TIPOFF

- The 56th season of intercollegiate women's basketball at the University of Kansas tips off on Wednesday, Nov. 8, at Allen Fieldhouse as the Jayhawks host Northwestern State.
- Tipoff is set for 6:30 p.m. CT and the game will be televised on Big 12 NOW, with Leif Lisec and Jill Dorsey-Hall on the call. Fans can also listen to the game on the Javhawk Radio Network from Learfield, with Steven Davis calling the action
- The Jayhawks have been picked to finish third in the Big 12 Conference during the 2023-24 season. Kansas earned a top-three conference projection for the fourth time in league history, and the first since being picked second prior to the 2009-10 season.
- · Kansas is receiving votes in both the Associated Press and WBCA Coaches polls after finishing 25-11 and claiming the 2023 WNIT Championship last season.
- Brandon Schneider is back for his ninth season leading the Jayhawks. The 2022 Big 12 Coach of the Year has guided Kansas to back-to-back 20-win seasons and postseason appearances. Last season, Schneider recorded his 500th career win and he enters his 26th season as a collegiate head coach with a career record of 508-274.

KANSAS NOTES

- Kansas returns four starters and seven letterwinners from last year's team, led by Preseason All-Big 12 selections Taiyanna Jackson, Zakiyah Franklin and Holly Kersgieter.
- The super-senior trio is back for their third year together at Kansas. Jackson was a unanimous Preseason All-Big 12 selection, while Franklin also earned a spot on the team and Kersgeiter received honorable mention.
- Jackson headlines the list of returners for Kansas following a breakthrough 2022-23

season. She is one of 50 players named to the 2023-24 Naismith Women's Player of the Year Watch List and one of 20 preseason candidates for the Lisa Leslie Award, recognizing the top center in college basketball.

- · Last season, Jackson was a unanimous All-Big 12 First Team and Big 12 All-Defensive Team selection after becoming the first Kansas player since 1981-82 to average a double-double, totaling 15.2 points and 12.7 rebounds per game for the year. She also finished the season with 23 double-doubles, the third-most in KU history, and ranked second in school history by shooting 66.1 percent (230-of-348) from the field.
- Franklin is a Preseason All-Big 12 selection and one of 20 candidates for the Nancy Lieberman Award, which recognizes the top point guard in college basketball. Franklin returns for her fifth year at Kansas after earning All-Big 12 First Team honors as KU's leading scorer at 15.7 points per game last season.
- Kersgieter is on the Preseason All-Big 12 Team for the fourth consecutive season. Last year, she ranked third on the team with 13.8 points per game and hit 64 three-pointers, which ranked sixth on KU's single-season list.

Brandon Schneider is in his ninth season at the helm of the Kansas Women's Basketball program. He was named the sixth head coach to lead the Jayhawks on April 20, 2015, and he signed a new four-year contract on March 9, 2022, that will keep him in Lawrence through the 2025-26 season.

Schneider has led the Jayhawks to the postseason in each of the past two seasons. The 2022-23 season saw Kansas finish with a 25-11 record after winning the WNIT with a 66-59 victory over Columbia in front of a crowd of 11,701 fans at Allen Fieldhouse. The Jayhawks played all six of its WNIT games at home and averaged 3,481 per game for the season, marking a 122 percent increase in home attendance from the 2021-22 season.

KU finished with 25 wins for just the sixth time in program. history, and the first since 1996-97. The Jayhawks have now won 20 or more games in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2012 and 2013. For his efforts, Schneider was named the Kansas Basketball Coaches Association (KBCA) Women's Four-Year College Coach of the Year in 2023, his third time earning the honor after also claiming in 2006 and 2010 as the head coach at Emporia State. During the 2022-23 season, Schneider became the 33rd active Division I coach to reach 500 career victories, picking up win No. 500 on Feb. 26, 2023, with a 66-57 win over Oklahoma

Schneider guided the Jayhawks to a breakthrough campaign in 2021-22. Kansas finished the season with a record of 21-10, marking the program's first 20-win season since 2012-13, and the Javhawks had 20 wins during the regular season for the first time since 1999-2000. Schneider was named the 2022 Big 12 Coach of the Year after guiding the Jayhawks to a fifth-place finish with 11 conference victories, the most by a KU team since 1999-2000.

Schneider guided Kansas to the 2022 NCAA Tournament, earning a No. 8 seed in the Spokane Regional. The Jayhawks defeated No. 9-seed Georgia Tech, 77-58, in the opening round before falling to eventual regional champion Stanford in the second round. The tournament bid was the 14th in program history for the Jayhawks and first since 2013.

During his tenure at Kansas, Schneider has coached 11 players who earned All-Big 12 postseason recognition. The Jayhawks have also had two players named to the Big 12 All-Freshman Team and two named to the Big 12 All-Defensive Team along with six Big 12 Players of the Week and three Freshman of the Week. Schneider has also coached 37 players who received Academic All-Big 12 recognition, including a program-best seven student-athletes earning a spot on the team in both 2022 and 2023. Additionally, Schneider's program set a new team-record with a 3.44 Team GPA

in the 2021 fall semester

Schneider increased the Jayhawks win total in each of his first five seasons in Lawrence, which culminated with a 15-14 record in 2019-20. That year, the Jayhawks finished with a winning record for the first time in seven seasons and were set to play in a postseason tournament prior to the COVID-19 pandemic cancelling the Big 12 Tournament and beyond.

Prior to Kansas, Schneider had a five-year stint at Stephen F. Austin, where he returned SFA to the top of the Southland Conference. Schneider guided SFA to three 20-win seasons and the Ladyjacks won back-to-back league titles in 2013-14 and 2014-15. SFA made three postseason appearances under Schneider, including the WNIT in 2015 after he was named the Southland Conference Coach of the Year. As head coach at Stephen F. Austin, Schneider was 95-66 overall in five years and 57-29 in Southland Conference play.

Schneider was named head coach of the Ladyjacks on April 20, 2010. Recognized as one of the top names at the NCAA Division II level, Schneider went to Nacogdoches after a highly successful 12-year stint at Emporia State.

The Canyon, Texas native is the second all-time winningest head coach at the NCAA Division II level. At Emporia State, Schneider guided the Lady Hornets to a 306-72 (.810) record, and the 2010 NCAA Division II National Championship. The school's all-time leader in wins and winning percentage, Schneider ranks among the all-time top 10 in fastest coaches to 100 victories, and third fastest among women's basketball coaches.

Schneider spent 12 seasons at ESU guiding the Lady Hornets to 11 NCAA Tournament appearances. During that stretch, Schneider's teams recorded two 30-win seasons and nine 20-win campaigns. Along with the 2010 national championship, Schneider coached ESU to four NCAA Division II South Central Regional titles, two Final Four appearances, six regular-season conference crowns and three league tournament titles.

Schneider was the first MIAA rookie head coach to win both the MIAA regular-season and tournament titles. In 2006 and 2010, the Kansas Basketball Coaches Association of four-year colleges voted Schneider as its coach of the year. He was also a three-time MIAA Coach of the Year.

The 2010 Bulletin Women's Basketball National Coach of the Year and the WBCA South Central Region Coach of the Year, Schneider's players have reaped the rewards of his guidance. He coached seven All-Americans, including two NCAA Division II Players of the Year, eight conference MVPs and seven players who have gone on to play professionally, including one in the WNBA.

A 1995 honors graduate of Wayland Baptist, Schneider was a four-year letterman in men's basketball for the Pioneers and the school's first-ever Academic All-American, capturing the honor

Schneider was raised in a coaching family. His father, Bob. was a member of the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame Class of 2022 following a 40-year coaching career at the high school and collegiate levels. Bob Schneider was one of the most successful women's coaches at the NCAA Division II level, having served as the head coach at West Texas A&M from 1981-2006. They became the first father/son combination to take teams to the Elite Eight. In addition. Schneider's brother. Brett, is currently the head women's basketball coach at Frank Phillips College in Borger, Texas.

Schneider and his wife Ali, have two sons, Cash and Cole.
