TIP-OFF

- No. 1 Kansas will open its home portion of its 121st season of men's basketball when it plays host to Vermont (1-0) on Monday, Nov. 12, at 8 p.m. (CT) on ESPN2. The contest is a campus round meeting of the NIT.
- Kansas is 17-3 in the NIT and last participated in the event in 2002-03, where the Jayhawks finished fourth. Prior to this year, KU has played in five NITs in 1985-96, 1989-90, 1993-94, 1997-98 and 2002-03. KU has won three NIT titles in 1989, 1993 and 1997.
- KU has won a mind-boggling 45-consecutive regular-season home openers in Allen Fieldhouse, a streak which started in the 1973-74 season.
- Kansas won the only series meeting with Vermont, 68-61, on Nov. 19, 2004, in Allen Fieldhouse. The game opened the 2004-05 season for Kansas. Ironically, Kansas was also ranked No. 1 in the national polls to open the 2004-05 season.
- Kansas opened the season with a 92-87 win against No. 10 Michigan State on Nov. 6 in the State Farm Champions Classic. The win improved KU to 4-4 in the event.
- Kansas is looking to go 2-0 for the second-straight season and ninth time in Bill Self's 16 seasons at KU.
- Kansas won the only series meeting with Vermont, 68-61, on Nov. 19, 2005, in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Entering Monday's contest, KU has sold out of 275-straight games in Allen Fieldhouse, a streak that started the second game of the 2001-02 season.
- Kansas returns two starters and six letterwinners from the squad that claimed the Jayhawks' 14th-consecutive Big 12 regular-season title, the Big 12 Championship title and advanced to school's 15th Final Four.
- Junior forward Detric Lawson was one of six listed on the Associated Press Preseason All-America Team. Lawson is also the Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year and is on the preseason All-Big 12 First Team.

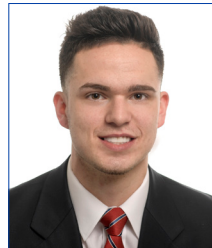

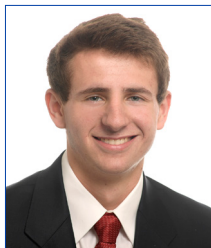

ABOUT KANSAS

Kansas opened the 2018-19 season with a 92-87 win against No. 10 Michigan State on Nov. 6, in the State Farm Champions Classic. Freshman guard Quentin Grimes led all scorers with 21 points, while redshirt junior forward Detric Lawson posted a double-double with 20 points and 14 rebounds. Two other Jayhawks scored in double figures with junior center putting up 17 points with four blocked shots in 20 minutes and freshman guard Devon Dotson chipping in 16 points with three assists. Dotson and senior guard Lagerald Vick each had three assists in the victory.

Vick and Azubuike return as the starters. Vick is the lone senior on the team and he averaged 12.1 points, 4.8 rebounds and 2.1 assists last season in earning All-Big 12 Honorable Mention honors. Azubuike, an All-Big 12 Second Team selection in 2017-18, is KU's leading returning scorer at 13.0 ppg and rebounder at 7.0 rpg. He led the nation and set the KU and Big 12 single-season record for field goal percentage at 77.0 percent in 2017-18.

Sophomore guard Marcus Garrett (4.1 ppg, 3.4 rpg) started seven games last season. Other KU regular returners include junior forward Mitch Lightfoot (3.8 ppg, 3.1 rpg, 1.4 blocked shots per game) and sophomore forward Silvio De Sousa (4.0 ppg, 3.7 rpg).

Three transfers from last season will have an immediate impact in 2018-19. Detric Lawson is the Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year and on the Preseason All-Big 12 First Team. He averaged nearly a double-double in his two seasons at Memphis before coming to Kansas. His brother, K.J. Lawson, is a redshirt sophomore who also came from Memphis. He averaged 12.3 points and 8.3 rebounds at Memphis in 2016-17. Redshirt sophomore guard Charlie Moore started every game in 2016-17 while at California and averaged 12.2 points and 3.5 assists.

Three of Kansas' 2018-19 freshmen were McDonald's All-Americans last year. Grimes heads the list as he is the Preseason Big 12 Freshman of the Year. The other two are Dotson and forward David McCormack.

ABOUT VERMONT

Located in Burlington, Vermont, with an enrollment of 10,080, Vermont opened the 2018-19 season with a 78-72 win at Boston University on Friday, Nov. 9. The Catamounts are coached by John Becker who is 167-77 in his eighth season at Vermont and 173-121 in his 10th season overall. Since Becker has been at Vermont, the Catamounts are the second winningest team in the northeast region, only trailing Connecticut.

For the third straight season, Vermont was the 2018-19 preseason choice to win the America East in a vote of the league coaches. Vermont is coming off a 27-8 season in which it won the America East Conference title with a 15-1 record. The Catamounts return one starter and 10 letterwinners from 2017-18.

In the win at Boston, starting sophomore G Steph Smith led all scorers with 22 points. Preseason All-America East selection Anthony Lamb, a junior forward starter, recorded a double-double with 19 points and 14 rebounds to go along with four blocked shots and three steals in the victory. Also a preseason all-league selection, redshirt senior G Ernie Duncan, who also started, scored 18 points and led Vermont with five assists, while freshman F Isaiah Moll scored 12 points in the victory. Other Vermont starters in its opener included redshirt junior G Everett Duncan (three points) and sophomore F Ra Kpedi (two points, six rebounds). Freshman G Robin Duncan, brother of Ernie and Everett played nine minutes in the contest. Redshirt sophomore G Ben Shungu (two points, two assists) also saw significant playing time at Boston.

THE SERIES

Kansas won the only series meeting with Vermont, 68-61, on Nov. 19, 2004, in Allen Fieldhouse. The game opened the 2004-05 season for Kansas. Ironically, Kansas was also ranked No. 1 in the national polls to open the 2004-05 season.

In the 2004 meeting, Vermont led 58-56 with 3:32 to play before KU's J.R. Giddens nailed a 3-pointer to give the Jayhawks the lead for good. All-American Wayne Simien posted a double-double with a game-high 25 points and a game-high 14 rebounds. Senior Keith Langford and freshman Darnell Jackson added 12 points each while senior Aaron Miles dished out a game-high nine assists to go along with seven rebounds.

FIELDHOUSE OPENERS

Opponents have not fared well when playing the Jayhawks in the first regular-season game played inside Allen Fieldhouse over the past half century. Kansas has won a mind-boggling 45-consecutive regular-season home openers dating back to the 1973-74 season.

The Jayhawks' last loss to open a season at AFH came against Vanderbilt on Dec. 2, 1972, 64-72. Kansas is 62-1 all-time in home openers at Allen Fieldhouse.

LAST TIME OUT

Kansas newcomers Detric Lawson, Quentin Grimes and Devon Dotson impressed in their debuts in the crimson and blue, propelling the No. 1 Jayhawks past No. 10 Michigan State in a 92-87 win at Bankers Life Fieldhouse in the State Farm Champions Classic.

Grimes, a freshman, scored 21 points on 7-of-14 shooting, leading the Jayhawks in scoring. Lawson, a redshirt junior transfer from Memphis, put up a double-double in his KU debut with 20 points and 14 rebounds while leading the team in assists with six. Another freshman guard, Dotson ended the game with 16 points and three assists, shooting 6-of-11.

KU's 14-point halftime was cut down in the second as the Jayhawks only had a three point lead with 34 seconds left in the game. Grimes and Dotson each made one of two free throws to make it a two-possession game with under 20 seconds left to bolster the Jayhawks to a win.

The veteran play of junior big man Udoka Azubuike powered the Jayhawks down low in the paint, scoring 17 points, while leading the Jayhawks on defense with four blocks.

The win marks the first for the Jayhawks against the Spartans in the Champions Classic, dating back to the event's inception in 2011, and also marks the third-straight victory for KU, beating Kentucky 65-61 in 2017 and Duke 77-75 in 2016.

MICHIGAN STATE NOTABLES

- The win made Kansas 1-0 for the 15th time in head coach Bill Self's 16 seasons at KU.
- Kansas improved to 4-4 in the Champions Classic, giving KU its third-straight win in the event.
- The win gave the Jayhawks at least one win over an Associated Press top-10 team for the fourth-straight season and the 15th year in Bill Self's 16 seasons.
- Kansas' record improved to 22-10 as the AP's No. 1-ranked team when playing a ranked opponent and 12-3 since 2010.
- The win improved the Jayhawks' record to 26-6 at neutral sites since 2015-16.
- Detric Lawson's 11 first-half rebounds moved him into a tie with Thomas Robinson (second half vs. Kentucky, 4/2/2012) for fourth-most rebounds in a half by a KU player since 1988-89. Eric Chenoweth leads with 14 (second half vs. Texas A&M, 1/14/1998).
- Detric Lawson is just the fifth Jayhawk (records dating back to 1988-89) to record a double-double in his Kansas debut. Other Jayhawks to record double-doubles in their career debut include Marcus Garrett (10 points, 10 rebounds vs. Tennessee State, 11/10/2017), David Padgett (13 points, 10 rebounds vs. UT Chattanooga, 11/21/2003) and Wayne Simien (10 points, 11 rebounds vs. Wake Forest, 12/4/2001).
- With Quentin Grimes and Devon Dotson both starting, the last time KU started two freshmen was Dec. 17, 2016, when Udoka Azubuike and Josh Jackson started versus Davidson.

KANSAS NO. 1 IN PRESEASON NATIONAL POLLS

For the third time in poll history Kansas men's basketball enters the season No. 1 by Associated Press (AP), as the AP released its poll Oct. 22. Three days later, Oct. 25, Kansas was once again picked No. 1 in the *USA TODAY* Coaches' Poll. KU has now been No. 1 in both preseason polls three times in 2004-05, 2009-10 and now 2018-19.

In the AP poll, Kansas received 37 of a possible 65 first-place votes from the AP panel. Kentucky is ranked second and had 19 first-place votes, while Gonzaga, Duke and Virginia round out the top five of the AP preseason poll.

Kansas will potentially play 10 regular-season games against teams ranked in the AP preseason poll, including four in the top 10: No. 2 Kentucky, No. 6 Tennessee (potential NIT), No. 9 Villanova, No. 10 Michigan State, No. 12 Kansas State (twice), No. 13 West Virginia (twice) and No. 20 TCU (twice).

In the coaches' poll, the 2018-19 Jayhawks join the 1996-97, 2004-05 and 2009-10 KU squads in being preseason No. 1. This is the fourth-straight year the Jayhawks have opened the season in the top-five of the coaches' poll and KU is ranked in the preseason for the 27th time in time in the 30-year history of the poll.

The No. 1 ranking marks the ninth time KU has been preseason No. 3 or higher in the coaches' poll. Additionally, it is the 13th time in the Bill Self era the Jayhawks have been preseason seventh or higher, including each of the last seven seasons. In 2017-18 Kansas opened the year No. 3 in the preseason coaches' poll and ended No. 3.

Kansas could potentially play 10 games against teams ranked in the coaches' preseason poll this season. Those include: No. 2 Kentucky, No. 6 Tennessee, No. 8 Villanova, No. 10 Michigan State, No. 11 Kansas State, No. 13 West Virginia and No. 21. TCU.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12

Kansas' Dedric Lawson, Quentin Grimes and Udoka Azubuike each garnered recognition on the 2018-19 Preseason All-Big 12 Team as voted on by the league's men's basketball coaches, the conference office announced Oct. 17.

Lawson was named the 2018-19 Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, while Grimes was dubbed the league's preseason freshman of the year. Lawson was also a preseason all-conference first-team selection, while Azubuike and Grimes secured preseason honorable mention honors. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own student-athletes in the selection process.

Joining Lawson on the five-member 2018-19 Preseason All-Big 12 Team are: Lindell Wigginton (Iowa State), Barry Brown Jr. (Kansas State), Dean Wade (Kansas State) and Sagaba Konate (West Virginia). In addition to Azubuike and Grimes, student-athletes receiving votes and thus honorable mention included: Cameron Lard (Iowa State), Alex Robinson (TCU), Kerwin Roach II (Texas), Jericho Sims (Texas) and Jarrett Culver (Texas Tech).

PRESEASON BIG 12 POLL

For the eighth-straight season and 18th time in the 23-year history of the league, Kansas topped the men's basketball Big 12 Preseason Poll, announced by the league office Oct. 19. The Jayhawks received all of the possible nine first-place votes in 2018-19 for the fourth-consecutive season.

KU has captured 18 outright or shared Big 12 regular-season championships in the previous 22 campaigns. The program's 14 consecutive, from 2005-present, and 61 overall conference titles are both NCAA records.

Kansas State was picked second in the preseason poll followed by West Virginia in third. TCU and Texas tied for fourth to round out the top five. Other placings were 6. Iowa State, 7. Texas Tech, 8. Oklahoma, 9. Baylor and 10. Oklahoma State.

Historically, in the previous 17 occurrences Kansas has been named the preseason favorite, the Jayhawks won the Big 12 regular-season on 15 occasions. This includes the first preseason poll in 1996-97 in which only a media poll was conducted.

Kansas was well represented on the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame's Starting 5 awards released Oct. 15-19. Of the five awards announced, which consisted of 20 candidates per category, Kansas had one student-athlete on four of the five honors lists. Freshman guard Devon Dotson is up for the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Award, freshman guard Quentin Grimes for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award, redshirt junior forward Dedric Lawson for the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award and junior center Udoka Azubuike for the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center of the Year Award.

Historically, Kansas has had numerous student-athletes named as candidates and finalists, including last year with Devonte' Graham being a Cousy finalist. In 2017, Frank Mason III was the recipient of the Cousy Award.

Kansas is 2-0 all-time in games on Nov. 12

Nov. 12, 2013: The No. 5-ranked Jayhawks claimed their first victory at the State Farm Champions Classic with a 94-83 win over the No. 4 Duke Blue Devils in Chicago's United Center. Sophomore forward Perry Ellis and freshman guard Andrew Wiggins combined for 46 points in the win, while freshman guard Frank Mason III came off the bench to add 15 points of his own. The 2013-14 Jayhawks went on to finish with a 25-10 record and claimed its 10th-straight Big 12 regular-season title with a 14-4 record.

Joining Lawson on the AP preseason All-America team are: Carsen Edwards (Purdue), Luke Maye (North Carolina), R.J. Barrett (Duke), Ethan Happ (Wisconsin) and Caleb Martin (Nevada). There were also 15 other student-athletes who received votes.

Named Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year and Preseason All-Big 12 First Team earlier this month, Lawson sat out last season after transferring from Memphis. The Memphis, Tennessee, forward averaged 19.2 points and 9.9 rebounds, amassing 19 double-doubles his sophomore year for the Tigers in 2016-17, earning All-American Athletic Conference First Team honors. As a freshman, Lawson averaged 15.8 points and 9.3 rebounds with 17 double-doubles for Memphis.

KANSAS VS TOP-25 TEAMS

With its win over No. 10 Michigan State to open the season on Nov. 6, Kansas added to an impressive record against ranked teams during the Bill Self era. Under Self, Kansas is now 91-45 against AP-ranked opponents. In his first 15 seasons at KU, Self's Jayhawks have collected four wins or more over top-25 ranked foes in 12 of those seasons, which includes a 36-16 record from 2014-present.

Kansas' record against top-10 ranked opponents is even more impressive. KU is 17-4 against foes ranked inside the top-10 of the AP poll since 2013-14, including 4-1 in 2017-18. Last season, KU's top-10 wins included Kentucky, West Virginia, Texas Tech and Duke. Since Bill Self's first season, the Jayhawks are 13-3 against AP top-10 teams inside Allen Fieldhouse, which includes KU's current streak of nine-straight home victories against top-10 foes.

KANSAS FROM DOWNTOWN

In 2017-18, Kansas led the Big 12 with 10.0 3-point field goals made per game and a 3-point field goal percentage at 40.1. Kansas made 10 or more 3-pointers in eight conference games and 19 total in 2017-18. For the season, the Jayhawks were 17-2 in games where they made 10 or more threes.

The 2017-18 team was the third KU squad to make 300 3-pointers in a season and last season's Jayhawks crushed the single-season school record for 3-pointers made, 391, and attempted, 974, surpassing 2016-17's record-setting marks of 318 made and 787 attempted. Three of the last eight Jayhawk squads have averaged more than seven threes per game, with both of the last two KU teams hitting an average of eight or more threes per contest.

CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Kansas enters 2018-19 having won 18 of the 22 Big 12 regular-season titles (includes ties), including the last 14, which is an NCAA record. Kansas' 61 conference titles are the most in NCAA Division I. Kentucky is second with 54 and Penn third at 37 (pre-2017-18). KU's 14-straight league titles, all under head coach Bill Self, is the longest active streak in NCAA Division I and the longest streak in school history.

- Kansas has 2,249 all-time victories, second most in NCAA Division I history (Kentucky).
- From the 2008-09 season to the present (10 seasons) Kansas has held 346 of its 370 opponents under 50 percent shooting.
- KU has held opponents to fewer than 100 points in 557 of its last 559 games. The last team to score 100 on Kansas in a 40-minute game was Oklahoma (100-78) on Feb. 27, 1990.
- KU has won at least 12 league games for 18-straight years, which is the longest active streak in the nation.
- Kansas won its 1,000th all-time conference game with a 83-50 win against Texas Tech (2/18/12). The Jayhawks won their 300th Big 12 game vs. Oklahoma (2/19/18).
- Each KU senior class since 1986-87 has won at least 100 games. Current KU senior Lagerald Vick has been a part of 95 wins while at Kansas. Last year's fourth-year seniors Devonte' Graham and Sviatoslav Mykhailiuk amassed 121 wins.
- Entering 2018-19, Bill Self has won 25 or more games in each of his last 13 seasons as a head coach.
- Kansas is the only team in the Big 12 to have a .500 winning percentage or better series record against every conference foe.
- Kansas' 2002 team is the only squad in Big 12 history to go undefeated in conference play at 16-0.
- Kansas is first in the conference in wins with a 302-64 record in Big 12 regular-season games. Texas is next at 225-141. Including the league postseason championship, Kansas is tops at 346-76, while Texas is second at 249-160.
- KU is the only Big 12 school to have won a regular-season championship with two different coaches (Roy Williams and Bill Self).
- Under Bill Self, Kansas is 116-8 (93.5 percent) in Big 12 home games: 8-0 in 2004, 7-1 in 2005, 7-1 in 2006, 7-1 in 2007, 8-0 in 2008, 8-0 in 2009, 8-0 in 2010, 7-1 in 2011, 9-0 in 2012, 8-1 in 2013, 9-0 in 2014, 9-0 in 2015, 9-0 in 2016, 8-1 in 2017 and 7-2 in 2018.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas has experienced only one regular-season conference sweep by a Big 12 opponent. In 103 regular-season Big 12 home-and-home series during the Self era, Kansas has 70 sweeps, 32 splits and has been swept once.

HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

Udoka Azubuike ended 2017-18 with the top field goal percentage in NCAA Division I at 77.0 percent and he was the only player shooting 70 percent or better with a minimum of five shots made per game. Azubuike broke the Big 12 single-season record of 69.3 percent, previously set by Ricardo Ratliffe of Missouri in 2011-12.

History has shown that it isn't easy to lead the nation in a statistic. In fact, checking the NCAA Records Book of annual leaders, before this season, only twice has a Jayhawk led the country in a season stat and both were KU All-Americans. KU legend Clyde Lovellette led the NCAA in scoring average in 1951-52 at 28.6 points per game. More recently, Thomas Robinson led the country in double-doubles with 27 during the 2011-12 season. Under Lovellette's leadership KU won the 1952 NCAA National Championship, while Robinson led the Jayhawks to a runner-up finish in 2012.

With a minimum of 175 attempts, Azubuike broke the Kansas single-season field goal percentage record of 64.6 percent by Mark Randall in 1988-89. On the NCAA level, with a minimum of five makes per game, Azubuike's 77.0 percent ranks second all-time behind Devontae Cacok of UNC-Wilmington, who set the NCAA record two seasons ago at (2016-17) at 80.0 percent.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2018-19

- Lagerald Vick has 775 career points heading into his senior season. Vick scored 266 points his sophomore year and 470 points last year. Should he reach 1,000, he will become the 61st Jayhawk to reach the milestone.
- Vick has 101 career 3-pointers made and is 25 shy from cracking the KU top-20.
- Udoka Azubuike has 82 career blocked shots and his 60 last season were the most since Joel Embiid swatted 72 in 2013-14. Azubuike is 18 shy of becoming the 20th player in school history to record 100 blocked shots.
- Not far behind Azubuike's blocked shots is junior Mitch Lightfoot with 66 career swats in two seasons.
- Azubuike has a career field goal percentage of 75.2 as he is 240-for-319. The KU career field goal percentage record, with a minimum of 500 attempts, is 62.0 by Mark Randall (643-for-1,037 in 1987, 89-91).
- Kansas is 11 wins shy from winning its 1,100th conference game. All-time, the Jayhawks are 1,089-364 in league play and are 302-64 in the Big 12.

NOTES

- Bill Self was named the eighth coach in Kansas basketball history on April 21, 2003.
- In September 2017, Self was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.
- Self won his 600th career game on Dec. 6, 2016, with KU's 105-62 win against UMKC. He became the 46th coach in NCAA Division I to accomplish the feat and the ninth fastest.
- While at Kansas, Self has won a national championship, a KU- and NCAA-record 14-straight regular-season Big 12 Conference titles and eight league tournament championships.
- At Kansas, Self has won more regular-season league titles (14) than he has home losses (13) in Allen Fieldhouse. With KU's win versus Siena (11/18/16), Self became the winningest coach in Allen Fieldhouse, posting his 207th victory in the venue.
- In his first trip to the Final Four in 2008, Self's team won the title. Self is one of 11 active coaches in NCAA Division I to have won a national title. Kansas' 14-straight conference titles (2005-18) is the longest streak in NCAA Division I history.
- In Self's first 15 seasons at Kansas, he has coached 11 NBA Lottery selections including Andrew Wiggins and Joel Embiid, the No. 1 and No. 3 overall selections in the 2014 NBA Draft. Wiggins was the second-ever Jayhawk to go No. 1 with the other being Danny Manning in 1988.
- Self has guided his teams to 20-straight 23-win seasons dating back to 1998-99.
- Self's teams have won 18 league crowns in the last 20 years, including the 2018 title. The other two seasons resulted in runner-up conference finishes.
- Kansas' four-straight 30-win seasons from 2009-10 to 2012-13 are the most consecutive 30-win seasons in NCAA history (note: Memphis did it from 2006-09 yet later vacated the 2008 season).
- Self was the head coach for Team USA's U18 team that competed and won gold at the 2018 FIBA Americas Championship held in St. Catherines, Canada, in the summer of 2018.
- Self is one of five coaches in NCAA Division I history to have led three different teams - Tulsa, Illinois and Kansas - to the NCAA Elite Eight, including seven times with KU (2004-07-08-11-12-16-17). The other coaches are: Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Rick Pitino and Eddie Sutton.
- A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kansas in 1985-86 under head coach Larry Brown. He then returned to his alma mater as an assistant for seven seasons under coaches Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton. His first head coaching job was at Oral Roberts in 1993-94, then Tulsa (1997-98), Illinois (2000-03) and Kansas (2003-present).
