THE RESULT...

Drops the Jayhawks to 16-9 on year and 6-8 in Big 12 play.
Is the third-consecutive loss versus Oklahoma and the second-straight home loss versus the Sooners.
KU's second-straight loss
Drops Kansas to 34-47 versus Oklahoma all-time and 16-21 in Lawrence.

TEAM NOTES

The Jayhawks scored 27 points in the first quarter, making it the most points scored in the first quarter against a Big 12 opponent this season
Kansas went 31-of-64 (48.4%) from the field and went 8-of-22 (36.4%) behind the arc. With the 31 field goals made today, the Jayhawks were one shy of their season-high in most field goals made which is 32 at Oklahoma State (Dec. 31)
This is the fifth time this season that the Jayhawks had two players score 20+ points in the same game

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Senior guard Zakiyah Franklin scored a career-high 30 points and dished out six assists. With the 30 points, she moves to 17th all-time in scoring at KU with 1,361 points. Franklin also hit a career milestone with her 400th assists and she's No. 6 on KU's career list with 403.

Senior guard Holly Kersgieter scored 24 points and had five rebounds. She moves into 13th place on KU's all-time scoring list with 1,448 points, moving past Angie Halbleib (1,429). Kersgieter hit a career-high six three-pointers, marking the first time a Jayhawk has had 6+ three-pointers in a game since Mia Vuksic had eight against Kansas State (2/13/21).

Senior center Taiyanna Jackson secured her league-leading 17th double-double with 19 points and 13 rebounds. This is her fourth double-double in the last five games and 21st of her career. Jackson had five blocked shots in the game, giving her 73 for the year and 168, which ranks third in KU history. She has scored in double figures in nine-consecutive games and 22 times this season.
