The combined 113-points marked the fewest in the Sunflower Showdown at Allen Fieldhouse since the teams combined for 109 points in a 62-47 Kansas victory on February 17, 1999.

ATTENDANCE: 16,300 (290th-consecutive sellout)

KANSAS' WIN...

- Made Kansas 21-7 and 1-5 in Big 12 play.
- Gave KU 21 victories for the 30th-straight season, beginning in 1989-90.
- Gave KU 10 league victories for the 25th straight year, beginning in 1994-95 and would add to its nation's longest active 10-win streak.
- Made Kansas 68-18 all-time on ESPN Big Monday (39-1 at home) including 50-12 under Self (29-0 at home). KU has now won 33-straight Big Monday games in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made KU 98-48 vs AP Top-25 teams in the Self era including an 8-3 mark this season.
- Gave Kansas its 13th-straight win against Kansas State in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made the KU-KSU series 197-94 in favor of the Jayhawks.
- Extended KU's home court winning streak to 20 games, including 19 in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made Kansas 15-0 in Allen Fieldhouse this season, 787-113 all-time in the venue, including 248-13 under head coach Bill Self.
- Made Self 468-103 while at Kansas, 675-208 overall and 33-6 all-time versus Kansas State (33-6 while at KU).
- Made Kansas 2,269-856 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas used a 9-0 run to erase a 15-11 Kansas State lead and take a 20-15 lead of its own. The Jayhawks never relinquished the lead.
- KU is now 91-12 following a loss in the Bill Self era, including 6-1 this season. Since the 2013-14 season, KU is now 41-4 following a loss.
- The Jayhawks held its opponent to under 59 points for the fourth time this season, the Jayhawks are 4-0 in those games with a 166-1 clip in
- KU tallied 64 points on the night marking the seventh time this season KU has scored between 60-69 points, Kansas is 2-7 in those contests and 68-55 in the Self era.
- KU outrebounded its opponent for the 16th time this season. Kansas is 13-3 in those contests and 347-42 under Self.
- K-State's 49 points marked the lowest by a conference opponent since the Jayhawks limited Texas Tech to 42 points on March 4, 2013. It was also the fewest points by a team in the KU-KSU series since Kansas held the Wildcats to 49 points in a KU win on January 4, 2012.

TEAM NOTES (CONT.)

- KU's eight personal fouls marked a season low and the fewest by the Jayhawks since committing seven against lowa State on February 12, 2011.
- K-State's five made free throws marked the fewest by a KU conference opponent this season and fewest by a Big 12 foe since Texas made three on February 26, 2018.
- Kansas limited Kansas State to just one double-figure scorer, marking the first time an opponent had just one 10-point performer since UMKC had one on December 6, 2016.
- Kansas and K-State combined for 39 made field goals, the fewest by the Jayhawks and their opponent since KU and Oklahoma State combined for 32 on January 13, 2015.

OPPONENT NOTES

Kansas limited Kansas State's three senior starters (Brown, Stokes, Wade) to 24 points while going 8-for-25 from the field. The trio entered the day averaging 38.9 points per game.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

RS-Junior forward Dedric Lawson

- Tallied a team-high 18 points along with a team-high 14 rebounds, marking the 17th double-double of the season and the 53rd of his career.
- Lawson is now tied for eighth-place for most double-doubles in a single season by a Jayhawk with Dave Robisch who tallied 17 in 1971.
- Attempted 20 field goals which is the most by a Jayhawk since Malik Newman took 21 against Iowa State on January 9, 2018. Fourteen of those attempts came in the second half, marking the most attempts in a half since Sherron Collins had 14 attempts in the second half against North Dakota State on March 20, 2009.

Freshman guard Devon Dotson

- Dotson swiped his 40th steal of the season, moving him into a tie with Jeff Boschee for 10th all-time in a single season as a freshman.
- With his 5-for-5 performance from the line, Dotson moved past Mario Chalmers who made 89 free throws in 2006 and sits tied with Xavier Henry who sank 90 in 2010 for fifth all-time in free throws made in a single season by a freshman.

Junior forward Mitch Lightfoot

- Lightfoot recorded three blocks in a game for the 10th time in his career. He has now swatted three shots in three of his last four games.
- The junior set a career high with 31 minutes, replacing his old mark of 27 minutes against Penn on March 15, 2018.
- Lightfoot scored a season high nine-points going 3-for-5 from the field.
- Going 1-for-2 from deep, Lightfoot recorded his first make from deep this season and his first in since he made a shot from beyond-the-arc against Texas A&M on January 7, 2018.

Freshman guard Quentin Grimes

Scored in double figures for the second time in conference play as the freshman tallied 12 points including a 3-for-6 clip from three-point range.
