KANSAS' WIN...

- Makes Kansas 28-6 on the season
- Makes KU 6-1 in neutral-site games this season
- Gives Kansas its 12th Big 12 Championship and makes KU 12-3 in Big 12 title games
- Marks KU's 16th all-time conference postseason tournament title and makes KU 16-7 in title games
- Secures the automatic bid from the Big 12 Conference, advancing Kansas to its 50th all-time NCAA Tournament and its 32nd consecutive
- Improves Kansas to 80-28 in league tournament play and 50-12 at the Big 12 Tournament
- Makes Kansas 46-10 all-time at the T-Mobile Center
- Makes Bill Self 756-229 all-time, 550-124 while at Kansas and 45-13 all-time in league tournaments (36-8 at Kansas)
- Makes Kansas 2,351-877 all-time

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas improved to 21-0 this season when holding its opponent to less than 70 points. The Jayhawks have held five straight opponents under 70 points, marking the team's longest streak of the season.
- Kansas had five players score in double figures for the fourth time this season.
- Kansas improved to 23-3 this season when leading at halftime. The Jayhawks led 37-36 at half.
- Kansas improved to 4-0 all-time against Texas Tech in the Big 12 Tournament.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Senior David McCormack finished with 18 points and 11 rebounds for his 10th double-double of the season and the 17th of his career. His 10 double-doubles lead the Big 12 Conference.
- Senior Ochai Agbaji started the 110th straight game that he has played in on Saturday. Agbaji finished with 16 points and now has 1,570 points in his career, which rank 18th all-time in program history. He passed Kenny Gregory (1,555) and Jeff Boschee (1,560) on Saturday.
- Agbaji hit three 3-pointers, giving him 239 for his career. He passed Svi Mykhaliuk for fourth all-time in program history.
- Agbaji was named the Most Outstanding Player of the Big 12 Tournament and is the first Jayhawk to earn that honor since Malik Newman in 2018. He's the 10th Jayhawk to be named Most Outstanding Player, and it's the 11th time a Kansas player has earned the honor with Paul Pierce winning twice (1997, 1998).
- Agbaji and junior Christian Braun were named to the All-Tournament Team. Kansas has had multiple players on the All-Tournament Team in three of the last four Big 12 Tournaments.
- Super-senior Mitch Lightfoot played the 162nd game of his career Saturday, which is the most games played in KU history and tied for 11th most ever in NCAA Division I. Lightfoot has now been a part of 165 wins in his Kansas career, which is tied for the most all-time at Kansas.
- Jalen Coleman-Lands played in his 166th game of his career, which ranks tied for third in NCAA Division I.
