KANSAS' WIN...

- Made Kansas 53-6 in its last 59 games following a loss dating back to 2012-13 (106-15 overall under Bill Self).
- Extended its win streak to six straight games against Iowa State.
- Improved its record to 3-2 in games against ranked opponents this season.
- Made Self 747-226 all-time, including 540-121 while at Kansas. With the victory, Self passed Phog Allen on the NCAA Division I all-time wins list.
- Made Kansas 2,341-874 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas shot 56.0 percent (28-of-50) from the field against Iowa State. The Jayhawks have shot 50.0 percent or better in 10 games this season.
- Kansas had four players finish in double figures for the second time in conference play this season (Harris Jr. - 14, McCormack - 14, Braun - 13, Wilson - 13).
- Kansas swiped 12 steals on Tuesday night, its fifth time this season with 10 or more steals. The 12 steals were the most in conference play since the Jayhawks had 13 steals at #14 West Virginia on Feb. 12, 2020.
- Kansas scored 34 points in the paint, nearly half of its total for the game.
- Kansas held a 30-24 advantage at the half. Kansas is 15-1 when leading at the half this season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Senior David McCormack posted his fifth double-double of the season with 14 points on a perfect 7-of-7 shooting, a game-high 14 rebounds, two assists and two blocks in a season-high 31 minutes. McCormack has finished with a double-double in three of his last six games.
- McCormack is the second KU player to shoot a perfect clip (min. 7 FGA) from the field this season (Mitch Lightfoot went 7-of-7 on Jan. 1 vs. George Mason).
- Redshirt-sophomore Dajuan Harris Jr. finished with a career-high-tying 14 points on 6-of-8 (75.0 percent) shooting, two rebounds, a career-high eight assists and a career-high-tying four steals in a career-high 38 minutes. His 6 field goals were also a career high. Harris Jr. has scored in double figures four times this season.
- Redshirt-sophomore Jalen Wilson posted 13 points on 5-of-8 (62.5 percent) shooting, six rebounds, four assists and two steals in 36 minutes.
- Junior Christian Braun had 13 points, three rebounds and two steals in 37 minutes.
- Sophomore Joseph Yesufu added seven points, a season-high five rebounds, a season-high-tying four assists and a season-high three steals in a season-high 23 minutes off the bench.
- Super-senior Jalen Coleman-Lands made his first start of the season. He had six points and two rebounds in 17 minutes.
