



NCAA DRUG TESTING

- The NCAA reserves the right to drug test 365 days a year
- NCAA will test for:
 - Recreational Drugs
 - Street Drugs
 - Performance-Enhancing Drugs (PEDs)
- Speak with your training staff and consult NCAA.org before ingesting any supplement, vitamin, or drug



NCAA DRUG TESTING

- The penalty for positive tests of both performance-enhancing and street drugs are strict and automatic.
- Performance-Enhancing drugs:
 - First offense: student-athletes lose one full year of eligibility (25% of their total eligibility) and are withheld from competition for a full year
 - Second offense: loss of all remaining eligibility
- Street Drugs
 - First offense: suspension from competition for 50% of the season
 - Second offense: a second positive test for street drugs results in losing a year of eligibility and being withheld from competition for an entire year



BIG 12 DRUG TESTING

- Tests may be administered during the academic year or during Big 12 Championships
- Positive test for a performance enhancing drug: student-athletes will be ineligible for 365 days and will lose one year of eligibility
 - Street drugs: student-athletes are entered into the institutional program
- Reminders for all drug tests:
 - Failure to report = positive test result
 - In addition to a positive Big 12 or NCAA drug test, Kansas Athletics policies will be in effect
 - If a student-athlete is notified by a national or international athletics organization and test positive, he/she is required to notify the director of athletics
 - All student-athletes were notified to consult training staff and strength and conditioning before taking any supplements/vitamins/protein powders, etc.
