KANSAS' WIN...

- Made Kansas 10-2 or better for the seventh-straight season beginning in 2014-15.
- Was Kansas' third-straight win against Oklahoma and made the series 151-68 all-time.
- Gave KU its 20th-straight win against Oklahoma in Allen Fieldhouse, a streak which started in 1994.
- Made Kansas 6-1 in Allen Fieldhouse this season, 808-115 all-time in the venue, including 270-15 under Bill Self.
- Improved Self to 511-111 while at Kansas, 718-216 all-time and 23-7 against Oklahoma, 23-5 while at KU.
- Made Kansas 2,312-864 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- In the middle of the first half, Kansas went on a 11-0 run over 3:11 shooting 4-for-4 from the field to take the lead, ended by a made 3-pointer by OU's Kur Kuath.
- Including the first run, Kansas made 6-of-8 field goals, ending the half shooting 48%.
- Following Oklahoma's 7-0 run, Kansas went on its own 7-0 run, ended by a made jumper by the Sooners' Austin Reaves.
- Kansas took the lead 16-15 with 11:36 to go in the half, making it the first time Kansas led in the game at home since West Virginia visited Allen Fieldhouse on December 22 (48:14).
- Towards the end of the half, Kansas did not score for 2:28, ended by a made layup by Tristan Enaruna.
- Following Enaruna's layup, Kansas went on a scoring drought for 3:04 partnered with five turnovers to end the half.
- In the middle of the second half, Kansas went 4-for-4 from the field. Shortly therafter, Kansas did not score for another 5:06, shooting 0-for-5 from the field. This scoring drought was ended by a made free throw by Jalen Wilson.
- Kansas did not make a field goal for 8:29, ended by a layup made by Marcus Garrett.
- Following this drought, Kansas ended the game going 6-for-8 from the field.
- Kansas attempted 47 field goals, which tied for the Jayhawks' lowest number of shot attempts in a game this season.
- Kansas shot 11-of-19 from the free-throw line (57.8%), the lowest FT% this season.
- After this game, Kansas is 9-0 when leading the game with 5:00 remaining in regulation and 10-0 when out-rebounding its opponent this season.
- The Jayhawks turned the ball over 16 times, tied for the most this season.
- Since 2017-2018, Kansas is now 28-6 (.823) in contests decided by five points or less.

OPPONENT NOTES

Oklahoma scored 59 points in the game. The last time a Kansas opponent scored less than 60 points in Allen Fieldhouse was against Omaha on December 11, 2020.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Marcus Garrett made the 62nd start of his Kansas career after snapping his 41-start streak last game when he was out due to injury.
- Mitch Lightfoot's four points at half tied his second most this season, done five times. The redshirt-senior finished the game with seven points.
- Jalen Wilson's six turnovers before the half was already a career high. He ended the game with seven turnovers, which marked the most turnovers committed by a Jayhawk this season. The last time a Jayhawk had seven+ turnovers in a game was Devon Dotson against West Virginia on January 19, 2019.
- David McCormack scored 17 points, his sixth double-figure scoring game of the season, his second straight and third time in the last four games.
- McCormack's 17 points made him KU's leading scorer for the second-straight game, and third time this season overall.
- Tonight marked Ochai Agbaji's seventh game this season making three or more 3-point FGs and 15th of his career. Including this game, Kansas is 15-0 when Agbaji makes three or more treys.
- Christian Braun's nine rebounds were his most in four games, since he pulled down 10 at Texas Tech (12/17). He has seven or more boards four times this season.
- Lightfoot's two blocks moved him to 17th among Kansas' all-time block leaders with 110 blocks.
- McCormack; s streak of 21-made free throws ended when he missed a pair of free throws in the first half.
- Wilson pulled down 11 rebounds to lead the Jayhawks and mark his fourth game with 10+ rebounds this season.
