KANSAS' WIN...

- Made Kansas 7-1 or better for the sixth straight season, starting in 2014-15, and for the 12th time in the 17-year Bill Self era.
- Made the KU-Colorado series 124-40 in favor of the Jayhawks, including 63-7 in meetings in Lawrence (54-5 in Allen Fieldhouse).
- Gave Kansas its 30th-consecutive win against Colorado in Allen Fieldhouse, a streak which started in Jan. 14, 1984.
- Extended Kansas' homecourt winning streak to 25 games with 24 of those in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made KU 4-0 in Allen Fieldhouse this season, 792-113 all-time in the venue, including 254-13 under Self.
- Improved Self to 480-107 while at Kansas and 687-212 for his career
- Made Kansas 2,281-860 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- The KU defense kept Colorado without a field goal from the 4:32 mark of the first half, to the 16:12 mark of the second, an 8:20 stretch that saw the Jayhawks go on a 16-6 run.
- KU held the Buffaloes to 30 percent (18-of-60) from the field, tying the Jayhawks' season-low by an opponent (Wofford, Nov. 15).
- The Jayhawks held the Buffaloes without a two-point field goal until the 6:24 mark in the first half.
- The Jayhawks hit the majority its tries (52.9 percent, 27-51) from the field for the fifth time in its last six games -- This against a Colorado defense who entered the night having held its first seven opponents to 37.8 percent.
- KU is now 5-0 on the year and 256-9 in the Bill Self era when shooting 50 percent or better.
- The Jayhawks held their third opponent of the season to under 60 points. KU is now 171-1 under Bill Self in those instances.
- With Ochai Agbaji posting a game-high 20 points, Kansas has now seen five different Jayhawks lead the team in scoring in its first eight outings.
- Kansas never trailed in the game, leading for 39:41 of the 40 minutes. It marked the longest KU has led in a game since the Jayhawks led UAB for 39:49 on Nov. 21, 2016.
- The Jayhawks outscored the Buffaloes 38-22 in the paint, and has now held a double-digit edge in the paint against seven of its eight opponents this season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Sophomore Ochai Agbaji

- Had 20 points and 12 rebounds, making for his third-career double-double and the first of this season.
- Made a team-high four three-pointers, shooting an efficient 4-of-6 from long range. It was the fifth time in his KU career he has connected on three or more triples in a game.

Senior Udoka Azubuike

- Added 12 points on 6-of-7 from the field, moving his season field goal percentage to 80.3 percent (53-66), which leads the nation.
- Tallied three blocks, bringing his career total to 108. He is now 17th on the KU all-time blocks chart, moving past Patrick Richey and Drew Gooden.

Sophomore Devon Dotson

- Hit a career-high 10 free throws
- With his 10-of-11 clip from the free throw line, is 29-of-32 (90.6 percent) from the charity stripe in his last five outings.
- Added six assists, tied for the team lead and two shy of his career high.
