Most Outstanding Performers

1948—Harrison Dillard, Baldwin-Wallace

Broke Kansas Relays' and world record with :13.6 performance in 120-yard high hurdles.

1949—Bob Walters, Texas

Scored upset victory over classy field and set Relays record of 6-8 3/16 in high jump.

1950—Bill Carroll, Oklahoma

Set Relays' record of 14-5 in pole vault.

1951—Don Cooper, Nebraska

Set new Relays' and National intercollegiate record of 15½ in pole vault, becoming first collegian in history to reach that magic level outdoors.

1952—Wes Santee, Kansas

Ran unofficial 4:11.6 mile in anchor carry of four-mile relay, and unofficial 3:02.0 in 1320 leg of distance medley. Jayhawkers won both events.

1953—Darrow Hooper, Texas A&M

Completed first twin triple-crown in Relays history by winning shot put in 55-3½, second longest cast in meet annals; and discus throw in 163-2½, the third most lengthy peg on the Relays books.

1954—Wes Santee, Kansas

Ran second-swiftest mile in American history, up to that time, 4:03.1, to bag Glenn Cunningham feature. Overcame 90-yard deficit in anchor carry of distance medley with 4:12.6 to fire Jayhawkers to that title.

1955—Dean Smith, Texas

Won wind-blown 100 in :09.4, anchored Longhorns to victory in 880 relay and led off for winning 440 baton team.

1956—Bobby Whilden, Texas

Tied 26-year-old Relays 100-yard dash record at :09.4 and ran No. 3 leg on Longhorn 440 relay team which bettered world record at :40.1.

1957—Billy Tidwell, Emporia State

Anchored Sprint Medley team to College division record of 3:22.6 with 1:49.5, and Mile quartet to second Relays mark of 3:15.1 on :46.5.

1958—Eddie Southern, Texas

Clocked unofficial :44.6 anchor leg to fire Texas to new Intercollegiate and Relays Mile relay record of 3:09.1. Also anchored Longhorns to 440 Relay victory, and second in 880.
