**Scouting Kansas**

Kansas enters the weekend with an overall record of 7-8.

The Jayhawks lost a pair of midweek games at Charleston Southern on Tuesday and Wednesday.

KU is hitting .264 as a team with 30 doubles, 19 home runs and 85 RBIs. They have scored 88 runs with 54 walks and eight stolen bases.

Chase Jans leads the way with a .326 average, while Jake English has a team-best four home runs.

The Jayhawk pitching staff bolsters a 4.85 team ERA. They have allowed 70 earned runs on 120 hits and 129 strikeouts in 130 innings.

Collin Baumgartner leads the way with a 2-0 record and a 3.15 ERA. He has allowed just 14 hits and struck out 24 over 20.0 innings.

### Double Digits All Weekend

The Citadel scored in double figures in all three games of the series sweep against Holy Cross. It is the first time the Bulldogs scored double digits in all three games of a weekend series since April 16-18 against High Point. The Citadel won all three games, 10-4, 11-10 and 14-2.

### Leadoff Homer

Thomas Rollauer opened the series against Holy Cross with a leadoff home run to left field. It is the first Bulldog leadoff homer since

Tyler Corbitt hit one against North Carolina A&T on March 9, 2021.

### 15 Strikeouts

Seven Bulldog pitchers combined to strikeout 15 South Carolina hitters. It was the most against the Gamecocks since Vanderbilt struck out 16 on March 25, 2022.

### Swygert Deals in Return

Sam Swygert returned to where he began his collegiate career and calmly struck out four of the six hitters he faced against South

Carolina, including striking out the side in his first inning of work.

### 8-Run First

The Bulldog offense erupted for eight runs in the first inning of the series finale against LIU. The Citadel scored the eight runs on eight hits, with five of the eight hits coming with two strikes. It was the first time the Bulldogs plated eight runs in the first inning since March 17, 2013 against Wofford.

## Five Hit Day

Thomas Rollauer went 5-for-6 with three RBIs in the series finale against LIU. The five hits are the most for a Bulldog since Jeffery Brown went 5-for-5 against South Carolina on March 10, 2021.

## A Run an Inning

The Bulldogs offense was consistent in the Saturday game against LIU as they scored at least one run in each of the first seven innings of the game.

## All 9 With a Hit

In the 12-5 victory over LIU, all nine hitters in the starting lineup collected a hit with five of the hitters posting multi-hit games. Thomas Rollauer and Travis Lott each had three hits out of the top two spots in the lineup.

## Another Reeves Quality Start

Right hander Cameron Reeves provided another quality start in the series opener against LIU as he allowed just one run on five hits and six strikeouts over 6.0 innings.

## Elliott Steps In

Travis Elliott stepped in after an injury in the series opener against LIU and recorded two hits in each of the first two games of the series.

## Cummiskey Strong Out of Pen

Conner Cummiskey has been strong out of the bullpen as he has allowed just one earned run in five appearances. He has surrendered nine hits and struck out 12 over 10.0 innings.

## Lott Wears It

Catcher Travis Lott continues to attract the baseball as he has been hit a team-high seven times this season.

## Reeves Bounces Back

Right hander Cameron Reeves was dominant in his start against Lehigh as he allowed just one run on two hits and three strikeouts over 6.0 innings to pick up the win over Lehigh. He needed only 63 pitches.

## Fewell Makes Mound Debut

Transfer Ethan Fewell made his collegiate debut on the mound against Charleston Southern. Fewell retired all three hitters he faced, including to strikeouts. He spent the previous three years as an outfielder at Winthrop.

## Season-Opening Sweep

The Citadel completed the three-game sweep over Delaware State with an 11-10 win on Sunday. It marked the second-straight season the Bulldogs opened the season with a series sweep.

# TONY SKOLE

**6TH SEASON • THE CITADEL, 1991**

**OVERALL RECORD - 655-754-1 • RECORD AT THE CITADEL - 89-159**

The Citadel Athletics Hall of Famer, and 25-year head coaching veteran, Tony Skole, enters his sixth season as the Bulldogs' head coach.

Skole was officially announced as the head coach at his alma mater on June 8, 2017.

He enters the 2023 season with an overall head coaching record of 645-774-1, including going 550-691-1 at the Division I level.

Skole was tasked with returning the Bulldog program back to one of the top teams in the Southern Conference. Skole started by building the culture of playing hard on the field and doing what is right in the corps. Skole has also put an emphasis on academics as the team has bolstered a grade-point average over 3.00 in every semester since he took over.

The 2019 Bulldog team featured a lineup that included mainly freshmen and sophomores. The lone senior in the lineup, Ben Peden, put together his best season as a Bulldog. He hit .299 with 15 doubles, eight home runs and 36 RBIs. Freshmen Tyler Corbitt led the team with a .333 average on his way to earning All-Southern Conference Freshman Team honors.

In his first season back in the Lowcountry, Skole led the Bulldogs to its most conference wins in three years. The young squad improved in nearly every offensive category, including raising the batting average by 28 points and reducing the number of strikeouts by 99.

Skole returned home after spending 17 years as the head coach at ETSU, accumulating a program record 471 wins. He led the Bucs to a pair of 36-win seasons,

including the 2013 season that saw ETSU capture the Atlantic Sun tournament championship and participate in the Vanderbilt Regional.

Skole has earned a national reputation as an elite recruiter and developer of student-athletes. He has coached 64 all-conference selections, two conference players of the year and ETSU's first conference pitcher of the year. Five Bucs were selected in last year's MLB Draft, matching the program record set in 2006 and adding to his total of more than 30 of athletes who have continued their playing career in the professional ranks.

Skole's ETSU teams showcased his balanced approach with multiple school records falling on offense and defense during his 18 years at the helm. In 2010, the Bucs broke single-season school records with 503 runs scored, 724 hits, 93 home runs and 142 doubles. His 2017 squad pounded out 654 hits for the second-highest single-season total in school history. ETSU has broken the school's record for strikeouts in a season each of the last three years. The 2015 staff recorded 431 strikeouts, shattering the previous record by 73 Ks, before the 2016 staff registered 436 punchouts and the 2017 staff pushed the record to 461.

In 2004, Skole tutored catcher Caleb Moore to Southern Conference Player of the Year and All-America honors after Moore led Division I with a .455 batting average and an average of .60 doubles per game. In 2010, first baseman Paul Hoilman was the Atlantic Sun Player of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was a first-team All-American after leading Division I with a slugging percentage of .860. The 2013 season featured ETSU's first conference Pitcher of the Year

courtesy of right-hander Kerry Doane. Doane ranked first in Division I with 12 complete games and 147.0 innings pitched and became the school's third first-team All-American.

Skole's first head-coaching position came at Lincoln Memorial University, where he was elevated to the top position in 1997 after four years as an assistant coach for the Railsplitters. During his three seasons in charge at LMU, Skole led the team's transition from NAIA to a Division II program that rose as high as No. 13 in the national rankings. He earned 95 wins and coached seven MLB Draft picks, including pitcher Scot Shields, during his time at LMU. Shields helped the Anaheim Angels win the 2002 World Series and was considered one of MLB's top relief pitchers for most of the decade.

Skole is a 1991 graduate of The Citadel, where he lettered in baseball and football. As a third baseman, he helped the baseball team win two Southern Conference championships and a berth in the 1990 College World Series. He hit a home run at Miami to win the Atlantic Regional over the Hurricanes and clinch the trip to Omaha. In Omaha, Skole had a game-winning hit in the 12th inning against Cal State Fullerton. On the gridiron, Skole started 35 consecutive games as a defensive back and helped the Bulldogs to two appearances in the NCAA I-AA playoffs. He was voted a team captain for the 1990 season and also led the SoCon in interceptions that season. In 2011, he was inducted into The Citadel Athletic Hall of Fame.

Skole and his wife, Jody, have three sons, Tilo, Jack and Gehrig.
