TIP-OFF

- Kansas will conclude exhibition play for the 2018-19 season when it hosts Washburn on Nov. 1 at 7 p.m., in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Washburn is coached by former KU guard and staff member Brett Ballard, who is in his second season with the Ichabods. Ballard played at KU in 2000-01 and 2001-02. The 2001-02 team is the only team in Big 12 history to go undefeated in conference play at 16-0.
- Ballard was on Bill Self's staff at KU for seven years (2003-10) and was Director of Basketball Operations those final two seasons.
- Kansas is 86-10 all-time in exhibition games, including 55-2 in games under head coach Bill Self. Following their 93-55 win against Emporia State (10/25), the Jayhawks have won 28-straight exhibition contests and 49-straight inside Allen Fieldhouse.
- The Jayhawks are 37-3 all-time against Washburn, including a 7-0 record in exhibition games.
- Kansas returns two starters and six letterwinners from the squad that claimed the Jayhawks' 14th-consecutive Big 12 regular-season title, the Big 12 Championship title and advanced to school's 15th Final Four.
- Junior center Udoka Azubuike is KU's leading returning scorer (13.0 ppg) and rebounder (7.0) from last season. Lagerald Vick is the lone senior on the KU roster and averaged 12.1 ppg last season.
- Junior forward Dedric Lawson is the Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year and is on the preseason All-Big 12 First Team. Azubuike was an honorable mention preseason all-conference member, while Quentin Grimes was the Preseason Big 12 Freshman of the Year and honorable mention all-league.
- For the third time in school history, Kansas enters the season No. 1 by Associated Press and No. 1 in the USA TODAY Coaches' polls. KU was also preseason No. 1 in both polls in 2004-05 and 2009-10. KU was also No. 1 in the coaches' preseason poll in 1996-97.

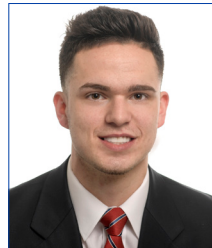

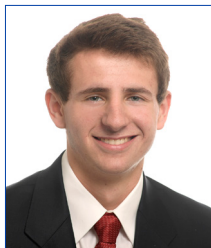

ABOUT KANSAS

Kansas returns two starters and six letterwinners from last season's 31-8 team, which won the Big 12 race with a 13-5 conference record. Besides the league regular-season title, Kansas also won the Miami Hoophall Invitational, the Big 12 Championship and advanced to the school's 15th Final Four.

Senior Lagerald Vick and junior Udoka Azubuike return as the starters. Vick is the lone senior on the team and he averaged 12.1 points, 4.8 rebounds and 2.1 assists last season in earning All-Big 12 Honorable Mention honors. Azubuike, an All-Big 12 Second Team selection in 2017-18, is KU's leading returning scorer at 13.0 ppg and rebounder at 7.0 rpg. He led the nation and set the KU and Big 12 single-season record for field goal percentage at 77.0 percent in 2017-18.

Sophomore guard Marcus Garrett (4.1 ppg, 3.4 ppg) started seven games last season. Other KU regular returners include junior forward Mitch Lightfoot (3.8 ppg, 3.1 rpg, 1.4 blocked shots per game) and sophomore forward Silvio De Sousa (4.0 ppg, 3.7 rpg).

Three transfers from last season will have an immediate impact in 2018-19. Redshirt junior forward Detric Lawson is the Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year and on the Preseason All-Big 12 First Team. He averaged nearly a double-double in his two seasons at Memphis before coming to Kansas. His brother, K.J. Lawson, is a redshirt sophomore who also came from Memphis. He averaged 12.3 points and 8.3 rebounds at Memphis in 2016-17. Redshirt sophomore guard Charlie Moore started every game in 2016-17 while at California and averaged 12.2 points and 3.5 assists.

Three of Kansas' 2018-19 freshmen were McDonald's All-Americans last year. The Woodlands, Texas, guard Quentin Grimes heads the list as he is the Preseason Big 12 Freshman of the Year. The other two are guard Devon Dotson from Charlotte, North Carolina, and forward David McCormack from Norfolk, Virginia. Freshman guard Ochai Agbaji is a Kansas City product who has also shined in the preseason.

ABOUT WASHBURN

Located in Topeka, Kansas, with an enrollment of 7,002, Washburn opens the season at Kansas, and is competing in its first exhibition of the season. The Ichabods are coached by former KU guard Brett Ballard, who is 22-10 after his opening season at Washburn in 2017-18 and 55-40 in his fourth season overall.

Tabbed third in both the MIAA preseason coaches' and media polls, out of 14 teams, Washburn returns two starters and nine letterwinners from last season's 22-10 team which lost in the finals of the MIAA Tournament and in the opening round of the NCAA Division II Regional Tournament. Seniors Javion Blake David Salach are the Washburn returning starters. Blake is a guard who averaged 14.3 point, 3.3 rebounds and 2.4 assists last season. Salach is a forward who averaged 6.0 points and 3.9 rebounds per contest in 2017-18. Senior guard Tyas Martin (10.7 ppg, 2.9 rpg) and sophomore guard Tyler Geiman (4.5 ppg) are other regulars from last season. Sophomore forward Will McKee (3.0 ppg, 2.6 rpg) is slotted to start for Washburn along with the aforementioned.

THE SERIES

Kansas leads the overall series with Washburn, 37-3, which includes a 7-0 record in exhibition play. The series dates back to 1906 and Kansas won the first six meetings. Washburn's three wins game in 1913, 1928 and 1944 with all three victories in Topeka. Since 1944, Kansas has won 11 straight against Washburn, which includes seven exhibition battles.

In the last meeting, Kansas defeated Washburn, 92-74 on Nov. 1, 2016, in Allen Fieldhouse. Eventual 2016-17 national player of the year Frank Mason III led KU with 21 points, while Sviatoslav Mykhailiuk added 16 and Josh Jackson had 14 points in the win. Current KU senior Lagerald Vick, then a sophomore, had nine points, while Udoka Azubuike, then a freshman, scored five points to go along with two blocked shots. Mitch Lightfoot, also a freshman in 2016-17, pulled down seven rebounds to pair with his three points.

The 2001-02 team is the only team in Big 12 history to go undefeated in conference play at 16-0. Washburn assistant coach Joe Balestrieri was a basketball manager at Kansas from 2007-10. He was named head manager his senior year.

EXHIBITION HISTORY

Kansas is 87-10 in exhibition history and has won 28-straight exhibition contests dating back to Oct. 30, 2012. Last season, KU posted a 4-0 exhibition record while touring Italy in August and defeated Missouri, 93-87, in the Showdown for Relief at Sprint Center on Oct. 22; Pittsburg State, 100-54, on Halloween; and Fort Hays State, 86-57, on Nov. 7.

Kansas is 60-5 in exhibition contests played in Allen Fieldhouse. KU has won the last 49 exhibition games in Allen Fieldhouse beginning in 1994. With the 100-54 win versus Pitt State (10/31/17), Kansas has scored 100-plus points in 29 exhibition games, including 13 under head coach Bill Self. The Jayhawks are 55-2 in exhibition play in Self's 15-plus seasons at KU.

EMPORIA STATE LEFTOVERS AND NOTABLES

- Redshirt junior Dedric Lawson scored the first 10 points of the game for the Jayhawks.
- In 11 minutes of first half play, Dedric Lawson recorded a double-double with 14 points and 12 rebounds.
- The last time a Jayhawk recorded a double-double in an exhibition game was in 2017 when Udoka Azubuike and Lagerald Vick both did so against Pittsburg State (10/31/17).
- Kansas held Emporia State to 22 points at halftime which is the smallest margin since Nov. 3, 2014 against Washburn with 13 in an exhibition game.
- Dedric Lawson's 31 points is the most by a Jayhawk in an exhibition game as far back as the 2008-09 season using KU Athletics' online database.
- KU's balanced scoring attack was evident by the 35 points off the bench with 58 coming from the starters.
- Senior guard Lagerald Vick tied his career high in assists in exhibition games with five. He last accomplished this on August 6, 2017, against the Italy All-Stars.
- The Jayhawks outrebounded the Hornets by a margin of 28 with 20 offensive and 39 defensive (59-31).
- The Jayhawks 59 rebounds were the most by a KU team in an exhibition game as far back as the 2008-09 season.

KANSAS NO. 1 IN PRESEASON NATIONAL POLLS

For the third time in poll history Kansas men's basketball enters the season No. 1 by Associated Press (AP), as the AP released its poll Oct. 22. Three days later, Oct. 25, Kansas was once again picked No. 1 in the USA Today Coaches' Poll. KU has now been No. 1 in both preseason polls three times in 2004-05, 2009-10 and now 2018-19.

In the AP poll, Kansas received 37 of a possible 65 first-place votes from the AP panel. Kentucky is ranked second and had 19 first-place votes, while Gonzaga, Duke and Virginia round out the top five of the AP preseason poll.

Kansas will potentially play 10 regular-season games against teams ranked in the AP preseason poll, including four in the top 10: No. 2 Kentucky, No. 6 Tennessee (potential NIT), No. 9 Villanova, No. 10 Michigan State, No. 12 Kansas State (twice), No. 13 West Virginia (twice) and No. 20 TCU (twice).

In the coaches' poll, the 2018-19 Jayhawks join the 1996-97, 2004-05 and 2009-10 KU squads in being preseason No. 1. This is the fourth-straight year the Jayhawks have opened the season in the top-five of the coaches' poll and KU is ranked in the preseason for the 27th time in time in the 30-year history of the poll.

The No 1 ranking marks the ninth time KU has been preseason No. 3 or higher in the coaches' poll. Additionally, it is the 13th time in the Bill Self era the Jayhawks have been preseason seventh or higher, including each of the last seven seasons. In 2017-18 Kansas opened the year No. 3 in the preseason coaches' poll and ended No. 3.

Kansas could potentially play 10 games against teams ranked in the coaches' preseason poll this season. Those include: No. 2 Kentucky, No. 6 Tennessee, No. 8 Villanova, No. 10 Michigan State, No. 11 Kansas State, No. 13 West Virginia and No. 21. TCU.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12

Kansas' Dedric Lawson, Quentin Grimes and Udoka Azubuike each garnered recognition on the 2018-19 Preseason All-Big 12 Team as voted on by the league's men's basketball coaches, the conference office announced Oct. 17.

Lawson was named the 2018-19 Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, while Grimes was dubbed the league's Preseason Freshman of the Year. Lawson was also a preseason all-conference first-team selection, while Azubuike and Grimes secured preseason honorable-mention honors. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own student-athletes in the selection process.

Joining Lawson on the five-member 2018-19 Preseason All-Big 12 Team are: Lindell Wigginton (Iowa State), Barry Brown Jr. (Kansas State), Dean Wade (Kansas State) and Sagaba Konate (West Virginia). In addition to Azubuike and Grimes, student-athletes receiving votes, and thus honorable mention, included: Cameron Lard (Iowa State), Alex Robinson (TCU), Kerwin Roach II (Texas), Jericho Sims (Texas) and Jarrett Culver (Texas Tech).

PRESEASON BIG 12 POLL

For the eighth-straight season and 18th time in the 23-year history of the league, Kansas topped the men's basketball Big 12 Preseason Poll, announced by the league office Oct. 19. The Jayhawks received all of the possible nine first-place votes in 2018-19 for the fourth-consecutive season.

KU has captured 18 outright or shared Big 12 regular-season championships in the previous 22 campaigns. The program's 14 consecutive, from 2005-present, and 61 overall conference titles are both NCAA records.

Kansas State was picked second in the preseason poll followed by West Virginia in third. TCU and Texas tied for fourth to round out the top five. Other placings were 6. Iowa State, 7. Texas Tech, 8. Oklahoma, 9. Baylor and 10. Oklahoma State.

Historically, in the previous 17 occurrences Kansas has been named the preseason favorite, the Jayhawks won the Big 12 regular-season on 15 occasions. This includes the first preseason poll in 1996-97 in which only a media poll was conducted.

PRESEASON STARTING FIVE

Kansas was well represented on the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame's Starting 5 awards released Oct. 15-19. Of the five awards announced, which consisted of 20 candidates per category, Kansas had one student-athlete on four of the five honors lists. Freshman guard Devon Dotson is up for the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Award, freshman guard Quentin Grimes for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award, redshirt junior forward Detric Lawson for the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award and junior center Udoka Azubuike for the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center of the Year Award.

Historically, Kansas has had numerous student-athletes named as candidates and finalists, including last year with Devonte' Graham being a Cousy finalist. In 2017, Frank Mason III was the recipient of the Cousy Award.

LAWSON NAMED PRESEASON AP ALL-AMERICA

Kansas redshirt junior Detric Lawson was named to the Associated Press (AP) 2018-19 preseason All-America team, as voted on by a national media panel, the AP announced Oct. 23.

Joining Lawson on the AP preseason All-America team are: Carsen Edwards (Purdue), Luke Maye (North Carolina), R.J. Barrett (Duke), Ethan Happ (Wisconsin) and Caleb Martin (Nevada). There were also 15 other student-athletes who received votes.

Named Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year and Preseason All-Big 12 First Team earlier this month, Lawson sat out last season after transferring from Memphis. The Memphis, Tennessee, forward averaged 19.2 points and 9.9 rebounds, amassing 19 double-doubles his sophomore year for the Tigers in 2016-17, earning All-American Athletic Conference First Team honors. As a freshman, Lawson averaged 15.8 points and 9.3 rebounds with 17 double-doubles for Memphis.

KANSAS FROM DOWNTOWN

In 2017-18, Kansas led the Big 12 with 10.0 3-point field goals made per game and a 3-point field goal percentage at 40.1. Kansas made 10 or more 3-pointers in eight conference games and 19 total in 2017-18. For the season, the Jayhawks were 17-2 in games where they made 10 or more threes.

The 2017-18 team was the third KU squad to make 300 3-pointers in a season and last season's Jayhawks crushed the single-season school record for 3-pointers made, 391, and attempted, 974, surpassing 2016-17's record-setting marks of 318 made and 787 attempted. Three of the last eight Jayhawk squads have averaged more than seven threes per game, with both of the last two KU teams hitting an average of eight or more threes per contest.

KANSAS VS TOP-25 TEAMS

Heading into 2018-19 with one of the nation's toughest schedules, Kansas will look to continue an impressive mark against top-25 teams over the last 15 years. Under Bill Self, Kansas is 90-45 against AP-ranked opponents. In his 15 first seasons at KU, Self's Jayhawks have collected four wins or more over top-25 ranked foes in 12 of those seasons, which includes a 35-16 record from 2014-present.

Kansas' record against top-10 ranked opponents is even more impressive. KU is 16-4 against foes ranked inside the top-10 of the AP poll since 2013-14, including 4-1 in 2017-18. This season, KU's top-10 wins included Kentucky, West Virginia, Texas Tech and Duke. Since Bill Self's first season, the Jayhawks are 13-3 against AP top-10 teams inside Allen Fieldhouse, which includes KU's current streak of nine-straight home victories against top-10 foes.

NOV. 1, 2007: Four different Jayhawks scored in double figures, including sophomore guard Sherron Collins, who scored a game-high 18 points to go along with five assists and four steals, as No. 4 Kansas kicked off the 2007-08 season with a 94-59 exhibition victory over Pittsburg (Kan.) State at Allen Fieldhouse. Junior guard Mario Chalmers added 14 points and five assists, while sophomore forward Darrell Arthur added 12 tallies and senior guard Rodrick Stewart chipped in 11. Kansas would win its first 20 games of the season en route to a school-record 37 victories, its fourth-consecutive Big 12 regular-season title, its third-consecutive Big 12 Tournament Championship and the 2008 NCAA National Championship.

CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Kansas enters 2018-19 having won 18 of the 22 Big 12 regular-season titles (includes ties), including the last 14, which is an NCAA record. Kansas' 61 conference titles are the most in NCAA Division I. Kentucky is second with 54 and Penn third at 37 (pre-2017-18). KU's 14-straight league titles, all under head coach Bill Self, is the longest active streak in NCAA Division I and the longest streak in school history.

Udoka Azubuike ended 2017-18 with the top field goal percentage in NCAA Division I at 77.0 percent and he was the only player shooting 70 percent or better with a minimum of five shots made per game. Azubuike broke the Big 12 single-season record of 69.3 percent, previously set by Ricardo Ratliffe of Missouri in 2011-12.

History has shown that it isn't easy to lead the nation in a statistic. In fact, checking the NCAA Records Book of annual leaders, before this season, only twice has a Jayhawk led the country in a season stat and both were KU All-Americans. KU legend Clyde Lovellette led the NCAA in scoring average in 1951-52 at 28.6 points per game. More recently, Thomas Robinson led the country in double-doubles with 27 during the 2011-12 season. Under Lovellette's leadership KU won the 1952 NCAA National Championship, while Robinson led the Jayhawks to a runner-up finish in 2012.

With a minimum of 175 attempts, Azubuike broke the Kansas single-season field goal percentage record of 64.6 percent by Mark Randall in 1988-89. On the NCAA level, with a minimum of five makes per game, Azubuike's 77.0 percent ranks second all-time behind Devontae Cacok of UNC-Wilmington, who set the NCAA record two seasons ago at (2016-17) at 80.0 percent.

- Lagerald Vick has 775 career points heading into his senior season. Vick scored 266 points his sophomore year and 470 points last year. Should he reach 1,000, he will become the 61st Jayhawk to reach the milestone.
- Vick has 101 career 3-pointers made and is 25 shy from cracking the KU top-20.
- Udoka Azubuike has 78 career blocked shots and his 60 last season were the most since Joel Embiid swatted 72 in 2013-14. Azubuike is 22 shy of becoming the 20th player in school history to record 100 blocked shots.
- Not far behind Azubuike's blocked shots is junior Mitch Lightfoot with 65 career swats in two seasons.
- Azubuike has a career field goal percentage of 75.4 as he is 233-for-309. The KU career field goal percentage record, with a minimum of 500 attempts, is 62.0 by Mark Randall (643-for-1,037 in 1987, 89-91).
- Kansas is 11 wins shy from winning its 1,100th conference game. All-time, the Jayhawks are 1,089-364 in league play and are 302-64 in the Big 12.

- Kansas has 2,248 all-time victories, second most in NCAA Division I history (Kentucky).
- From the 2008-09 season to the present (10 seasons) Kansas has held 345 of its 369 opponents under 50 percent shooting.
- KU has held opponents to fewer than 100 points in 556 of its last 558 games. The last team to score 100 on Kansas in a 40-minute game was Oklahoma (100-78) on Feb. 27, 1990.
- KU has won at least 12 league games for 18-straight years, which is the longest active streak in the nation.
- Kansas won its 1,000th all-time conference game with a 83-50 win against Texas Tech (2/18/12). The Jayhawks won their 300th Big 12 game vs. Oklahoma (2/19/18).
- Each KU senior class since 1986-87 has won at least 100 games, including last year's fourth-year seniors Devonte' Graham and Sviatoslav Mykhailiuk (121 wins).
- Bill Self has won 25 or more games in each of his last 13 seasons as a head coach, including 2017-18.
- Kansas is the only team in the Big 12 to have a .500 winning percentage or better series record against every conference foe.
- Kansas' 2002 team is the only squad in Big 12 history to go undefeated in conference play at 16-0.
- Kansas is first in the conference in wins with a 302-64 record in Big 12 regular-season games. Texas is next at 225-141. Including the league postseason championship, Kansas is tops at 346-76, while Texas is second at 249-160.
- KU is the only Big 12 school to have won a regular-season championship with two different coaches (Roy Williams and Bill Self).
- Under Bill Self, Kansas is 116-8 (93.5 percent) in Big 12 home games: 8-0 in 2004, 7-1 in 2005, 7-1 in 2006, 7-1 in 2007, 8-0 in 2008, 8-0 in 2009, 8-0 in 2010, 7-1 in 2011, 9-0 in 2012, 8-1 in 2013, 9-0 in 2014, 9-0 in 2015, 9-0 in 2016, 8-1 in 2017 and 7-2 in 2018.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas has experienced only one regular-season conference sweep by a Big 12 opponent. In 103 regular-season Big 12 home-and-home series during the Self era, Kansas has 70 sweeps, 32 splits and has been swept once.

- Bill Self was named the eighth coach in Kansas basketball history on April 21, 2003.
- In September 2017, Self was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.
- Self won his 600th career game on Dec. 6, 2016, with KU's 105-62 win against UMKC. He became the 46th coach in NCAA Division I to accomplish the feat and the ninth fastest.
- While at Kansas, Self has won a national championship, a KU- and NCAA-record 14-straight regular-season Big 12 Conference titles and eight league tournament championships.
- At Kansas, Self has won more regular-season league titles (14) than he has home losses (13) in Allen Fieldhouse. With KU's win versus Siena (11/18/16), Self became the winningest coach in Allen Fieldhouse, posting his 207th victory in the venue.
- In his first trip to the Final Four in 2008, Self's team won the title. Self is one of 11 active coaches in NCAA Division I to have won a national title. Kansas' 14-straight conference titles (2005-18) is the longest streak in NCAA Division I history.
- In Self's first 15 seasons at Kansas, he has coached 11 NBA Lottery selections including Andrew Wiggins and Joel Embiid, the No. 1 and No. 3 overall selections in the 2014 NBA Draft. Wiggins was the second-ever Jayhawk to go No. 1 with the other being Danny Manning in 1988.
- Self has guided his teams to 20-straight 23-win seasons dating back to 1998-99 and including 2017-18.
- Self's teams have won 18 league crowns in the last 20 years, including the 2018 title. The other two seasons resulted in runner-up conference finishes.
- Kansas' four-straight 30-win seasons from 2009-10 to 2012-13 are the most consecutive 30-win seasons in NCAA history (note: Memphis did it from 2006-09 yet later vacated the 2008 season).
- Self was the head coach for Team USA's U18 team that competed and won gold at the 2018 FIBA Americas Championship held in St. Catherines, Canada, in the summer of 2018.
- Self is one of five coaches in NCAA Division I history to have led three different teams - Tulsa, Illinois and Kansas - to the NCAA Elite Eight, including seven times with KU (2004-07-08-11-12-16-17). The other coaches are: Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Rick Pitino and Eddie Sutton.
- A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kansas in 1985-86 under head coach Larry Brown. He then returned to his alma mater as an assistant for seven seasons under coaches Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton. His first head coaching job was at Oral Roberts in 1993-94, then Tulsa (1997-98), Illinois (2000-03) and Kansas (2003-present).
