KANSAS' WIN...

- Made Kansas 20-8 and gave KU 20 victories for the 32nd consecutive season beginning in 1989-90.
- Made KU 3-1 in neutral-site games this season.
- Made Kansas 21-3 in Big 12 Championship quarterfinals.
- Advanced KU to the conference tourney semifinals for the 21st time in Big 12 history and 39th time overall.
- Improved Kansas to 77-28 in league tournament play and 47-12 at the Big 12 Championship.
- Made Kansas 43-10 all-time in T-Mobile Center, including 1-0 this season.
- Made Bill Self 521-117 while at Kansas, 728-22 all-time and 42-13 all-time in conference tournaments (33-8 while at KU).
- Made Kansas 2,322-870 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- In the first half, Kansas forced Oklahoma into a shot clock violation, marking the 23rd opponent shot clock violation Kansas has forced this season. On the flip side, Kansas has only committed six shot clock violations all season.
- Kansas held Oklahoma to just 15 points in the first half, the fewest points allowed in a half all season. The Jayhawks also led by 20 points, marking the fourth time this season Kansas led by 20 or more at the break.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Junior Ochai Agbaji made his 75th consecutive start on Thursday night, which ranks him 12th in KU history on the consecutive start list. The next highest is No. 11 Greg Dreiling who started 78 consecutive games from 1984-86.
- Agbaji scored a career-high 26 points on 9-of-14 from the field and 4-of-8 from beyond the arc, surpassing his previous high of 24 points set against Texas on January 29, 2019. Agbaji's 26 points marks his second 20-point game this season and 20th of his career.
- Agbaji's four 3-pointers marked the 14th game this season and 22nd of his career with three or more makes from beyond the arc.
- Senior Marcus Garrett scored 17 points on Thursday, marking his 13th game this season in double figures, including his third-straight and fifth in his last six games.
- Redshirt freshman Dajuan Harris drew his seventh charge of the season in the first half. He is second on the team in drawn charges, behind only Mitch Lightfoot's team-high 14.
- Harris also swiped four steals on Thursday, tying a career-high previously set against Kentucky on December 1, 2020.
- Senior Mitch Lightfoot scored 11 points on 5-of-10 from the field, marking the second most points he scored this season, behind his career-high 14 points against Omaha on Dec. 11.
