TIPOFF

- No. 1 Kansas (4-0) will face its second-ranked opponent of the 2023-24 season when the Jayhawks face No. 4 Marquette (4-0) in the semifinals of the 2023 Allstate Maui Invitational, Tuesday, Nov. 21, at 9:30 p.m. Central. The game will be televised on ESPN with Dan Shulman, Jay Bilas and Angel Gray calling the action.
- Kansas is participating in its eighth Allstate Maui Invitational and has a combined record of 19-6 in the event. The Jayhawks are 3-0 in campus round games and hold a 16-6 record in Maui.
- Kansas has won three Maui Invationals in 1996, 2015 and 2019, including its last two appearances in the event.
- Kansas is facing Marquette for the ninth time in men's basketball. The Jayhawks have won the last four meetings against the Golden Eagles.
- Kansas is 4-0 after its 83-56 win against Chaminade in the opening round of the Maui Invitational. Marquette improved to 4-0 with a 71-69 win against UCLA in its opening-round game.
- KU won its mind-boggling 51st-straight home opener, 99-56 against North Carolina Central on Nov. 6. The streak began in 1973-74 under coach Ted Owens. KU coaches Larry Brown (5-0) and Roy Williams (15-0) never lost a home opener. KU is 21-0 in home openers under Bill Self.
- Kansas posted a 28-8 overall record in 2022-23 and won the Big 12 regular-season title with a 13-5 league mark.
- Kansas was No. 1 in the Associated Press preseason poll for the fourth time in poll history, with all four coming in the Bill Self era - 2004-05, 2009-10, 2018-19 and 2023-24.
- KU has been ranked in the Associated Press top 10 in each of the last 41 polls dating back to the 2021-22 preseason poll. The 41 consecutive is the longest active streak in men's college basketball.
- Including 2023-24, Kansas has been the Big 12 coaches' choice to win the league 20 times in the 27-year history of the conference.
- Kansas is celebrating 126 years of men's basketball in 2023-24.

ABOUT KANSAS

No. 1 Kansas is 4-0 for the 10th time in head coach Bill Self's 21 seasons after its 83-56 win against Chaminade in the opening-round game of the 2023 Allstate Maui Invitational on Nov. 20. Kansas averages 92.5 points per game with a plus-28.3 scoring margin. The Jayhawks pull down 42.0 rebounds per outing with a plus-11.3 rebound margin. Kansas also averages 27.5 assists, 6.8 steals and 4.5 blocked shots per contest.

Senior center Hunter Dickinson is coming off his second-straight double-double with 31 points and 11 rebounds against Chaminade where he was 15-for-18 from the field. He leads Kansas in scoring at 24.3 ppg and rebounding at 12.0 rpg. Named the Big 12 Player and Newcomer of the Week Nov. 20, Dickinson is 6-for-8 from three-point range through four games. Graduate-senior Kevin McCullar Jr. has posted back-to-back triple-doubles after his 12 points, 10 rebounds and a career-high 10 assists against Kentucky (Nov. 14) and his 22 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists versus Chaminade (Nov. 20). He is next in scoring at 17.8 points per contest. McCullar is tied with redshirt-senior Dajuan Harris Jr. for the team lead with six three pointers made. Junior KJ Adams Jr. leads the Big 12 in field goal percentage at 78.1%. Adams averages 12.5 points and 3.8 rebounds per contest. Harris scored a career-high 23 points against Kentucky and averages 8.0 points per contest. His 8.0 assists per game lead the Big 12. Freshman Elmarko Jackson (7.8 ppg, 4.8 assists per game) rounds out the KU starters. Other KU regulars include graduate-senior Parker Braun (5.5 ppg, 4.0 rpg, team-high five blocks), freshman Johnny Furphy (6.3 ppg, 2.8 rpg,) and graduate-senior Nicolas Timberlake (4.3 ppg).

Kansas opened the 2023-24 season with a 99-56 win against North Carolina Central on Nov. 6, in Allen Fieldhouse. The game was part of the McLendon Classic honoring Kansas grad and two-time Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame coach John McLendon.

Kansas is coming off a 28-8 season in which it won the Big 12 regular-season title with a 13-5 league record. It was KU's NCAA-record 63rd conference regular-season title and 16th under head coach Bill Self in his 20 seasons at Kansas.

Kansas returned three starters – Adams, Harris and McCullar – and eight letterwinners from last season. KU welcomed nine newcomers, including the 2023-24 coaches' Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year and the Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year Dickinson. Dickinson, Harris and McCullar were on the All-Big 12 Preseason team as well.

THE KANSAS-MARQUETTE SERIES

The Kansas and Marquette series dates back to 1956 and the Jayhawks hold a 7-1 advantage against the Golden Eagles. Kansas has won the last four meetings, including a 77-68 win in the 2018 NIT Tipoff in Brooklyn. The previous clash was in the 2003 Final Four in New Orleans, a KU 94-61 win.

A KANSAS WIN WOULD...

Make Kansas 5-0 for the second-consecutive season ... Make Kansas 20-6 all-time in the Maui Invitational, 17-6 in games played in Hawaii ... Give Kansas eight-straight wins in the Maui Invitational that includes the 2015 and 2019 Maui titles ... Make the Kansas-Marquette series 8-1 in favor of the Jayhawks ... Make Bill Self 570-132 while at Kansas and 777-237 overall ... Make Kansas 2,375-885 all-time.

A KANSAS LOSS WOULD...

Make Kansas 4-1 for the first time since also going 4-1 in the 2020-21 season ... End Kansas' seven-game winning streak in the Maui Invitational ... Make Kansas 19-7 all-time in the Maui Invitational, including 16-7 in games played in Hawaii ... Give Marquette its first win against Kansas since 1974, making the series 7-2 in favor of KU ... Make Bill Self 569-133 while at Kansas and 776-237 overall ... Make Kansas 2,374-886 all-time.

CHAMINADE LEFTOVERS

- Kansas is 4-0 for the 10th time in head coach Bill Self's 21 seasons at KU.
- Kansas improved to 19-6 in the Maui Invitational (16-6 in games played in Hawaii).
- KU extended its win streak in the Maui Invitational to seven games.
- Kansas has now made 141 field goals on 110 assists. Kansas dished out 29 assists against Chaminade and with 110 through the first four games, it is the most by a KU team in its first four contests since 1996-97 and most in the Bill Self era.
- Kansas shot 36-of-60 (60.0 percent) for the game. Kansas shot 17-of-30 (56.7 percent) from the floor in the first half and is 3-0 when shooting above 50.0 percent in the first half.
- Kansas' defense held Chaminade to 2-of-12 (16.7 percent) from beyond the arc in the first half.
- Kansas recorded a season-high 58 points in the paint and converted on 27 fast-break points.
- Kansas outrebounded Chaminade 41-26 and never trailed during the contest.
- Graduate-senior Kevin McCullar Jr. recorded a triple-double (22 pts, 11 rebs, 10 asts) for a second-consecutive game, which is the first in Kansas men's basketball history. It is the seventh time in NCAA history a player has recorded consecutive triple-doubles, with the last being Tony Lee of Robert Morris on Feb. 9, 2008 and Feb. 14, 2008.
- Senior center Hunter Dickinson posted a KU-career-high 31 points on 15-of-18 (83.3 percent) shooting to go along with 11 rebounds and two steals. Dickinson has now scored 20 or more points in three of four games this season and 37 times for his career. In the first half, Dickinson posted 15 points on 7-of-8 (87.5 percent) shooting. In each of Dickinson's four games with Kansas he has scored in double figures in the first half.
- Redshirt-senior Dajuan Harris Jr. dished out eight assists, tying him for 13th on Kansas' all-time career assists list with Ryan Robertson (1996-99 at KU) at 485. Harris also posted seven points and pulled down four rebounds.
- Junior KJ Adams Jr. logged eight points on 4-of-5 (80.0 percent) shooting and also dished out four assists. Adams has shot 80 percent or better in two of four games this season. He has shot 72.7 percent or better in all four games this season.
- Freshman Elmarko Jackson scored seven points on 2-of-4 (50.0 percent) shooting, dished out three assists and pulled down two rebounds.
- Freshman Johnny Furphy made his first collegiate start for Kansas, scoring four points and pulling down two rebounds.

KANSAS NOTABLES

- Kansas beat Kentucky, 89-84, on Nov. 14, thanks in part to 27 made free throws. The Jayhawks are 48-1 (.980) under Bill Self (since 2003-04) when they make 25 or more free throws in a game, the best record by any D-1 team in that span (minimum 40 games).
- Kansas overcame a 14-point deficit in the second half to Kentucky to win its first game when trailing by double-digits since Feb. 18, 2023 vs. #9 Baylor (17 points). In the last 10 seasons, Kansas has posted 31 wins when overcoming a 10-point deficit. That is the most among Big 12 teams with Iowa State at 27 being second.

KANSAS IN THE MAUI INVITATIONAL

Kansas has a combined 19-6 record in the Maui Invitational (counting mainland home games that were part of three tournaments). KU is 16-6 in games played in Hawaii and has won its last six games in the invitational.

This is Kansas' eighth appearance in the Maui Invitational, which is tied for the most all-time with Arizona and North Carolina. The Jayhawks' three championships in Maui trail only Duke (five) and North Carolina (four) all-time.

In KU's 1988 NCAA National Championship season, the Jayhawks placed fourth in the event, going 1-2. Kansas won the 1996 Maui Invitational, defeating LSU, California and Virginia. Raef LaFrentz was named the MVP. In 2001, KU finished third in the event with a 2-1 record. Drew Gooden was a member of the all-tournament team and was the first Jayhawk on the Maui Invitational all-tourney list, which began in 2000.

KU has appeared in the invitational four times under Bill Self. In 2005, the Jayhawks placed seventh, losing to Arizona and Arkansas before defeating Chaminade. In 2011, KU finished runner-up, defeating Georgetown and UCLA before falling to Duke in the title game. Jayhawk Thomas Robinson was named to the 2011 Maui All-Tournament Team. Later that season KU would advance to the Final Four, finishing runner-up. In 2015, Kansas won the event with victories over Chaminade, UCLA and Vanderbilt. KU's Wayne Selden Jr. and Frank Mason III were named co-MVPs, and were joined on the all-tournament team by teammate Perry Ellis. In 2019, Kansas defeated Chaminade, BYU and Dayton en route to its fourth Maui Invitational title. KU's Devon Dotson and Udoka Azubuike were named co-MVPs of the 2019 event.

DICKINSON NAMED BIG 12 PLAYER & NEWCOMER OF THE WEEK

Kansas center Hunter Dickinson swept both the Big 12 Men's Basketball Player and Newcomer of the Week honors after leading the top-ranked Jayhawks to an 89-84 come-from-behind victory against No. 17 Kentucky in the Champions Classic in Chicago on Nov. 14. Dickinson is the first Big 12 player to win both awards since Iowa State's Izaiah Brockington on Dec. 27, 2021.

Dickinson recorded his first double-double as a Jayhawk and the 32nd of his career with a game-high 27 points and a career-high 21 rebounds, while adding a career-high-tying three steals against Kentucky. The senior transfer from Michigan secured the double-double in the first half with 13 points and 10 rebounds at the break. Kansas trailed Kentucky by 14 points in the second half before mounting the come-from-behind win.

DICKINSON NAMED BIG 12 NEWCOMER OF THE WEEK

Kansas senior center Hunter Dickinson averaged 19.5 points, 8.0 rebounds and shot 4-of-4 from three-point range to be named the Big 12 Newcomer of the Week, the conference office announced on Nov. 13. This is the first weekly honor for Dickinson and a KU player and the 11th conference weekly honor of his career.

Dickinson scored 21 points in just 24 minutes in his Kansas debut against North Carolina Central, a KU 99-56 win on Nov. 6. Dickinson went 3-of-3 from beyond the arc and was almost perfect from the field, going 8-for-9 with eight rebounds, five assists, two blocked shots and one steal. In Kansas' 99-61 win against Manhattan College on Nov. 10, Dickinson posted 18 points, eight rebounds and two assists in 21 minutes.

JAYHAWKS NO. 1 IN PRESEASON POLLS

Kansas entered the 2023-24 season No. 1 in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' polls. This marked the fourth time KU has been No. 1 in the preseason AP poll with all four in the Bill Self era - 2004-05, 2009-10, 2018-19 and 2023-24. This is the fifth time in the coaches' poll that the Jayhawks have been No. 1 in the preseason poll with four in the Self era - 1996-97, 2004-05, 2009-10, 2018-19 and 2023-24.

Under 21st-year and Hall of Fame head coach Bill Self, this is the 18th time that Kansas entered the season ranked seventh or higher in the Associated Press preseason poll. Historically, the No. 1 ranking marks the 26th time since the 1992-93 season that Kansas will enter the season seventh or higher.

Kansas could possibly play 10 games against teams ranked in the preseason Associated Press Top 25. KU will play against No. 6 UConn, No. 7 Houston, No. 16 Kentucky, No. 18 Texas and No. 20 Baylor (twice). KU could also play No. 3 Purdue, No. 5 Marquette, and No. 11 Gonzaga in the Maui Invitational, Nov. 20-22, in Honolulu.

The No. 1 ranking marked the 10th-straight year Kansas has entered the season No. 5 or higher in the coaches' poll dating back to 2014-15. Additionally, it is the 18th time in the Self era the Jayhawks have been preseason seventh or higher, including each of the last 12 seasons.

KU PICKED FIRST IN THE PRESEASON BIG 12 POLL

For the 20th time in the 27-year history of the coaches' preseason Big 12 poll, Kansas has been selected as the favorite to win the league as the preseason poll was announced Oct. 13.

For the 2023-24 poll, KU collected 12 of a possible 14 first-place votes and finished with a total of 168 points. Houston received two first-place nods and was second with 153 points. Texas was third with 143 points, while Baylor was fourth with 137 points and TCU fifth with 113 points to round out the top five. See page 9 for the complete poll.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12

Kansas men's basketball senior Hunter Dickinson, redshirt-senior Dajuan Harris Jr. and graduate Kevin McCullar Jr. were named to the 2023-24 Preseason All-Big 12 Team as voted on by the league coaches, the conference announced Oct. 12.

Dickinson is the Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year and the Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, becoming the first player in conference history to earn both honors in the same season. Dickinson is joined on the Preseason All-Big 12 First Team by Harris, while McCullar is an honorable mention honoree.

Historically, Dickinson is the 11th Jayhawk to collect the preseason player of the year award and the fifth to earn preseason newcomer. Kansas has had at least one player on the Preseason All-Big 12 First Team in all but two of the 28 seasons the conference has existed, since 1996-97. Dickinson and Harris are the 39th and 40th Jayhawks to be listed on the preseason all-league first team.

THREE JAYHAWKS ON WOODEN AWARD PRESEASON TOP 50

Hunter Dickinson, redshirt-senior Dajuan Harris Jr. and graduate Kevin McCullar Jr. were named to the 2023-24 Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 on Nov. 14. Kansas is one of three schools with three players on the list, along with Duke and Creighton. Kansas has had two previous winners of the John R. Wooden Award with Danny Manning in 1988 and Frank Mason III in 2017.

Chosen by a preseason poll of national college basketball experts, the Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 is comprised of student-athletes who are the early front-runners for the one of the most prestigious honors in college basketball, the Wooden Award All American Team and Most Outstanding Player Award.

Players not chosen to the preseason list are still eligible for the Wooden Award midseason list, late season list, and the National Ballot, which consists of 15 student-athletes. Last year, KU's Jalen Wilson was on the Wooden National Ballot and Jayhawk Ochai Agbaji was on the ballot the previous season in 2022. Both were Wooden finalists as well.

KU TRIO ON NAISMITH PRESEASON TOP 50

The Kansas men's basketball trio of Hunter Dickinson, Dajuan Harris Jr. and Kevin McCullar Jr. have been named to the 2023-24 Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy Men's preseason 50 watch list the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced Nov. 6, the opening day of the season. Kansas is the only team with three players on the list and one of eight schools with multiple players.

Kansas has had two previous winners of the Naismith Trophy with Danny Manning in 1988 and Frank Mason III in 2017.

In late January the Naismith Trophy will name a top 15 midseason team. In early March 2024 the award will announce 10 national semifinalists and later that month name four finalists. The Naismith Trophy Men's Player of the Year will be awarded April 7, the Sunday prior to the NCAA title game.

DICKINSON ON THE PRESEASON NABC WATCH LIST

Kansas senior Hunter Dickinson was one of 20 players named to the 2024 NABC Division I Player of the Year Watch List, the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) announced Nov. 2. The 2024 NABC Division I Player of the Year - selected by a vote of Division I head coaches - will be announced the week of the 2024 Men's Final Four.

KANSAS VS. TOP-25 TEAMS

No. 4 Marquette will be the second Associated Press (AP) ranked opponent for Kansas in 2023-24. KU defeated No. 17 Kentucky on Nov. 14. Last season, KU was 7-7 against AP ranked foes in 2022-23, including 4-2 versus top 10 teams. KU played 12 Associated Press-ranked opponents during the 2021-22 season and went 8-4 versus those teams. Eleven of the last 14 and 17 of Kansas' last 23 losses have been to ranked foes. In 2019-20, KU went 4-3 against top-25 teams. In the Bill Self era, KU is 120-72 against AP-ranked opponents, including 47-28 versus Top-10 foes. In that span, Self's KU teams have collected seven or more wins against ranked foes in each of the last three and four of the last five seasons.

Kansas' record against top-10 ranked opponents is even more impressive. KU is 21-13 against foes ranked inside the top-10 of the AP poll since 2013-14. Since Bill Self's first season, 2003-04, the Jayhawks are 18-4 against AP top-10 teams inside Allen Fieldhouse, 9-1 versus top-five opponents.

WINNING THE BIG 12 NO CAKEWALK

If you think KU's success in the Big 12 is due to playing in a non-competitive conference, think again. The stats show that this is anything but the case. Over the last 20 seasons, the Big 12 has proven to be one of the toughest leagues in the NCAA, making KU's run of 16 league titles since 2004 even more impressive.

Beginning in the 2003-04 season, the Big 12 has ranked as the nation's No. 1 conference in the RPI/NET rankings six times and in the top-three on 11 occasions. The Big 12 was the only league that ended the 2020-21 season with seven teams and 70 percent of its membership in the top 36 of the NCAA NET ratings.

The stoutness of the league is also highlighted by KU's strength of schedule during this stretch, which has been among the toughest every season. The Jayhawks have posted a top-10 strength of schedule 13 times in Bill Self's 20 years at KU, which includes the nation's strongest schedule six times - 2004-05, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2018-19 and last season in 2022-23.

FOUR JAYHAWKS ARE ON STARTING FIVE WATCH LISTS

In October, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced watch lists for its "Starting Five" for the 2023-24 season. Four Jayhawks were among the 20 watch list honorees with Dajuan Harris Jr. on the Bob Cousy Point Guard Award, Kevin McCullar Jr. on the Jerry West Shooting Guard Award, Johnny Furphy on the Julius Erving Small Forward Award and Hunter Dickinson on the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center Award.

A national committee of top college basketball personnel determined the watch lists of 20 candidates for every starting five.

College basketball fans are encouraged to participate in Fan Voting presented by Dell Technologies in each of the three rounds. In late January, the watch list of 20 players for each honor will be narrowed to 10 and then in late February to five. In March, the Hall of Fame's selection committee will determine the winners.

Historically, Kansas' Jalen Wilson was the 2023 Julius Erving Award recipient and Jayhawk Frank Mason III won the 2017 Bob Cousy Award.

CLOSE CALLS

Kansas' 89-84 win versus Kentucky on Nov. 14 marked the first five-point decision this season. In 2022-23, Kansas had 11 games decided by five points or less and/or in overtime. KU went 9-2 in those contests. In Kansas' 2021-22 national championship season, KU also played 11 games with the outcome being decided by five points or less or in overtime. KU went 9-2 in those contests.

- Kansas has 2,374 all-time victories which is the second most in NCAA Division I men's basketball history.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas has won 16 regular-season Big 12 championships with just 17 losses at Allen Fieldhouse.
- KU has held opponents to fewer than 100 points in 768 of its last 771 games. The last team to score 100 on Kansas in a 40-minute game was Gonzaga (102-90) on 11.26.2020 with the previous being Oklahoma (100-78) on 2.27.1990.
- Kansas set the NCAA DI record for being ranked in the Associated Press poll at 231 consecutive weeks from Feb. 2, 2009 until Feb. 1, 2021. KU's stretch consisted of 433 games of being ranked.
- KU has won at least 12 league games for 23 of the last 24 seasons.
- Each four-year KU senior class since 1986-87 has won at least 100 games. The current KU four-year players - graduate Michael Jankovich and redshirt senior Dajuan Harris Jr. - have won 87.
- Kansas is the only team in the Big 12 to have a .500 winning percentage or better series record against every league foe.
- KU is the only Big 12 school to have won a regular-season championship with two different coaches (Roy Williams and Bill Self).
- Kansas is first in the conference in wins with a 365-86 record in Big 12 regular-season games. Texas is next at 275-179. Including the league postseason championship, Kansas is top at 417-99, while Texas is second at 304-201.

MORE KANSAS NOTABLES

- On Nov. 7, Naismith Hall of Fame member Bill Self signed an amended contract with the University of Kansas. Self and KU Director of Athletics Travis Goff signed the reworked agreement — effectively a five-year extension worth \$44.5 million, including a \$1 million signing bonus.
- Kansas went 16-for-16 on free throws at Baylor on Jan. 23, 2023. That is the most free throws made in a game without a miss in program history, surpassing Dec. 9, 2015 vs. Holy Cross when KU went 12-for-12 from the free throw line.
- Kansas went 15-1 in Allen Fieldhouse each of the last two seasons (2021-22 and 2022-23). KU has won 10 or more home games for 38 of the last 39 seasons, beginning in 1983-84. KU has won 12 or more in Allen Fieldhouse for 23 of the last 24 seasons beginning in 1999-2000.
- KU won its mind-boggling 51st-straight home opener with a 99-56 win against North Carolina Central on Nov. 6. The streak began in 1973-74 under head coach Ted Owens. KU coaches Larry Brown (5-0) and Roy Williams (15-0) never lost a home opener. KU is 21-0 in home openers in the Bill Self era.

- Kansas has won 31 of its last 32 conference openers (beginning in 1991-92 under head coach Roy Williams and including 2022-23) and 30 of its last 40 Senior Nights (beginning in 1983-84 under coach Larry Brown).
- On Nov. 9, 2022, former KU guard Jacque Vaughn was named head coach of the Brooklyn Nets. He is the fourth KU graduate to coach at the highest level - John McClendon (ABA, 1969-70 at Denver); Wilt Chamberlain (ABA, 1973-74 at San Diego); Kevin Pritchard (NBA, 2005 at Portland, 27 games); Jacque Vaughn (NBA, 2012-15 at Orlando, 2022-present at Brooklyn).

BRAUN WINS NBA TITLE

Former Kansas guard Chirstian Braun became the 15th Jayhawk to win an NBA title, when the Denver Nuggets defeated the Miami Heat last June.

Braun played three seasons at Kansas from 2019-20 to 2021-22. In 2020, the Burlington, Kansas, native was named to the Big 12 All-Freshman Team and he was a 2021 all-conference honorable mention selection the following season. In Kansas' 2022 NCAA National Championship season, Braun averaged 14.1 points and 6.5 rebounds per game. The two-time Academic All-Big 12 First Team selection was an all-league second-team selection, and was on the all-tournament teams for the Big 12 Championship and the NCAA Tournament Midwest Regional. In his three seasons at KU, Braun played in 101 games with 74 starts and had 1,018 career points, 506 rebounds, 183 assists and 97 steals.

Braun is the fifth player in NBA history to win an NCAA title and an NBA title in back-to-back seasons. He joins Bill Russell (1956 San Francisco; 1957 Boston Celtics), Henry Bibby (1972 UCLA; 1973 New York Knicks), Magic Johnson (1979 Michigan State, 1980 L.A. Lakers) and Billy Thompson (1986 Louisville; 1987 L.A. Lakers).

With the addition of Braun, there have been 15 Jayhawks who have won 20 NBA titles during their professional careers. Braun becomes the seventh Jayhawk under head coach Bill Self to win an NBA title. He joins Wayne Simien (2006), Mario Chalmers (2012, 2013), Brandon Rush (2015), Sasha Kaun (2016), Markieff Morris (2020) and Andrew Wiggins (2022).

Braun is the fifth Kansas player to have won both an NCAA and NBA title and the fourth under Self. He joins Clyde Lovellette (1952 NCAA title), Chalmers, Rush and Kaun, who were members of the 2008 NCAA National Championship team.

KANSAS HOSTED MCCLENDON CLASSIC NOV. 5-6

Kansas Athletics hosted the inaugural McLendon Classic over the weekend of Nov. 5-6 on the campus of the University of Kansas. On Nov. 5 KU hosted the McLendon Classic Community Event at the Lied Center. The two-day recognition concluded when Kansas basketball hosts North Carolina Central on Nov. 6. In Allen Fieldhouse.

The McLendon Classic Community Event featured a screening of Fast Break: The Legendary John McLendon. Following the showing, there was a round table discussion featuring KU professor and Emmy Award winning director Kevin Willmott, KU director of equity and success initiatives Melissa Peterson, North Carolina Central head coach LeVelle Moton and KU head coach Bill Self. KU professor Shawn Alexander will serve as moderator to the round table discussion, and the group shared their thoughts about the documentary while exploring the profound impact that John McLendon had on the University of Kansas, the game of basketball and society at large.

The Nov. 6 basketball game honored McLendon during the contest. Both teams' coaching staffs wore patches and special pregame shooting shirts. There were recognitions throughout the contest honoring McLendon as well as moments to highlight current affinity groups at KU that are continuing McLendon's legacy of inclusion, pro activity and perseverance.

KANSAS SIGNS THREE IN NOVEMBER

Flory Bidunga (G, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Kokomo [Ind.] HS), Rakease Passmore (G, Palatka, Fla., A.C. Reynolds [N.C.] HS, Combine (N.C.) Academy) and Labaron Philon (G, Mobile, Ala., Baker HS, Link [Mo.] Academy) have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball at Kansas, KU head coach Bill Self announced Nov. 8-9. The three will be freshmen at KU for the 2024-25 season. The Kansas class ranks fourth nationally according to 247sports.com.

FLORY BIDUNGA – FR., F, 6-9, 220, DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF THE CONGO, KOKOMO (IND.) HS

- Was named to the Naismith Trophy Boy's High School Player of the Year Preseason Watch List on Nov. 17.
- Is a five-star big man from the Democratic Republic of the Congo who attends Kokomo High School in Kokomo, Indiana.
- Has been described as a freak athlete who can rebound, block shots and plays above the rim.
