NIT NOTES

- Kansas' 20-3 record in the NIT Season Tip Off marks the third most wins in the NIT trailing Duke's 25 and Arizona's 22.
- Kansas' four NIT Season Tip-Off titles tie for the most in the event. Duke and Arizona have also won four NITs.
- All-Tournament Team: Jordan Nwora, UL; Sam Hauser, MU; Jordan Bone, Grant Williams, UT; Lagerald Vick, Dedric Lawson (MVP), KU

KANSAS' WIN...

- Made Kansas 5-0 for the second-straight season and seventh time in head coach Bill Self's 16 seasons at KU.
- Made Kansas 20-3 all-time in the NIT Season Tip-Off and gave KU its fourth NIT title.
- Gave the Jayhawks their 13th-straight regular-season victory over a top-10 ranked team.
- Moved KU's record to 15-3 against AP top-10 teams since the 2015-16
- Gave KU its third-straight win in an overtime game and pushed its record to 7-2 in its last nine overtime games. KU is now 21-9 in games that go to overtime under Bill Self.
- Gave the Jayhawks their fifth-straight in-season tournament championship, a streak which began in 2014.
- Made Kansas 3-1 all-time versus Tennessee, giving KU a two-game series winning streak.
- Made Self 452-96 while at Kansas and 659-201 overall.
- Made Kansas 2.253-849 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas shot 50 percent for the game marking the second time the Jayhawks shot 50 percent from the field this season.
- Kansas' five 3-pointers tied for a season low. The Jayhawks also only made five treys against Marquette in the NIT semifinals. Prior to Marquette, the last time Kansas made five or fewer 3-pointers and won the game was at Baylor (5-for-20) in a 67-65 win on Feb. 18,
- With Tennesse building a nine-point lead (45-36) with 16:06 left in regulation, Kansas has now trailed by eight or more points in each of its last four games.

TEAM NOTES (CONT.)

- KU went on to win each by six or more points. KU also set season highs in free throws made (22) and free throws attempted (34).
- Kansas outrebounded Tennessee, 43-40, and has outrebounded all five opponents this season.
- KU's 48 points in the paint were its most this season and the most since the Jayhawks tallied 58 paint points against Oakland on Nov. 24, 2017.
- The Jayhawks' 18 points in overtime were their most since also scoring 18 points in a 97-89 win over lowa State in Lawrence on Jan. 3, 2013.

OPPONENT NOTES

- The Volunteers' 25.9 percent clip (7-of-27) from 3-point range was a KU opponent season-low and Tennessee's worst percentage from 3-point range this season.
- Tennessee's Grant Williams fouled out with 1:24 remaining in regulation. After that point, KU outscored Tennessee, 20-12.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

RS-Junior forward Dedric Lawson

- His 24 points and 13 rebounds marked the 39th double-double of his collegiate career and his third as a Jayhawk.
- The performance also give Lawson the third 20+ point outing as a Jayhawk and the 17th of his collegiate career.
- Lawson scored 17 of his points in the second half and overtime.
- Lawson became the third Jayhawk to be named Most Valuable Player of the NIT Season Tip-Off joining Mark Randall (1989), Richard Scott (1993) and Paul Pierce (1997).

RS-Sophomore guard K.J. Lawson

Lawson had his best game as a Jayhawk, playing 19 minutes with a season-high eight points, six rebounds and two steals. His six boards tied for his season high as he also pulled six rebounds against Michigan State in the season opener.

Senior guard Lagerald Vick

- Vick made three 3-pointers in the title game in scoring 15 points and earning all-tournament honors. Vick has now made three or more 3-pointers in four-straight games and is 21-for 32 (65.6 percent) from beyond the arc in that span.
- Tallied his second-straight 40+ minute outing, posting a career-high 43 minutes.

RS-Sophomore guard Charlie Moore

Moore scored a season-high nine points surpassing his seven versus Vermont (11/12). His 32 minutes played against Tennessee were also a season high.

Junior center Udoka Azubuike

- Azubuike was 4-for-6 from the field in scoring nine points in 17 minutes. Azubuike is 15-for-21 (71.4 percent) from the field in his last three games.
- Suffered his first disqualification of the season and the fifth of his career.
