TIPOFF

- No. 2 Kansas (8-1) concludes its four-game homestand when it hosts Missouri (7-2) in the HyVee Hoops Border Showdown on Saturday, Dec. 9, at 4:15 p.m. (Central). The contest from Allen Fieldhouse will be televised on ESPN with Tom Hart and Fran Fraschilla calling the action.
- Kansas is 8-1 for the sixth-straight season beginning in 2018-19 after its 88-69 win against Kansas City on Dec. 5. Missouri has won four straight games after its 82-72 win against Wichita State on Dec. 3.
- This will be the 271st meeting in the HyVee Hoops Border Showdown rivalry. Kansas and Missouri were conference members from 1907 to 2012. KU leads the overall series 175-95, which includes a 95-67 win last season in Mizzou Arena. The Jayhawks have won four straight and nine of the last 10 meetings with MU.
- Kansas will be retiring two jerseys in 2023-24 beginning Dec. 9 with 2012 Consensus All-America and Big 12 Player of the Year Thomas Robinson.
- Kansas is No. 15 in the men's basketball NET rankings through games of Dec. 6. Kansas' three Quadrant 1 wins are tied for the most with Purdue and Clemson.
- Kansas has won 12-straight games against non-conference opponents in Allen Fieldhouse. The Jayhawks are 150-6 (96.2%) versus non-league foes in Allen Fieldhouse under Bill Self.
- Kansas leads the nation in assists per game at 22.8 and in field goal percentage at 53.6%. Kansas is the only Power 5 school and just one of two teams (McNeese) to rank in the top 10 nationally in both FG% (first) and FG% defense, ninth at 36.7%.
- Senior Hunter Dickinson is second in the nation in rebounds per game at 12.2. At 20.1 ppg, he is the only player in the Big 12 to average a double-double.
- Graduate-senior Kevin McCullar Jr. leads the nation in triple doubles with two. He is just the seventh player in NCAA history to record consecutive triple doubles and the first since Tony Lee of Robert Morris (2007-08).
- Redshirt-senior Dajuan Harris Jr. leads the Big 12 in assists per game at 7.2, which is fifth nationally.

ABOUT KANSAS

No. 2 Kansas is 8-1 after its 88-69 win against Kansas City on Dec. 5. Kansas enters Saturday's matchup averaging 80.7 points per game with a plus-15.4 scoring margin. The Jayhawks pull down 38.7 rebounds per outing with a plus-5.6 rebound margin. Kansas leads the nation in assists per game at 22.8 and in field goal percentage (53.6%). KU also averages 7.2 steals and 4.9 blocked shots per contest.

On most every national player of the year watch list, senior center Hunter Dickinson leads Kansas in scoring at 20.1 ppg and is second in the nation in rebounds per game at 12.2 rpg. He is the only player in the Big 12 to average a double-double. A three-time Big 12 weekly award honoree, Dickinson is 11-for-19 (57.9%) from three-point range and leads KU with 13 blocked shots and 12 steals.

Named the Big 12 Player of the Week and an Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week Nov. 28, graduate-senior Kevin McCullar Jr. leads the nation in triple doubles with two. He is coming off a career-high 25 points against Kansas City (12/5) and is second on the KU team in scoring at 19.2 points per contest. McCullar has made a team-high 13 threes made.

Junior KJ Adams Jr. leads the Big 12 and is fifth nationally in field goal percentage at 70.6%. Adams has scored a season-high 18 points in each of his last two games against UConn (12/1) and Kansas City (12/5), Adams averages 12.4 points and 4.0 rebounds per contest.

Redshirt-senior Dajuan Harris Jr. leads the Big 12 with 7.2 assists per game, which is fifth nationally. Harris averages 5.9 points per contest. Freshman Elmarko Jackson (5.7 ppg, 3.3 assists per game) rounds out the KU starters. Other KU regulars include Furphy (6.3 ppg, 12 3FGs), graduate-senior Nicolas Timberlake (3.6 ppg, six 3FGs), graduate-senior Parker Braun (3.4 ppg, 2.4 rpg, eight blocked shots), and freshman Jamari McDowell (2.5 ppg, 2.0 rpg).

Kansas opened the 2023-24 season with a 99-56 win against North Carolina Central on Nov. 6, in Allen Fieldhouse. The game was part of the McLendon Classic honoring Kansas grad and two-time Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame coach John McLendon.

ABOUT MISSOURI

Located in Columbia, Missouri, the Tigers bring a four-game winning streak to Allen Fieldhouse after its 82-72 win against Wichita State on Dec. 3. The Tigers are 2-0 in true road games this season with wins at Minnesota and Pittsburgh. MU is coached by Dennis Gates who is 32-12 in his second season at Missouri and 82-52 in his fifth season overall.

Missouri averages 75.4 points per game with a plus-8.2 scoring margin. The Tigers also record 34.1 rebounds, 9.7 three-pointers made, 14.6 assists, 9.3 steals and 6.7 blocked shots per game. The 6.7 blocked shots rank sixth in the nation.

Graduate G Sean East II leads Missouri in scoring at 16.8 points per game. He also leads the team with 31 assists and has made 13 threes this season. Graduate G Noah Carter is next in scoring at 12.6 points per game. He leads the team with 6.7 rebounds per game and is second on the team with 13 blocked shots. Carter has made 14 threes this season. Graduate G Nick Honor (11.8 ppg) has made a team-high 24 three pointers, while graduate G Caleb Grill, an Iowa State transfer, is second on the team with a 5.8 rebounds per game average to complement his 8.4 scoring average. Other MU regulars include junior G Tamar Bates (7.4 ppg), freshman G Anthony Robinson II (5.7 ppg, team-high 17 steals), graduate C Connor Vanover (3.2 ppg), graduate G John Tonje (3.2 ppg, has missed the last three games) and sophomore F Aiden Shaw (3.1 ppg, 4.3 rpg, team-high 20 blocked shots).

THE KANSAS-MISSOURI SERIES

This HyVee Hoops Border Showdown series dates back to 1907 when both schools were members of the Missouri Valley Intercollegiate Athletic Association (1907-28), then the Big Six (1929-47), Big Seven (1948-58), Big Eight (1959-96) and Big 12 (1997-2012) when Missouri left the league following the 2011-12 season. Kansas leads the overall series, 175-95, with the last meeting being last season, a KU 96-67 win in Columbia. Including a 93-87 exhibition win in 2017, Kansas has won four straight and nine of the last 10 battles with MU.

From 2009 to 2012, the Jayhawks won six of the last seven regular-season meetings against the Tigers, with the last matchup being an 87-86 overtime win for No. 4-ranked Kansas over No. 3 Missouri in an epic come-from-behind win at Allen Fieldhouse. In MU's time in the Big 12, from 1996-97 to 2011-12, Kansas was 26-10 against Missouri – 23-9 in regular-season play and 3-1 in the Big 12 Championship.

- Kansas has won the last four meetings, nine of the last 10 and 14 of the last 16 against Missouri dating back to March 6, 2006.
- KU has won the last 14 meetings in Allen Fieldhouse (from 2000-21) versus Missouri.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas is 18-4 (81.8%) against Missouri, including 10-0 in Allen Fieldhouse and 6-4 in Columbia (5-4 in Mizzou Arena).
- Since 1991, Kansas is 36-13 (73.5%) against Missouri.

In 2017, the Showdown for Relief came to fruition on Oct. 13 as an opportunity to raise funds for hurricane relief efforts that occurred in the United States, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands. The game sold out within two days and public tickets were never available. Nine days later, on Oct. 22, Kansas defeated Missouri, 93-87, before a crowd of 18,951 in Sprint Center in Kansas City, Missouri, and the event raised in excess of \$2 million for hurricane victims.

Make Kansas 9-1 or better for the third-straight season and fifth time in the last six seasons beginning in 2018-19 ... Give Kansas its fifth-straight win against Missouri and the 176-95 in favor of the Jayhawks ... Give Kansas 11-straight wins in Allen Fieldhouse, including 6-0 this season, 846-117 all-time in the venue and 305-17 under Bill Self ... Make Self 151-6 against non-conference opponents in Allen Fieldhouse ... Make Bill Self 574-133 while at Kansas, 781-238 overall and 19-4 versus Missouri ... Make Kansas 2,379-886 all-time.

Make Kansas 8-2 on the season, yet still making KU 8-2 or better for 10-straight seasons beginning in 2014-15 ... End a Kansas four-game winning streak against Missouri ... End a Kansas 14-straight win streak against Missouri in Allen Fieldhouse ... Make the KU-MU all-time series 175-96 in favor of Kansas ... End a Kansas 10-game win streak in Allen Fieldhouse ... Make Kansas 5-1 in Allen Fieldhouse this season and 845-118 all-time in the venue, including 304-18 under Bill Self ... Make Kansas 150-7 in non-conference games under Bill Self ... Make Bill Self 573-134 while at Kansas, 780-238 overall and 18-5 versus Missouri ... Make Kansas 2,378-887 all-time.

KANSAS CITY LEFTOVERS

- Kansas is 8-1 or better for the sixth-straight season beginning in 2018-19, and the ninth time in the last 10 seasons.
- Kansas has won 10-straight games in Allen Fieldhouse, including 5-0 this season.
- Kansas outrebounded the Roos 37-36. Kansas has now won 57-consecutive games when outrebounding its opponent, which is the longest active streak in the NCAA.

KANSAS CITY LEFTOVERS

- Kansas finished the contest with 88 points on 54.1 percent (33-of-61) shooting. Kansas is 7-0 on the season when shooting 50 percent or better for the contest.
- Kansas outscored its opponent in the paint, 42-22 and is 7-0 in games when leading in the category.
- Kansas dished out 23 assists on 33 made field goals. It is the sixth game this season with 20 or more assists for the Jayhawks.
- Graduate-senior Kevin McCullar Jr. posted a career-high 25 points on 9-of-13 (69.2 percent) shooting. It is McCullar's fifth 20+ point game of the season and eighth of his career. McCullar also pulled down six boards, dished out five assists and went a perfect 2-of-2 from deep.
- Junior KJ Adams Jr. added a season-high-tying 18 points on 6-of-9 shooting while pulling down seven boards and dishing out a career-high six assists. Adams also notched a game high and career-high tying four steals in the win.
- Senior Hunter Dickinson recorded his 36th-career double-double and fifth of the season with 14 points and 12 rebounds on 50.0 percent (6-of-12) shooting. Kansas is now 5-0 when Dickinson records 10+ rebounds in a game.
- Freshman Johnny Furphy ended the contest with 10 points, all of which came in the second half. Furphy connected on two three-pointers and shot 57.1 percent (4-of-7) from the floor. It is the second game this season Furphy has posted double-digit scoring.
- Redshirt-senior Dajuan Harris Jr. posted eight points to go along with a game-high seven assists. Harris went 3-of-6 from the floor, two of which coming from beyond the arc. Harris has made multiple threes for the second time this season and the 17th time of his career

When Dickinson reaches the 1,800 points and 900 rebounds he will be just the second active player in NCAA Division I to reach the milestones - Armando Bacot (UNC) - 1,952 points, 1,442 rebounds.

KANSAS NOTABLES

- Kansas leads the nation in assists per game at 22.8 and in field goal percentage at 53.6%. Kansas is the only Power 5 school and just one of two teams (McNeesee) to rank in the top 10 nationally in both FG% (first) and FG% defense, ninth at 36.7%.
- Kansas has won 57-straight games when outrebounding its

opponent. The streak started Feb. 8, 2021 against Oklahoma State and is the longest active streak in NCAA Division. Florida Atlantic is next at 37.

- With the win against No. 4 UConn (12/1), Kansas is 13-0 at home against opponents ranked higher or the same than KU in the Bill Self era.
- Kansas beat Kentucky, 89-84, on Nov. 14, thanks in part to 27 made free throws. The Jayhawks are 48-1 (.980) under Bill Self (since 2003-04) when they make 25 or more free throws in a game, the best record by any D-I team in that span (minimum 40 games).
- Kansas overcame a 14-point deficit in the second half to Kentucky to win 89-84 (11/14). In the last 10 seasons, Kansas has posted 31 wins when overcoming a 10-point deficit. That is the most among Big 12 teams with Iowa State at 27 being second.

KANSAS TO RETIRE TWO JERSEYS BEGINNING DEC. 9

Kansas men's basketball will retire two jerseys during upcoming home games starting with Thomas Robinson Dec. 9 when the Jayhawks take on Missouri. KU will also retire Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer Bill "Skinny" Johnson on Jan. 22 when Kansas hosts Cincinnati.

Robinson was named Consensus All-America First Team in 2012, having led Kansas to the Final Four and the NCAA title game. In 2012, the Washington, D.C., forward was the ESPN.com National Player of the Year, the Big 12 Player of the Year and All-Big 12 First Team. Robinson was the Most Outstanding Player of the 2012 NCAA Tournament Midwest Region and named to the 2012 Final Four All-Tournament Team.

In 2011-12, Robinson set the Kansas single-season double-doubles record with 27, achieving the feat in 69.2 percent (27-of-39) of games played his junior year. His 463 rebounds in 2011-12 are second most in school history for a single season, trailing only KU legend Wilt Chamberlain's 510 in 1956-57. Additionally, Robinson's 692 points in 2011-12 are ninth on the KU single-season list. Career-wise at KU, Robinson ranks 56th in career scoring with 1,026 points, and 15th in all-time rebounds at 763.

The dominant collegiate center of his time, Johnson, who wore No. 33 while at Kansas, achieved All-American status in 1933 as he led the Jayhawks to three-consecutive Big Six Conference title under head coach Phog Allen. From Oklahoma City, Johnson, who stood 6-foot-4, was considered a giant in an era when the center jump after each basket was a part of the game, a rule that was later eliminated in 1937.

After graduation, Johnson continued to be a force in basketball. He played for Southern Kansas Stage Lines in the AAU, earning All-America honors. He led his team to the Missouri Valley AAU Conference title and third place in the National AAU Tournament in 1934. He was one of the few men to ever receive All-American honors in high school, college and AAU basketball. Johnson

KANSAS TRIPLE DOUBLES

Graduate-senior Kevin McCullar Jr. became just the seventh player in NCAA history to record back-to-back triple doubles with 12 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists against Kentucky (Nov. 14) and 22 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists versus Chaminade (Nov. 20). It was the first in NCAA history since Tony Lee of Robert Morris did it during the 2007-08 season. McCullar's two triple doubles are the third and fourth, respectively, in KU history, with all three in the Bill Self era. His triple double against Kentucky was the first since Jeff Withey's triple-double against San Jose State (16 points, 12 rebounds and a KU and Big 12-record 12 blocked shots) on Nov. 26, 2012. Cole Aldrich's triple-double against Dayton (13 points, 20 rebounds, 10 blocked shots) on March 22, 2009, is formally the first recorded in Kansas men's basketball history as blocked shots, assists and steals were not recorded at Kansas until the 1970s (and the NCAA until the 1980s). *Lawrence Journal-World* reporter Bill Mayer provided Kansas with two instances in which Jayhawk legend Wilt Chamberlain recorded triple-doubles. Additionally, the NCAA Final Four record book shows that KU great B.H. Born had an unofficial triple-double against Indiana in the 1953 NCAA Tournament title game.

MCCULLAR EARNS WEEKLY HONORS

Kansas graduate senior Kevin McCullar Jr. was named the Big 12

Player of the Week Nov. 27 after averaging 20.0 points and 8.3 rebounds in three games at the 2023 Allstate Maui Invitational, including two contests against top-10 opponents. In the 83-56 win versus Chaminade (11/20), McCullar posted a 22-point, 11-rebound, 10-assist triple double which also included two blocked shots and three steals. It was McCullar's second-consecutive triple double, with his last coming against Kentucky on Nov. 14 (12 points, 10 rebounds, 10 assists). McCullar is just the seventh player in NCAA history, first in the Big 12, to record back-to-back triple doubles and the first since 2008 (Tony Lee of Robert Morris).

In the 59-73 loss to No. 4 Marquette, McCullar had 24 points on 9-of-14 (64.3 percent) shooting with eight rebounds. In the 69-60 win against No. 7 Tennessee, McCullar had 14 points and six rebounds.

The following day McCullar was named one of five Oscar Robertson National Players of the Week by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) for games of the week ending Sunday, Nov. 26, the USBWA announced Nov. 21.

DICKINSON NAMED BIG 12 PLAYER & NEWCOMER OF THE WEEK

Kansas center Hunter Dickinson swept both the Big 12 Men's Basketball Player and Newcomer of the Week honors after leading the top-ranked Jayhawks to an 89-84 come-from-behind victory against No. 17 Kentucky in the Champions Classic in Chicago on Nov. 14. Dickinson is the first Big 12 player to win both awards since Iowa State's Izaiah Brockington on Dec. 27, 2021.

Dickinson recorded his first double-double as a Jayhawk and the 32nd of his career with a game-high 27 points and a career-high 21 rebounds, while adding a career-high-tying three steals against Kentucky. The senior transfer from Michigan secured the double-double in the first half with 13 points and 10 rebounds at the break. Kansas trailed Kentucky by 14 points in the second half before mounting the come-from-behind win.

The following day Dickinson was named one of five Oscar Robertson National Players of the Week by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) for games of the week ending Sunday, Nov. 19.

DICKINSON NAMED BIG 12 NEWCOMER OF THE WEEK

Kansas senior center Hunter Dickinson averaged 19.5 points, 8.0 rebounds and shot 4-of-4 from three-point range to be named the Big 12 Newcomer of the Week, the conference office announced on Nov. 13. This is the first weekly honor for Dickinson and a KU player and the 11th conference weekly honor of his career.

Dickinson scored 21 points in just 24 minutes in his Kansas debut against North Carolina Central, a KU 99-56 win on Nov. 6. Dickinson went 3-of-3 from beyond the arc and was almost perfect from the field, going 8-for-9 with eight rebounds, five assists, two blocked shots and one steal. In Kansas' 99-61 win against Manhattan College on Nov. 10, Dickinson posted 18 points, eight rebounds and two assists in 21 minutes.

JAYHAWKS NO. 1 IN PRESEASON POLLS

Kansas entered the 2023-24 season No. 1 in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' polls. This marked the fourth time KU has been No. 1 in the preseason AP poll with all four in the Bill Self era - 2004-05, 2009-10, 2018-19 and 2023-24. This is the fifth time in the coaches' poll that the Jayhawks have been No. 1 in the preseason poll with four in the Self era - 1996-97, 2004-05, 2009-10, 2018-19 and 2023-24.

Under 21st-year and Hall of Fame head coach Bill Self, this is the 18th time that Kansas entered the season ranked seventh or higher in the Associated Press preseason poll. Historically, the No. 1 ranking marks the 26th time since the 1992-93 season that Kansas will enter the season seventh or higher.

Kansas could possibly play 10 games against teams ranked in the preseason Associated Press Top 25. KU will play against No.

THIS DAY IN KANSAS BASKETBALL HISTORY

Dec. 9, 1989: In one of the most fast-paced games in Kansas history, the Jayhawks defeated Kentucky 150-95 in Allen Fieldhouse. The Jayhawks broke or tied six school records, including most points, most points in one half (80) and most assists (36). Terry Brown came off the bench to sink seven of 10 three-point attempts and finish with a career-high 31 points.

6 UConn, No. 7 Houston, No. 16 Kentucky, No. 18 Texas and No. 20 Baylor (twice). KU could also play No. 3 Purdue, No. 5 Marquette, and No. 11 Gonzaga in the Maui Invitational, Nov. 20-22, in Honolulu.

The No. 1 ranking marked the 10th-straight year Kansas has entered the season No. 5 or higher in the coaches' poll dating back to 2014-15. Additionally, it is the 18th time in the Self era the Jayhawks have been preseason seventh or higher, including each of the last 12 seasons.

KU PICKED FIRST IN THE PRESEASON BIG 12 POLL

For the 20th time in the 27-year history of the coaches' preseason Big 12 poll, Kansas has been selected as the favorite to win the league as the preseason poll was announced Oct. 13.

For the 2023-24 poll, KU collected 12 of a possible 14 first-place votes and finished with a total of 168 points. Houston received two first-place nods and was second with 153 points. Texas was third with 143 points, while Baylor was fourth with 137 points and TCU fifth with 113 points to round out the top five. See page 9 for the complete poll.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12

Kansas men's basketball senior Hunter Dickinson, redshirt-senior Dajuan Harris Jr. and graduate Kevin McCullar Jr. were named to the 2023-24 Preseason All-Big 12 Team as voted on by the league coaches, the conference announced Oct. 12.

Dickinson is the Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year and the Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, becoming the first player in conference history to earn both honors in the same season. Dickinson is joined on the Preseason All-Big 12 First Team by Harris, while McCullar is an honorable mention honoree.

Historically, Dickinson is the 11th Jayhawk to collect the preseason player of the year award and the fifth to earn preseason newcomer. Kansas has had at least one player on the Preseason All-Big 12 First Team in all but two of the 28 seasons the conference has existed, since 1996-97. Dickinson and Harris are the 39th and 40th Jayhawks to be listed on the preseason all-league first team.

THREE JAYHAWKS ON WOODEN AWARD PRESEASON TOP 50

Hunter Dickinson, redshirt-senior Dajuan Harris Jr. and graduate Kevin McCullar Jr. were named to the 2023-24 Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 on Nov. 14. Kansas is one of three schools with three players on the list, along with Duke and Creighton. Kansas has had two previous winners of the John R. Wooden Award with Danny Manning in 1988 and Frank Mason III in 2017.

Chosen by a preseason poll of national college basketball experts, the Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 is comprised of student-athletes who are the early front-runners for the one of the most prestigious honors in college basketball, the Wooden Award All American Team and Most Outstanding Player Award.

Players not chosen to the preseason list are still eligible for the Wooden Award midseason list, late season list, and the National Ballot, which consists of 15 student-athletes. Last year, KU's Jalen Wilson was on the Wooden National Ballot and Jayhawk Ochai Agbaji was on the ballot the previous season in 2022. Both were Wooden finalists as well.

KANSAS VS. TOP-25 TEAMS

No. 4 UConn was the fourth Associated Press (AP) ranked opponent for Kansas in 2023-24 and the third top-10 contest. KU defeated No. 17 Kentucky, 89-84, on Nov. 14, lost to No. 4 Marquette, 73-59, Nov. 21, defeated No. 7 Tennessee, 69-60, on Nov. 22 and No. 4 UConn, 69-65, on Dec. 1. Last season, KU was 7-7 against AP ranked foes in 2022-23, including 4-2 versus top 10 teams. KU played 12 Associated Press-ranked opponents during the 2021-22 season and went 8-4 versus those teams. Twelve of the last 15 and 16 of Kansas' last 24 losses have been to ranked foes. In 2019-20, KU went 4-3 against top-25 teams. In the Bill Self era, KU is 123-73 against AP-ranked opponents, including 49-29 versus Top-10 foes. In that span, Self's KU teams have collected seven or more wins against ranked foes in each of the last three and four of the last five seasons.

Kansas' record against top-10 ranked opponents is even more impressive. KU is 22-14 against foes ranked inside the top-10 of the AP poll since 2013-14. Since Bill Self's first season, 2003-04, the Jayhawks are 19-4 against AP top-10 teams inside Allen Fieldhouse, 10-1 versus top-five opponents.

- Kansas has 2,378 all-time victories which is the second most in NCAA Division I men's basketball history.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas has won 16 regular-season Big 12 championships with just 17 losses at Allen Fieldhouse.
- KU has held opponents to fewer than 100 points in 773 of its last 776 games. The last team to score 100 on Kansas in a 40-minute game was Gonzaga (102-90) on 11.26.2020 with the previous being Oklahoma (100-78) on 2.27.1990.

DICKINSON ON THE PRESEASON NABC WATCH LIST

Kansas senior Hunter Dickinson was one of 20 players named to the 2024 NABC Division I Player of the Year Watch List, the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) announced Nov. 2. The 2024 NABC Division I Player of the Year – selected by a vote of Division I head coaches – will be announced the week of the 2024 Men's Final Four.

FOUR JAYHAWKS ARE ON STARTING FIVE WATCH LISTS

In October, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced watch lists for its "Starting Five" for the 2023-24 season. Four Jayhawks were among the 20 watch list honorees with Dajuan Harris Jr. on the Bob Cousy Point Guard Award, Kevin McCullar Jr. on the Jerry West Shooting Guard Award, Johnny Furphy on the Julius Erving Small Forward Award and Hunter Dickinson on the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center Award.

A national committee of top college basketball personnel determined the watch lists of 20 candidates for every starting five. College basketball fans are encouraged to participate in Fan Voting presented by Dell Technologies in each of the three rounds. In late January, the watch list of 20 players for each honor will be narrowed to 10 and then in late February to five. In March, the Hall of Fame's selection committee will determine the winners.

Historically, Kansas' Jalen Wilson was the 2023 Julius Erving Award recipient and Jayhawk Frank Mason III won the 2017 Bob Cousy Award.

KU TRIO ON NAISMITH PRESEASON TOP 50

The Kansas men's basketball trio of Hunter Dickinson, Dajuan Harris Jr. and Kevin McCullar Jr. have been named to the 2023-24 Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy Men's preseason 50 watch list the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced Nov. 6, the opening day of the season. Kansas is the only team with three players on the list and

one of eight schools with multiple players. Kansas has had two previous winners of the Naismith Trophy with Danny Manning in 1988 and Frank Mason III in 2017.

In late January the Naismith Trophy will name a top 15 midseason team. In early March 2024 the award will announce 10 national semifinalists and later that month name four finalists. The Naismith Trophy Men's Player of the Year will be awarded April 7, the Sunday prior to the NCAA title game.

WINNING THE BIG 12 NO CAKEWALK

If you think KU's success in the Big 12 is due to playing in a non-competitive conference, think again. The stats show that this is anything but the case. Over the last 20 seasons, the Big 12 has proven to be one of the toughest leagues in the NCAA, making KU's run of 16 league titles since 2004 even more impressive.

Beginning in the 2003-04 season, the Big 12 has ranked as the nation's No. 1 conference in the RPI/NET rankings six times and in the top-three on 11 occasions. The Big 12 was the only league that ended the 2020-21 season with seven teams and 70 percent of its membership in the top 36 of the NCAA NET ratings.

The stoutness of the league is also highlighted by KU's strength of schedule during this stretch, which has been among the toughest every season. The Jayhawks have posted a top-10 strength of schedule 13 times in Bill Self's 20 years at KU, which includes the nation's strongest schedule six times - 2004-05, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2018-19 and last season in 2022-23.

MORE KANSAS NOTABLES

- Senior Hunter Dickinson had 27 points and a career-high 21 rebounds against No. 14 Kentucky on Nov. 14. The feat marked the 28th time in KU history a player has recorded at least 25 points and 20 rebounds in a game. The last to do it was Thomas Robinson who had 30 points and 21 rebounds against North Dakota (12/31/2011). The only other player to accomplish the feat in the Bill Self era was Wayne Simien who had 25 points and 20 rebounds against Kansas State on his Senior Night (3/2/2005).
- On Nov. 7, Naismith Hall of Fame member Bill Self signed an amended contract with the University of Kansas. Self and KU Director of Athletics Travis Goff signed the reworked agreement — effectively a five-year extension worth \$44.5 million, including a \$1 million signing bonus.
- Kansas went 16-for-16 on free throws at Baylor on Jan. 23, 2023. That is the most free throws made in a game without a miss in program history, surpassing Dec. 9, 2015 vs. Holy Cross when KU went 12-for-12 from the free throw line.
- Kansas went 15-1 in Allen Fieldhouse each of the last two seasons (2021-22 and 2022-23). KU has won 10 or more home games for 38 of the last 39 seasons, beginning in 1983-84. KU has won 12 or more in Allen Fieldhouse for 23 of the last 24 seasons beginning in 1999-2000.
- KU won its mind-boggling 51st-straight home opener with a 99-56 win against North Carolina Central on Nov. 6. The streak began in 1973-74 under head coach Ted Owens. KU coaches Larry Brown (5-0) and Roy Williams (15-0) never lost a home opener. KU is 21-0 in home openers in the Bill Self era.
- Kansas has won 31 of its last 32 conference openers (beginning in 1991-92 under head coach Roy Williams and including 2022-23) and 30 of its last 40 Senior Nights (beginning in 1983-84 under coach Larry Brown).
- On Nov. 9, 2022, former KU guard Jacque Vaughn was named head coach of the Brooklyn Nets. He is the fourth KU graduate to coach at the highest level - John McLendon (ABA, 1969-70 at Denver); Wilt Chamberlain (ABA, 1973-74 at San Diego); Kevin Pritchard (NBA, 2005 at Portland, 27 games); Jacque Vaughn (NBA, 2012-15 at Orlando, 2022-present at Brooklyn).

BRAUN WINS NBA TITLE

Former Kansas guard Christian Braun became the 15th Jayhawk to win an NBA title, when the Denver Nuggets defeated the Miami Heat last June. Braun played three seasons at Kansas from 2019-20 to 2021-22. In 2020, the Burlington, Kansas, native was named to the Big 12 All-Freshman Team and he was a 2021 all-conference

honorable mention selection the following season. In Kansas' 2022 NCAA National Championship season, Braun averaged 14.1 points and 6.5 rebounds per game. The two-time Academic All-Big 12 First Team selection was an all-league second-team selection, and was on the all-tournament teams for the Big 12 Championship and the NCAA Tournament Midwest Regional. In his three seasons at KU, Braun played in 101 games with 74 starts and had 1,018 career points, 506 rebounds, 183 assists and 97 steals.

Braun is the fifth player in NBA history to win an NCAA title and an NBA title in back-to-back seasons. He joins Bill Russell (1956 San Francisco; 1957 Boston Celtics), Henry Bibby (1972 UCLA; 1973 New York Knicks), Magic Johnson (1979 Michigan State, 1980 L.A. Lakers) and Billy Thompson (1986 Louisville; 1987 L.A. Lakers).

With the addition of Braun, there have been 15 Jayhawks who have won 20 NBA titles during their professional careers. Braun becomes the seventh Jayhawk under head coach Bill Self to win an NBA title. He joins Wayne Simien (2006), Mario Chalmers (2012, 2013), Brandon Rush (2015), Sasha Kaun (2016), Markieff Morris (2020) and Andrew Wiggins (2022).

Braun is the fifth Kansas player to have won both an NCAA and NBA title and the fourth under Self. He joins Clyde Lovellette (1952 NCAA title), Chalmers, Rush and Kaun, who were members of the 2008 NCAA National Championship team.

KANSAS HOSTED MCLENDON CLASSIC NOV. 5-6

Kansas Athletics hosted the inaugural McLendon Classic over the weekend of Nov. 5-6 on the campus of the University of Kansas. On Nov. 5 KU hosted the McLendon Classic Community Event at the Lied Center. The two-day recognition concluded when Kansas basketball hosts North Carolina Central on Nov. 6. in Allen Fieldhouse.

The McLendon Classic Community Event featured a screening of Fast Break: The Legendary John McLendon. Following the showing, there was a round table discussion featuring KU professor and Emmy Award winning director Kevin Willmott, KU director of equity and success initiatives Melissa Peterson, North Carolina Central head coach LeVelle Moton and KU head coach Bill Self.

The Nov. 6 basketball game honored McLendon during the contest. Both teams' coaching staffs wore patches and special pregame shooting shirts. There were recognitions throughout the contest honoring McLendon as well as moments to highlight current affinity groups at KU that are continuing McLendon's legacy of inclusion, pro activity and perseverance.

RAISING FUNDS FOR MAUI

Kansas Athletics partnered with the Maui Invitational Hoops for 'Ohana online auction in conjunction with the Hawai'i Community Foundation's Maui Strong Fund, which is dedicated to providing financial resources for rapid response and recovery for the devastating wildfires on Maui. Fans had the opportunity to bid on the jerseys worn by the men's basketball team from Oct. 29 through Nov. 22 and additional experiences and merchandise donated by Kansas Athletics. NOTES

- Bill Self was named the eighth coach in Kansas basketball history on April 21, 2003.
- In September 2017, Self was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.
- Self won his 700th career game on Feb. 8, 2020, with KU's 60-46 win at TCU. He became the 31st coach in NCAA Division I to accomplish the feat, the second youngest and the sixth fastest.
- While at Kansas, Self has won two national championships (2008, 2022), 16 regular-season Big 12 Conference titles, including a KU- and NCAA-record-tying 13-straight titles from 2005-17, and eight league tournament titles.
- At Kansas, Self has won 16 regular-season league titles with just 17 losses in Allen Fieldhouse. With KU's win versus Siena (11/18/16), Self became the winningest coach in Allen Fieldhouse, posting his 207th victory in the venue.
- In his first trip to the Final Four in 2008, Self's Kansas team won the title. Self is one of two active coaches in NCAA Division I to have won multiple national titles (Rick Pitino) and one of 16 all-time with multiple titles.
- While at Kansas, he has coached 13 NBA Lottery selections including Andrew Wiggins and Joel Embiid, the No. 1 and No. 3 overall selections in the 2014 NBA Draft. Wiggins was the second-ever Jayhawk to go No. 1 with the other being Danny Manning in 1988.
- Self has guided his teams to 23-win seasons in 23 of the last 25 seasons dating back to 1998-99.
- Self's teams have won 20 regular-season league crowns in the last 25 years. His teams have never finished lower than third in the conference.
- Self's 10 career 30-win seasons are tied for third most in NCAA history - Mike Krzyzewski (16), Roy Williams (12), John Calipari (10); and is tied for No. 1 on the active coaches' list. Nine of his 10 30-win seasons have been at Kansas.
- Self was the head coach for Team USA's U18 team that competed and won gold at the 2018 FIBA Americas Championship held in St. Catharines, Canada, in the summer of 2018.
- Self is one of five coaches in NCAA Division I history to have led three different teams - Tulsa, Illinois and Kansas - to the NCAA Elite Eight, including eight times with KU (2004-07-08-11-12-16-17-22). The other coaches are: Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Rick Pitino and Eddie Sutton.
- A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kansas in 1985-86 under head coach Larry Brown. He then returned to his alma mater as an assistant for seven seasons under coaches Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton. His first head coaching job was at Oral Roberts in 1993-94, then Tulsa (1997-98), Illinois (2000-03) and Kansas (2003-present).
