#### Team Notes

- Kansas' all-time record goes to 589-610-58.
- Kansas won the toss and elected to receive the opening kickoff.
- Head coach Lance Leipold moved to 1-4 with the Jayhawks, and 145-33 in his career.
- Kansas falls to 26-22-3 against Iowa State in games played in Ames, while Kansas still holds the all-time series advantage at 50-45-6.

#### Offensive Notes

- The Jayhawks rushed for 175 yards against the Cyclones, marking the most in a conference game on the road since Oct. 19, 2019 at Texas.
- In the third quarter, Torry Lockin scored the first Jayhawk points on a 12-yard carry. The touchdown marked Locklin's second rushing touchdown of his career, including his second in as many games. The Jayhawks scored on a nine play, 66 yard drive that took up 4:03 on the clock.
- Super-senior Kwamie Lassiter II recorded 4 receptions on Saturday, moving him into a tie for 10th all-time in Kansas school history in career receptions with 108. He is tied for 10th all-time with Harrison Hill (1997-2001), while surpassing Charles Gordon (11th, 106), Emmett Edwards (12th, 105), and Marcus Henry (13th, 104).

#### Defensive Notes

- Linebacker Gavin Potter led the Jayhawks with seven tackles on Saturday, marking his first game in which he led the team this season. He now has 36 tackles on the season.
- Freshman cornerback Jacobee Bryant set a career high in tackles, recording five. His previous most of three game against Baylor earlier this year.
- Super-senior defensive end Kyron Johnson recorded the team's lone sack of the game, which resulted in a three-yard loss and a fumble. The sack was Johnson's 3.5 of the season and his second forced fumble. Johnson leads the team in sacks this season and his two forced fumbles are tied for first with Kenny Logan Jr.
