KANSAS' WIN...

- Made Kansas 23-8 and 12-6 in Big 12 play, giving KU the outright No. 3 seed for the Big 12 Championship, March 13-16
- Gave Kansas 23 victories for the 30th-consecutive season, beginning in 1989-90
- Gave KU 12 league victories for the 19th-straight year, beginning in 2000-01
- Made the Kansas-Baylor series 32-5 in favor of KU, including 17-0 in games in Lawrence (16-0 in Allen Fieldhouse)
- Gave Kansas 36-straight home season finale wins, a streak which started in 1983-84
- Gave Kansas its 20th undefeated season in Allen Fieldhouse and its first since going 16-0 in 2015-16
- Made KU 17-0 at home this season and extend its home court winning streak to 21 games, 20 in Allen Fieldhouse
- Made KU 788-113 all-time in Allen Fieldhouse, including 250-13 under head coach Bill Self
- Made Self 470-104 while at Kansas, 677-209 overall and 24-5 all-time versus Baylor (24-4 while at KU)
- Made Kansas 2,271-857 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas held the Bears, the Big 12's most-accurate 3-point shooting team entering the day, to a 0-for-10 start from 3-point range through the game's first 13 minutes.
- Baylor finished the first half shooting 2-for-15 from the 3-point line.
- KU took a lead into halftime for the 17th time this season. Kansas has a 14-3 record in those games and a 382-31 record in the Self era.
- Kansas assisted on eight of their 12 makes in the first half.
- The Jayhawks pushed their lead to 11 (40-29) with an 8-0 run to start the second half.
- KU finished the game with two players (Dedric Lawson and Devon Dotson) attempting double-digit free throws for the first time in 2018-19.
- Since Texas Tech (Feb. 23) shot 61.5 percent from beyond the arch, the Jayhawks have not allowed an opponent to shoot better than 40 percent from 3-point range in the four games since.

OPPONENT NOTES

- Baylor's 22 second chance points were the most by a KU opponent this season, and the most since Oklahoma State tallied 26 points off offensive boards on Feb. 3, 2018.
- Jared Butler's 31 points were the most points scored against Kansas this season and the most since Clemson's Gabe Devoe also tallied 31 against KU on March 23, 2018.

OPPONENT NOTES (CONT.)

- Baylor's seven assists were the fewest by an opponent in Big 12 play this season.
- The Bear's 43 rebounds were the most by a Big 12 opponent inside Allen Fieldhouse this season.
- Baylor's 22 points off turnovers tied Kansas State (Feb. 5) for the most by a Big 12 opponent this season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

RS-Junior forward Dedric Lawson

- Tallied his 20th double-double of the season and the 56th of his career as he scored 23 points and hauled in 14 rebounds. He is now in sole possession of 5th place on Kansas' single season double-doubles list.
- Lawson became just the third Jayhawk to tally 20 double-doubles in a season during the Bill Self era. (Thomas Robinson - 27 in 2012, Cole Aldrich - 21 in 2009.)
- Finished with a team and season-high 11 made free throws. It was the third time this season Lawson has finished with double-digit makes from the free throw line and his first time since Dec. 1, 2018 against Stanford.
- Over his last four games, Lawson is 29-for-31 (93.5 percent) from the free throw line.
- Finished with a team-high three blocks. It is his fourth game this season with three or more rejections.
- Led the team in points for the 17th time this season.

Freshman guard Quentin Grimes

- After going 3-for-4 from three-point range, Grimes moved into 9th place all time for three-point makes in a single season by a freshman with 45 makes.
- With his four attempts from three-point range, Grimes has moved into a tie for 6th place all time with Wayne Selden Jr. (2014) and Mario Chalmers (2006) for three-point field goals attempted by a freshman in a single season with 128.
- Grimes' five assists are the second most he has had this season.

Freshman guard Devon Dotson

- With his 15 points scored, Dotson moved into 12th place all time total points scored in a single season as a freshman with 364.
- After finishing with two steals, Dotson moved into 8th place all time for steals in a single season by a freshman with 42.
- With six free throw makes, Dotson moved into a tie for 3rd place all time with Josh Jackson (2017) and Joel Embiid (2014) for free throws made in a single season by a freshman with 98.
- Tied a career-high with 10 free throws attempted.
- After logging 34 minutes, Dotson has moved into 8th place all time in single season minutes played by a freshman with 1,003.

Freshman forward David McCormack

- Scored a team-high 10 points in the first half going 5-for-7 from the field in just 10 minutes of action.
- Finished the game with double digit points (12) for the fourth time this season and the first time in back-to-back games. In the last two games he has shot 14-for-20 (70 percent) from the field and has grabbed five rebounds in each contest.
