Team Notes

- Kansas' all-time record goes to 588-655-58.
- The head-to-head series between Kansas and Iowa State moves to 50-44-6, KU, after today's loss.
- Iowa State extends their winning streak to 6.
- Kenny Logan now leads the team with 43 tackles this season.

Offensive Notes

- Freshman offensive guard Armaj Adams-Reed made his first-career start on Saturday.
- Andrew Parchment's 15-yard reception in the first half is the second longest reception of the season for Parchment. Only his 43-yard touchdown at West Virginia was longer.
- Luke Grimm set career highs in receiving yards (53) and receptions (4)
- Luke Grimm's 36-yard reception in the second quarter was a season high, breaking the 28-yard reception he had at Kansas State.
- Jalon Daniels' 36-yard pass to Luke Grimm in the second quarter was the longest passing play of the season and the fifth longest play of the season for the Kansas offense.
- Daniel Hishaw Jr., scored his first career touchdown in the second quarter for Kansas' first touchdown of the day.
- Mason Fairchild set a new career-high with three receptions. His previous best was two, which he set last week against K-State.
- Jalon Daniels 13-yard rush in the third quarter was a career high, topping his 11-yard run vs Baylor.
- Jalon Daniels made his first start as an 18-year old. His previous three starts were when he was 17.
- Kwamie Lassister II hauled in five receptions for a total of 66 yards, the most he's accumulated this season.
- A pass from Andrew Parchment to Kwamie Lassister was the second two-point conversion completed this season. The last successful two-point conversation was against Coastal Carolina in the season opener. This was Parchment's second two-point conversion pass, previously against Texas Tech on October 26, 2019.

Defensive Notes

- DaJon Terry tied his career high with 1.0 sack in the first quarter.
- Only two Jayhawks from 2019 had more sacks than DaJon Terry's 2.0 sacks in 2020, Azur Kamara (3.5-22) and Darrius Moragne (2.5-13)
- Karon Prunty recorded six tackles, a new career-high.
- Ricky Thomas recorded a career-high seven tackles with five coming in the first half. Moving his season total to 14.
- Nick Channel tied a career-high eight tackles, which he previously set vs Oklahoma State.
- Elijah Jones had four tackles in the first half and tied a career-high five tackles, which he previously set at Baylor on September 26.
- Kenny Logan Jr. tallied his first career interception in the fourth quarter, returning it 12-yards to the Kansas 30-yard line. The interception is the second for the Jayhawks this season and first since Malcolm Lee's interception at West Virginia.

Special Teams Notes

- Junior Ben Miles recorded his second kick return for 7 yards.
- Kenny Logan's 100-yard kick return for a touchdown was the first of his career. Logan finished with 124 kickoff return yards in Saturday's game. The 100-yard return is the longest return of the season and is tied for second in program history - tied with Greg Heaggans vs. Missouri State (Sept. 14, 2002), Eric Vann vs. Oklahoma (Oct. 5, 1996) and June Henley vs. Colorado (Nov. 13, 1993).
- Reis Vernon's 44-yard punt in the first quarter eclipsed his previous season-high 39-yard punt against Kansas State. Vernon later bested that mark on a 50-yard punt at the end of the first quarter.
- Freshman Kyler Pearson made his first appearance in a Kansas uniform and recorded his first-ever kickoff return for 18 yards.
