### KANSAS' LOSS...

- Made Kansas 10-1, ending a 10-game winning streak, the longest at KU since the 2016-17 season
- Ended a KU three-game winning streak in nonconference true road games, giving KU its first true non-league road loss since Dec. 22, 2014, at Temple
- Gave Arizona State a 6-5 series advantage against Kansas, including a 4-0 mark in games played in Tempe
- Made Bill Self 457-97 while at Kansas and 664-202 overall
- Made Kansas 2,258-850 all-time

### TEAM NOTES

- KU led 72-65 with five minutes remaining, marking just the 16th time in the Bill Self era the Jayhawks have lost when leading with 5:00 left in regulation. Kansas is now 419-16 in the last 16 seasons in those instances.
- Kansas set season highs in 3-point field goal attempts (28), free throw percentage (93.8) and turnovers (16).
- When ranked No. 1 in the country, Kansas dropped its all-time record to 33-11 when on the road. The Jayhawks are 50-61 (82.0 percent) from the free throw line in their last three contests.
- KU posted a season low in field goal percentage (41.5 percent).
- With the Jayhawks' largest lead of 12 points, the loss marked the largest lead blown in a KU loss since Iowa State came back from a 15-point deficit to beat Kansas in Lawrence on Feb. 4, 2017.
- The KU bench managed just five points, a season low. ASU's bench, on the other hand, scored 26, the second-most in 2018-19 by a KU opponent after South Dakota's bench put in 30 of the team's 53 total points on Tuesday night (12/18).

### OPPONENT NOTES

- Arizona State's 32 free throw attempts were the most by a KU opponent since Dec. 3, 2016, when Stanford shot 37 charities in a Jayhawk win in Lawrence.
- Won its first game at home when playing the No. 1-ranked team in the country.
- The win gave ASU just its second victory over a No.1 team in school history, having previously beat then-No. 1 Oregon State in Corvallis (3/7/81). The Sun Devils are now 2-8 all-time playing against the nation's No. 1-ranked team.
- Took its first lead of the game with just 2:23 remaining to be played in the game, after a 3-pointer by Rob Edwards.

### INDIVIDUAL NOTES

#### RS-Junior forward Dedric Lawson

- Led all scorers with a season-high 30 points.
- Posted his eighth double-double, fourth-straight, of the season by pulling down 14 rebounds.
- Of those 14 total rebounds, he tied his season high with 12 on the defensive glass.
- Scored 18 of his 30 points in the first half on 8-of-10 shooting from the field, which tied him for second all-time for most individual field goals made in a half with Malik Newman (vs. Oklahoma State, 3/8/18).
- Reached the 30-point plateau for the first time this season and second time in his career, of which his high is 35 vs. Iowa (11/26/16).
- At the 3:02 mark of the first half, had scored the same number of baskets as the entire Sun Devil team combined with eight.

#### Senior guard Lagerald Vick

- Recorded 14 points, his eighth double-digit scoring performance of the season.

#### Freshman guard Devon Dotson

- Scored in double-digits for the seventh time in KU's 11 games this season with his 12.
- Dished out five assists, also his seventh game this year, with three or more dimes.
