- Made Kansas 6-0 for the second-straight year and sixth time in Bill Self's 16 seasons at KU
- Made Kansas 11-3 all-time versus Stanford
- Made Kansas 6-0 vs Stanford at Allen Fieldhouse
- Made Kansas 2-0 in overtime games this season, 22-9 under Bill Self
- Improved Kansas to 64-1 under Bill Self when scoring 90 points or more
- Moved KU to 30-29 in the Bill Self era when the opponent scores 80 points or more
- Made Kansas 776-113 all-time in Allen Fieldhouse, including 236-13 under Self
- Made Self 453-96 while at Kansas and 660-201 overall
- Made Kansas 2,254-849 all-time

TEAM NOTES

- The game marked first time that Kansas has been held without a three in half since the second half vs. Texas Tech (1/2/18)
- Kansas was held to fewer than 30 points in a half for the first time since scoring just 20 points in the first half vs. Baylor on Feb. 10.
- Kansas has now trailed by 8 or more in each of the last five games, and went on to win all of them by five points or more.
- Kansas has also trailed by 12 points three times this season, KU came back to win all three games
- KU outscored Stanford 33-21 over the final 12 minutes of regulation to force overtime. In that span Kansas was 11-of-15 (73.3 percent) from the field and 3-of-5 from 3-point range.
- The Jayhawks' one first half assist were their the fewest in a half since
 Nov. 18, 2014 when KU had 0 against Kentucky at the Champions Classic.
- The 35-29 halftime deficit marked the third-consecutive game that Kansas had trailed at the break
- Kansas played in back-to-back overtime games for the first time since the 2009-10, season when it played Kansas State (1/30/10) and Colorado (2/3/10), winning both.
- Kansas outscored Stanford 33-21 in the final 12:18 of the second half to force overtime.
- The 15 lead changes was a season high and the most since Kansas and Duke traded the lead 18 times in KU's overtime win over the Blue Devils in the Elite Eight of last year's NCAA tournament on March 25, 2018.

OPPONENT NOTES

 Stanford's 18 team turnovers tied an opponent season high for the Jayhawks. Kansas converted those 18 turnovers into 22 points which was a season high and the most since the Jayhawks tallied 24 points off turnovers against Texas A&M on Jan. 27, 2018.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Senior guard Lagerald Vick

- Vick knocked down seven 3-pointers on the night, marking the fifthstraight game Vick has recorded multiple threes in a game and third time this season he has tallied seven or more triples.
- His 27 points marked the fifth-consecutive game he has scored in double figures.
- His five threes in the second half marks the most by a Jayhawk in a half since Svi Mykhailuik made five against lowa State on Jan. 9, 2018.
- Scored 19 of his 27 points in the final 7:30 of the second half and overtime.
 In that span, Vick was 6-7 from the field, including a 5-of-6 clip from 3-point range
- Played 43 minutes in the win marking the second-consecutive 40-minute game and the third time this season he has played at least 40 minutes
- His eight points in overtime marked the second-straight game a Jayhawk scored eight points in an overtime after Dedric Lawson also tallied eight in KU's OT win over Tennessee (11/23).

RS-Junior forward Dedric Lawson

- With 24 points and 15 rebounds, tallied his fourth double-doubles this season and 40th for his career. He is now one of just four active players in the NCAA DI to have 40 or more career double-doubles.
- His 15 rebounds marked a season high and fell one short of his career high 16, which he recorded against Tulane (2/13/16)

Freshman guard Devon Dotson

- Dished four assists, tying his season high.
- His 10 points marked the fourth-time this season Devon has scored in double figures.

Sophomore guard Marcus Garrett

• Grabbed four steals, tying his career high, which he set against South Dakota State (11/17/17).

Junior center Udoka Azubuike

- Posted his best shooting night of the season, going 9-for-11 (82 percent) from the field.
- His 18 points marked the fourth time this season Azubuike has hit double figures.
