KANSAS' WIN...

- Made Kansas 2-1 for the seventh time in the Bill Self era (2006-07, 2011-12, 2013-13, 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17).
- Made the KU-Monmouth series 1-0 in favor of Kansas.
- Made the Jayhawks 16-1 against current membership of the MAAC.
- Gave KU its 23rd-straight home win, including 22 in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made KU 790-113 all-time in Allen Fieldhouse, including 252-13 under Self.
- Improved Self to 475-107 while at Kansas and 682-212 for his career.
- Made Kansas 2,276-860 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas took a 26-4 lead with 11:00 remaining in the first half. The Jayhawks forced Monmouth to go 0-for-11 from the field while committing six turnovers in the opening nine minutes.
- Kansas took a 59-21 lead into the half, marking the largest lead by the Jayhawks at the intermission since Kansas led Alcorn State 53-12 (41 pts) on Dec. 2, 2009.
- It also marked the most points by the Jayhawks in a half since Kansas scored 59 in the first half against Toledo on Nov. 28, 2017.
- The Jayhawks' 112 points were their most since KU tallied 114 against Texas Southern on Nov. 21, 2017. The Jayhawks are now 26-0 when scoring 100+ in the Self era.
- Kansas' 14 makes from deep marked the most by the Jayhawks since KU made 15 against West Virginia on Mar. 10, 2018.
- KU committed just seven turnovers on the night, the fewest by a Kansas team since they committed four against Texas on Jan. 14, 2019. Kansas has committed 17 turnovers in its last two games after committing 18 in the opening half against Duke on Nov. 8.
- Kansas' bench tallied 66 points, nine more than Monmouth's team scored on the night.
- The Jayhawks improved to 169-1 when holding its opponent to under 60 points in the Self era.
- KU finished the night with a 56.1 percent from the field, its best shooting night since hitting 56.4 percent against West Virginia on March 10, 2018.
- Kansas' 55-point victory was its largest since KU defeated Chaminade 123-72 on Nov. 23, 2015.
- KU never trailed on the night, leading for a total of 39:09.
- KU held Monmouth to 23.1 percent shooting (18-60) from the field, the lowest by a Kansas opponent since Texas posted 21.8 percent shooting in Lawrence on Feb 16, 2013.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Senior Udoka Azubuike

- Finished a perfect 5-for-5 on the night including a 2-of-4 mark from the free throw line as the senior scored 12 points while grabbing eight rebounds along with three blocks.

Senior Isaiah Moss

- Moss' 5-for-6 clip from beyond-the-arc marked the most threes made by a Jayhawk since Quentin Grimes made five against West Virginia on Mar. 15, 2019.
- Finished with a team-high 21 points.

Junior Silvio De Sousa

- In his first-career start as a Jayhawk, De Sousa finished with 11 points while grabbing six rebounds and adding one block.
- Made his first career three in his first career attempt.

Sophomore Devon Dotson

- Tallied 17 points going 4-for-9 from the field while making 7-of-9 from the free throw line.
- Dotson added four assists, while committing just two turnovers.

Sophomore David McCormack

- Posted his first career double-double as the sophomore scored 17 points while grabbing 11 rebounds.
- Dished a career-high four assists.

Redshirt-Freshman Elijah Elliott

- Scored his first points as a Jayhawk, finished 1-for-2 on the night while adding his first-career assist.

Freshman Christian Braun

- Went a perfect 4-of-4 from the field, 3-for-3 from deep as Braun scored 11 points on the night.
- Braun's two rebounds, two steals and one assist were his first of each as a Jayhawk.

Freshman Michael Jankovich

- Tallied his first career points as a Jayhawk as he finished the night with five points.
