KANSAS' WIN...

- Improved KU to 3-1 or better in Big 12 play for the seventh straight season and 16th time in the Bill Self era.
- Made Kansas 96-13 in the Bill Self era in games coming off a loss.
- Gave Kansas consecutive Big 12 road wins for the first time since the 2017-18 season.
- Made Kansas 3-1 in true road game this season and 7-2 in games not played in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made the Kansas-Oklahoma series 148-68 overall in favor of KU, 53-44 in Norman meetings and a 20-19 edge in Lloyd Noble Center battles.
- Improved Self to 486-109 while at Kansas, 693-214 for his career and 21-7 against Oklahoma, 21-5 while at Kansas.
- Made Kansas 2,288-862 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas forced Oklahoma to go 9-for-32 from the field in the first half, marking the seventh time this season that KU has held its opponent to under 10 makes from the field in the first half.
- Kansas' victory ended a two-game losing streak in Norman.
- KU's 14-point victory marked the largest over OU in Norman in the Self era and the largest by KU in Norman since Kansas defeated Oklahoma 69-54 on Feb. 8, 1975.
- Oklahoma's 52 points were its fewest against KU in Norman since KU topped OU 60-50 on Feb. 20, 1999.
- OU's 13 fouls was the fewest by a KU opponent in conference play since Texas Tech committed 11 on Feb. 23, 2019.
- Kansas held OU to under 60 points, marking the fourth-consecutive true road game the Jayhawks have limited their opponent to under 60 and the ninth overall time this season. KU is now 8-1 in those contests with a 176-2 record in the Self era.
- KU outscored Oklahoma 32-10 in points in the paint. The Jayhawks have outscored their opponent by 10 or more in the paint 12 times this season.
- Azubuike, Moss and Garrett combined for 51 of Kansas' 66 points.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Senior Udoka Azubuike

- Tallied 16 points while grabbing 14 rebounds, recording his 14th career double-double and sixth of his senior season.
- Added three blocks, bringing his total to 16 rejections in his last four games.
- With his 7-of-10 performance from the field, Azubuike has now hit the minimum to qualify for KU's all-time field goal percentage chart. Azubuike is 378-for-503 in his career, giving him the top spot at 75.1 percent from the field. Azubuike is now ahead of Mark Randall, who shot 62 percent from 1987-91.

Senior Isaiah Moss

- Tied his career-high with six threes, the most by a Jayhawk since Lagerald Vick sank six at Baylor on Jan. 12, 2019.
- Attempted a career high 11 threes on the night replacing his previous high of 10, a mark he sat while playing for lowa on Jan. 27, 2019 against Minnesota.
- Finished with a team high 20 points, going 7-of-13 from the field and hitting the 20-point plateu for the second time this year.

Junior Marcus Garrett

 Scored 15 points on a 5-of-12 shooting performance while leading the Jayhawks with five assists.
