TIP-OFF

- No. 2 Kansas (2-0) continues its two-game homestand hosting Louisiana (1-1) on Friday, Nov. 16, at 7 p.m. (Central) on Jayhawk TV/ESPN+.
- The Jayhawks are coming off an 84-68 win versus Vermont in its home opener on Nov. 12 in a campus round game of the NIT Season Tip Off.
- Kansas is looking to go 3-0 for the second-straight season and eighth time in Bill Self's 16 seasons at KU.
- Kansas and Louisiana are 1-1 in all-time meetings. UL defeated KU in New Orleans, 54-45 in 1983 and Kansas won the most recent, a 96-51 win in 2004 at Allen Fieldhouse.
- Louisiana is one of five opponents on the 2018-19 KU schedule that does not have a losing record against the Jayhawks. The others are Michigan State (7-7, after Nov. 6), Villanova (4-3), Arizona State (5-5) and Kentucky (22-9).
- Senior G Lagerald Vick's 32 points against Vermont (11/12) marked the 29th time in Bill Self's 15-plus seasons at KU a Jayhawk has scored 30 or more points. The feat happened four times last season, two by Devonte' Graham and two by Malik Newman.
- Junior F Dedric Lawson was named the Big 12 Player of the Week on Nov. 12, while freshman G Quentin Grimes was the Big 12 Newcomer of the Week. KU leads the Big 12 with 120 combined weekly honors in the 22-year history of the conference.
- With its win versus Vermont (11/12), KU has won a mind-boggling 46-consecutive regular-season home openers in Allen Fieldhouse, a streak which started in the 1973-74 season.
- The victory over the Catamounts also marked the 40th-straight KU win inside Allen Fieldhouse during the month of November, a streak which began in 2006.
- Kansas returns two starters and six letterwinners from last season's squad that claimed the Jayhawks' 14th-consecutive Big 12 regular-season title, the Big 12 Championship title and advanced to school's 15th Final Four.

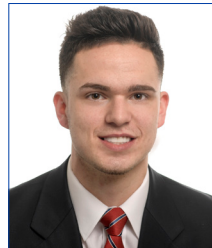

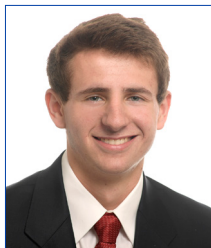

ABOUT KANSAS

No. 2 Kansas is 2-0 for the second-straight season and ninth time under head coach Bill Self after its 84-68 win against Vermont on Nov. 12 in a campus round game of the NIT Season Tip Off. Through two games, Kansas leads the Big 12 in 3-point field goal percentage at 52.4 percent and assists with a 20.0 average. KU averages 88.0 points and has a +10.5 scoring margin. The Jayhawks make 11.0 3-pointers per game and have a +6.0 rebound margin.

The Jayhawks are led by junior C Udoka Azubuike who is averaging 20.0 points per game after his double-double (23 points, 11 rebounds) against Vermont. Azubuike is second on the team with 7.0 rebounds per contest and leads KU with five blocked shots.

Senior G Lagerald Vick is coming off a career-high 32 points against Vermont in which he set the KU single-game record by going 8-for-8 from 3-point range. Vick is averaging 17.0 points in two games and is second on the team with four steals.

Freshman G Quentin Grimes, who was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Week Nov. 12, leads Kansas with 14 assists in two games, which included 10 versus Vermont (11/12) in posting a double-double with 10 points. Grimes, who averages 17.0 points per game, is tied with Vick for most 3-point field goals made with eight in two outings.

Freshman G Devon Dotson is a starter who averages 11.5 points and 4.0 rebounds per game. He is 4-for-7 (57.1 percent) from 3-point range in his first two contests. Junior F Detric Lawson, who was named Big 12 Player of the Week Nov. 12, rounds out the starters. Lawson is one of four Big 12 players averaging a double-double at 10.0 points and 10.5 rebounds.

Other KU regulars include sophomore G Marcus Garrett (4.0 ppg, 3.0 rpg), redshirt sophomore G Charlie Moore (4.0 ppg, 2.0 rpg), freshman F David McCormack (3.0 ppg, 3.0 rpg), junior F Mitch Lightfoot (2.5 ppg) and redshirt sophomore g K.J. Lawson (2.0 ppg, 3.0 rpg).

ABOUT LOUISIANA

Located in Lafayette, Louisiana, with an enrollment of 19,387, Louisiana is 1-1 on the season after its 87-65 loss at No. 5 Tennessee on Nov. 9. The Ragin' Cajuns are coached by Bob Marlin who is 156-112 in his ninth season at UL. UL averages 93.0 points per game and has a +9.5 scoring margin. The Ragin' Cajuns make 11 3-pointers per game, shoot 44.9 percent from 3-point range and average 14.0 assists per contest.

Senior F JaKeenan Gant leads the team in scoring at 18.5 points per game. Gant also leads the squad with a 66.7 field goal percentage (16-for-24) and with four blocked shots. Senior G/F Malik Marquetti leads the team in rebounds with 7.0 per game and scores 13.5 points per contest. Junior G Jeremy Hayes comes off the bench to average 10.5 points per game, which is the same as junior F Justin Miller.

Sophomore G Cedric Russell is a starter who has made a team-high five 3-pointers in two games. Miller scores 9.5 points per outing. Senior G Marcus Stroman (9.5 ppg) leads Louisiana with 19 assists and four steals. Other UL regulars include junior F Jerekus Davis (8.0 ppg), freshman G Trajen Wesley (4.5 ppg) and junior G P.J. Hardy (2.5 rpg).

THE SERIES

This series is tied with Louisiana winning the first meeting, 54-45, on Dec. 29, 1983, and Kansas winning the most recent match-up, 96-51, on Dec. 11, 2004. The first meeting was the first season for KU head coach Larry Brown and was the title game of the Sugar Bowl Tournament in New Orleans. The second meeting was under current KU coach Bill Self and Kansas was ironically ranked No. 2 by Associated Press for that contest.

Make Kansas 3-0 for the second-straight season and eighth time in head coach Bill Self's 16 seasons at KU ... Give KU its 41st-consecutive win at Allen Fieldhouse in the month of November, a streak which began in 2006 ... Make Kansas 2-1 all-time versus Louisiana, giving KU a two-game series winning streak ... Make Kansas 774-113 all-time in Allen Fieldhouse, including 236-13 under Self ... Make Self 450-96 while at Kansas and 657-201 overall ... Make Kansas 2,251-849 all-time.

Make Kansas 2-1 for the eighth time in the Bill Self era ... Give Louisiana a 2-1 series advantage over Kansas ... End a Kansas five-game home court winning streak ... Hand KU its first November loss in Allen Fieldhouse since 2006, when Kansas fell to Oral Roberts, ending a streak of 40-straight victories ... Make Kansas 773-114 all-time in Allen Fieldhouse, including 235-14 under Self ... Make Self 449-97 while at Kansas and 656-202 overall ... Make Kansas 2,250-850 all-time.

VERMONT NOTABLES

- KU's 81-66 victory over Vermont marks the Jayhawks' 46th-consecutive regular season home opener in Allen Fieldhouse, a streak that dates back to the 1973-74 season.
- The Jayhawks improved to 2-0 for the second-straight season and ninth time in Bill Self's 16 seasons at Kansas.
- Lagerald Vick (32) and Udoka Azubuike (23) combined 55 points, the most points by a Jayhawk duo since Devonte' Graham (35) and Vick (20) scored 55 against Syracuse on Dec. 2, 2017.
- Quentin Grimes and Azubuike's double-doubles mark the first time a pair of Jayhawks has notched double-doubles since March 10, 2018, against West Virginia in the Big 12 Championship title game last season. Devonte' Graham posted 18 points and 13 assists and Silvio De Sousa had 16 points and 10 rebounds in that contest.
- The Jayhawks' 63.2 percent (12-19) clip from 3-point range was the team's best since hitting 69.2 percent (9-13) against New Mexico State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament on March 20, 2015.
- Combing the final 1:49 of the first half and the first 6:25 of the second half, the Jayhawks outscored the Catamounts 20-4, going 9-13 from the field and 2-3 from beyond the arc during that stretch.
- Vick's eight 3-pointers marked his career-high for treys made in a single game and tied for the second most in KU history (11 by Terry Brown vs. N.C. State, 1-5-91; 8 by Mario Chalmers vs. Texas, 3-16-08; and 8 by Billy Thomas vs. Texas, 1-10-98).
- Vick's eight treys also set a Kansas record for most 3-pointers made without a miss. Ben McLemore previously held the record going 6-for-6 from the 3-point line against Iowa State in on Jan. 9, 2013.
- Vick's 32 points on 12-of-14 shooting, surpass his previous career high of 28 versus Washington (12/6) set last season.
- Vick's 32 points were the most by a Jayhawk since Malik Newman had 32 versus Duke in last season's NCAA Tournament Regional Final.
- Vick also surpassed the 800-point plateau as he has 809 career points while at Kansas.

30-POINT GAMES UNDER SELF

Senior G Lagerald Vick scored a career-high 32 points against Vermont (11/12), and in the process he set the KU game record for most 3-pointers made without a miss going 8-for-8. His eight treys also tied for the second-most ever made by a Jayhawk in a game. The 32 points marked the 29th time a Jayhawk has scored 30 or more points in a game in the Bill Self era.

Just eight Jayhawks have posted multiple 30-point outings in a career since Self took over in 2003-04. Wayne Simien tallied four 30-point performances during his time in Lawrence, two apiece in his junior and senior seasons. Frank Mason III scored 30 points three times, all during his National Player of the Year campaign in 2016-17. Ben McLemore also hit 30 three times, all coming in his one season with the Jayhawks in 2012-13.

Last season, both Devonte' Graham and Malik Newman hit the 30-point plateau on two occasions.

KANSAS SWEEPS BIG 12 WEEKLY HONORS

The Kansas duo of Dedric Lawson and Quentin Grimes swept the first Big 12 weekly honors of the 2018-19 season, the conference office announced Nov. 12. Lawson was the Big 12 Player of the Week, while Grimes was the Big 12 Newcomer of the Week.

In No. 1 Kansas' 92-87 win against No. 10 Michigan State in the State Farm Champions Classic, Nov. 6, Lawson recorded a double-double with 20 points and 14 rebounds. The 6-foot-9, Memphis, Tennessee, forward also led KU with six assists in the win.

In his collegiate debut, Grimes led all scorers with 21 points in the win versus Michigan State, which was played at Bankers Life Fieldhouse in Indianapolis. The Woodlands, Texas, guard was 7-for-14 from the field, including 6-for-10 from 3-point range and had four assists.

Historically, Kansas has won the more Big 12 weekly honors than any other school with 120 in the 22-year history of the conference. Lawson is the Kansas' Big 12 Player of the Week for the 72nd time, while Grimes is KU's Big 12 Newcomer/Rookie of the Week for the 48th time.

LAST TIME OUT

Senior Lagerald Vick's career-high 32 points, including a perfect line from three-point range, lifted the No. 2 Kansas Jayhawks to an 84-68 win over the Vermont Catamounts Nov. 12 inside Allen Fieldhouse.

With a little more than a minute remainign in the opening frame, Udoka Azubuike dunked in two of his 23 points to begin a 7-0 Jayhawk run to close the first half as the team claimed a 40-36 advantage as it headed to the halftime locker room.

The Kansas run extended into the second half as the Jayhawks begin the frame on a 13-4 stretch that pushed its lead to 53-40 and was capped by yet another Vick three-pointer. That shot was the first of three-straight treys by the senior that pushed KU's lead to 59-45 with 11:20 remaining.

From there a group effort helped KU to the finish line as Vick, Azubuike, sophomore Charlie Moore and freshman Quentin Grimes accounted for 20 of their team's final 25 points, to close out the Catamounts with an 84-68 win.

Ending his night with a perfect 8-of-8 from 3-point range, Vick became the first Jayhawk in program history to make eight threes without a miss. He closed the night with a career-high 32 points on 10-of-12 shooting and was joined in double-figures by Azubuike, who tallied his eighth-career double-double with 23 points and 11 rebounds.

NIT HISTORY

After the Louisiana contest, Kansas will play Marquette on Nov. 21 in the NIT Tip Off at Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York. With its win versus Vermont on Nov. 12 in a campus round of the NIT, Kansas is 18-3 in the NIT Season Tip off having won event three times - 1989, 1993 and 1997. The Jayhawks placed second in 1985 and fourth in 2002. In the early format, KU has advanced to the event's semifinals and finals/consolation finals in Madison Square Garden all five times it has played in it.

KANSAS NO. 1 IN PRESEASON NATIONAL POLLS

For the third time in poll history Kansas men's basketball enters the season No. 1 by Associated Press (AP), as the AP released its poll Oct. 22. Three days later, Oct. 25, Kansas was once again picked No. 1 in the USA TODAY Coaches' Poll. KU has now been No. 1 in both preseason polls three times in 2004-05, 2009-10 and now 2018-19.

In the AP poll, Kansas received 37 of a possible 65 first-place votes from the AP panel. Kentucky is ranked second and had 19 first-place votes, while Gonzaga, Duke and Virginia round out the top five of the AP preseason poll.

Kansas will head to Brooklyn's Barclays Center to face Marquette in the semifinals of the NIT Season Tip Off, Wednesday, Nov. 21, at 6 p.m. (Central) on ESPN2.

Kansas is 6-1 all-time versus Marquette with the last meeting on April 5, 2003, in the Final Four in New Orleans, a 94-61 KU win.

After its win versus Vermont (11/12), Kansas is 18-3 in the NIT and last participated in the event in 2002-03, where the Jayhawks finished fourth. Prior to this year, KU has played in five NITs in 1985-96, 1989-90, 1993-94, 1997-98 and 2002-03. KU has won three NIT titles in 1989, 1993 and 1997.

Kansas is 1-0 all-time in games on Nov. 16 (5-0 including exhibitions)

Nov. 16, 1990: Kansas wrapped up exhibition play with a 94-66 victory over East Melbourne. Sophomore forward Richard Scott scored 18 points on 8-of-12 shooting to lead the Jayhawks, while former Jayhawk guard Milt Newton led East Melbourne with 15 points. The Jayhawks went on to a 27-5 record overall and an 11-3 record in conference to claim the Big Eight regular-season title. Behind Associated Press National Coach of the Year Roy Williams, Kansas also clinched their first Big Eight Conference tournament championship since 1986. First-Team All-Conference selections Rex Walters and Adonis Jordan, as well as a Second Team All-Conference Alonzo Jamison, went on to secure a number one seed in the NCAA Tournament.

Kansas will potentially play 10 regular-season games against teams ranked in the AP preseason poll, including four in the top 10: No. 2 Kentucky, No. 6 Tennessee (potential NIT), No. 9 Villanova, No. 10 Michigan State, No. 12 Kansas State (twice), No. 13 West Virginia (twice) and No. 20 TCU (twice).

In the coaches' poll, the 2018-19 Jayhawks join the 1996-97, 2004-05 and 2009-10 KU squads in being preseason No. 1. This is the fourth-straight year the Jayhawks have opened the season in the top-five of the coaches' poll and KU is ranked in the preseason for the 27th time in time in the 30-year history of the poll.

The No. 1 ranking marks the ninth time KU has been preseason No. 3 or higher in the coaches' poll. Additionally, it is the 13th time in the Bill Self era the Jayhawks have been preseason seventh or higher, including each of the last seven seasons. In 2017-18 Kansas opened the year No. 3 in the preseason coaches' poll and ended No. 3.

Kansas could potentially play 10 games against teams ranked in the coaches' preseason poll this season. Those include: No. 2 Kentucky, No. 6 Tennessee, No. 8 Villanova, No. 10 Michigan State, No. 11 Kansas State, No. 13 West Virginia and No. 21. TCU.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12

Kansas' Detric Lawson, Quentin Grimes and Udoka Azubuike each garnered recognition on the 2018-19 Preseason All-Big 12 Team as voted on by the league's men's basketball coaches, the conference office announced Oct. 17.

Lawson was named the 2018-19 Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, while Grimes was dubbed the league's preseason freshman of the year. Lawson was also a preseason all-conference first-team selection, while Azubuike and Grimes secured preseason honorable mention honors. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own student-athletes in the selection process.

Joining Lawson on the five-member 2018-19 Preseason All-Big 12 Team are: Lindell Wigginton (Iowa State), Barry Brown Jr. (Kansas State), Dean Wade (Kansas State) and Sagaba Konate (West Virginia).

PRESEASON BIG 12 POLL

For the eighth-straight season and 18th time in the 23-year history of the league, Kansas topped the men's basketball Big 12 Preseason Poll, announced by the league office Oct. 19. The Jayhawks received all of the possible nine first-place votes in 2018-19 for the fourth-consecutive season.

KU has captured 18 outright or shared Big 12 regular-season championships in the previous 22 campaigns. The program's 14 consecutive, from 2005-present, and 61 overall conference titles are both NCAA records.

Kansas State was picked second in the preseason poll followed by West Virginia in third. TCU and Texas tied for fourth to round out the top five. Other placings were 6. Iowa State, 7. Texas Tech, 8. Oklahoma, 9. Baylor and 10. Oklahoma State.

Historically, in the previous 17 occurrences Kansas has been named the preseason favorite, the Jayhawks won the Big 12 regular-season on 15 occasions. This includes the first preseason poll in 1996-97 in which only a media poll was conducted.

PRESEASON STARTING FIVE

Kansas was well represented on the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame's Starting 5 awards released Oct. 15-19. Of the five awards announced, which consisted of 20 candidates per category, Kansas had one student-athlete on four of the five honors lists. Freshman guard Devon Dotson is up for the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Award, freshman guard Quentin Grimes for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award, redshirt junior forward Detric Lawson for the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award and junior center Udoka Azubuike for the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center of the Year Award.

Historically, Kansas has had numerous student-athletes named as candidates and finalists, including last year with Devonte' Graham being a Cousy finalist. In 2017, Frank Mason III was the recipient of the Cousy Award.

LAWSON NAMED PRESEASON AP ALL-AMERICA

Kansas redshirt junior Detric Lawson was named to the Associated Press (AP) 2018-19 preseason All-America team, as voted on by a national media panel, the AP announced Oct. 23. Joining Lawson on the AP preseason All-America team are: Carsen Edwards (Purdue), Luke Maye (North Carolina), R.J. Barrett (Duke), Ethan Happ (Wisconsin) and Caleb Martin (Nevada). There were also 15 other student-athletes who received votes.

Named Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year and Preseason All-Big 12 First Team earlier this month, Lawson sat out last season after transferring from Memphis. The Memphis, Tennessee, forward averaged 19.2 points and 9.9 rebounds, amassing 19 double-doubles his sophomore year for the Tigers in 2016-17, earning All-American Athletic Conference First Team honors. As a freshman, Lawson averaged 15.8 points and 9.3 rebounds with 17 double-doubles for Memphis.

- Kansas has 2,250 all-time victories, second most in NCAA Division I history (Kentucky).
- From the 2008-09 season to the present (10 seasons) Kansas has held 345 of its 371 opponents under 50 percent shooting.
- KU has held opponents to fewer than 100 points in 558 of its last 560 games. The last team to score 100 on Kansas in a 40-minute game was Oklahoma (100-78) on Feb. 27, 1990.

- KU is the only Big 12 school to have won a regular-season championship with two different coaches (Roy Williams and Bill Self).
- Under Bill Self, Kansas is 116-8 (93.5 percent) in Big 12 home games: 8-0 in 2004, 7-1 in 2005, 7-1 in 2006, 7-1 in 2007, 8-0 in 2008, 8-0 in 2009, 8-0 in 2010, 7-1 in 2011, 9-0 in 2012, 8-1 in 2013, 9-0 in 2014, 9-0 in 2015, 9-0 in 2016, 8-1 in 2017 and 7-2 in 2018.

KANSAS VS TOP-25 TEAMS

With its win over No. 10 Michigan State to open the season on Nov. 6, Kansas added to an impressive record against ranked teams during the Bill Self era. Under Self, Kansas is now 91-45 against AP-ranked opponents. In his first 15 seasons at KU, Self's Jayhawks have collected four wins or more over top-25 ranked foes in 12 of those seasons, which includes a 36-16 record from 2014-present.

Kansas' record against top-10 ranked opponents is even more impressive. KU is 17-4 against foes ranked inside the top-10 of the AP poll since 2013-14, including 4-1 in 2017-18. Last season, KU's top-10 wins included Kentucky, West Virginia, Texas Tech and Duke. Since Bill Self's first season, the Jayhawks are 13-3 against AP top-10 teams inside Allen Fieldhouse, which includes KU's current streak of nine-straight home victories against top-10 foes.

KANSAS FROM DOWNTOWN

In 2017-18, Kansas led the Big 12 with 10.0 3-point field goals made per game and a 3-point field goal percentage at 40.1. Kansas made 10 or more 3-pointers in eight conference games and 19 total in 2017-18. For the season, the Jayhawks were 17-2 in games where they made 10 or more threes.

The 2017-18 team was the third KU squad to make 300 3-pointers in a season and last season's Jayhawks crushed the single-season school record for 3-pointers made, 391, and attempted, 974, surpassing 2016-17's record-setting marks of 318 made and 787 attempted. Three of the last eight Jayhawk squads have averaged more than seven treys per game, with both of the last two KU teams hitting an average of eight or more threes per contest.

Kansas enters 2018-19 having won 18 of the 22 Big 12 regular-season titles (includes ties), including the last 14, which is an NCAA record. Kansas' 61 conference titles are the most in NCAA Division I. Kentucky is second with 54 and Penn third at 37 (pre-2017-18). KU's 14-straight league titles, all under head coach Bill Self, is the longest active streak in NCAA Division I and the longest streak in school history.

HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

Udoka Azubuike ended 2017-18 with the top field goal percentage in NCAA Division I at 77.0 percent and he was the only player shooting 70 percent or better with a minimum of five shots made per game. Azubuike broke the Big 12 single-season record of 69.3 percent, previously set by Ricardo Ratliffe of Missouri in 2011-12.

History has shown that it isn't easy to lead the nation in a statistic. In fact, checking the NCAA Records Book of annual leaders, before this season, only twice has a Jayhawk led the country in a season stat and both were KU All-Americans. KU legend Clyde Lovellette led the NCAA in scoring average in 1951-52 at 28.6 points per game. More recently, Thomas Robinson led the country in double-doubles with 27 during the 2011-12 season. Under Lovellette's leadership KU won the 1952 NCAA National Championship, while Robinson led the Jayhawks to a runner-up finish in 2012.

With a minimum of 175 attempts, Azubuike broke the Kansas single-season field goal percentage record of 64.6 percent by Mark Randall in 1988-89. On the NCAA level, with a minimum of five makes per game, Azubuike's 77.0 percent ranks second all-time behind Devontae Cacok of UNC-Wilmington, who set the NCAA record two seasons ago at (2016-17) at 80.0 percent.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2018-19

- Lagerald Vick has 775 career points heading into his senior season. Vick scored 266 points his sophomore year and 470 points last year. Should he reach 1,000, he will become the 61st Jayhawk to reach the milestone.
- Vick has 101 career 3-pointers made and is 25 shy from cracking the KU top-20.
- Udoka Azubuike has 82 career blocked shots and his 60 last season were the most since Joel Embiid swatted 72 in 2013-14. Azubuike is 18 shy of becoming the 20th player in school history to record 100 blocked shots.
- Not far behind Azubuike's blocked shots is junior Mitch Lightfoot with 66 career swats in two seasons.
- Azubuike has a career field goal percentage of 75.2 as he is 240-for-319. The KU career field goal percentage record, with a minimum of 500 attempts, is 62.0 by Mark Randall (643-for-1,037 in 1987, 89-91).
- Kansas is 11 wins shy from winning its 1,100th conference game. All-time, the Jayhawks are 1,089-364 in league play and are 302-64 in the Big 12.

- Bill Self was named the eighth coach in Kansas basketball history on April 21, 2003.
- In September 2017, Self was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.
- Self won his 600th career game on Dec. 6, 2016, with KU's 105-62 win against UMKC. He became the 46th coach in NCAA Division I to accomplish the feat and the ninth fastest.
- While at Kansas, Self has won a national championship, a KU- and NCAA-record 14-straight regular-season Big 12 Conference titles and eight league tournament championships.
- At Kansas, Self has won more regular-season league titles (14) than he has home losses (13) in Allen Fieldhouse. With KU's win versus Siena (11/18/16), Self became the winningest coach in Allen Fieldhouse, posting his 207th victory in the venue.
- In his first trip to the Final Four in 2008, Self's team won the title. Self is one of 11 active coaches in NCAA Division I to have won a national title. Kansas' 14-straight conference titles (2005-18) is the longest streak in NCAA Division I history.
- In Self's first 15 seasons at Kansas, he has coached 11 NBA Lottery selections including Andrew Wiggins and Joel Embiid, the No. 1 and No. 3 overall selections in the 2014 NBA Draft. Wiggins was the second-ever Jayhawk to go No. 1 with the other being Danny Manning in 1988.
- Self has guided his teams to 20-straight 23-win seasons dating back to 1998-99.
- Self's teams have won 18 league crowns in the last 20 years, including the 2018 title. The other two seasons resulted in runner-up conference finishes.
- Kansas' four-straight 30-win seasons from 2009-10 to 2012-13 are the most consecutive 30-win seasons in NCAA history (note: Memphis did it from 2006-09 yet later vacated the 2008 season).
- Self was the head coach for Team USA's U18 team that competed and won gold at the 2018 FIBA Americas Championship held in St. Catherines, Canada, in the summer of 2018.
- Self is one of five coaches in NCAA Division I history to have led three different teams - Tulsa, Illinois and Kansas - to the NCAA Elite Eight, including seven times with KU (2004-07-08-11-12-16-17). The other coaches are: Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Rick Pitino and Eddie Sutton.
- A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kansas in 1985-86 under head coach Larry Brown. He then returned to his alma mater as an assistant for seven seasons under coaches Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton. His first head coaching job was at Oral Roberts in 1993-94, then Tulsa (1997-98), Illinois (2000-03) and Kansas (2003-present).
