KANSAS' WIN ...

- Made Kansas 89-9 all-time in exhibition games.
- Extended KU's home exhibition winning streak to 51 games dating back to the 1994 season.
- Gave Kansas its 30th-consecutive exhibition victory.
- Made KU 12-0 against Fort Hays State, including 10-0 in exhibition games.
- Improved KU head coach Bill Self to 57-2 in exhibition play while at KU, including 33-0 in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made KU 62-5 in exhibition games in Allen Fieldhouse.

TEAM NOTES

- Led by Junior Marcus Garrett's nine first half points, the Jayhawks took a 36-25 lead into the half.
- After the Tigers trimmed the KU lead to 41-36, the Jayhawks responded with a 12-0 run taking a 53-36 lead with 13:17 to play. Kansas would hold onto a double-digit lead for the remainder of play.
- Kansas shot a solid 47.5 percent from the field in the second half as the Jayhawks outscored Fort Hays State 50-31 in the frame.
- KU outscored the Tigers 28-3 in second chance points.
- The Jayhawks owned the paint as KU tallied 38 points inside while limiting the Tigers to 16.
- Kansas outrebounded Fort Hays State 47-36.
- The Jayhawks attempted 33 shots from beyond-the-arc on the night, which would have been the most by a Jayhawk team since Kansas tallied 32 attempts against Oklahoma on January 23, 2018.
- Kansas' seven turnovers would have marked the fewest by a Jayhawk team since Kansas committed seven against Wofford on December 4, 2018.
- KU outscored Fort Hays State 14-3 on fast break points.

- Kansas was able to grab 20 offensive rebounds leading to 28 second chance points.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Junior Marcus Garrett

- Scored an exhibition career high 15 points on the night going 5-for-10 from the field, including a 4-for-7 mark from beyond-the-arc.
- Would have set a career high in three pointers made with four, surpassing a mark he set against Texas on January 14, 2019.
- Led the Jayhawks with five assists which would have tied his career high and marked the fourth time in his career.

Junior Silvio De Sousa

- Playing in his first exhibition game as a Jayhawk, De Sousa tallied 11 points while grabbing seven rebounds on the night.

Sophomore Ochai Agbaji

- Scored a game high 21 points, which would have been just three shy of his career high 24 points which he set against Texas on January 29, 2019. Agbaji finished 8-for-15 from the field.
- Grabbed six rebounds on the night.

Freshman Christian Braun

- In his first action as a Jayhawk, Braun led all KU freshman with eight points including a 2-for-5 mark from deep.
- Braun added three rebounds to go along with his three assists.
