## KANSAS' WIN...

- Made Kansas 52-6 in its last 58 games following a loss dating back to 2013-14 (105-15 overall under Bill Self).
- Extended its win streak to five straight games against Iowa State.
- Kept KU undefeated in Allen Fieldhouse this season (7-0).
- Made Self 742-225 all-time, including 535-120 while at Kansas.
- Made Kansas 2,336-873 all-time.

## TEAM NOTES

- Kansas' 62 points is its lowest total in a victory over Iowa State in Lawrence since a 62-57 win on Feb. 5, 1949.
- Kansas recorded nine blocks, its most in a conference game since Feb. 1, 2020 vs. Texas Tech (nine blocks).
- Kansas had three players finish in double figures (Ochai Agbaji - 22, Christian Braun - 13, Dajuan Harris Jr. - 12).
- Kansas grabbed 10 offensive rebounds on Tuesday night. KU has secured 10+ offensive rebounds in nine games this season.

## INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Senior Ochai Agbaji had a game-high 22 points on 8-of-15 (53.3 percent) shooting, including a 50.0 percent (4-of-8) clip from three-point range, a season-high-tying seven rebounds and one block in 38 minutes of action. Agbaji has scored 20+ points in nine games this season and 16 times in his career. He now has 1,229 career points to move him into 36th on the all-time KU scoring list, passing Scot Pollard and Greg Dreiling.
- Agbaji started his 92nd consecutive game on Tuesday, he is eighth on the all-time list for consecutive starts at KU. His 194 career three-point field goals put him at ninth on the all-time KU list.
- Redshirt-sophomore Dajuan Harris Jr. scored the game-winning basket on a layup with 7.1 seconds remaining in the game. Harris Jr. finished with 12 points, including a perfect 6-of-6 from the free throw line, and three assists in 37 minutes.
- Junior Christian Braun posted 13 points, a team-high-tying seven rebounds and two assists in 38 minutes. Braun has scored in double figures in 14 straight games.
- Redshirt-sophomore Jalen Wilson dished out a season-high five assists, while also scoring four points and grabbing two rebounds in 24 minutes.
- Freshman KJ Adams Jr. made his first career start. Adams Jr. had three points, two rebounds and two blocks in 10 minutes.
- Freshman Bobby Pettiford played eight minutes in his first game since Dec. 3, 2021 at St. John's.
