THE WIN...

- Made Kansas 27-6 overall.
- Made KU 5-1 in neutral-site games this season.
- Made Kansas 16-5 in the Big 12 Championship semifinals.
- Advanced KU to the Conference Championship game for the 16th time in Big 12 history and 24th time overall.
- Improved Kansas to 82-28 in league tournament play and 52-12 at the Big 12 Championship.
- Made Kansas 48-10 all-time in the T-Mobile Center, including 2-0 this season.
- Made Kansas 52-12 in the Big 12 Championship all-time, including 30-6 in the Championship at the T-Mobile Center.
- Made Kansas 2,384-883 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas won the opening tip, marking the 17th time this season controlled a jump ball.
- Kansas starting five of Harris, Dick, Wilson, McCullar and Adams have combined for 307 career starts. The starting combination have started 30 of 32 games this season, of which the Jayhawks are 24-6 in those games.
- Redshirt junior Dajuan Harris scored Kansas' first points of the game, his seventh time opening the scoring for the Jayhawks this season. Harris' shot marked the ninth game-opening jumpshot of the season.
- Kansas led at halftime, 33-25. The Jayhawks improved to 25-0 this season when leading at the break.
- Kansas led or was tied for all but 18 seconds on Friday night, with Kansas holding its largest lead of 13 to end the game at 71-58.
- Kansas shot 52.3% (23-of-44) from the field, while holding Iowa State to 40% (22-of-55) marking the 25th time this season Kansas has outshot its opponent. The Jayhawks are 23-2 in those games.
- With 71 points, Kansas improves to 8-0 when scoring between 70-79 points this season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Redshirt junior Jalen Wilson scored 25 points on 8-of-14 shooting from the field, including 3-of-7 from beyond the arc, marking his 71st career game with 10+ points and his 31st of the season. Wilson has now scored 20 or more points in 26 career games and 19 times this season, including his fourth-straight.
- Paired with his 25 points, Wilson added 10 rebounds for his Big 12 leading 12th double-double of the season, including his third-straight. Wilson now has 28 career double doubles, which ranks ninth in KU history.
- Wilson has combined for 68 points against Iowa State this season after scoring 26 on Feb. 4 and 16 on Jan. 14.
- Wilson scored 11 of Kansas' 13 points in the first five minutes of play. Wilson was 4-of-4 over that span, including 3-of-3 from beyond the arc. Wilson would finish the first half with a game-high 15 points.
- Harris scored 11 points on 3-of-4 from the field and 5-of-8 from the free throw line, marking his 24th career game in double-figures and 16th this season. Kansas is 24-0 when Harris scores in double figures, including 16-0 this season.
- With Harris' 6 assists on Friday, he moved into 14th on KU's all-time career assists list with 439, passing Mark Turgeon (1984-87) with 437 career assists.
- Kansas freshman Gradey Dick scored 15 points on 4-of-10 from the field. Dick now has 361 field goal attempts as a freshman, which are the sixth-most in school history, passing Xavier Henry (2010) and Kerry Boagni (1983), who each had 354.
- Dick connected on 2-of-6 from beyond the arc, which ties Jeff Boschee (1999) for the most 3-point field goals made in KU freshman history with 79.
- Dick's 15 points mark his 23rd career game in double-figures.
