KANSAS' WIN...

- Made Kansas 22-7 and 11-5 in Big 12 play
- Gave Kansas 22 victories for the 30th-consecutive season, beginning in 1989-90
- Gave KU 11 league victories for the 25th-straight year, beginning in 1994-95 and added to its nation's longest active league 11-win streak
- Made the Kansas-Oklahoma State series 116-59 in favor of the Jayhawks, including 37-35 in meetings in Stillwater (35-35 in Gallagher-Iba Arena)
- Made Kansas 3-7 in true road games in 2018-19 and 7-7 in games not played in Allen Fieldhouse
- Made Bill Self 469-103 while at Kansas, 676-208 overall and 20-13 all-time versus Oklahoma State (19-10 while at KU)
- Made Kansas 2,270-856 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas trailed at the half for the 10th time this season, the Jayhawks are
 7-3 in those contests. 71-68 in the Self era.
- Trailing 39-32 with 18:18 left in the second half, Kansas went on a 16-2 run to take a 48-41 lead. OSU responded with a 16-7 run as the Cowboys regained the lead at 57-55 with 8:45 remaining.
- Kansas played lockdown defense against the Cowboys down the stretch as OSU went scoreless for the final 4:02 of the game. Kansas went on an 8-0 to close the game and held the Cowboys to 2-of-9 from the field in that final four-minute span.
- OSU's two free throw makes in the game marked the fewest by a KU opponent since West Virginia hit just one on February 17, 2018.
- Kansas and OSU were tied with 5:00 remaining marking just the second time this season KU hit the 5:00 mark tied with its opponent. Kansas is 2-0 in those contests and 6-3 in the Self era.
- The Jayhawks outrebounded their opponent for the 17th time this season, KU is 14-3 in those games and 348-42 in the Self era.
- KU held OSU to 67 points, the 10th time this season KU's opponent scored between 60-69 points. Kansas is 9-1 in those matchups and 180-29 in the Self era.
- OSU's 67-points marked the fewest the Cowboys have scored against Kansas in Gallagher-Iba Arena since the OSU tallied 67 on February 7, 2015.
- KU committed more turnovers (14) than its opponent (11) for the 14th time this season, the Jayhawks are now 8-6 in those meetings with a 182-69 record in the Self era.
- In their two meetings, OSU outscored KU 73-68 in the first half while the Jayhawks outscored the Cowboys 88-66 in the second half.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

RS-Junior forward Dedric Lawson

- Recorded his 18th double-double of the season, 54th of his career (20 points and 15 rebounds). His 15 boards tied for a season high.
- Lawson's 18 double-doubles ties for seventh all-time with Danny Manning (1987) for the most double-double's in a single season by a Jayhawk.
- His 9-of-9 clip from the free throw line marked the most consecutive made by a Jayhawk in a game since Devonte Graham made 13-straight against Texas Tech on January 2, 2018. Lawson is 26-of-27 from the line in his last four games.

Freshman guard Quentin Grimes

- Has now scored in double figures for two-straight games and nine times overall this season.
- His four hits from deep marked the most by Grimes since the freshman drained six against Michigan State on November 6, 2018.
- With his seven attempts from three, Grimes moved past Paul Pierce (1996) and Sherron Collins (2007) into ninth place all-time from three point attempts in a single season by a freshman with 120 attempts.
- Grimes matched his season high with 36 minutes played.

Freshman guard Devon Dotson

- Tallied 11 points, finishing in double figures for the first time since February 16 when the freshman tallied 10 against West Virginia.
- Took a season-high eight shots from 3-point range.

Junior forward Mitch Lightfoot

• Lightfoot scored seven points to go along with a career-high three assists.

Sophomore guard Marcus Garrett

• Tied his season high with six rebounds.
