Team Notes

- Kansas' all-time record goes to 590-666-58.
- TCU won the loss and deferred to the second half. Kansas received the opening kickoff.
- Head coach Lance Leipold moved to 2-9 with the Jayhawks, and 148-48 in his career.
- Kansas had just one penalty for 0 yards on Saturday. The one penalty is a new season-best.

Offensive Notes

- Redshirt senior offensive guard Joey Gilbertson made his first career start on the line at left guard.
- Freshman running back Devin Neal scored a 2-yard touchdown in the first half, giving him eight rushing touchdowns on the season. The eight touchdowns are the most by a freshman since James Sims had nine in 2010.
- Super-Senior wide receiver Kwamie Lassiter II had eight catches for 101 yards. It marked the third 100-yard game of his career and the eight catches tied his career high, set twice before including last game against Texas.
- Lassiter II now has 1,505 career yards, moving him into 15th all-time in program history. He needs 14 more yards to move into 14th. The eight catches gave him 141 for his career, which moved him into sole possession of fifth all-time in program history. He would need 14 more to move into a tie for fourth.
- Sophomore quarterback Jalon Daniels threw for a career-high 255 yards on 22 of 30 passing. He threw two touchdowns and one interception. Daniels now has six touchdown passes on 85 pass attempts, after throwing just one touchdown on 152 attempts last season.
- Sophomore wide receiver Luke Grimm had four catches for 39 yards and a touchdown. He now has touchdown catches in three straight contests. Of the five touchdown catches in his career, three have come against the Horned Frogs after catching two last year.
- Freshman tight end Jared Casey caught the first touchdown catch of his career in the third quarter when he hauled in a 10-yard pass from Daniels. Casey finished with four catches for 34 yards and the touchdown.
- Fellow freshman tight end Trevor Kardell, who entered the game with four catches for 42 yards in his career, had one catch for 44 yards on Saturday.
- Kansas averaged 11.6 yards per completion Saturday, establishing a new season-high. The previous best was 10.7 against Oklahoma.

Defensive Notes

- Junior safety Kenny Logan Jr., finished with a career-high 15 tackles against the Horned Frogs, including two tackles-for-loss. The 15 tackles top his previous high of 14 set earlier this year against Oklahoma. Logan, who entered with two career tackles-for-loss, had multiple TFLs in a game for the first time in his career.
- Super-Senior defensive end Kyron Johnson tied his season-high with eight tackles against TCU. He also picked up a sack, giving him 6.5 for the season. He was one shy of tying his career best. Johnson's 8.5 TFLs and 6.5 sacks on the season are both career-highs for the fifth-year player.
- Super-Senior linebacker Nate Betts picked up the first sack of his career Saturday against TCU in the second half. Betts entered the game with 19 career games to his credit. The sack also marked the first TFL of his career.
- Freshman cornerback Jacobee Bryant came up with an interception for the second-straight week on Saturday. Bryant also had an interception against Texas the previous game. He is the first Jayhawk defender this season to register multiple interceptions on the year.
- Senior defensive tackle Caleb Sampson had six tackles, establishing a new career-high for the Saint Rose, Louisiana native. Sampson's previous high was four, set three times previously, including once this season.
- Sophomore defensive end Jereme Robinson collected the first sack of his career against TCU. Robinson entered with 2.5 TFLs, but had never had a sack until Saturday. Robinson's three tackles also establish a new career-high.
