KANSAS' WIN...

- Made Kansas 19-6 and 8-4 in Big 12 play.
- Gave Kansas its fourth-straight win against TCU.
- Made KU 3-0 in overtime games this season and 23-9 under Bill Self.
- Ended KU's four-game road losing streak.
- Gave KU its 13th-straight win on ESPN Big Monday and moved the Jayhawks to 68-18 all-time on Big Monday, including 48-12 under Bill Self.
- Made Kansas 18-2 all-time against TCU, including a 7-1 record in Fort Worth meetings, 5-1 in Schollmaier Arena.
- Made Bill Self 466-102 while at Kansas, 673-207 overall and 22-5 all-time versus TCU (14-2 while at KU).
- Made Kansas 2,267-855 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas started four freshman for the second-consecutive game and just the third time in the Bill Self era.
- The Jayhawks and Horned Frogs entered the break at a 37-37 deadlock marking the second-straight game KU and its opponent had been tied at half. Kansas is now 2-1 in those games on the season, 17-4 in the Self era.
- KU used an 16-6 run to take its largest lead of the night, a 61-49 advantage with 8:34 left in the game.
- Kansas led with 5:00 remaining for the 19th time this season. KU is now 17-2 in those contests and 428-17 in the Self era.
- TCU used a 17-2 run spanning 4:20 to take a 69-65 lead over KU with 2:07 remaining. Kansas had four turnovers in that stretch.
- Kansas outrebounded its opponent for the 15th time this season, the Jayhawks are 12-3 in those meetings, 346-42 in the Self era.
- Kansas grabbed a season high 49 rebounds.
- KU's five point overtime win is the largest margin of victory in OT in conference play since Kansas topped West Virginia 76-69 (3/3/15).
- Kansas' 30 shots from deep were the most attempted by the Jayhawks in a game this season.
- With Dotson, D. Lawson and Agbaji each recording 10+ rebounds, it marked the first time KU has had three players with double digit rebounds since Kansas had three double figure rebounders against Valparaiso (11/15/10) and only the second time since the 1988-89 season.
- Double-doubles from Agbaji, Dotson and Lawson marked the fifth time that three Jayhawks have recorded double-doubles in a Big 12 game and the first time since Elijah Johnson, Jeff Withey and Kevin Young each recorded a double-double against Iowa State (1/9/13).

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Freshman guard Devon Dotson

- Dotson replaced his season high as the freshman scored a team high 24 points (14 in the first half), including a season high four makes from beyond the arc. He has now scored 10+ points in four-straight games.
- Grabbed a season- and career-high 10 rebounds as the freshman recorded his second double-double of the season.
- Dished a team high five assists.
- Went 6-of-6 from the free throw line in overtime.
- Played a season high 45 minutes, the most by a Jayhawk since Devonte' Graham played 45 in an overtime victory over Duke (3/25/18). Dotson's 45 minutes were the most by a Jayhawk in a conference game since Perry Ellis tallied 53 minutes against Oklahoma (1/4/16).

Freshman Ochai Agbaji

- Earned his second double-double of the season scoring 20 points while grabbing 11 rebounds.
- Agbaji has now scored 20+ in back-to-back games and three times in his last five games.

RS-Junior forward Dedric Lawson

- Recorded his 16th double-double of the season, the 52nd of his career as Lawson tallied 14 points along with 10 rebounds.
- Lawson's 16 double-doubles now rank him ninth on the school's single-season DDs list, now 11 behind the single-season record of 27.
- His double digit effort marked the 13th-consecutive game Lawson has scored 10+ points.

Sophomore forward Mitch Lightfoot

- Lightfoot grabbed six rebounds along with a season high three blocked shots.

Redshirt-sophomore K.J. Lawson

- Lawson scored in double digits for the first time as a Jayhawk as he finished with 10 points on 4-of-6 shooting in just 15 minutes of play.
