TIP-OFF

- No. 2 Kansas (4-0) will face No. 5 Tennessee (4-0) in the finals of the NIT Season Tip-Off on Nov. 23, at 8 p.m. (CT) on ESPN2. The contest will be played at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York.
- The Jayhawks are coming off a 77-68 win versus Marquette on Nov. 21 in the NIT semis. Tennessee defeated Louisville, 92-81, in its semifinal contest.
- Kansas is appearing in its fifth NIT Season Tip-Off championship game in six trips to the event. KU has won three of the four NIT title games it has appeared in (1989, 1993, and 1997).
- Tennessee is the second top-10 team Kansas will play this season. KU opened the 2018-19 campaign with a 92-87 win versus No. 10 Michigan State in the Champions Classic in Indianapolis.
- Kansas has won 12-straight regular-season meetings vs. top-10 ranked opponents. Since 2015-16, KU is 14-3 against Associated Press top-10 ranked squads, including a 6-1 mark against top-5 ranked teams.
- Kansas is looking to go 5-0 for the second-straight season and seventh time in Bill Self's 16 seasons at KU.
- Kansas leads Tennessee 2-1 in all-time meetings, with the last meeting on Nov. 28, 2014, at KU 82-67 win in the semifinals of the Orlando Classic, an event the Jayhawks went on to win.
- Kansas is vying to win its fifth-straight in-season tournament, beginning with the Orlando Classic in 2014. KU since won the Maui Invitational in 2015, the CBE Classic in 2016 and the Miami Hoophall Invitational in 2017.
- Senior G Lagerald Vick's 32 points against Vermont (11/12) and 33 points versus Louisiana marked the 29th and 30th time in Bill Self's 16 seasons at KU that a Jayhawk has scored 30 or more points.
- Vick's back-to-back 30-point efforts earned him Big 12 Player of the Week honors for the first time in his career. The announcement marked the 73rd time in the league's history a Jayhawk has claimed the Player of the Week award and the second this season (Dedric Lawson, Nov. 12).

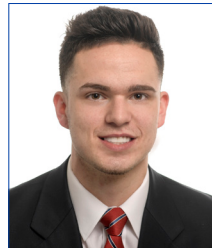

ABOUT KANSAS

No. 2 Kansas is 4-0 for the second-straight season and eighth time under head coach Bill Self after its 77-68 win against Marquette on Nov. 21. Through three games, Kansas leads the Big 12 in scoring offense at 85.5, 3-point field goal percentage at 47.3 percent and assist-to-turnover ratio at 1.5. KU averages 88.3 points and has a +11.3 scoring margin. The Jayhawks make 8.8 3-pointers per game and have a +8.0 rebound margin.

The Jayhawks are led by senior G Lagerald Vick who ranks second in the Big 12 with a 20.8 scoring averaging. Vick also leads the team with 18 3-pointers made with all of those in the last three contests. Vick is second on the team with seven steals. Redshirt junior F Dedic Lawson is coming off his second double-double of the season with 26 points and 12 rebounds versus Marquette (11/21). He is scoring 16.3 points per game, which is tied for seventh in the Big 12, and his 9.8 rebounds per game are tied for seventh in the conference. Dedic Lawson is second on the team with 14 assists. Junior C Udoka Azubuike is next in scoring at 15.8 points per game and his 6.5 rebound average is second on the squad. Azubuike leads the team with nine blocked shots and a 66.7 field goal percentage. Freshmen guards Quentin Grimes (10.0 ppg, team-high 17 assists) and Devon Dotson (9.3 ppg, team-high eight steals) round out the Kansas starters.

Sophomore G Marcus Garrett (6.3 ppg, 2.8 rpg) is tied with Grimes for third on the team with 10 assists. Garrett is coming off a season-high 11-point performance against Marquette (11/21). Other KU regulars include redshirt sophomore G Charlie Moore (2.0 ppg, 2.3 rpg), freshman F David McCormack (2.3 ppg, 3.0 rpg), redshirt sophomore G K.J. Lawson (1.5 ppg) and junior F Mitch Lightfoot (2.0 ppg).

Tennessee averages 82.8 points per game and has a plus-22.8 scoring margin. The Volunteers dominate the boards averaging 42.8 rebounds per game with a plus-7.3 rebound margin. They shoot 51.2 percent from the field and hold opponents to a 32.8 field goal percentage. UT are also impressive with 21.0 assists per game and force 11.3 turnovers per contest.

Junior F Grant Williams leads Tennessee in scoring at 22.5 points and rebounds with an 8.5 average. He has 15 assists and four steals. Senior G Admiral Schofield is next in scoring at 14.0 points per game and he is also second in rebounds with a 7.3 average. Schofield leads the team with 19 assists. Junior G Jordan Bone scores 13.5 points per contest and he is just behind Schofield with 18 assists and he leads the team with five steals. Senior F Kyle Alexander (11.3 ppg, 6.3 rpg) leads the team with 11 blocked shots and he and junior G Jordan Bowden (7.5 ppg, 4.3 rpg) round out the UT starters.

In his season debut, redshirt junior G Lamonte Turner scored 13 points with five rebounds versus Louisville (11/21). Other Tennessee regulars include redshirt sophomore F John Fulkerson (5.8 ppg, 3.5 rpg) and sophomore G/F Yves Pons (3.3 ppg, 4.0 rpg).

THE SERIES

This dates back to 2009 and Kansas leads 2-1. The two teams claimed home victories in a home-and-home series with Kansas defeating Tennessee, 92-85, on Jan. 3, 2009, in Allen Fieldhouse and UT posting a 76-68 win against KU on Jan. 10, 2010, in Knoxville. Kansas won the last meeting, 82-67, on Nov. 28, 2014, in the semifinals of the Orlando Classic. Kansas went on to win the event.

Make Kansas 5-0 for the second-straight season and seventh time in head coach Bill Self's 16 seasons at KU ... Make Kansas 20-3 all-time in the NIT Season Tip-Off and give KU its fourth NIT title ... Give the Jayhawks their 13th-straight regular-season victory over a top-10 ranked team ... Move KU's record to 15-3 against AP top-10 teams since the 2015-16 season ... Give the Jayhawks their fifth-straight in-season tournament championship, a streak which began in 2014 ... Make Kansas 3-1 all-time versus Tennessee, giving KU a two-game series winning streak ... Make Self 452-96 while at Kansas and 659-201 overall ... Make Kansas 2,253-849 all-time.

A KANSAS LOSS WOULD...

Make Kansas 4-1 ... Make Kansas 19-4 in the NIT Season Tip-Off, giving KU its second runner-up finish with the other in 1985 ... Hand the Jayhawks their first regular-season loss against a top-10 ranked team since 2014, ending a streak of 12 games ... Tie the Kansas-Tennessee series at 2-2 ... Make head coach Bill Self 451-97 while at Kansas and 658-202 overall ... Make Kansas 2,252-850 all-time.

LAST TIME OUT

A commanding second-half performance by forward Dedric Lawson sparked the Jayhawks in a 77-68 victory over the Marquette Golden Eagles in the semifinals of the NIT Season Tip-Off on Nov. 21 inside Barclays Center. Lawson collected a double-double with a season-high 26 points and a team-leading 12 rebounds.

It was another shaky opening half for the Jayhawks who faced an eight-point deficit for the third-consecutive game, finding themselves trailing by 12 points, 42-30, with just over two minutes before the intermission. Marquette was able to build the lead with help from 11 first-half 3-pointers and headed to the locker room with a 47-38 advantage, the Jayhawks largest deficit at the break this season.

The Jayhawk the defense got to work in the second half though, while the offense quickly went into motion. Lawson shot in two of his 26 points within the opening 20 seconds after the restart to kick off a momentum-swinging KU run. Kansas amassed a 22-0 run over the first nine minutes of the half to turn what once was a 12-point hole, into a 13-point advantage, with 11:02 to play in the second frame.

From there, the Jayhawk defense took the reins, holding Marquette to a 25.9 field goal percentage in the second frame. Lawson added nine more points over the final 10 minutes of regulation.

MARQUETTE NOTABLES

- Kansas improved to 65-65 under Bill Self when trailing at halftime.
- After falling behind 42-30 at the 2:16 left the first half, the Jayhawks have now trailed by eight or more points in each of their last three outings.
- Kansas began the second half on a 22-0 run. In that span (first 9:15 of 2nd), KU forced Marquette to go 0-for-10 from the field and commit five turnovers.
- After falling behind by 12 points (42-30) with 2:16 remaining in the first half, Kansas outscored Marquette 38-14 over the next 14 minutes of game action to flip the score and give KU a 12-point lead (68-56) with 7:13 left in regulation.
- The Jayhawks committed just three turnovers in the second half and their eight total turnovers were a season low.
- Marquette's 11 3-pointers in the first half, marked the most treys by a KU opponent since Villanova connected on 13 from beyond the arc in the first half of the Final Four semifinal contest on March 31, 2018.
- After shooting a 54.5 percent (18-33) in the first half, Marquette was held to 25.9 percent shooting (7-27) in the second stanza.
- RS-Junior F Dedric Lawson's 26 points and 12 rebounds marked the 38th of his collegiate career and his second as a Jayhawk.
- The performance also give Lawson the second 20+ point outing as a Jayhawk and the 16th of his collegiate career, coming nine points shy of his career high (35 vs. Iowa, 11-26-16).
- Senior G Lagerald Vick went 3-for-5 from 3-point range and is now 18-of-25 (72 percent) from behind the arc in his last three games.

NIT HISTORY

With its win versus Marquette on Nov. 21 in the NIT Season Tip-Off semifinals, Kansas is 19-3 in the NIT Season Tip off having won

30-POINT GAMES UNDER SELF

Senior G Lagerald Vick scored a career-high 32 points against Vermont (11/12), and in the process he set the KU game record for most 3-pointers made without a miss going 8-for-8. His eight treys also tied for the second-most ever made by a Jayhawk in a game. The 32 points marked the 29th time a Jayhawk has scored 30 or more points in a game in the Bill Self era. Four days later, Vick surpassed his career high with 33 points in the win versus Louisiana, Nov. 16.

Vick became the ninth Jayhawk to have posted multiple 30-point outings in a career since Self took over in 2003-04. Wayne Simien tallied four 30-point performances during his time in Lawrence, two apiece in his junior and senior seasons. Frank Mason III scored 30 points three times, all during his National Player of the Year campaign in 2016-17. Ben McLemore also hit 30 three times, all coming in his one season with the Jayhawks in 2012-13. Last season, both Devonte' Graham and Malik Newman hit the 30-point plateau on two occasions.

VICK NAMED BIG 12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Kansas senior Lagerald Vick posted back-to-back 30-point efforts as he has been named the Big 12 Player of the Week in a vote by a media panel which covers the league, the conference announced Nov. 19. This is the second-straight week Kansas has taken home the Big 12 Player of the Week accolade as redshirt junior forward Dedic Lawson was last week's honoree (Nov. 12).

Vick opened the week scoring a then-career-high 32 points in Kansas' 84-68 win against Vermont on Nov. 12. In the game, the Memphis, Tennessee, guard broke the Big 12 and Kansas record for most 3-point field goals made without a miss by going 8-for-8 from beyond the arc. Vick's 8-for-8 effort was two shy of the NCAA record and his eight treys tied for the second-most made in KU history.

In Kansas, 89-76 win against Louisiana on Nov. 16, Vick scored 33 points, surpassing his career high set earlier in the week. Once again Vick was sharp shooting from 3-point range, making 7-of-12 from beyond the arc. KU's lone senior just missed a double-double against the Ragin' Cajuns as he pulled down nine rebounds in the win.

For the week, Vick averaged 32.5 points and shot 23-for-32 (71.8 percent) from the field, 15-for-20 (75.0 percent) from 3-point range and averaged 6.0 rebounds. Vick's 15 3-pointers in the two contests set a Kansas record for most 3-pointers made in consecutive games.

TOUGH COMPETITION

Many talk about how tough the Kansas schedule is for 2018-19. One look at KU's nonconference opponents shows that six foes were preseason selections in their respective league races, with an additional five picked for second-place finishes.

KANSAS IN THE NATIONAL POLLS

Kansas men's basketball enters this week at No. 2 in both the Associated Press and the USA TODAY Coaches' polls released on Nov. 19.

Kansas has been ranked in each of the last 183 AP polls dating back to Feb. 3, 2009, which is the longest active streak in NCAA Division I. For the third time in poll history Kansas entered the season ranked No. 1 by Associated Press (AP), as the AP released its poll Oct. 22. Three days later, Oct. 25, Kansas was once again picked No. 1 in the USA TODAY Coaches' Poll. KU has now been No. 1 in both preseason polls three times in 2004-05, 2009-10 and now 2018-19.

This is the fifth-straight year the Jayhawks have opened the season in the top five of the coaches' poll. The No. 1 ranking marked the ninth time KU has been preseason No. 3 or higher in the coaches' poll. Additionally, it was the 13th time in the Bill Self era the Jayhawks have been preseason seventh or higher, including each of the last seven seasons. In 2017-18 Kansas opened the year No. 3 in the preseason coaches' poll and ended No. 3.

Kansas is 6-2 all-time in games on Nov. 23

Nov. 23, 1984: Danny Manning was in the starting lineup for his Kansas debut in Anchorage, Alaska, in Kansas' first-ever appearance in the Great Alaska Shootout. Against a Maryland Terrapin team led by Adrian Branch and Len Bias, Kansas junior Calvin Thompson sank a 20-foot jump shot with four seconds remaining to win the game, 58-56. Junior Ron Kellogg led all Jayhawks with 14 points, while Manning posted a double-double with 12 points and 12 rebounds. Kansas finished with a 26-8 record in 1984-85, including an 11-3 mark in the Big Eight Conference. The 1984-85 season concluded with a two-point loss to Auburn in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12

Kansas' Detric Lawson, Quentin Grimes and Udoka Azubuike each garnered recognition on the 2018-19 Preseason All-Big 12 Team as voted on by the league's men's basketball coaches, the conference office announced Oct. 17.

Lawson was named the 2018-19 Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, while Grimes was dubbed the league's preseason freshman of the year. Lawson was also a preseason all-conference first-team selection, while Azubuike and Grimes secured preseason honorable mention honors. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own student-athletes in the selection process.

PRESEASON BIG 12 POLL

For the eighth-straight season and 18th time in the 23-year history of the league, Kansas topped the men's basketball Big 12 Preseason Poll, announced by the league office Oct. 19. The Jayhawks received all of the possible nine first-place votes in 2018-19 for the fourth-consecutive season.

KU has captured 18 outright or shared Big 12 regular-season championships in the previous 22 campaigns. The program's 14 consecutive, from 2005-present, and 61 overall conference titles are both NCAA records.

Historically, in the previous 17 occurrences Kansas has been named the preseason favorite, the Jayhawks won the Big 12 regular-season on 15 occasions. This includes the first preseason poll in 1996-97 in which only a media poll was conducted.

PRESEASON STARTING FIVE

Kansas was well represented on the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame's Starting 5 awards released Oct. 15-19. Of the five awards announced, which consisted of 20 candidates per category, Kansas had one student-athlete on four of the five lists. Freshman guard Devon Dotson is up for the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Award, freshman guard Quentin Grimes for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award, RS-junior forward Detric Lawson for the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award and junior center Udoka Azubuike for the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center of the Year Award.

Historically, Kansas has had numerous student-athletes named as

candidates and finalists, including last year with Devonte' Graham being a Cousy finalist. In 2017, Frank Mason III was the recipient of the Cousy Award.

KANSAS VS TOP-25 TEAMS

With its win over No. 10 Michigan State to open the season on Nov. 6, Kansas added to an impressive record against ranked teams during the Bill Self era. Under Self, Kansas is now 91-45 against AP-ranked opponents. In his first 15 seasons at KU, Self's Jayhawks have collected four wins or more over top-25 ranked foes in 12 of those seasons, which includes a 36-16 record from 2014-present.

Kansas' record against top-10 ranked opponents is even more impressive. KU is 17-4 against foes ranked inside the top-10 of the AP poll since 2013-14, including 4-1 in 2017-18. Last season, KU's top-10 wins included Kentucky, West Virginia, Texas Tech and Duke. Since Bill Self's first season, the Jayhawks are 13-3 against AP top-10 teams inside Allen Fieldhouse, which includes KU's current streak of nine-straight home victories against top-10 foes.

KANSAS FROM DOWNTOWN

In 2017-18, Kansas led the Big 12 with 10.0 3-point field goals made per game and a 3-point field goal percentage at 40.1. Kansas made 10 or more 3-pointers in eight conference games and 19 total in 2017-18. For the season, the Jayhawks were 17-2 in games where they made 10 or more threes.

The 2017-18 team was the third KU squad to make 300 3-pointers in a season and last season's Jayhawks crushed the single-season school record for 3-pointers made, 391, and attempted, 974, surpassing 2016-17's record-setting marks of 318 made and 787 attempted. Three of the last eight Jayhawk squads have averaged more than seven threes per game, with both of the last two KU teams hitting an average of eight or more threes per contest.

- Kansas has 2,252 all-time victories, second most in NCAA Division I history (Kentucky).

- Under Bill Self, Kansas is 116-8 (93.5 percent) in Big 12 home games: 8-0 in 2004, 7-1 in 2005, 7-1 in 2006, 7-1 in 2007, 8-0 in 2008, 8-0 in 2009, 8-0 in 2010, 7-1 in 2011, 9-0 in 2012, 8-1 in 2013, 9-0 in 2014, 9-0 in 2015, 9-0 in 2016, 8-1 in 2017 and 7-2 in 2018.

KU's 14-straight league titles, all under head coach Bill Self, is the longest active streak in NCAA Division I and the longest streak in school history.

HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

Udoka Azubuike ended 2017-18 with the top field goal percentage in NCAA Division I at 77.0 percent and he was the only player shooting 70 percent or better with a minimum of five shots made per game. Azubuike broke the Big 12 single-season record of 69.3 percent, previously set by Ricardo Ratliffe of Missouri in 2011-12.

With a minimum of 175 attempts, Azubuike broke the Kansas single-season field goal percentage record of 64.6 percent by Mark Randall in 1988-89. On the NCAA level, with a minimum of five makes per game, Azubuike's 77.0 percent ranks second all-time behind Devontae Cacok of UNC-Wilmington, who set the NCAA record two seasons ago at (2016-17) at 80.0 percent.

KU SIGNS TWO IN EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

Combo guards Issac "Mackey" McBride and Christian Braun have each signed a National Letter of Intent to play men's basketball at Kansas, KU head coach Bill Self announced Nov. 14, the first day of the signing period.

A 6-foot-1, 180-pound guard from Little Rock, Arkansas, McBride has rewritten the record book at Baptist Preparatory School. In guiding Baptist Prep to three-straight state championships, McBride set the school's single-season scoring record with 707 points his sophomore year in 2016-17. As a junior, he broke his own mark by scoring 883 points in 2017-18, which included a school-record 46-point game. In that, McBride averaged 24.5 points, 4.0 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 1.6 steals per game in 2017-18.

McBride is a two-time all-state selection and was the most valuable player of the last two state tournaments his sophomore and junior seasons. A four-star recruit who is ranked 109 by Rivals.com, McBride is the highest-ranked player in the state of Arkansas. He plays AAU basketball for the Arkansas Hawks.

Originally from Burlington, Kansas, Braun (6-foot-6, 180 pounds) moved to Overland Park, Kansas, his freshman year high school and has won back-to-back 6A state championships his sophomore and junior seasons at Blue Valley Northwest High School. A four-star prospect who is ranked No. 112 by Rivals.com, last year Braun averaged 14.2 points, 5.1 rebounds and 3.1 assists as a junior at Blue Valley Northwest. Braun plays for MoKan on the AAU circuit.

Braun comes from a basketball family. His father, Donald, was a walk-on at Kansas and his mother, Lisa, was a three-time All-Big Eight Conference honoree at Missouri where she played from 1987-91. His uncle, Mike Sandbothe, was a standout at Missouri from 1986-89, as was his aunt Lori from 1988-90. Additionally, his older brother, Parker, is a currently a freshman forward at MU.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2018-19

- Lagerald Vick has 858 career points and is 142 from becoming the 61st Jayhawk to score 1,000 career points.
- Vick has 119 career 3-pointers made and is one shy from cracking the KU top-20.
- Udoka Azubuike has 87 career blocked shots and his 60 last season were the most since Joel Embiid swatted 72 in 2013-14. Azubuike is 13 shy of becoming the 20th player in school history to record 100 blocked shots.
- Not far behind Azubuike's blocked shots is junior Mitch Lightfoot with 68 career swats in two-plus seasons.
- Azubuike has a career field goal percentage of 74.4 as he is 261-for-351. The KU career field goal percentage record, with a minimum of 500 attempts, is 62.0 by Mark Randall (643-for-1,037 in 1987, 89-91).
- Kansas is 11 wins shy from winning its 1,100th conference game. All-time, the Jayhawks are 1,089-364 in league play and are 302-64 in the Big 12.

- Bill Self was named the eighth coach in Kansas basketball history on April 21, 2003.
- In September 2017, Self was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.
- Self won his 600th career game on Dec. 6, 2016, with KU's 105-62 win against UMKC. He became the 46th coach in NCAA Division I to accomplish the feat and the ninth fastest.
- While at Kansas, Self has won a national championship, a KU- and NCAA-record 14-straight regular-season Big 12 Conference titles and eight league tournament championships.
- At Kansas, Self has won more regular-season league titles (14) than he has home losses (13) in Allen Fieldhouse. With KU's win versus Siena (11/18/16), Self became the winningest coach in Allen Fieldhouse, posting his 207th victory in the venue.
- In his first trip to the Final Four in 2008, Self's team won the title. Self is one of 11 active coaches in NCAA Division I to have won a national title. Kansas' 14-straight conference titles (2005-18) is the longest streak in NCAA Division I history.
- In Self's first 15 seasons at Kansas, he has coached 11 NBA Lottery selections including Andrew Wiggins and Joel Embiid, the No. 1 and No. 3 overall selections in the 2014 NBA Draft. Wiggins was the second-ever Jayhawk to go No. 1 with the other being Danny Manning in 1988.
- Self has guided his teams to 20-straight 23-win seasons dating back to 1998-99.
- Self's teams have won 18 league crowns in the last 20 years, including the 2018 title. The other two seasons resulted in runner-up conference finishes.
- Kansas' four-straight 30-win seasons from 2009-10 to 2012-13 are the most consecutive 30-win seasons in NCAA history (note: Memphis did it from 2006-09 yet later vacated the 2008 season).
- Self was the head coach for Team USA's U18 team that competed and won gold at the 2018 FIBA Americas Championship held in St. Catherines, Canada, in the summer of 2018.
- Self is one of five coaches in NCAA Division I history to have led three different teams - Tulsa, Illinois and Kansas - to the NCAA Elite Eight, including seven times with KU (2004-07-08-11-12-16-17). The other coaches are: Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Rick Pitino and Eddie Sutton.
- A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kansas in 1985-86 under head coach Larry Brown. He then returned to his alma mater as an assistant for seven seasons under coaches Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton. His first head coaching job was at Oral Roberts in 1993-94, then Tulsa (1997-98), Illinois (2000-03) and Kansas (2003-present).
