THE WIN...

- Made Kansas 6-0 for the seventh time in head coach Bill Self's 20 seasons at KU, and the first since 2019.
- Extended Kansas' win streak to 17 games, tying for the fifth longest winning streak in the Bill Self era.
- Extended Kansas' win streak to seven games against Big Ten opponents, dating back to Dec. 10, 2016 vs. Nebraska.
- Advanced Kansas to the championship game in the Battle 4 Atlantis.
- Made Kansas 4-1 all-time in the Battle 4 Atlantis.
- Made Kansas 2,363-877 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas improved to 1-0 in overtime games this season. The Jayhawks have won three straight overtime contests, beginning with a 94-91 double overtime win versus #13 Texas Tech on Jan. 24, 2022.
- Kansas held Wisconsin to 38.7 percent (24-of-62) shooting from the field. Kansas has kept all six of its opponents under 40.0 percent shooting, marking the longest stretch to start a season since the beginning of the 2009-10 season (first seven games).
- Kansas' defense only allowed 20 points in the first half to Wisconsin. That is the second time this season the Jayhawks defense has allowed 20 points or fewer in the first half (19 vs. North Dakota State on Nov. 10).
- Kansas secured a season-high 50 rebounds, finishing with a 50-35 advantage on the boards.
- Kansas grabbed 14 offensive rebounds. The Jayhawks have at least 10 offensive rebounds in five of their six games this season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Redshirt junior Jalen Wilson recorded his fourth double-double of the season (20th career) with 29 points and a season-high 14 rebounds in 40 minutes. Wilson has a double-double in consecutive games for the first time this season. He has scored 20+ points in four games this season and 11 times in his career. Wilson also made a career-high nine free throws.
- Wilson has 146 points this season, which is the most by a KU player through the first six games since at least the 1996-97 season.
- Redshirt senior Kevin McCullar Jr. posted a season-high 18 points, nine rebounds and three assists in 36 minutes. McCullar Jr. hit the game-tying three-pointer with 11.8 seconds remaining in regulation. He has at least seven rebounds in four games this season.
- Redshirt junior Dajuan Harris Jr. had five points, three rebounds, seven assists, one block and three steals in 38 minutes. Harris Jr. has at least three steals in three straight games for the first time in his career.
- Sophomore Bobby Pettiford Jr. scored the go-ahead basket on a putback layup with 0.2 seconds remaining in overtime. The bucket was his first of the game.
