### MISCELLANEOUS:

- Coin Toss: Kansas won the toss and deferred to the second half. The Cyclones will receive the Jayhawks' kickoff. Kansas will defend the north goal.

### TEAM NOTES

- Going up against No. 22-ranked Iowa State today in Ames, this marked the third-consecutive game in which the Jayhawks faced not only a Top-25 team, but the third-straight week they took to the gridiron against the No. 22 team in the nation.
- With junior K **Liam Jones'** 36-yard field goal in the first quarter, the Jayhawks took their first lead in a game since playing the Oklahoma Sooners on Oct. 5.
- Prior to today's game, Iowa State had outscored the Jayhawks, 72-3, in the teams' previous two meetings (L, 3-27 in Lawrence in 2018 and L, 0-45 in Ames in 2017). The Jayhawks' 31 points on Saturday were the most against the Cyclones since the 2014 matchup, in which KU defeated Iowa State, 34-14.

### OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Sophomore RB **Pooka Williams Jr.**, surpassed the 2,000-yard mark for his KU career with a 48-yard gain in the second quarter. It made him the first KU football player to 2,000 career rushing yards in his first two seasons since Gale Sayers (1962-63). For the afternoon, Williams carried the ball 19 times for a total of 154 yards, which brought his career total as a Jayhawk to 2,070 yards with the game next Saturday against Baylor (Nov. 30) left to be played this season.
- Williams'** 33-yard carry with 1:36 remaining on the clock in the second quarter of play marked his third 100-plus-yard rushing game of the 2019 season and the eighth of his career, which moved him into a tie for eighth place in number of career rushing-100-yard games with Jake Sharp (2006-09).
- Through their first two seasons, Pooka Williams Jr., and Gale Sayers hold similar stat lines, with Williams carrying the football 342 times for 2,7yards and 10 touchdowns in 21 career games, while Sayers rushed the ball 290 times for 2,042 yards and 14 touchdowns in 20 career games.
- Senior QB **Carter Stanley** surpassed David Jaynes to claim sole possession of second place in most career passing touchdowns in KU history with 37 with his touchdown pass to **Stephon Robinson Jr.**, in the fourth quarter. The only person with more passing TDs in Kansas football history is Todd Reesing (90).
- That Stanley to Robinson connection was also **Robinson's** eighth TD reception of the season, which is tied for fourth most in a KU season.
- Freshman FB **Spencer Roe** caught a two-yard reception in the third quarter from Stanley, which marked the first catch of his KU career, as well as his first touchdown reception as a Jayhawk.

### DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Senior S **Mike Lee** led the Kansas defensive effort with 13 total tackles, seven of them solo, his most of the 2019 season (previously nine, achieved twice, most recently at Oklahoma State [Nov. 16]). The total surpassed his career high of 12 tackles in a KU game, previously achieved two times, most recently against Texas in 2016.
- Lee's** double-digit tackles (13) Saturday in Ames were his fifth double-digit tackling game in his Kansas career (previous four: 10 at K-State in 2018; 10 vs. West Virginia in 2017; 12 vs. Iowa State and 12 vs. Texas in 2016).
- Lee** picked off Iowa State QB Brock Purdy in the third quarter with 1:30 on the clock for his first interception of the 2019 season. It marked his fifth-career INT of his four-year career in the Crimson and the Blue.
- Sophomore LB **Jay Dineen** set a new season and career high with 10 tackles (six of the solo variety), surpassing his previous bests of six tackles, set at Oklahoma State in last week's game (Nov. 16).
- Sophomore S **Davon Ferguson** tallied eight tackles total against the Cyclones (five solo, three assisted). The number tied his season and Kansas-career best, achieved two other times this season, most recently at Oklahoma State.

### SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- With his three field goal makes in the first half (Q1: 36, 37, Q2: 30), **Jones** set a new season and career high for most FGs made in a game.
