SERIES INFO: Kansas leads, 151-68

- KU is now 77-16 in meetings in Lawrence and 50-7 in Allen Fieldhouse. It was the 19th-straight win over OU in Lawrence, a streak which started in 1994.

ATTENDANCE: 16,300 (303rd-consecutive sellout)

KANSAS' WIN...

- Made Kansas 22-3 overall, giving it 22 wins for the 31st-straight season beginning in 1989-90.
- Made Kansas 11-1 in Big 12 play or better for the first time since the 2009-10 season when KU was 12-0 and the third time in the Bill Self era which began in 2003-04 with the other being 11-1 in 2008-09.
- Gave the Jayhawks 11 conference wins for the 26th-consecutive season, a streak which started in 1994.
- Gave Kansas 10-straight wins for the first time this season and the 17th time in the Bill Self era.
- Made KU 12-1 at home this season, including 11-1 in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made KU 799-114 all-time in Allen Fieldhouse, including 261-14 under Self.
- Improve Self to 495-109 while at Kansas, 702-214 for his career and 22-7 all-time against Oklahoma, including 22-5 while at Kansas
- Made Kansas 2,296-862 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- The Jayhawks' 11 3-pointers tied for their most in Big 12 play and their most in a league home game this season.
- KU's 11-of-22 mark from 3-point range (50%) marked the team's second-highest mark from deep this season and the Jayhawks' best clip from beyond the arc with 20 or more attempts since the team also went 11-of-22 against Texas on Jan. 14, 2019.
- Kansas led 41-32 at the end of the first half, the 17th time that Kansas has had the lead going into the locker room this season. KU is now 17-0 when they lead at the end of the first 20 minutes.
- KU ended the first half on a 15-5 run and began the second half on a 16-5 run. Combined, the Jayhawks went on a 31-10 stretch from the 4:40 mark of the first half to the 15:00 mark of the second half.
- The contest also marked the 22nd time the Jayhawks have held their opponent to 70 points or fewer this season. The 2007-08 squad held 31 teams to 70 or under 31 times, the most during the Bill Self era.
- KU held OU to just 35.8% (24-of-67) from the field. It was the 16th time this season that the Jayhawks have held a team to below 40% from the field. Kansas is 15-2 in those games.
- For the third time in Big 12 play, the Jayhawks had four players score in double figures.
- The contest saw 11 lead changes, the most in a game inside Allen Fieldhouse since the KU-Stanford contest switched leads 15 times on Dec. 1, 2018.
- Head coach Bill Self received a technical with 5:49 left in the game. It was Self's first technical of the season.

OPPONENT NOTES

- The Jayhawks' 87 points were the most allowed by the Sooners this season.
- Kristian Doolittle's 27 points marked the most by a Jayhawk opponent in 2019-20. Doolittle's five 3-pointers were also the most by a KU foe this season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Junior Marcus Garrett

- His 24 points bested his previous career-high of 20 points set against Texas last season on Jan. 14, 2019.
- His six threes also marked a new career best, and made him the third Jayhawk (Moss and Braun) to connect on six or more triples in a game this season.
- Garrett, who went 6-of-9 from deep, entered the day with five combined 3-pointers in Big 12 play and had attempted just six threes in his last eight games.
- Led the team in scoring for the first time this season and second time in his career.
- Collected four or more steals for the sixth time this season and the third time in his last four outings. Has collected 16 thefts in those four games.
- Rebounded from his six turnover day on Feb. 12 with just one giveaway against the Sooners.

Senior Udoka Azubuike

- Had 15 points and 17 rebounds to tally his 18th career double-double and 11th this season.
- His 17 rebounds tied his career high. He previously reached the number on Dec. 10, 2019 against Milwaukee.
- With his 10 first-half boards, collected double-figure rebounds in a half for the third time this season. He also pulled down 10 in the first halves against Milwaukee (12/10) and Stanford (12/29).
- His four blocks marked the ninth game of the season he has tallied four or more rejections.
- Those four swats also pushed his career total to 158 and moved him to No. 8 on KU's all-time blocks list.

Sophomore Ochai Agbaji

- Scored in double figures for the 20th time in his career and 11th this season.
- His six rebounds marked the 20th time in his career and 11th time this season he has grabbed five or more boards.

Sophomore Devon Dotson

- Scored in double figures for the 23rd time this season with 19 points.
- Added eight rebounds to tie a season-high. He is now averaging 5.6 rebounds per game over his last five outings.
