## KANSAS' WIN...

- Made KU 8-1 or better in Big 12 play for the 11th time under Bill Self.
- Improved its record to 4-2 in games against AP ranked opponents this season.
- Pushed its record to 10-1 at home this season.
- Made Self 748-226 all-time, including 541-121 while at Kansas.
- Made Kansas 2,342-874 all-time.

## TEAM NOTES

- Kansas had its largest win against an AP Top-10 opponent since an 87-57 victory vs. #9 Oklahoma State on Jan. 10, 2007. The victory was the largest against an AP Top-25 opponent since a 98-66 win against Purdue on March 23, 2017 and the largest win against an AP Top-25 opponent at Allen Fieldhouse since Jan. 2, 2016 vs. #23 Baylor (102-74).
- The 24-point margin of victory was the largest win in the series against Baylor since a 102-74 win on Jan. 2, 2016 at Allen Fieldhouse.
- Kansas' defense held Baylor to 29.6 percent (21-of-71) shooting from the field. That is the lowest percentage by an AP Top-10 ranked KU opponent since #9 Arizona shot 28.3 percent (17-of-60) against KU on Nov. 21, 2005.
- Kansas shot 51.6 percent (32-of-62) from the field against Baylor. The Jayhawks have shot 50.0 percent or better in 11 games this season.
- Kansas posted a season-high 35 defensive rebounds in the contest. The Jayhawks also grabbed 11 offensive rebounds on Saturday. KU has secured 10+ offensive rebounds 14 times this season.
- Kansas limited Baylor to 21 points in the first half, tying an opponent season low (vs. UTEP - 21 points in the first half).
- Kansas held a 39-21 advantage at the half. Kansas is 16-1 when leading at the half this season.

## INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Junior Christian Braun recorded his first double-double of the season with a game-high-tying 18 points on 8-of-14 (57.1 percent) shooting, a game-high 10 rebounds and three assists in 32 minutes. The double-double was the second of Braun's career (Feb. 8, 2021 vs. #23 Oklahoma State). His 18 points were a season high in conference play this season.
- Senior Ochai Agbaji finished with a game-high-tying 18 points, a season-high nine rebounds and two assists in 32 minutes. He now has 1,356 career points which puts him at 30th on the all-time KU scoring list, passing Mario Chalmers. His 213 career three-point field goals have him at seventh on the all-time KU list.
- Redshirt-sophomore Jalen Wilson had 15 points on 7-of-10 (70.0 percent) shooting, seven rebounds, four assists and two steals in 29 minutes. Wilson has scored in double figures seven times this season, including on five occasions in the last seven games.
- Super-senior Mitch Lightfoot contributed eight points on a perfect 4-of-4 shooting from the field, five rebounds and two blocks in 15 minutes off the bench. He now has 140 career blocks, moving into sole possession of 12th on the all-time KU blocked shots list.
- Senior David McCormack added nine points and eight rebounds in 21 minutes of action.
