STORYLINES

•Belmont and Kansas will meet for the second time in four seasons at E.S. Rose Park. The Jayhawks visited over Opening Week-end in 2020, taking two of three games.

•For the first time in program history, Belmont is playing two Power Five opponents in three-game series. The Bruins traveled to Raleigh, N.C., last weekend for three games against No. 21 North Carolina State

•Belmont secured their first road sweep of a Power Five opponent last season, outscoring Purdue 22-9 in three games in West Lafayette, Ind.

•After three home runs against Middle Tennessee on Tuesday, Belmont has 11 for the season from seven different players. The Bruins are ranked 52nd in NCAA Division I in homers

MR. MILESTONE

With an 11-1 win over Middle Tennessee on Feb. 23, 2022 Dave Jarvis recorded his 1,000th career win (324 at Three Rivers College, 676 at Belmont). With an 8-2 win over Evansville on April 26, 2022, Jarvis notched his 700th win at Belmont, one of only 16 active coaches with 700+ Division I wins at their current school. Jarvis became the winningest coach in program history in 2021 thanks to a doubleheader win on April 17 against Murray State. Jarvis passed Belmont legend Dave Whitten (1969-1997) for the all-time wins record in program history. Jarvis and Whitten had a close relationship until Whitten's death in 2012, with Whitten serving as an assistant and pitching coach under Jarvis from 1998-2000 during Jarvis' first three years at Belmont. The Bruins have had just two coaches since 1969 (Whitten and Jarvis).

FOLLOW THE LEADERS

Team captains for the Bruins in 2023 are Andy Bean and Brodey Heaton

MR. BEAN

Andy Bean collected Belmont's first conference pitcher of the year award in the program's Division I era when he was named 2022 OVC Pitcher of the Year.

DOMINANCE AGAINST THE SKYHAWKS

Mason Landers earned Belmont Baseball's first-ever MVC Player of the Week nod on Feb. 20 after going 6-for-14 with three home runs and six RBIs against UT Martin in the opening weekend series

BRODEY BASHES

Brodey Heaton hit ten home runs in 24 OVC games last year, and had two multi-homer games against conference opponents (April 1 at Murray State, May 7 at UT Martin). Heaton was named OVC Player of the Week on May 9 after going 9-15 with three home runs and 9 RBIs against UT Martin on May 6-8, and was named OVC Co-Player of the Week on May 23 after going 7-15 with two home runs against SIUE on May 19-20

CHEESEHEADS

Junior college transfer and right-handed pitcher Jett Thielke attended the same high school in Suamico, Wisconsin, as Belmont pitching coach A.J. Gaura (Bay Port High School)

BATTLE FOR THE VOLUNTEER STATE

Belmont's schedule features home-and-home matchups with Middle Tennessee and Lipscomb, highly anticipated midweeks with Tennessee, Vanderbilt, Tennessee Tech, and Austin Peay, and a three-game series against UT Martin at E.S. Rose Park.

QUICK HITS

DON'T FIGHT THE POWER

Last season, Brodey Heaton and Tommy Crider became the first pair of Bruin teammates to hit 10+ home runs each since Brennan Washington and Clay Payne in 2016

615 GROWN

Nine Bruins hail from the Nashville area and the surrounding suburbs: Sam Kirkpatrick (Franklin), Sam Slaughter (Smyrna), Aaron Hubbell (Mt. Juliet), Blake Barton (Franklin), Ethan Harden (Franklin), Jordan Zuger (Hendersonville), Jack Rando (Brentwood), Caleb Guisewite (Greenbrier), and Cade Granzow (Franklin)

NEW GUYS

This year's team features 18 newcomers, making up more than half of the 35 members of the team. The 18 additions marks the most new players to a Dave Jarvis-coached team since he took over the program in 1998.

ON THE BACK OF DEFENSE

Belmont finished 4th in NCAA Division I in fielding percentage last year (.983), trailing only Texas, Houston, and East Carolina. The Bruins committed only 37 errors, tied for the second-fewest in the country

RUNNING AWAY WITH IT

Guy Lipscomb turned in one of the great individual seasons in program history last year on the way to being the highest-drafted Bruin since 1975. Lipscomb was taken with the No. 151 overall pick in the fifth round of the 2022 MLB First-Year Player Draft by the Cleveland Guardians. The sophomore center fielder was an All-American and the OVC Player of the Year after batting .406 with 42 stolen bases, becoming the first player in NCAA Division I to hit .400 with at least 40 stolen bases since 2011.

POWER SURGE

Belmont hit six home runs in their seven-inning, 11-4 win over UT Martin on Feb. 19, their most home runs in a game since hitting 12 dingers against UT Martin in a 34-10 win in 2015

DEFEND THE ROSE

Belmont was 21-10 at home last year, and have had a winning record at home in each of the last three seasons, going 46-23 over that span (.667)

TOP TEN CONFERENCE

The Valley ranked 9th nationally in conference RPI last season behind the SEC, ACC, Big 12, Pac-12, Conference USA, Sun Belt, American and Big Ten.

Since the 2011 season, the Missouri Valley Conference has ranked among the Top 10 leagues nationally in RPI in nine of the 11 seasons. In fact, The Valley has ranked among the top seven conferences in seven of those 11 seasons.

RED-HOT CAPTAIN KIRK

Junior transfer shortstop Sam Kirkpatrick has started his Bruin career sizzling at the plate, going 15-for-33 (.455) with two doubles, a home run, and three bunt base hits

BRUIN ON THE WORLD STAGE

Former Belmont catcher Jamie Ritchie (2012-2014) was selected to Great Britain's national team roster for the 2023 World Baseball Classic, becoming the first Bruin to participate in the event. Ritchie has played for eight seasons in the minor leagues after being drafted in the 13th round of the 2014 MLB First-Year Player Draft by the Houston Astros. This past offseason, Ritchie signed a minor league deal with the Toronto Blue Jays.

BELMONT'S MLB CHAMPION

Former Belmont Baseball All-American Matt Beaty ('15) became the first Bruin alum to win a World Series title when he was a member of the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2020. The Dresden, Tenn. native is the second Belmont alum to win a World Championship in professional sports, with former Belmont Basketball player Ian Clark winning an NBA Championship in 2017 as a member of the Golden State Warriors. Beaty became the first Belmont player to play in a Major League Baseball game since Dwight Bernard in 1978, making his Major League debut on April 30, 2019. Beaty was traded to the San Diego Padres on March 28, 2022 and signed with the Kansas City Royals on January 10, 2023.

SINGING STARS

Not only has Belmont alumni made its name in the professional baseball ranks, but they have shined as stars off the field. Florida Georgia Line's Brian Kelley pitched for the Bruins from 2008-09, compiling 109 strikeouts. Judah Akers, the lead singer of Judah and the Lion, earned All-Atlantic Sun honors and was named the 2012 Atlantic Sun Tournament MVP to help Belmont to its second straight NCAA Tournament.

FROM HERE TO ANYWHERE

Several of Belmont Baseball's alumni have gone onto success in coaching. Vanderbilt Football's head coach Clark Lea was a member of the Bruins in 2002, hitting .400 in his lone season. Packy Elkins now serves as the run production coach for the St. Louis Cardinals, where he played at Belmont from 2007-10 and hit .327 in his senior season. Grace Christian Academy's Brad Myers was inducted into the Tennessee Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in January 2022. He played for Belmont from 1989-92.

MULTIPLE TEAMS AGAIN

For the 27th time in 41 seasons, multiple MVC baseball teams were selected as part of the field of 64 teams to play for the 2022 College World Series title. It was the seventh time in eight seasons the MVC has placed multiple teams into the NCAA field. Since the 1981 season (41 seasons), the MVC has placed multiple teams into the NCAA Tournament 27 times (66%). On seven occasions (1990, 1995, 1999, 2000, 2012, 2015, 2019) the MVC has put three teams into the NCAA field.

--Kansas is out to a 5-2 start, with series wins over Valparaiso and Oakland

--The Jayhawks rank 7th in the country in fielding percentage, having only committed two errors in seven games

--Kansas is in their first year under head coach Dan Fitzgerald, who was previously an assistant coach at LSU and Dallas Baptist

--The Jayhawks lost one of the top players in the country last year to the transfer portal, with All-American shortstop Maui Ahuna leaving for Tennessee

--Perfect Game ranked Kansas' junior college recruiting class the No. 1 class in the country. Kansas brought in eight highly-touted juco players ahead of this season

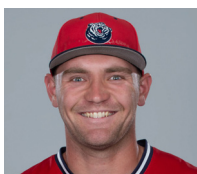

Entering his 26th season at the helm of Belmont's baseball program and 41st year of coaching overall, head coach Dave Jarvis has cultivated a rich program that's seen success both on the field and in the classroom. Jarvis has led the Bruins since their inception as a NCAA Division I institution in 1998, leading Belmont to four conference championships and its two NCAA Tournament berths in 2011 and 2012.

As a coach, Jarvis has culminated an overall record of 1,034-797-2 in 34 years as a head coach and helped produce nine seasons in which the Bruins garnered 30 or more wins. The team constructed a program-best 39 wins during both the 2012 and 2022 seasons.

Not only has Jarvis lifted Belmont Baseball to new heights, but he is also in elite company in NCAA Division I baseball. Jarvis is one of just 16 active head coaches to record 700 or more Division I wins at their current school.

Jarvis has developed 29 players from Belmont who have gone on to play professional baseball, including current San Diego Padres infielder/outfielder Matt Beaty and 2022 MLB Draft pick Guy Lipscomb, who was selected No. 151 overall by the Cleveland Guardians to become the highest draft selection in program history. In addition to his on-field success, Jarvis has helped his players excel in

the classroom. Following the 2021-22 academic year, a league-high 30 Belmont baseball players were named to the OVC Commissioner's Honor Roll.

During the 2022 season, Belmont secured their first OVC Regular Season championship by finishing conference play with an 18-6 mark, tying the program record for both regular season wins (37) and total wins (39). The Bruins swept the conference's major awards, with Jarvis earning OVC Coach of the Year, Guy Lipscomb earning OVC Player of the Year, and Andy Bean taking home OVC Pitcher of the Year. On April 22-24, the Bruins swept Purdue on the road, the program's first-ever road sweep of a Power Five opponent.

The Bruins boasted one of the top defenses in the country in 2022, finishing 4th in NCAA Division I in fielding percentage (.983) with first baseman Brodey Heaton being named one of three finalists for the 2022 Rawlings Gold Glove Award, given annually to the top defender at each position. Guy Lipscomb turned in one of the best individual seasons in program history, setting program records for batting average (.406) and stolen bases (42) on the way to Third-Team All-American status and towards becoming the first player in NCAA Division I since 2011 to hit over .400 and steal at least 40 bags.

Lipscomb and Bean earned First-Team All-Conference honors while Heaton, Jalen Borders, and Kyle Brennan picked up Second-Team All-Conference recognition in 2022.

Jarvis recorded his 1,000th career win on February 23, 2022 with an 11-1 victory over Middle Tennessee. On April 26, 2022, Jarvis picked up his 700th win at Belmont with an 8-2 victory at Evansville.

Jarvis developed 28 players from Belmont who have gone on to play professional baseball, including current Los Angeles Dodgers infielder/outfielder Matt Beaty. In addition to his on-field success, Jarvis has helped his players excel in the classroom. Following the 2019-20 academic year, 21 Belmont baseball players were named to the OVC Commissioner's Honor Roll.

The 2020 Belmont Bruins finished the season receiving votes in the final two weeks of the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Top 30 poll, posting the 17th-highest win-loss percentage in NCAA Baseball with an .824 mark. The Bruins were also 18th in the country in total home runs with 20.

In 2011, Belmont beat Oklahoma State and Troy in the Baton Rouge Regional, marking the first time in program history that the Bruins won an NCAA tournament game in any sport. Concluding the landmark season, Jarvis was named the TBCA College Coach of the Year. The previous year carved another program-best when Belmont started the season with a perfect 10-0 start.

Belmont toppled its first ranked opponent in 2001 when Jarvis' squad beat then-No. 13 ranked Georgia, who would be an eventual College World Series participant. Since then the Bruins have beaten multiple ranked opponents.

Jarvis fine-tuned his coaching ability with a nine-year stint as head coach at Three Rivers Community College in Poplar Bluff, Mo. from 1985-93. With Jarvis at the helm, the Raiders were consistently ranked in the National Junior College Athletic Association top 20 poll, highlighted by a No. 4 ranking in 1992.

Jarvis broke into NCAA Division I baseball as an assistant with Murray State in the fall of 1993. At Murray State, he was primarily responsible for the instruction of hitters and catchers as well as teaching base running skills. Jarvis also used his extensive junior college network to create a recruiting pipeline for the Racers.

He finished his playing career at Arkansas State as the starting catcher and team captain. The Missouri native earned a bachelor's degree in education and later received his master's in education, both at Arkansas State.

A dedicated family man, Jarvis has three sons, Jordan, Logan, and Jackson. The family resides in Franklin, Tenn.

COACHING STAFF



Aaron Smith • Associate Head Coach

Aaron Smith enters his 14th season at Belmont and his fourth as associate head coach in 2022-2023. Smith's main duties entail working with the infielders, hitters, coaching third base and heading up the recruitment of student-athletes. In addition, Smith assists with the camp instruction and the administration of the Belmont Fall Instructional League.

In his first 13 years at Belmont, Smith has coached 35 First and Second Team All-Conference players, including an Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Year and two Atlantic Sun Conference Tournament MVPs. In all, 23 former Belmont players have gone on to play professional baseball since Smith arrived in Nashville.

Under Smith's guidance, Belmont was one of the best fielding teams in the country in 2022 on the way to a 39-win season and an OVC Regular Season championship, finishing fourth in NCAA Division I with an incredible .983 fielding percentage. The Bruins trailed only Texas, Houston, and East Carolina in that category, committing just 37 errors, tied for the second-fewest in the country.

First baseman Brodey Heaton had a career year in 2022, becoming one of three finalists for the Rawlings Gold Glove Award, given annually to the top defender at each position.

Smith's development for hitters allowed outfielder Guy Lipscomb to have one of the best seasons in the nation, with the center fielder finishing 9th in the country in batting average (.406) and 4th in the country in stolen bases (42), becoming the first player in NCAA Division I since 2011 to hit at least .400 and steal at least 40 bases. Lipscomb earned OVC Player of the Year honors, All-Region honors, and Third Team All-American honors before being selected in the fifth round in the 2022 MLB First-Year Player Draft by the Cleveland Guardians, the highest Bruin draft pick since 1975.

From 2009-2012 coach Smith served as a volunteer assistant at Belmont. During this time he worked with the outfielders and coached first base. He also was instrumental in the coordination of the base running scheme that has been a staple of the Bruin program.

Before coming to Belmont, Smith assisted at Trevecca Nazarene University for three years working with the outfielders, catchers and hitters. Prior to Trevecca, Smith coached one year Motlow State Community College and spent two years at Riverdale High School.



A.J. Gaura • Pitching Coach

A.J. Gaura enters his second season as the Belmont pitching coach in 2022-2023 after being introduced to the Bruins' staff on Jan. 3, 2022.

Gaura's first season in the dugout for the Bruins resulted in Belmont owning the best pitching staff in the Ohio Valley Conference, leading the league in ERA (4.59) with the runner-up nearly a full run behind (5.52). Belmont was also first in the conference in opponent batting average (.253), first in wins (39), first in saves (18), second in home runs allowed (60), and third in walks allowed (217).

With Gaura's guidance, the Bruins owned one of the best weekend rotations in the country, with OVC Pitcher of the Year Andy Bean and Second-Team All-Conference selection Jalen Borders bookending two-time OVC Preseason Pitcher of the Year Joshua South. Bean, Borders, and South were all in the top-10 in the Ohio Valley Conference in ERA, in the top-5 in opponent batting average, in the top-7 in innings pitched, and in the top-10 in strikeouts.

Under Gaura's tutelage, Bean earned Belmont's first-ever OVC Pitcher of the Year honor after going 9-1 with a 4.64 ERA and 75 strikeouts in 2022, to help lead the Bruins to their first OVC Regular Season Championship.

In the bullpen, reliever Kyle Brennan enjoyed a record-breaking year as the Bruin closer, finishing 4th in the country in saves (14) while breaking the program's all-time career record for saves (31). Gaura's efforts with reliever Dusty Baird resulted in the right-hander developing finishing the season on a scorching stretch that saw him allow just one run over his final 13 innings, before signing a professional contract with the Rocky Mountain Vibes of the Pioneer League.

A native of Suamico, Wisconsin, Gaura arrived at Belmont after three seasons as the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Evansville.



Corvin Scott • Assistant Coach

Corvin Scott enters his second season as the volunteer assistant coach on the Bruin staff in 2022-2023 after being introduced on Jan. 25, 2022. Scott primarily works with the outfielders and is also the first base coach, additionally helping spearhead the Belmont Baseball Camps.

In 2022, Scott helped develop the talents of center fielder Guy Lipscomb, who finished 9th in the country in batting average (.406) and 4th in stolen bases (42) on the way to Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Year honors, an All-Region selection, and Third-Team All-American honors before being drafted in the fifth round in the 2022 MLB First-Year Player Draft by the Cleveland Guardians, becoming the highest draft pick in program history.

A Nashville native who played at East Nashville High School (2011-14), Scott graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Leisure, Sport and Tourism Studies from Middle Tennessee State in 2018 and went on to earn a Master of Arts in Sports Management and Administration from Campbellsville in the fall of 2021.
