David McCormack (1/1)

- Kansas started four true freshmen for just the second time in the Bill Self era (since 2003-04). The other game that saw four freshmen in KU's starting line-up occurred on Dec. 7, 2013, when Joel Embiid, Frank Mason III, Wayne Selden Jr., and Andrew Wiggins started at Florida.
- KU's four starting freshmen combined for 47 points in the KU win.

KANSAS' WIN...

- Made KU 18-6 and 7-4 in Big 12 play.
- Made Kansas 115-59 all-time against OSU, including a 63-12 mark in Lawrence meetings, 48-10 in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made Kansas 90-12 following a loss in the Bill Self era, including 5-1 this season. Since the 2013-14 season, KU is 40-4 following a loss.
- Gave KU its 17th-straight win in Allen Fieldhouse, KU is 13-0 at home this season.
- Made KU 785-113 all-time in the venue, including 247-13 in the Bill Self era.
- Made Self 465-102 while at Kansas, 672-207 overall and 19-13 all-time versus Oklahoma State (18-10 while at KU).
- Made Kansas 2,266-855 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- OSU cut the KU lead to 53-51 with 12:32 left in regulation, over the ensuing 7:30, Kansas outscored Oklahoma State 23-6 to build a 19-point lead, its largest of the game.
- KU outscored OSU 48-36 in the second half snapping a four-game streak that saw the Jayhawks outscored by its opponent in the final frame.
- The Jayhawks outrebounded OSU 38-26 marking the 14th time this season KU has edged its opponent on the glass. KU is now 11-3 in those games this season.
- Kansas shot 50 percent from the field (31-62), improving its season record to 10-0 when shooting 50 percent or better and 248-9 in the Self era.
- OSU's eight turnovers were the fewest by a KU opponent since Texas committed just six (1/14/19) and the fourth fewest by a KU opponent in conference play since the 1988-89 season.
- The 16 combined turnovers were the fewest by KU and its opponent since the Jayhawks and Texas combined for 10 (1/14/19).
- KU's 84 points were the most scored by the Jayhawks in Big 12 play this season.
- The Jayhawks' 48 second-half points were the most KU has scored in a half during Big 12 play this season.
- In its last two home games (TTU and OSU) the Jayhawks have led their opponent for 76 minutes out of 80 played.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

RS-Junior forward Dedric Lawson

- For the sixth-straight game Lawson recorded at least one 3-point field goal.
- Lawson finished with 25 points, marking the 13th time this season the redshirt-junior has scored 20+ points and the 39th time in his career.
- His five assists were the most by Lawson since he dished five against Eastern Michigan (12/29). Lawson also grabbed seven rebounds while swiping one steal.
- After his 3-of-6 clip from beyond-the-arc on Saturday, Lawson is 12-24 (50 percent) from three in his last six outings. In the first 18 games of the season Lawson was 6-of-29 (20.7 percent).

Freshman Ochai Agbaji

- Made a season-high five baskets from beyond-the-arc while scoring 23 points, just one shy of his season high.
- Agbaji's five makes from deep were the most by a Jayhawk since Lagerald Vick made five against Texas (1/14/19).

Sophomore forward Mitch Lightfoot

- Lightfoot replaced several season highs on the day with nine rebounds, two blocks and one steal. The junior also added six points and one assist in a season high 20 minutes.

Freshman guard Devon Dotson

- Dotson scored in double figures for the third-straight game as the freshman tallied 18 points on the day to go along with two steals, four assists and five rebounds while committing just one turnover.

Freshman David McCormack

- Made his first career start, pulling down five rebounds to go along with one block.
