THE WIN...

- Snapped a Kansas three-game losing streak.
- Made Kansas 6-4 all-time in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge.
- Made Kansas 3-8 versus Kentucky in Lexington, with all three wins coming under Bill Self.
- Made Kansas 4-2 in true road games and 7-3 in contests not played in Allen Fieldhouse this season.
- Made Kansas 2,374-881 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas shot 90.0 percent (9-of-10) from the free throw line. After shooting 100 percent at Baylor on Jan. 23, the Jayhawks have shot 90.0 percent or better from the free throw line in back-to-back true road games for the first time since at least the 1996-97 season.
- Kansas did not allow a three-point field goal to Kentucky in the first half. That marks the second time this season that Kansas has not allowed an opponent to make a three-pointer in a half (Dec. 1, 2022 vs. Seton Hall, 1st half).
- Kansas held Kentucky to only four offensive rebounds. The last team to hold Kentucky to four offensive rebounds or less in Rupp Arena was Ole Miss on Feb, 27, 2008 (2 offensive rebounds).
- Kansas limited Kentucky to 15.4 percent (2-of-13) shooting from the three-point arc, the third lowest three-point field goal percentage against Kansas this season. The two three-point field goals tied the lowest by a Kansas opponent this season (Oklahoma, Jan. 10).
- Kansas has forced its opponents into 10 shot clock violations this season compared to only two shot clock violations offensively.
- Kansas is 16-1 when leading at the half this season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Redshirt junior Jalen Wilson had 22 points and eight rebounds in 39 minutes. Wilson has scored 20+ points in four straight games and 12 games this season. Wilson has now scored 1,200 career points, passing Svi Mykhailiuk (1,181) and Aaron Miles (1,183) to move to 41st on the Kansas all-time career scoring list.
- Wilson has scored 113 points over his last four games, which marks the most points by a Kansas player in a four-game stretch since the inception of the Big 12 in 1996-97.
- Sophomore KJ Adams Jr. finished with 17 points on 8-of-10 (80.0 percent) shooting and three assists in 24 minutes. Adams has scored in double-figures 12 times this season, with all 12 coming in the last 14 games.
- Redshirt senior Kevin McCullar Jr. recorded his sixth double-double of the season (ninth career) with 11 points and a career-high-tying 12 rebounds in 34 minutes.
- Freshman Gradey Dick contributed 13 points and five rebounds in 33 minutes.
