KANSAS' WIN...

- Made Kansas 13-2 and 2-1 in Big 12 play for the second straight season
- Gave Kansas a 17-3 all-time series record against TCU, including an 8-0 record in Lawrence (all in Allen Fieldhouse)
- Made KU 13-2 against TCU in the Big 12 era
- Gave KU its 13th-consecutive win in Allen Fieldhouse
- Made the Jayhawks 87-11 under Bill Self in games coming off a loss.
- Made Kansas 5-1 against top-25 foes this season and 95-46 against ranked opponents under Bill Self
- Made Kansas 9-0 in Allen Fieldhouse this season, 243-13 under head coach Bill Self and 781-113 all-time in the venue
- Made Self 460-98 while at Kansas, 667-203 overall and 21-6 all-time versus TCU (14-2 while at KU)
- Made Kansas 2,261-851 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Lawson and Vick each posted double digits marking the eighth game the duo have scored 10+ more in the same game
- TCU trimmed the Kansas lead to 55-53 with 10:33 remaining in the game. The Jayhawks responded with a 9-0 by Dedric Lawson giving KU its largest lead on the night at 64-53.
- A pair of Dedric Lawson free throws gave Kansas a 66-58 lead with 5:00 remaining in the game, Kansas now 422-16 when leading at the 5:00 mark.
- The Jayhawks forced 20 TCU turnovers, the figure was a season high for both TCU and a Kansas opponent this season.
- Kansas recorded a season low with 34 rebounds on the night.
- TCU's 46.3 shooting percentage marked the third time this season a KU opponent has shot better than Kansas, KU has now won two out of those three games.
- Kansas finished the game on a 6-0 run spanning the final 1:41 of regulation.
- After committing 24 turnovers against Iowa State, the Jayhawks cut that number in half against TCU. Kansas committed 12 turnovers in the win while limiting TCU to just 13 points off turnovers.

OPPONENT NOTES

- The Horned Frogs entered the game with a league leading assist-to-turnover ratio of 1.7. However the Jayhawks pressured TCU into 20 turnovers and limited them to only 12 assists. It marked only the second time this season TCU had more turnovers than assists (Lipscomb 15:16)

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

RS-Junior forward Dedric Lawson

- Recorded his 47th-career double-double, 11th as a Jayhawk with 31 points and 14 rebounds. Lawson went 10-18 from the field and shot consistently at the line finishing 9-13.
- Lawson's 31-points marked a season high, and the third time he's scored 30+ in a game including two as a Jayhawk. The 31 point night is the highest by a junior since Wayne Selden tallied 33 against Kentucky (1/30/16).
- Lawson has now scored 20+ points for the Jayhawks in nine games this season.
- Lawson's 13 free throw attempts marks the most individually this season for KU.
- Lawson's 19 shots on the night marked a season high by a Jayhawk.
- His three steals matched a career high which Lawson has met eight times, the last being against South Dakota (12/18/18)

Freshman guard Ochai Agbaji

- Made his Kansas debut, checking in at the 15:51 mark of the first half.
- Agbaji didn't take long to enter the scoring column, converting on an ally-oop dunk just 10 seconds after he checked in for his first points as a Jayhawk.
- Scored seven points on just five shots in his debut. The Kansas City native added four rebounds, one assists, two steals and one block in 25 minutes of play.
- Agbaji's 25 minutes are the most by a non-starting Jayhawk in a KU debut since Devonte' Graham registered 26-minutes against UC Santa Barbara on 11/14/14

Sophomore guard Marcus Garrett

- Garrett dished three assists to go along with two steals, four rebounds and eight points.

Senior guard Lagerald Vick

- With his two made threes on the night, Vick tied Ryan Robertson with the 18th-most three point field goals made in KU history at 144
- With his 12 points, Vick now has 994 career points making him six shy of becoming the 61st KU player to score 1,000 points.
