

## **TIPOFF**

- Kansas will open up the 2023-24 season when it plays host to North Carolina Central on Nov. 6 at 7 p.m. (Central), in Allen Fieldhouse. The game will be televised on Big 12 NOW via ESPN+ with Steven Davis, Wayne Simien and Kennetra Pulliams on the broadcast.
- KU has won a mind-boggling 50-straight home openers, beginning in 1973-74 under head coach Ted Owens. KU coaches Larry Brown (5-0) and Roy Williams (15-0) never lost a home opener and Bill Self is 20-0.
- Kansas posted a 28-8 overall record in 2022-23 and won the Big 12 regular season title with a 13-5 league mark. North Carolina Central went 18-12 in 2022-23, including a 10-4 record in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) where the Eagles finished second.
- Kansas and North Carolina Central will meeting for the first time in men's
- · Kansas Athletics will host the inaugural McLendon Classic over the weekend of Nov. 5-6 on the campus of the University of Kansas. In addition to the game, KU will host the McLendon Classic Community Event at the Lied Center on Sunday, Nov. 5, at 5 p.m. CT.
- Kansas returns three starters KJ Adams Jr., Dajuan Harris Jr. and Kevin McCullar Jr. – and eight letterwinners from last season. KU welcomes nine newcomers, including the 2023-24 coaches' Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year and the Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year Hunter Dickinson. Dickinson, Harris and McCullar were on the All-Big 12 Preseason team as
- Kansas is No. 1 in the Associated Press poll for the fourth time in poll history, with all coming four in the Bill Self era - 2004-05, 2009-10, 2018-19 and 2023-24.
- KU has been ranked in the AP top 10 in each of the last 39 polls dating back to the 2021-22 preseason poll. The 39 consecutive is the longest active streak in men's college basketball.
- Including 2023-24, Kansas has been the Big 12 coaches' choice to win the league 20 times in the 27-year history of the conference.

#### **ABOUT KANSAS**

No. 1 Kansas closed out exhibition play with a 73-55 win against Fort Hays State on Nov. 1 in Allen Fieldhouse. There were 13 Jayhawks who played, including 12 who logged six or more minutes in the contest. Graduate Kevin McCullar Jr. paced the way with 21 points, while senior Hunter Dickinson posted a double-double with 17 points and 11 rebounds. Junior KJ Adams Jr. also reach double figures with 14 points. Redshirt-senior Dajuan Harris Jr. led KU with eight assists, while McCullar had a team-high three steals.

Kansas is coming off a 28-8 season in which it won the Big 12 regular-season title with a 13-5 league record. It was KU's NCAA-record 63rd conference regular-season title and 16th under head coach Bill Self in his 20 seasons at Kansas.

Kansas returns three starters – Adams, Harris and McCullar – and eight letterwinners from last season. KU welcomes nine newcomers, including the 2023-24 coaches' Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year and the Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year Dickinson. Dickinson, Harris and McCullar were on the All-Big 12 Preseason team as well.

In August 2023, Kansas went 2-1 in three exhibition contests in Pureto Rico, Aug. 3-7. Dickinson led the team with 19.0 ppg and 7.0 rpg. Harris Jr. paced KU with 6.7 assists per contest and 3.6 steals per game.

With Dickinson leading the way, Kansas had four players average in double figures in Puerto Rico with McCullar at 13.6 ppg, Adams at 13.0 pgg and freshman Elmarko Jackson at 10.6 ppg. Adams shot a team-best 71.4 percent from the field, including 2-for-3 from three-point range. McCullar was second on the team with a 6.3 rebound average. Graduate Nicolas Timberlake made a team-high six threes in the three contests.

## **ABOUT NORTH CAROLINA CENTRAL**

Located in Durham, North Carolina, North Carolina Central has six returners and 11 newcomers on a team that went 18-12 and finished second in the MEAC with a 10-4 record. The Eagles are coached by LeVelle Moton, who is 246-184 entering his 15th season at UNCC, his alma mater.

North Carolina Central is predicted to finish third in the MEAC. All five of the Eagles' starters from last season left. Seniors Ja'Darius Harris and Fred Cleveland Jr. bring back the most experience for the Eagles. Both made 29 appearances in 30 games last season. Cleveland was named to the 2023-24 All-MEAC Preseason Third Team. He was eighth in the conference in assists last season, averaging 2.8 per game.

## THE KANSAS-NORTH CAROLINA CENTRAL SERIES

Kansas and North Carolina Central are meeting for the first time in men's basketball. KU is 8-0 all-time versus the current MEAC - 3-0 vs. Howard, 3-0 vs. South Carolina State, 2-0 vs. Coppin State. Howard was KU's last MEAC contest with the Jayhawks winning 96-68 on March 16, 2023, in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament in Des Moines, lowa.

### **FORT HAYS STATE LEFTOVERS**

- Graduate Kevin McCullar Jr. finished with four three pointers and a game-high 21 points on 6-of-10 (60.0 percent) shooting, six rebounds and a team-high three steals.
- Junior KJ Adams Jr. had 14 points, four rebounds and two assists
- Redshirt-senior Dajuan Harris Jr. contributed seven points, a game-high eight assists and two steals.

#### KANSAS TO HOST MCCLENDON CLASSIC NOV. 5-6

Kansas Athletics will host the inaugural McLendon Classic over the weekend of Nov. 5-6 on the campus of the University of Kansas. On Sunday, Nov. 5, at 5 p.m. CT, KU will host the McLendon Classic Community Event at the Lied Center. The two-day recognition will conclude when Kansas basketball hosts North Carolina Central on Monday, Nov. 6, at 7 p.m. in Allen Fieldhouse.

The McLendon Classic Community Event will feature a screening of Fast Break: The Legendary John McLendon. Following the showing, there will be a round table discussion featuring KU professor and Emmy Award winning director Kevin Willmott, KU director of equity and success initiatives Melissa Peterson, North Carolina Central head coach LeVelle Moton and KU head coach Bill Self. KU professor Shawn Alexander will serve as moderator to the round table discussion, and the group will share their thoughts about the documentary while exploring the profound impact that John McLendon had on the University of Kansas, the game of basketball and society at large. The McLendon Classic Community Event is free to the public and attendees will have the option to donate resources to the NCCU Black Student-Athlete Summit Experience Fund.

The Nov. 6 basketball game will honor McLendon during the contest. Both teams' coaching staffs will wear patches and feature special pregame shooting shirts. There will be recognitions throughout the contest honoring McLendon as well as moments to highlight current affinity groups at KU that are continuing McLendon's legacy of inclusion, pro activity and perseverance.

### **JAYHAWKS NO. 1 IN PRESEASON POLLS**

Kansas enters the 2023-24 season No.1 in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' polls. This marks the fourth time KU has been No.1 in the preseason AP poll with all four in the Bill Self era - 2004-05, 2009-10, 2018-19 and 2023-24. This is the fifth time in the coaches' poll that the Jayhawks have been No.1 in the preseason poll with four in the Self era 1996-97, 2004-05, 2009-10, 2018-19 and 2023-24.

Under 21st-year and Hall of Fame head coach Bill Self, this is the 18th time that Kansas entered the season ranked seventh or higher in the Associated Press preseason poll. Historically, the No. 1 ranking marks the 26th time since the 1992-93 season that Kansas will enter the season seventh or higher.

Kansas could possibly play 10 games against teams ranked in the preseason Associated Press Top 25. KU will play against No. 6 UConn, No. 7 Houston, No. 16 Kentucky, No. 18 Texas and No. 20 Baylor (twice). KU could also play No. 3 Purdue, No. 5 Marquette, and No. 11 Gonzaga in the Maui Invitational, Nov. 20-22, in Honolulu.

The No. 1 ranking marked the 10th-straight year Kansas has entered the season No. 5 or higher in the coaches' poll dating back to 2014-15. Additionally, it is the 18th time in the Self era the Jayhawks have been preseason seventh or higher, including each of the last 12 seasons.

### **KU PICKED FIRST IN THE PRESEASON BIG 12 POLL**

For the 20th time in the 27-year history of the coaches' preseason Big 12 poll, Kansas has been selected as the favorite to win the league as the preseason poll was announced Oct.

For the 2023-24 poll, KU collected 12 of a possible 14 first-place votes and finished with a total of 168 points. Houston received two first-place nods and was second with 153 points. Texas was third with 143 points, while Baylor was fourth with 137 points and TCU fifth with 113 points to round out the top five.

#### **PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12**

Kansas men's basketball senior Hunter Dickinson, redshirtsenior Dajuan Harris Jr. and graduate Kevin McCullar Jr. were named to the 2023-24 Preseason All-Big 12 Team as voted on by the league coaches, the conference announced Oct. 12.

Dickinson is the Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year and the Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, becoming the first player in conference history to earn both honors in the same season. Dickinson is joined on the Preseason All-Big 12 First Team by Harris, while McCullar is an honorable mention honoree.

Historically, Dickinson is the 11th Jayhawk to collect the preseason player of the year award and the fifth to earn preseason newcomer. Kansas has had at least one player on the Preseason All-Big 12 First Team in all but two of the 28 seasons the conference has existed, since 1996-97. Dickinson and Harris are the 39th and 40th Jayhawks to be listed on the preseason all-league first team.

## **DICKINSON ON THE PRESEASON NABC WATCH LIST**

Kansas senior Hunter Dickinson was one of 20 players named to the 2024 NABC Division I Player of the Year Watch List, the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) announced Nov. 2. The 2024 NABC Division I Player of the Year – selected by a vote of Division I head coaches – will be announced the week of the 2024 Men's Final Four.

## **BRAUN WINS NBA TITLE**

Former Kansas guard Chirstian Braun became the 15th Jayhawk to win an NBA title, when the Denver Nuggets defeated the Miami Heat last June.

Braun played three seasons at Kansas from 2019-20 to 2021-22. In 2020, the Burlington, Kansas, native was named to the Big 12 All-Freshman Team and he was a 2021 all-conference honorable mention selection the following season. In Kansas' 2022 NCAA National Championship season, Braun averaged 14.1 points and 6.5 rebounds per game. The two-time Academic All-Big 12 First Team selection was an all-league second-team selection, and was on the all-tournament teams for the Big 12 Championship and the NCAA Tournament Midwest Regional. In his three seasons at KU, Braun played in 101 games with 74 starts and had 1,018 career points, 506 rebounds, 183 assists and 97 steals.

Braun is the fifth player in NBA history to win an NCAA title and an NBA title in back-to-back seasons. He joins Bill Russell (1956 San Francisco; 1957 Boston Celtics), Henry Bibby (1972 UCLA; 1973 New York Knicks), Magic Johnson (1979 Michigan State, 1980 L.A. Lakers) and Billy Thompson (1986 Louisville; 1987 L.A. Lakers).

With the addition of Braun, there have been 15 Jayhawks who have won 20 NBA titles during their professional careers. Braun becomes the seventh Jayhawk under head coach Bill Self to win an NBA title. He joins Wayne Simien (2006), Mario Chalmers (2012, 2013), Brandon Rush (2015), Sasha Kaun (2016), Markieff Morris (2020) and Andrew Wiggins (2022).

Braun is the fifth Kansas player to have won both an NCAA and NBA title and the fourth under Self. He joins Clyde Lovellette (1952 NCAA title), Chalmers, Rush and Kaun, who were members of the 2008 NCAA National Championship team.

## THIS DAY IN KANSAS BASKETBALL HISTORY

## NOVEMBER



**Nov. 6, 1999:** The highly-touted recruiting class of Kirk Hinrich, Nick Collison and Drew Gooden made their Kansas debut in a 124-101 exhibition victory over the California All-Stars. Seven players, including all three freshmen, scored in double figures in this shootout. The Jayhawks led by only six at halftime, but came out with a 21-8 run to open the second half. The 1999 freshmen class would go on to become one of the most productive classes in school history, with all three members scoring at least 1,500 points in their careers.

#### **KANSAS VS. TOP-25 TEAMS**

No. 7 Texas (March 11, 2023) was the 14th Associated Press top-25 ranked team Kansas played in 2022-23. KU was 7-7 against AP ranked foes in 2022-23, including 4-2 versus top 10 teams. KU played 12 Associated Press-ranked opponents during the 2021-22 season and went 8-4 versus those teams. Eleven of the last 14 and 17 of Kansas' last 23 losses have been to ranked foes. In 2019-20, KU went 4-3 against top-25 teams. In the Bill Self era, KU is 120-70 against AP-ranked opponents, including 47-28 versus Top-10 foes. In that span, Self's KU teams have collected seven or more wins against ranked foes in each of the last three and four of the last five seasons.

Kansas' record against top-10 ranked opponents is even more impressive. KU is 21-13 against foes ranked inside the top-10 of the AP poll since 2013-14. Since Bill Self's first season, 2003-04, the Jayhawks are 18-4 against AP top-10 teams inside Allen Fieldhouse, 9-1 versus top-five opponents.

## **WINNING THE BIG 12 NO CAKEWALK**

If you think KU's success in the Big 12 is due to playing in a non-competitive conference, think again. The stats show that this is anything but the case. Over the last 19 seasons, the Big 12 has proven to be one of the toughest leagues in the NCAA, making KU's run of 15 league titles since 2004 even more impressive.

Beginning in the 2003-04 season, the Big 12 has ranked as the nation's No. 1 conference in the RPI/NET rankings six times and in the top-three on 11 occasions. The Big 12 was the only league that ended the 2020-21 season with seven teams and 70 percent of its membership in the top 36 of the NCAA NET ratings.

The stoutness of the league is also highlighted by KU's strength of schedule during this stretch, which has been among the toughest every season. The Jayhawks have posted a top-10 strength of schedule 13 times in Bill Self's 20 years at KU, which includes the nation's strongest schedule six times - 2004-05, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2018-19 and last season in 2022-23.

## **MORE KANSAS NOTABLES**

- Kansas went 16-for-16 on free throws at Baylor on Jan. 23., 2023. That is the most free throws made in a game without a miss in program history, surpassing Dec. 9, 2015 vs. Holy Cross when KU went 12-for-12 from the free throw line.
- Kansas went 15-1 in Allen Fieldhouse each of the last two seasons (2021-22 and 2022-23). KU has won 10 or more home games for 38 of the last 39 seasons, beginning in 1983-84. KU has won 12 or more in Allen Fieldhouse for 23 of the last 24 seasons beginning in 1999-2000.
- Kansas has won a mind-boggling 50-straight home openers (beginning in 1973-74 under coach Ted Owens), 32-consecutive conference openers (beginning in 1991-92 under head coach Roy Williams and including 2022-23) and 40-straight Senior Nights (beginning in 1983-84 under coach Larry Brown).
- On Nov. 9, 2022, former KU guard Jacque Vaughn was named head coach of the Brooklyn Nets. He is the fourth KU graduate to coach at the highest level - John McClendon (ABA, 1969-70 at Denver); Wilt Chamberlain (ABA, 1973-74 at San Diego); Kevin Pritchard (NBA, 2005 at Portland, 27 games); Jacque Vaughn (NBA, 2012-15 at Orlando, 2022-present at Brooklyn).

## **NOTES**

- Bill Self was named the eighth coach in Kansas basketball history on April 21, 2003.
- In September 2017, Self was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.
- Self won his 700th career game on Feb. 8, 2020, with KU's 60-46 win at TCU. He became the 31st coach in NCAA Division I to accomplish the feat, the second youngest and the sixth fastest.
- While at Kansas, Self has won two national championships (2008, 2022), 16 regular-season Big 12 Conference titles, including a KU- and NCAA-record-tying 13-straight titles from 2005-17, and eight league tournament titles.
- At Kansas, Self has won 16 regular-season league titles with just 17 losses in Allen Fieldhouse.
   With KU's win versus Siena (11/18/16), Self became the winningest coach in Allen Fieldhouse, posting his 207th victory in the venue.
- In his first trip to the Final Four in 2008, Self's Kansas team won the title. Self is one of two active coaches in NCAA Division I to have won multiple national titles (Rick Pitino) and one of 16 all-time with multiple titles.
- While at Kansas, he has coached 13 NBA Lottery selections including Andrew Wiggins and Joel Embiid, the No. 1 and No. 3 overall selections in the 2014 NBA Draft. Wiggins was the second-ever Jayhawk to go No. 1 with the other being Danny Manning in 1988.
- Self has guided his teams to 23-win seasons in 23 of the last 25 seasons dating back to 1998-99.
- Self's teams have won 20 regular-season league crowns in the last 25 years. His teams have never finished lower than third in the conference.
- Self's 10 career 30-win seasons are tied for third most in NCAA history Mike Krzyzewski (16), Roy
  Williams (12), John Calipari (10); and is tied for No. 1 on the active coaches' list. Nine of his 10
  30-win seasons have been at Kansas.
- Self was the head coach for Team USA's U18 team that competed and won gold at the 2018 FIBA Americas Championship held in St. Catherines, Canada, in the summer of 2018.
- Self is one of five coaches in NCAA Division I history to have led three different teams Tulsa,
   Illinois and Kansas to the NCAA Elite Eight, including eight times with KU (2004-07-08-11-12-16-17-22). The other coaches are: Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Rick Pitino and Eddie Sutton.
- A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kansas in 1985-86 under head coach Larry Brown. He then returned to his alma mater as an assistant for seven seasons under coaches Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton. His first head coaching job was at Oral Roberts in 1993-94, then Tulsa (1997-98), Illinois (2000-03) and Kansas (2003-present).
