KANSAS' WIN...

- Made Kansas 6-1 or better for the eighth straight season, starting in 2012-13, and for the 15th time in the 17-year Bill Self era.
- Made the KU-Dayton series 2-1 in favor of the Jayhawks.
- Gave Kansas its third Maui Jim Maui Invitational title (1996, 2015, 2019).
- Made KU 18-6 all-time in the Maui Jim Maui Invitational, 3-1 in title games.
- Made KU 16-6 in games at Lahaina Civic Center.
- Gave Kansas its sixth straight win in the Maui Invitational.
- Gave KU its 14th-straight in-season tournament victory.
- Improved Self to 479-107 while at Kansas and 686-212 for his career.
- Made Kansas 2,280-860 all-time.
- Improved KU's overtime record to 71-57 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Devon Dotson (31) and Udoka Azubuike (29) combined for 60 points the most by a KU combo since Terry Brown and Alonzo Jamison combined for 65 against NC State on Jan. 5, 1991.
- Kansas trailed 37-36 at the half, marking just the second time this season the Jayhawks have been behind at the break. Kansas is now 1-1 in those contests with a 72-72 mark in the Self era.
- Dayton's eight makes from deep in the first half was the most by a KU opponent since Auburn sank nine in the first half on Mar. 23, 2019.
- Kansas used an 11-0 run to erase a 66-58 deficit, its largest of the season, and take a 69-66 lead over Dayton with 2:25 remaining.
- Kansas trailed at the 5:00 mark for the first time this season. With the win Kansas is now 34-86 when trailing with 5:00 remaining in the Self era.
- Dotson and Ochai Agbaji finished the night playing 45 minutes each, the most by a Jayhawk since Dotson tallied 45 minutes against TCU on Feb. 11, 2019.
- Dayton's 16 makes from deep marked the most by a Kansas opponent since Texas Tech hit 16 on Feb. 23, 2019.
- The Jayhawks outscored Dayton 52-22 in the paint, marking the fifth-straight game Kansas has outscored its opponent by 20 or more points in the paint.
- KU's 17 points in overtime was the most by the Jayhawks since Kansas tallied 18 against Tennessee on Nov. 23, 2018 to win the NIT Tip Off.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Senior Udoka Azubuike

- Earned tournament Co-MVP honors after averaging 18.3 points and 6.7 rebounds per game in his three outings in Maui.
- Tallied a career-high 29 points, passing his old mark of 26 points against Nebraska on Dec. 16, 2017.
- Azubuike's 12 2-point field goals marked the most by a Jayhawk since he sank 12 against Stanford on Dec. 21, 2017.
- He posted nine points in overtime, the most by a Jayhawk in an extra period since Malik Newman had 13 points against Duke on March, 25, 2018.
- His four blocks tied a season high and marked the 31st time in his career he has posted multiple blocks in a game.

Sophomore Devon Dotson

- Earned tournament Co-MVP honors after averaging 21.0 points, 4.3 rebounds and 4.2 assists per game in his three outings in Maui.
- Finished with a career-high 31 points, replacing his previous high of 25 which he posted against TCU on Feb. 11, 2019. His 11 field goals were also a career high.
- Dotson's 31 points was the highest point total by a Kansas sophomore since Malik Newman tallied 32 against Duke on Mar. 25, 2018.
- Dotson's five steals marked the most swipes by a Jayhawk since Marcus Garrett had six steals against West Virginia on Jan. 19, 2019. This clip also marked the most by a KU sophomore since Marcus Garrett had six steals against West Virginia on Jan. 19, 2019.
- Tied his career high with 10 free throw attempts, a mark he had set twice previously against Baylor, the most recent on Mar. 9, 2019.

Junior Marcus Garrett

- Finished the night with 18 points, going 6-for-10 from the field while adding seven rebounds and two assists.
