawson said. "He's a great kid, a great human being, a great person to be around."

Lightfoot, by the way, has averaged 20.2 minutes a game the last six games after averaging 8.3 minutes his first 20 games.

#### Three factors that caused Kansas' historic Big 12 title streak to finally snap

One of the more impressive streaks in college sports has finally ended.

Kansas' 81-68 loss to Oklahoma on Tuesday officially stopped the Jayhawks' 14-year reign over the Big 12, with one of coach Bill Self's KU teams winning at least a share of the league's regular-season title in every season since finishing second in 2004.

But how did this Kansas team, a preseason No. 1 in the coaches poll and a national title favorite in November, fail to do what so many teams did before it?

Granted, Self has had some remarkable Kansas teams, including national title-worthy teams that underachieved in the NCAA tournament (KU also won't be a No. 1 or No. 2 seed this year for the first time since 2009). Those squads featured NBA draft lottery picks, veteran four-year players and Wooden Award winners. But there were also way worse Kansas teams on-paper that got the job done.

What was different this year? Let's break it down.

1. The Big 12 was always too good

Perhaps the most impressive part of Kansas' record streak, and one that casual fans hardly could grasp, is how good the Big 12 has been during the last decade and a half. The conference is leading the NCAA's new metric, the NET, this year by a landslide. And it was the country's best conference in every season since a once-mighty Big East disbanded into the American Athletic and a revamped Big East back in 2013.

This season was as much a strong conference showing its colors as much as it was circumstance and vulnerabilities sinking Kansas' title chances. Texas Tech and Kansas State, the two teams fighting for this year's Big 12 title, are well-coached teams coming off Elite Eight finishes last year. Road losses to both those teams hurt, especially the Red Raiders' 29-point beatdown last week. But Kansas' demise likely happened before the pressure heated up in March back in February when it lost at West Virginia by one point. Playing in Morgantown is never easy, but WVU was the worst team in the conference this year. That was the beginning of the end.

2. Huge losses of key players

Kansas' national title hopes started to unravel when UdokaAzubuike, an All-America-caliber 7-footer who bypassed the NBA draft, suffered a seasonending injury. It didn't make matters better in KU's frontcourt when 6-9 forward Silvio De Sousa was ruled ineligible for the season. After playing last season with four guards and just one big guy, Self finally was supposed to have a frontcourt to be reckoned with since Memphis transfer Dedric Lawson, a Big 12 player of the year candidate, was eligible. The whole team DNA was revamped with that loss and instead of Lawson and Azubuike forming a 1-2 punch, Lawson has been harnessed with doing too much this season.

In early February Self announced that Lagerald Vick, the team's second-leading scorer and key veteran, was taking a leave of absence. The senior's streaky shooting wasn't so much a difference-maker as his veteran presence was supposed to be for a team largely made up of freshmen and eligible transfers. Without him, Self was again forced to reestablish an identity for a team when most other teams had already found theirs.

3. Backcourt youth and inconsistency

Freshman Quentin Grimes was ranked as high on some recruiting boards as Duke's Zion Williamson and R.J. Barrett. But Grimes has not lived up to the hype that made him the Big 12's preseason freshman of the year and a projected NBA lottery pick back in November. He's still playing a crucial 27 minutes a game and is starting to come along on both ends. But his 7.8 points a game certainly doesn't fill the void left by Big 12 player of the year Devonte Graham, who helped carry KU to the Final Four last year as a senior.

Charlie Moore, a transfer from Cal, also didn't really make an impact as expected. After averaging 12.2 points a game in 2016-17, he's playing just 13.7 minutes and averaging 3.2 points a game.

Freshman Devon Dotson won the point guard spot, and he's been a pleasant surprise — averaging 11.6 points and 3.6 assists a game. But in the last two games, with Vick out and his role in the backcourt more vital, he's shot 4-for-17 from the floor.

A Kansas program that usually has stellar threepoint shooting ranks 200th nationally in made triples. And defensively, this team is nowhere near where Self's teams get by March, ranking 150th in the nation in scoring defense. There are several factors that accumulate those stats, but it starts in the backcourt.

#### Dynamic duo: McCormack, Lawson lift Kansas past Baylor in regular-season finale

On a day when recent Oscar winner Kevin Willmott was honored on the court during a timeout at Allen Fieldhouse, Kansas coach Bill Self turned to a legendary Hollywood actress to describe the current state of his team following a 78-70 victory over Baylor in the regular-season finale for both teams.

"I mean, it's '50 First Dates.' Drew Barrymore could star with our team," Self said following Saturday's victory. "It's something new every day."

The Jayhawks latest victory, which capped off a 17-0 season inside Allen Fieldhouse, certainly backed up Self's claim, with freshman David McCormack leading the Jayhawks' offense for the first 20 minutes.

Fresh off of a career-high 18 points in a Tuesday loss at Oklahoma, McCormack scored 12 more on Saturday, with 10 of them coming in the first half.

The bruising 6-foot-9 forward from Norfolk, Va., scored the first two of the game for Kansas on a monster dunk over two Baylor players after a nifty extra pass from Ochai Agbaji (6 points, 8 rebounds and 4 assists) underneath.

That merely set the tone for McCormack's assertiveness and the one-time reserve who has started the past eight games for the 13th-ranked Jayhawks (23-8 overall, 12-6 Big 12) scored three times from the post and grabbed five tough rebounds on a day that Self said would have to be "the most aggressive we're going to play the whole year."

"He played terrific," Self said of McCormack. "I should've played him more. He was our best offensive player the first half and made some good strong moves. ... I thought he was really good."

While McCormack's size and frame position him well to attack just about any player an opposing team can throw at him, it's learning how to play alongside KU's leading scorer, Dedric Lawson, that has helped the KU freshman reach a new gear.

During the past month, and even more so during the past couple of games, the chemistry between KU's two starting big men has become automatic.

Lawson, who tallied 23 points and 14 rebounds Saturday and closed the regular season averaging a double-double of 19.1 points and 10.6 rebounds per game, draws a crowd every time he moves into the paint, and McCormack is starting to find space around him to make opposing defenses pay.

"In practice, we mix up the teams and stuff so me and Dave have been playing a lot with each other so we're just getting that chemistry of playing together in practice," Lawson said after Saturday's win. "Finding Dave around the rim, he's a big body and he's got a great touch. Most of the time you throw it to him, he'll finish, so I try to get him in areas where he can be the most productive."

Asked what has been the biggest reason for McCormack's recent surge, Lawson needed little time to formulate an answer.

"He's just playing with confidence," Lawson said. "He's being patient. They're not really doubling him and he's just taking his time and making his move."

Added Self of his two big men playing together: "David definitely benefits from Dedric's presence, without question."

After averaging just 6.4 minutes per game during KU's first 10 Big 12 games this season, McCormack's usage has skyrocketed to 16 minutes a game during the final eight.

The KU freshman said being more comfortable on the floor and having the game slow down both have benefited him during his run in the starting lineup. But whether he's starting or not, McCormack's mentality has and always will be to take advantage of every opportunity he gets.

"The more you play, the more fun you have," he said. "The more fun you have, the more positive you are, the more confident you are. I (feel) like I've always kind of proved myself and know the type of player I am, but, over the past few games, I feel like I have asserted myself as a post player and a post presence."

Asked what message he has received from Self during recent days, McCormack said the agenda has not changed.

"Just to keep working, keep having a great mindset, keep working hard. Just doing your job and do what you can to help the team," he said. "(Self) always wants more."

That same message could have applied to the entire Kansas team on Saturday.

After building a 32-29 halftime lead, the Jayhawks ripped off a 6-0 run to open the second half. McCormack's tip-in at the 19:37 mark got it going. Seconds later, a monster block reminiscent of one that might come from someone named Azubuike, Withey, Aldrich or Embiid, further put the Bears (19-12, 10-8) in a hole and inspired Kansas to take complete control.

Less than two minutes later, on a putback by Lawson, the Jayhawks' lead grew to 11 and Kansas spent most of the second half protecting that type of margin.

Baylor made its runs, closing to as few as 5 or 6 points on a couple of occasions, including a 72-66 deficit with 2:35 to play, but Kansas always had an answer. Most of the time it was Lawson, who hit 11 of 12 free throws in 36 minutes. But Quentin Grimes (9 points, 5 assists in 22 minutes) and Marcus Garrett (7 points, 3 assists, 2 steals in 27 minutes) both hit key 3-pointers in front of the Kansas bench to help the Jayhawks maintain control.

For a team that spent the entire season trying to avoid giving away its leads, none of what transpired in the final 20 minutes came as much of a surprise, including the final result.

"It's hard to come back on Kansas here," Baylor coach Scott Drew said after the loss. "We've done it a couple times, but it's really hard to do. (They're) too wellcoached."

That coaching will have to travel the rest

of the season, with the Jayhawks playing nothing but neutral-court games the rest of the way.

Asked how he felt about his team heading into postseason play, Self said he was neither "in love with" how the Jayhawks were playing nor "ultra-concerned with how we're playing."

And then that whole "50 First Dates" analogy came back into play.

"I don't really know what to expect," Self said. "But I'm excited to see whatever happens. I still think there's a level we can get to that we haven't got to yet, so, you know, hopefully we'll peak at the right time."

#### Late run in first half lifts Kansas past West Virginia in Big 12 semifinals

The shot was big, the foul was foolish but the pass was pristine.

Late in what was, in just about every way, a sluggish offensive half for the third-seeded Kansas Jayhawks in Friday's Big 12 semifinal against West Virginia at Sprint Center, freshman point guard Devon Dotson darted his way up the floor after a West Virginia miss and needed about three steps to know where he was headed.

Forget that Dotson and his lightning-quick first step had proven to be nearly impossible to guard during Friday's first half. There was no time for monopolizing the ball on this play.

Instead, Dotson rifled a perfect pass to Quentin Grimes on the far wing in front of the WVU bench, where Grimes cooly rose up, drilled a 3-pointer and absorbed the foul. The ensuing free throw gave Grimes a rare 4-point play and Kansas its first lead since the 13-minute mark.

It also sparked a 14-4 KU run to close the half and completely changed the tone of a game the 17thranked Jayhawks went on to win 88-74 to advance to Saturday's Big 12 title game (5 p.m. on ESPN) against No. 5 seed Iowa State.

"I saw him streaking down the court," began Dotson, recalling the play after Friday's victory. "And I knew he was hot because he hit a shot before that and I just wanted to feed him the ball and get him going a little bit because we're going to need him if we're going to make a big run."

Added Grimes: "I saw the defender closing out and I was like, 'He's running pretty fast; he's got to stop, so I'm going to shoot this one and I'm either going to get three free throws or a 4-point play.' And the 4-point play went my way."

Grimes, who drilled all five 3-pointers he attempted in the first half, hit two more in the final 2:29 of the half, including a 25-footer that beat the halftime buzzer and put Kansas up 48-40 at the break. "I looked up at the shot clock and it was like 6, 5 seconds left and I was like, 'I'm shooting it no matter how far it is,'" Grimes recalled. "So I shot it farther from NBA range and it went in."

Said KU coach Bill Self of Grimes' monster half: "If it weren't for him, over a 4- or 5-minute stretch, West Virginia controlled the first half and we ended up going up 8 just primarily because of Quentin."

In every way, from the sweet stroke to his extreme confidence and giddy celebrations, Grimes' performance on Friday night was reminiscent of his KU debut against Michigan State at the Champions Classic last November in Indianapolis.

"Nobody brought that up," Grimes said when asked about the Michigan State game after Friday's win. "You're the first one, actually."

But that question wasn't the first time someone in a Kansas uniform thought back to KU's season opener.

"Yeah, definitely," Dotson said with a huge smile. "The way he was shooting, it was kind of giving me flashbacks (to the Michigan State game)."

There, Grimes hit six of his first seven 3-pointers and broke onto the college basketball scene in a monster way, dropping in a 21-point night that still stands as his career-high.

In this one, Grimes tallied 16 first-half points — 18 for the game — and was crucial part of what proved to be a balanced offensive attack that pushed the Jayhawks into yet another Big 12 championship game.

"He shot the ball ridiculously well the first half," KU coach Bill Self said of his 5-star freshman. "There was absolutely no hesitation. He was so confident."

As much as Grimes no doubt felt a little relief and elation to play free and see his shot fall with ease again, Grimes' memorable game was not limited to what he did when the ball was in his hands.

For the second consecutive game Grimes was good on the glass (8 rebounds) and he also chipped in with four assists and four steals in 30 minutes. And that kind of all-around effort was consistent throughout the KU lineup once that Dotson-to-Grimes 4-point play broke down the bad basketball barrier.

Dedric Lawson hit 9-of-13 shots from the floor and finished with 24 points and 8 rebounds. Marcus Garrett, who looked as close as he's been to 100 percent on that injured ankle, tallied 11 points in 30 minutes — nearly all of them right at the rim — and Dotson added 13 points, 5 rebounds and 6 assists.

It wasn't all swishes and smiles for the Grimes-led Jayhawks on Friday. In addition to a scary moment with 6 minutes to play when Grimes went down with some sort of left leg injury and did not return, the Jayhawks were forced to overcome a slow start in a sterile building.

After the game, Self, Grimes and the rest of the Jayhawks said the injury was nothing serious.

"He just got a cramp," Self said. "So he's fine. I mean, I guess he needs to drink a lot of water and he should be fine."

It took Kansas five minutes to claim its first lead of the game, but a 10-3 run that featured five points from Lawson and five more from Dotson turned a 10-5 West Virginia lead into a 15-13 Kansas advantage at the 15:22 mark of the first half.

Twice during the run, Dotson showed his ability to blow by the Mountaineer guards in KU's half-court sets. As it turned, that was the easy part. Once Dotson got to the rim, he found arms and bodies and heads and shoulders hovering between him and the basket. No worries.

Like he's done all season, the freshman point guard merely contorted his body or hung a half-second longer to finish the play.

After nearly two and a half minutes without another point from there, Dotson returned to his attacking ways and picked up his sixth and seventh points of the game at the free throw line after another hard drive to the rim.

Those free throws, two more from David McCormack and a rebound and putback by Lawson were the only the Kansas points in a span of more than 7 minutes. During that stretch, while the KU offense struggled to both make and find good shots — KU opened 6-of-19 from the floor — the Mountaineers maintained their hot shooting — 10-of-16 overall (62.5 percent) in the game's first 12 minutes, including 4-of-7 from 3-point range — and used a 12-4 run to build a 27-21 lead at the 8-minute timeout of the first half.

One area WVU struggled early was the free throw line, where the Mountaineers hit just 3 of their first 7 attempts, compared to 7-of-7 for the Jayhawks.

From there, the Mountaineers' mistakes started to cost them. Seven first-half turnovers led to seven Kansas points, including a transition 3-pointer from

Grimes that pulled the Jayhawks within two (32-30) with 4:11 to play in the half.

A quick start to the second half, which featured a Grimes steal and coast-to-coast layup, put Kansas up double digits and the Jayhawks (25-8) played most of the rest of the way effortlessly protecting a lead between 14 and 20 points.

Kansas now leads the all-time series with West Virginia, 12-5, including a 2-1 edge in the 2018-19 season series.

The Jayhawks have won six of the last seven meetings with the Mountaineers (14-20), with the only loss coming in Morgantown, W.Va., earlier this season, in a game that many Kansas and Big 12 fans pointed to as one of the big reasons the Jayhawks' streak of 14 consecutive Big 12 titles came to an end this season.

Friday's clash marked the third time in the past four seasons that the two programs have met in the Big 12's postseason tournament. Kansas won both of the previous meetings, as well, topping WVU in the 2016 and 2018 Big 12 title games.

So now it's on to another Big 12 title game for the Jayhawks, who will be playing in their 14th such game — by far the most of any Big 12 program — and looking to win a third consecutive rubber match.

KU and Iowa State (22-11) split the season series back in January, with each team winning on its home court.
