KANSAS' WIN...

- Made Kansas 12-2 or better for the second-straight season and for the 10th time in the 17-year Bill Self era.
- Made the Jayhawks 16-1 in Big 12 road opener under Bill Self, and 30-2 over the last 32 seasons.
- Made KU 2-0 in Big 12 play for the 14th time in the Self era.
- Made Kansas 2-1 in true road games this season and 5-2 in games away from Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made the KU-Iowa State series 183-66 in favor of the Jayhawks, including a 71-40 advantage in Ames (27-22 in Hilton Coliseum).
- Improved Self to 485-108 while at Kansas, 692-213 for his career and 28-10 against Iowa State.
- Made Kansas 2,287-861 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas' 26-point victory was the largest for the Jayhawks in Ames since KU defeated Iowa State 50-17 on Jan. 17, 1919.
- The 20-point lead by KU was the largest by a Jayhawk team in the Self era in Ames, replacing a previous mark of 13 set on Jan. 23, 2010 when KU led 38-25 at the half.
- The lead at intermission was Kansas' largest Big 12 road lead at the half since KU led Texas 47-23 in Austin on Feb. 29, 2016.
- Iowa State's 53 points was the fewest by the Cyclones against KU in Ames since ISU tallied 52 on Feb. 28, 1999.
- After the Cyclones opened the game hitting nine of its first 17 shots (52.4 percent), the Jayhawk defense held ISU to just 26.8% (11-of-41) over the final 28 minutes of the contest.
- KU limited its opponent to under 60 points for the eighth time this season. The Jayhawks are 7-1 in those games with a 175-2 record in the Self era.
- Kansas' 10 3-pointers were its most in a Big 12 road game since the Jayhawks sunk 17 at Texas on Dec. 29, 2019.
- Kansas connected on 10-of-19 3-point tries, good for a 52.9% clip from beyond the arc. It was the best shooting performance of the season from deep for the Jayhawks, who entered the night hitting 35.6% from three

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Senior Udoka Azubuike

- Went 4-of-5 from the free throw line. His 80% clip from the charity stripe was the highest of his career with a minimum of five attempts.

Sophomore Devon Dotson

- Tallied 20 points, marking the 20th-straight 10-plus point game. The last time Dotson didn't score in double digits was against Oklahoma on Mar. 5, 2019.
- With his three steals, tallied three or more thefts for the fourth time in his last five outings.

Freshman Christian Braun

- Turned in a 3-of-4 clip from beyond the arc. Over his last three outings, is now 6-of-9 from 3-point range.
- After pulling down five rebounds, has logged 21 rebounds in his last five games, good for a 4.2 average. In his nine games prior, he averaged just 1.4 rebounds per game.

Sophomore Ochai Agbaji

- Connected on 4-of-5 from 3-point range, marking the seventh time in his career he has hit three or more triples. His 80% clip from deep was the highest of his career with a minimum of five attempts.
