## KANSAS' WIN...

- Gave KU its 21st win of the season for the 33rd consecutive season, a streak which started in 1989-90, and is the longest active streak in NCAA Division I men's basketball.
- Gave Kansas 10 league wins for the 28th consecutive season, a streak which started in 1994-95 and is the longest active streak in NCAA Division I men's basketball.
- Improved its record on ESPN Big Monday to 76-21 all-time (46-1 at home and 30-20 on the road), including 56-15 under head coach Bill Self (35-0 at home and 22-15 on the road).
- Improved its record to 12-1 in Allen Fieldhouse this season.
- Made Self 750-227 all-time, including 543-122 while at Kansas.
- Made Kansas 2,344-875 all-time.

## TEAM NOTES

- Kansas had five players finish in double figures for the third time this season and the first time in conference play (Agbaji - 20, Braun - 16, McCormack - 12, Harris Jr. - 12, Wilson - 11).
- Kansas grabbed 16 offensive rebounds on Monday. KU has secured 10+ offensive rebounds in 15 games this season.
- Kansas held a 38-28 advantage at the half. Kansas is 17-1 when leading at the half this season.

## INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Senior Ochai Agbaji finished with a game-high 20 points, including a career-high 9 FTM, seven rebounds, four assists and a game-high three steals in 35 minutes. He now has 1,398 career points which puts him at 27th on the all-time KU scoring list. His 217 career three-point field goals have him at seventh on the all-time KU list.
- Senior David McCormack recorded his sixth double-double of the season with 12 points and a game-high 12 rebounds, to go along with two blocks in 28 minutes. McCormack leads the Big 12 with five of those double-doubles coming in conference games. He has four double-digit rebounding games against Oklahoma State in his career.
- Junior Christian Braun had 16 points and four rebounds in 36 minutes. He has scored in double figures in 23 of 25 games this season.
- Redshirt-sophomore Dajuan Harris Jr. contributed 12 points, a game-high five assists and two steals in 35 minutes. Harris Jr. has scored in double figures five times this season, including three times in league play.
- Redshirt-sophomore Jalen Wilson added 11 points and seven rebounds in 25 minutes. Wilson has scored in double figures 10 times this season, including on eight occasions in the last 10 games.
