### KANSAS' LOSS...

- Made Kansas 20-7 and 9-5 in conference play, tying last season's league loss number.
- Gave Texas Tech its first win against Kansas in Lubbock since March 4, 2009, ending a KU seven-game winning streak in Lubbock meetings.
- Gave KU just its 10th loss under Bill Self in games following five or more days off. Kansas is now 70-10 in such games since 2003-04 and 4-1 this season.
- Made the KU-TTU series 35-6 in favor of Kansas, including a 14-5 mark in Lubbock meetings (10-4 in United Supermarkets Arena).
- Made KU 2-7 in true road games this season and 6-7 in games not played in Allen Fieldhouse in 2018-19.
- Made Bill Self 467-103 while at Kansas, 674-208 overall and 22-8 all-time versus Texas Tech (21-5 while at KU).
- Made Kansas 2,268-856 all-time.

### TEAM NOTES

- Kansas' 20 first half points is the lowest by the Jayhawks in a half since KU scored 20 against Baylor (2/10/18).
- KU's 25-point halftime deficit was its largest halftime deficit since Kansas trailed 47-22 at Baylor on Feb. 12, 2001.
- The contest marked the first time this season Kansas has not held a lead in a game.
- KU's 29-point defeat marked its largest margin of defeat since Kentucky defeated Kansas by 32 on Nov. 18, 2014) and the largest by a conference opponent since Oklahoma State topped the Jayhawks by 33 on Feb. 7, 2000.
- Kansas' 23 rebounds were its fewest since Kansas grabbed 23 against Kansas State on Feb. 14, 2011.
- Dedric Lawson was the only Jayhawk to score in double-figures marking the fewest double-figure scorers for KU since Kansas had just one against TCU on Jan. 28, 2015.
- Kansas gave up a season-high 91 points. KU is now 3-7 in the Self era when its opponent tallies 90 or more.

### OPPONENT NOTES

- TTU's 16 3-pointers marked the third-most ever by a Jayhawk opponent and the most this season. It also tied the TTU school record for single-game 3-pointers.
- The Red Raiders were 16-of-26 from 3-point range on the night for a 61.5 percent clip. That's the best 3-point shooting by a KU opponent with a minimum of five attempts since Iowa State hit 64.7 percent of its tries on Feb. 5, 2001.
- The Red Raiders shot a blistering 60.7 percent from the field, the highest by a Kansas opponent since Long Beach State shot 62.8 percent on Jan. 25, 1993.
- Texas Tech's 68.0 percent (17-of-25) clip from the field in the second half was the best field goal percentage by a KU opponent in a half since Iowa State also went for 68 percent in the second half of its game against KU in the Big 12 tournament final on March 14, 2014.
- Tech's 91 points is the most by a Jayhawk opponent since Iowa State hit 92 (2/4/17) and the most in a non-overtime game since Iowa State tallied 94 in a Jayhawk loss (3/14/14).

### INDIVIDUAL NOTES

#### RS-Junior forward Dedric Lawson

- Tallied 14 points including a 7-of-8 mark from the free throw line. Lawson has now scored 10-plus points in 25 games this season and 81 times in his career.
- Has now hit a 3-pointer in each of his last nine games. In that nine-game span, he has hit 17-of-33 (52 percent) from beyond the arc.

#### Freshman forward David McCormack

- Went perfect from the field with a 3-for-3 line scoring eight points and grabbing four rebounds.

#### RS-Sophomore guard Charlie Moore

- Connected on three 3-pointers, his second most in a game on the year, and the fourth time this season he has hit multiple triples.
