- Ended a Kansas three-game winning streak against Kentucky
- Made the KU-UK all-time series 23-9 in favor of Kentucky
- Made Kansas 4-2 in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge, including 2-1 against Kentucky
- Made Kansas 2-1 against top-10 teams this season, ending a 13-game Kansas regular-season winning streak versus top-10 foes which started Jan. 4, 2016
- Made Bill Self 463-100 while at Kansas, 670-205 overall and 6-5 all-time versus Kentucky (6-4 while at KU)
- Made Kansas 2,264-853 all-time.

**TEAM NOTES**

- Kansas led 33-30 at the half marking the 12th time this season KU has led its opponent at the half. The Jayhawks are now 10-2 in those games.
- KU trailed at the 5:00 mark for just the third time this season, KU is now 1-2 in those games and 33-80 in the Bill Self era.
- Kansas was edged in the rebounding category for the fifth time this season, losing for just the second time in those games.
- Kentucky became the first team this season to defeat the Jayhawks despite committing more turnovers. KU is now 10-1 when its opponent commits more turnovers this season.
- UK's 49 rebounds is the ties for the most given up by the Jayhawks this season and the second largest rebound margin (Baylor) Kansas has faced.
- Kansas is now 1-3 in games when it scores between 60-69 points. Kansas' 63 points is its second lowest point total this season (at Iowa State).
- Kansas reached a double-digit lead in the first half at the 9:19 mark leading UK 16-6.
- The combined 8 steals are the fewest by KU and its opponent since the Jayhawks and Marquette combined for eight thefts on 11/21/18.
- Kansas' 9 assists were the second fewest by the Jayhawks this season (West Virginia).
- KU's 36.5 percent clip from the field was its lowest of the season.

**OPPONENT NOTES**

- For the first time since the 1988-89 season, a Kansas opponent saw three players post a double-double. Kentucky's Reid Travis (18 pts, 12 rbs), P.J. Washington (20 pts, 13 rbs) and Keldon Johnson (15 pts, 10 rbs) each posted double-doubles.

**INDIVIDUAL NOTES****RS-Junior forward Dedric Lawson**

- Lawson racked up his 50th career double-double and the 14th in a KU uniform with his 20 points and 15 rebounds.
- Lawson's 15 rebounds marks the second-straight outing he's posted 15 rebounds and the third time he has pulled down 15 boards this season. He finished just one rebound shy of his career high (16) which he tallied while at Memphis (Tulane 2/13/16).
- His 12 first half rebounds marked the second time this season the junior has recorded 12 rebounds in a half.
- Recorded his eighth-straight double digit performance.

**Senior guard Lagerald Vick**

- With his 10 points on the night, Vick moved past Otto Schnellbacher (1,062) and Rex Walters (1,064) in points all-time as a Jayhawk. Vick is now ranked 47th all-time with 1,070 points.
- Vick tallied six rebounds, his highest since he recorded seven against Villanova.

**Freshman guard Quentin Grimes**

- The freshman posted his first double digit performance in the last six games scoring 13 points while adding one rebounds and two assists.
- His three makes from deep marks the most since he hit three against Iowa State (1/5/19).

**Freshman guard Devon Dotson**

- Dotson scored nine points while recording a team high four assists.
