## Team Notes

- Kansas' all-time record goes to 589-665-58.
- Kansas State won the loss and deferred to the second half. Kansas received the opening kickoff.
- Head coach Lance Leipold moved to 1-8 with the Jayhawks, and 147-47 in his career.

## Offensive Notes

- Kansas played three quarterbacks, Jason Bean, Miles Kendrick and Jalon Daniels, the first time this season all three played in the same game.
- In the third quarter, Kansas super-senior Kwamie Lassiter II caught his second touchdown of the season and the sixth of his career. Lassiter II finished with six receptions for 82 yards and a touchdown.
- Lassiter's six receptions moves him into eighth in KU history with 125 career receptions. Lassiter II also ranks 19th in KU history with 1,336 yards.
- Sophomore quarterback Jalon Daniels was on the throwing end of the Lassiter II touchdown, marking his first passing touchdown of the season and second of his career. Daniels finished with 13-of-19 passing for 105 yards and a touchdown.
- Kansas freshman Devin Neal finished with 19 carries for 62 yards. The 19 carries are the second-most of the season for Neal.

## Defensive Notes

- In the first half, defensive end Malcolm Lee forced Kansas State quarterback Skylar Thompson into an intentional grounding penalty, resulting in a sack. The sack marks Lee's 2.5 of the season and 3.5 in his career.
- Kansas' Rich Miller finished with eight tackles, marking the fourth game this season Miller has led the team in tackles. He now has 53 to his credit this season.

## Special Teams Notes

- Kicker Jacob Borcila scored the first points of the game for the Jayhawks on a 40-yard field goal. Borcila went 1-of-2 in the game and is 7-of-12 on the season.
- In the third quarter, Punter Reis Vernon booted a 58 yard punt, his second longest of the season, behind his 59-yard long set against Baylor. Vernon finished with four punts for 177 yards on Saturday.
