GUARANTEED RATE BOWL

TUESDAY, DECEMBER 26, 2023 | PHOENIX, ARIZONA | CHASE FIELD

The Guaranteed Rate Bowl is a unique and exciting event unlike any other Bowl game in the country! The game features Bowl Season's only matchup between the Big 12 and Big Ten, two of college football's most successful conferences. With two BIG teams on the field, it's sure to be an entertaining game! The Guaranteed Rate Bowl was the first bowl to be regularly played at an MLB ballpark and the transformation of a baseball diamond into a football field creates an atmosphere like no other!

The Guaranteed Rate Bowl is an annual college football bowl game that has been played in the state of Arizona since 1989. Played as the Copper Bowl from inception through 1996, it was known as the Insight.com Bowl from 1997-2001, then the Insight Bowl from 2002-11, the Buffalo Wild Wings Bowl for 2012 -13, and the Cactus Bowl from 2014-17. In 2018-19, the game was known as the Cheez-It Bowl. In 2020, Guaranteed Rate signed on as the title sponsor of the game, renaming it as the Guaranteed Rate Bowl.

When the bowl was initially founded, it was played at Arizona Stadium in Tucson, on the campus of the Univer-

sity of Arizona. In 2000, the organizers moved the game from Tucson to Phoenix. There, it was played at what is now known as Chase Field, the home of the Arizona Diamondbacks of Major League Baseball. For the 2006 season, the bowl moved a second time. After the annual Fiesta Bowl left Sun Devil Stadium in Tempe in favor of playing in University of Phoenix Stadium in Glendale, the bowl (then still known as the Insight Bowl) was relocated there as a permanent replacement. The bowl returned to its previous home of Chase Field in Phoenix for the January 2016 playing.

The bowl has remained at Chase Field, making it one of four active bowl games staged in baseball-specific stadiums, the other three being the Pinstripe Bowl at Yankee Stadium, the Fenway Bowl at Fenway Park, and the Holiday Bowl at Petco Park.

CHASE FIELD HOME OF THE DIAMONDBACKS

One of the most innovative and fan-friendly Major League Baseball stadiums, Chase Field has served as the home of the Arizona Diamondbacks since the spring of 1998. Designed by renowned architect Ellerbe Becket, Chase Field is located in the heart of downtown Phoenix, only 4.3 miles from Phoenix Sky Harbor Airport, with Light Rail access on-site. During that time, it has hosted twelve Guaranteed Rate Bowls (formerly Cactus Bowl/Cheez-It Bowl) as well as various other spring and live musical events, in addition to its baseball activities.

Chase Field is the home of the Arizona Diamondbacks and has played host to the 2001 World Series Champions and 2011 MLB All-Star game. From its retractable roof – that is operated by a pair of 200-horsepower motors – to its signature swimming pool, Chase Field is one of the Valley of the Sun’s most recognizable landmarks.

The ballpark covers approximately 1,300,000 square feet, including the playing surface, and is divided into four levels: the field and service level, the main concourse, suite level and upper concourse (no mechanical level). The stadium also has a press level between the main concourse and suite level.

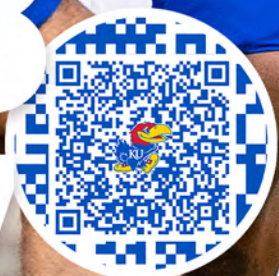

LANCE LEIPOLD HEAD COACH

Lance Leipold, a six-time National Champion, a five-time conference coach of the year and the fastest coach in NCAA history to reach 100 career wins, was named the 41st head coach in Kansas Football history on April 30, 2021.

Leipold's track record as a program builder showed itself early in his time in Lawrence, leading the Jayhawks to back-to-back bowl games in 2022 and 2023, a feat that has only been done in Lawrence once in program history. Leipold has guided Kansas to its first-ever program win in Austin, Texas in 2021, followed by Kansas' first-ever win over West Virginia in Morgantown in 2022 and a win over #6 Oklahoma in 2023. In just his second year at the helm, Leipold helped Kansas to secure its first bowl eligibility with a win over No. 18 Oklahoma State on November 5, 2022, giving Kansas its first bowl berth since 2008. Kansas' ranked win was the first since 2010, snapping a 44-game losing streak to AP ranked opponents, while it was Kansas's first ranked win against a conference opponent at home since 2005.

Leipold has engineered Kansas to one of the greatest stories in college football, guiding Kansas to its first national rankings in 675 weeks, hosting ESPN's College Gameday for the first time in program history on October 8, 2022, hosting FOX Big Noon Kickoff for the first time on Oct. 28, 2023, and earning Kansas' first-ever ranking in the College Football Playoff Ranking on Oct. 31, 2023.

Leipold arrived at Kansas after a successful six-year stay at Buffalo, where in his final three seasons, he posted three straight winning seasons for the first time in 20 years. He won 24 games over the final three seasons, which included a seven-game shortened-season schedule in 2020 because of the COVID-19 pandemic, marking the most successful three-year run in Buffalo history.

A proven winner with a strong track record for player development, Leipold served as the head coach at Wisconsin-Whitewater for eight seasons from 2007 to 2014, capturing six NCAA Division III national championships and tallying an astounding record of 109-6.

After taking over a rebuilding Buffalo program that went 7-17 in his first two seasons, Leipold put together a record of 30-16 over his final four seasons, including three bowl appearances and two bowl victories with the Bulls.

Leipold had a 2020 season at Buffalo that brought unprecedented success to the program. The Bulls went a perfect 5-0 in the regular season and won the MAC East Division title for the second-straight year. Leipold's squad also beat Marshall in the Camellia Bowl for the program's second ever bowl win and second in as many years.

Buffalo also appeared in the Associated Press Top 25 at No. 24 on December 6, 2020, marking the first-time in school history the Bulls appeared in the national rankings. The team finished the season ranked 25th in both the AP poll and the Amway Coaches Poll. Leipold was named the MAC Coach of the Year for the second time in his career after the record-breaking season.

Showcasing his pristine reputation for player development and a keen eye for recruiting, Buffalo tied a school-record with 12 All-MAC selections in 2020, all of whom were recruited by Leipold. Running back Jaret Patterson led the way, rushing for 1,072 yards in just six games, including a 409-yard performance against Kent State, which is the second-best performance in FBS history.

Patterson was named the winner of the Vern Smith Leadership Award, given to the MVP of the MAC and was also named the MAC Offensive Player of the Year under Leipold's tutelage.

Buffalo also had 12 all-conference players in 2019, a season that culminated in the school's first-ever bowl victory – a 31-9 win over Charlotte in the Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl. The 2019 team featured one of the best defenses in the school's history. Buffalo ranked seventh nationally in total defense, allowing 291.9 yards per game. The Bulls were also fourth nationally against the run, allowing 94.2 yards per game.

In 2018, Buffalo won 10 games in a season for the first time ever in program history. Leipold's team went 7-1 in MAC play and won the East Division title. The Bulls also won 42-13 at Rutgers, marking the school's first-ever win over a Power 5 opponent. He was named the MAC Coach of the Year and was also a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award.

In that 2018 season, the Buffalo offense had a record-breaking season. Buffalo scored 484 points, 64 touchdowns and totaled 5,803 yards of total offense, establishing new school records in each category. Quarterback Tyree Jackson was named the MAC Offensive Player of the Year, while Patterson earned MAC Freshman of the Year honors.

In Leipold's third season in 2017, the Bulls gained bowl eligibility for just the third time as an FBS

program. The Bulls offense averaged 432 yards per game and led the conference in passing yards per game at 291. Showing an ability for explosive plays, Buffalo produced 20 plays of 45 or more yards on the season.

Leipold became the head coach at Buffalo in December of 2014 after a triumphant career as the head coach at Wisconsin-Whitewater, which saw him earn six National Coach of the Year awards. In his first season there in 2007, the Warhawks went 14-1 and won the Division III national championship. In 2008, the team made it back to the title game and fell to Mount Union.

Wisconsin-Whitewater then went 45-0 over the next three seasons, winning three straight national championships. After a 7-3 campaign in 2012, Whitewater went 30-0 combined in 2013 and 2014 winning two more national titles with Leipold at the helm.

During his time there, Warhawk players totaled 56 All-America honors, with running back Justin Beaver winning the Gagliardi Trophy as the top player in Division III. Brent Allen won the Division III Rimington Award as the top center. Running back Levell Coppage earned D3Football.com Offensive Player of the Year honors, while Klotz won those honors on the defensive side.

Leipold, a native of Jefferson, Wisconsin, began his coaching career at Whitewater in 1987 as a quarterbacks coach. He moved to the University of Wisconsin in 1991, where he served as a graduate assistant for Barry Alvarez for three seasons and helped the Badgers win a Big Ten title and a Rose Bowl appearance in 1993.

He then served as an assistant coach at Division II Nebraska-Omaha from 1994-2000, helping the Mavericks become three-time conference champions. He was promoted to offensive coordinator in 2000, before moving on to Nebraska where he worked for Frank Solich for four seasons. He then returned to Nebraska-Omaha for three years as the associate head coach and offensive coordinator, before moving on to Wisconsin-Whitewater in 2007.

Leipold is a 1987 graduate of Wisconsin-Whitewater, where he was a standout quarterback.

Leipold and his wife Kelly, have a daughter, Lindsey, and a son, Landon.

BRIAN BORLAND DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Brian Borland is in his third season as defensive coordinator at Kansas after joining the staff alongside KU head coach Lance Leipold in May 2021.

Mello Dotson and defensive end Jereme Robinson received honorable mention from the conference.

Borland guided KU's defense in 2022 as the Jayhawks qualified for a bowl game for the first time since 2008 and reached the Associated Press Top 25 for the first time since 2009. Kansas started the season 5-0 and hosted ESPN's College Gameday for the first time in program history.

Complementing a record-breaking offense, Buffalo's defense also had a strong season in 2020. The Bulls led the Mid-American Conference in total defense (360.4) and ranked second in the league in scoring defense (21.9). Buffalo led the MAC in sacks for the second straight year with 20 in a shortened season, which the Bulls went 6-1. Three members of the Buffalo defense were named All-MAC in 2020.

In 2019, Borland oversaw a defense that was arguably one of the best in school history. The Bulls led the MAC and ranked seventh in the nation in total defense, allowing 291 yards per game. Buffalo was especially stout against the run, allowing only 94.2 yards per game – good for fourth best in the national rankings and tops in the conference. Seven members of the Buffalo defense were named All-MAC in 2019.

Buffalo ranked third in the MAC in total defense in 2018, allowing 355.4 yards per game – less

In three seasons at Kansas, Borland has coached 12 All-Big 12 selections, one Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year (Austin Booker, 2023), one NFL Draft pick (Kyron Johnson, 2021) and two others who signed to play in the NFL as undrafted free agents (Lonnie Phelps & Caleb Sampson, 2022).

In 2023, Kansas ranks fourth in the Big 12 in total defense and sixth in scoring defense. KU is also tied for second in the league with 26 tackles for loss and fifth in the league with 12 interceptions, including three returned for touchdowns. The 2023 season saw a two-win improvement from 2022 as the Jayhawks finished the regular season with eight wins for the first time since 2007. Kansas will appear in a bowl game for the second consecutive season, a feat accomplished by Kansas Football just once in program history.

The Jayhawks were led by Big 12 Newcomer of the Year Austin Booker, who ranked third in the league in sacks and sixth in tackles for loss, and First Team All-Big 12 cornerback Cobee Bryant, who recorded three interceptions and returned a fumble for a touchdown against BYU. Safety Kenny Logan Jr. earned All-Big 12 Second Team honors after leading the Jayhawks in tackles for the fourth-straight season, while cornerback

than two yards per game behind first place. The Bulls ranked second in the conference with 14 interceptions in 2018. It was the most by a Buffalo team since 2013. Eight different players recorded interceptions on the year.

Borland led a unit that ranked fifth in the MAC in scoring defense (24.8) in 2017 and had three defensive players named All-MAC.

In 2016, Borland guided a defense that led the MAC and ranked 13th in the nation in pass defense, allowing 181.5 yards per game.

The Bulls were a very opportunistic defense in 2015, as they scored a school-record seven defensive touchdowns (by seven different players) to rank second in the nation. Three members of Borland's defense were named to the All-MAC team in 2015.

Borland also oversaw the development of five players who were either drafted or signed as NFL free agents during his time at Buffalo, while 20 defensive players earned all-conference honors during his tenure.

Prior to Buffalo, Borland spent the previous 21 seasons at Wisconsin-Whitewater. Since 2002, Borland served as the Warhawks defensive coordinator.

Borland began at UW-W in 1994, also serving as the defensive backs coach. He was a 2015 Wisconsin Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame inductee.

Borland was named Division III Coordinator of the Year in 2013 by Footballscoop.com after helping lead the Warhawks to the NCAA Division III national championship, the team's fifth in seven seasons. UW-Whitewater led the nation in scoring defense, allowing just 9.1 points per contest, and ranked No. 1 in the country in fumbles recovered (19) and turnovers forced (44) in 2013.

From 2009-14, Borland's defenses led the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference and ranked among the top 20 in the nation in rushing defense, scoring defense and total defense. The Warhawks also led the league in pass efficiency from 2010-13. During his time at Wisconsin-Whitewater, Borland coached at least one first-team all-conference player at his position from 1994 to 2014. He also coached the D3Football.com National Defensive Player of the Year on three separate occasions (2006, 2008 and 2013).

Borland earned Wisconsin Collegiate Assistant Coach of the Year honors from the Wisconsin Football Coaches Association in both 2004 and 2006. In 2009, Borland led the Warhawks to the fourth-best scoring defense in Division III. In 2010, the Warhawks were ranked second in NCAA Division III in run defense. In 2011, Borland's rushing defense was ranked first in the WIAC.

From 1994-2002, Borland also coached track and field at UW-Whitewater. In 2000, he led the Whitewater women's track and field team to a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Division III Outdoor Track and Field Championships. He earned NCAA D-III national coach of the year honors for his successful season.

Prior to Whitewater, Borland was the defensive coordinator for three years at Baker University (Kan.) from 1991-93, and at the University of Minnesota-Morris from 1989-90. He also was the head women's softball coach at Baker University and head track and field coach at Minnesota-Morris. Borland's other stops include stints as a graduate assistant football coach at the University of Florida and at the University of Wisconsin. He also coached defensive backs at Arizona Western College.

Borland played his college football at Morningside (Iowa) College (1981-84) where he was a four-year letterwinner and three-year starter at defensive back, and a team captain.

He has a wife, Gayle, and two sons, Evan and Jaren. Jaren Borland is currently the Head Strength & Conditioning Coach for the Angelo State football team.





JORDAN PETERSON CO-DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Jordan Peterson is in his fourth season as an assistant coach at Kansas, working with the defensive backs under head coach Lance Leipold. At the conclusion of the 2023 regular season, Peterson was elevated to be Kansas' Co-Defensive Coordinator.

Peterson has mentored four All-Big 12 selections during his time at Kansas, including two-time All-Big 12 First Team selection Cobee Bryant, who became the second Jayhawk cornerback in school history to twice be named First Team All-Conference. Bryant and Mello Dotson, an All-Big 12 Honorable Mention honoree, combined for seven interceptions in 2023, the most by a KU duo since 2007. Dotson returned two of those interceptions for touchdowns, doing so in back-to-back games as he became the first Jayhawk in school history with a pick-six in consecutive games.

The 2023 season was another step forward for Kansas Football as the Jayhawks had a two-win improvement in the regular season, finishing 8-4 to secure a winning record for the first time since 2008. The eight wins are the most by KU in the regular season since 2007 and the Jayhawks have claimed consecutive bowl berths for only the second time in program history.

In 2022, Peterson assisted as the Jayhawks qualified for a bowl game for the first time since 2008 and reached the Associated Press Top 25 for the first time since 2009. Kansas started the season 5-0 and hosted ESPN's College Gameday for the first time in program history.

He coached All-Big 12 First Team selection Cobee Bryant, who finished with three interceptions and nine pass breakups in 2022. He ranked fifth in the Big 12 with 12 passes defended in league play and totaled 38 tackles on the year.

Peterson joined Kansas' staff on January 11, 2020, working the safeties. Prior to his arrival in Lawrence, Peterson had coached in five bowl games, including an appearance in the 2011 Cotton Bowl.

In his first season in Lawrence, Peterson coached Kansas' Kenny Logan Jr., to a standout season, where the sophomore snagged a team-high two interceptions and 58 tackles. Logan was a game-changer for the KU secondary, recording four pass breakups, one forced fumble and one sack.

Peterson arrived at Kansas after serving as the defensive coordinator/safeties coach at New Mexico in 2019, where he oversaw the entire defense and held all duties associated with mentoring the Lobos' safeties. Peterson was hired to coach the New Mexico safeties in 2017, before being promoted to defensive coordinator and safeties coach in 2019.

In his first two seasons at New Mexico, Peterson guided the safeties unit to lead the team in tackles, with Jake Rothschilder and Stanley Barnwell Jr., recording 76 tackles in 2018.

Prior to his time at New Mexico, Peterson coached at Fresno State for five seasons, from 2012-16, helping the Bulldogs to three consecutive bowl games and a 2014 Mountain West Championship game appearance and a 2013 Mountain West title. He served a variety of positions with Fresno State, coaching both the secondary and outside linebackers. He also has served as recruiting coordinator and a special teams coach.

Peterson excelled in his role of secondary coach at Fresno State, coaching that position in 2012 when Fresno State went 9-4 and ranked second nationally in pass defense and fourth in pass efficiency defense. He also mentored safety Phillip Thomas to Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year honors in 2012.

Peterson got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant coach at Texas A&M in 2010 and 2011. That followed a four-year playing career with the Aggies, where he made 81 tackles and broke up 15 passes. He also forced two fumbles, recovered one fumble and picked off four passes. He returned one of those passes 48 yards for a touchdown against New Mexico. He was a two-time All-Big 12 Academic First Team selection, and he was a CoSIDA Academic All-Region selection in 2008.

Peterson received his bachelor's degree in sport management from Texas A&M in 2009 along with his master's in education curriculum and instruction in 2010. He graduated from Lexington High School in Central Texas, where he earned first-team all-state honors as a defensive back and honorable mention honors as a quarterback his senior year. He was named Texas Prep Xtra Central Texas MVP.

He and his wife Missy have three daughters, Ellie, Emery and Everly.

JEFF GRIMES ASSISTANT HEAD COACH/OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

A 30-year coaching veteran, Jeff Grimes joined the Kansas staff under head coach Lance Leipold in December of 2023 as the Jayhawks' Offensive Coordinator.

Grimes is among the top offensive coaches in the country, being named as a finalist for the Frank Broyles Awards, awarded to the nation's top assistant coach in 2021 while at Baylor and 2020 at BYU.

Grimes comes to Kansas after three years at Baylor, where he served as the offensive coordinator and tight ends coach, coaching the Bears to the 2021 Big 12 Championship and directing one of the most productive offensive attacks in the country.

Grimes guided the Bears to drastic improvement in his first year at Baylor, as the Bears' offense ranked 10th nationally with 5.37 yards per rush and 30th nationally with 6.32 yards per play. Baylor increased its rushing production by 129 yards per game, compared the 2020 season, raising its rushing average from 90.3 yards per game (123rd nationally) to 219.3 yards per game (10th nationally). Grimes was among five finalists for the Broyles Award, while offensive lineman Connor Galvin was named the Big 12 Offensive Lineman of the Year and running back Abram Smith ranked among the nation's best in yards per carry (14th, 6.23), total rushing (5th, 1,601), and rushing touchdowns (tied for 39th, 12). Ben Sims (361 yards, 6 TDs) and Tyquan Thornton (948 yards, 10 TDs) each had career years for the Bears as well.

Baylor's offensive attack continued to excel in 2022, ranking among the top-10 in program history in a several categories, including scoring the seventh-most TDs (34), while totaling the 10th most total yards (5,380) and first downs (296). In the air, Baylor ranked fourth best in single-season history in completing 63 percent of its passing attempts. Individually, Richard Reese shattered the program standard for freshman rushing yards, earning Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year honors.

Prior to his three seasons at Baylor, Grimes directed a high-powered offense at BYU in 2020 that finished its season ranked in the top-15 of 10 different statistical categories, including scoring (3rd, 43.5 ppg), total offense (7th, 522.2 ypg) and passing offense (8th, 332.1 ppg).

The 2020 BYU Cougars tied for the national lead in yards per play at 7.84, and led all of FBS in plays of 30 or more yards with 45. Overall, BYU scored 40 or more points nine times in 12 games.

Under Grimes' leadership, BYU quarterback Zach Wilson was named a finalist for the Heisman Trophy and Manning Award, as well as a semifinalist for the Walter Camp Player of the Year, the Maxwell Award and the Davey O'Brien Award. In 2020, Wilson passed for 3,692 yards, 33 touchdowns and posted a 196.4 passing efficiency. He finished the year ranked in the top-10 nationally in 11 offensive categories.

Led by All-American offensive lineman Brady Christensen, the BYU offensive line allowed only 12 sacks in 12 games, the eighth-best per game average in the country, and helped the Cougars to the fourth-most rushing touchdowns nationally with 34. Running back Tyler Allgeier rushed for 1,130 yards, the ninth-best total in BYU history

and the eighth-best total by a FBS player for the season.

Overall, BYU had four offensive players named to All-America teams in 2020, including Wilson, Christensen, and wide receiver Dax Milne. Additionally, freshman tight end Isaac Rex earned Freshman All-America honors from The Athletic. Wilson (1st round, No. 3 overall, New York Jets), Christensen (3rd round, Carolina) and Milne (7th round, Washington) were each selected in the 2021 NFL Draft.

In addition to his time as a coordinator, Grimes has extensive experience as one of the country's top offensive line coaches. Since 2000, 17 offensive linemen that played under Grimes have been selected in the NFL Draft including three first rounders (Levi Jones, Nate Solder and Greg Robinson).

He served as offensive line coach and run game coordinator at LSU from 2014-17. While in Baton Rouge, Grimes had three of his players selected in the NFL Draft to go along with nine earn All-SEC honors and four be selected as All-Americans (La'el Collins, Vadal Alexander, Ethan Pocic and Will Clapp).

LSU's offensive line helped pave the way for four consecutive 1,000-yard rushers in each of Grimes' four seasons. In 49 games as LSU's offensive line coach and run game coordinator, the Tigers had at least one running back reach the 100-yard rushing mark 34 times.

Grimes spent one season as run game coordinator and offensive line coach at Virginia Tech in 2013 following four seasons as offensive line coach at Auburn from 2009-12 that included the program's second National Championship in 2010.

During Auburn's 2010 national championship season, Grimes' coached an offensive line that helped set school records for total yards of offense (6,989) and points (577) for a second consecutive season. The Tigers were No. 5 nationally in rushing yards per game (284.8) and led the SEC in scoring (41.2). Auburn's 2010 team set school records for rushing touchdowns (41), passing touchdowns (31), rushing yards (3,987) and had three offensive linemen earn individual honors.

Grimes also had successful stints leading the offensive lines at Colorado (2007-08), BYU (2004-06), Arizona State (2001-03) and Boise State (2000). He got his start in collegiate coaching at Hardin-Simmons (1998-99), and also served as a graduate assistant at Texas A&M (1996-97) and Rice (1995). Following the completion of his playing career he coached at Riverside High School in El Paso (1993-94).

Grimes earned his bachelor's degree in education from UTEP in 1991 and a master's degree in education administration from Texas A&M in 1997. He and his wife, Sheri, have four children, daughters, Bailey and Jada, and sons, Garrison and Greydon.

a signature victory over No. 6 Oklahoma and road wins at Iowa State and Cincinnati this season. Kansas' offense passed for 2,672 yards this season along with 18 touchdowns and a 163.2 passing efficiency, which ranks second in the Big 12 Conference.

Both Bean and Daniels rank in the top-five in passing touchdowns in KU school history, along with ranking in the top-10 in school history in career passing yards.

In his second season at Kansas, Zebrowski mentored Daniels as he had a breakout campaign and led KU to a bowl game for the first time since 2008 and reached the Associated Press Top 25 for the first time since 2009. Kansas started the season 5-0 and hosted ESPN's College Gameday for the first time in program history.

Daniels was a Second Team All-Big 12 selection after completing 152-of-230 (66.1 percent) passes for 2,014 yards and 18 touchdowns, while adding 425 yards and seven touchdowns on the ground. He capped off the season with a record-setting performance in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl, where he went 37-of-55 for 544 yards and five touchdowns, while also rushing for a touchdown.

KU's offense has also seen success with Bean under center and the duo combined to throw for 32 touchdowns to eight interceptions in 2022. Daniels passed for 18 touchdowns and 2,014 yards in 2022. Daniels' 18 touchdowns tied for the fifth most in a season in school history, while Bean's 14 touchdown passes tied for eighth. Bean was also one of just five Power 5 quarterbacks in 2022 to have back-to-back games of 250 yards passing and four touchdown passes.

A coaching veteran in the Big Ten and Mid-American Conference, Zebrowski came to Kansas with 29 years of experience, including four seasons at Buffalo as the quarterbacks coach and co-offensive coordinator. He is well known for developing young quarterbacks within the programs he works for.

In 2020, Zebrowski helped Buffalo quarterback Kyle Vantrease develop into a solid starting quarterback for the Bulls. In a season that was dominated by the run game, Vantrease was still able to shine after he threw for 353 yards and four touchdowns against Miami (OH) and 365 yards and a score against Ball State in the MAC Championship game. He became the first UB quarterback since 2014 to throw for 350+ yards twice in the same season under Zebrowski's guidance.

In 2019, Zebrowski led two different young quarterbacks to an eight-win season and helped UB earn the program's first win in a bowl game. Redshirt-freshman Matt Myers began the season as the starter before suffering a season-ending injury in the fifth game. Myers had a standout performance against Penn State, throwing for 245 yards and a touchdown. Redshirt-sophomore Kyle Vantrease started the final eight games of the season and threw for 1,193 yards and eight touchdowns and ran for six additional touchdowns.

Under Zebrowski's guidance in 2018, quarterback Tyree Jackson became the first player in school history to be named Mid-American Conference Offensive Player of the Year and the first quarterback in school history to be named All-MAC. He threw for 3,131 yards and 28 touchdowns – both were second in school history for a single season.

During his first season at Buffalo in 2017, Zebrowski made an immediate impact with the Bulls. Despite an injury-riddled season that saw the Bulls have to start three different quarterbacks, Buffalo still led the MAC and set a school record with 3,490 passing yards on the year. Jackson threw for 2,096 yards and 14 touchdowns in eight games, including three 300-plus yard games. Backup Drew Anderson started against Western Michigan and threw for a school- and conference-record 597 yards and seven touchdowns.

Prior to his time at Buffalo, Zebrowski was the quarterbacks coach at Minnesota from 2011-15 and helped lead the Gophers to three-straight bowl games. To touch on his development of young quarterbacks, he took Minnesota signal-caller Mitch Leidner from running the scout team to accounting for 2,250 yards and 21 touchdowns in 2014. Leidner had 10 rushing touchdowns, tying the school record for a quarterback.

He helped lead the Gophers to the Meineke Car Care Bowl in 2012, the Texas Bowl in 2013 and the Citrus Bowl in 2014.

Prior to coaching at Minnesota, Zebrowski was the quarterbacks coach at Northern Illinois in 2010. He tutored All-MAC quarterback Chandler Harnish, an NFL draft pick of the Indianapolis Colts. He also laid the foundation for Harnish's backup Jordan Lynch who was an All-American and a Heisman Trophy finalist in 2013. Featuring a high-powered offense that averaged over 35 points per game, Zebrowski helped lead the Huskies to the 2010 MAC Championship game and a win over Fresno State in the Humanitarian Bowl.

This is the third time Zebrowski will serve under Leipold. The first was when he was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Wisconsin-Whitewater from 2007-09. Over his tenure, the Warhawks went 42-3 and advanced to the Division III title game every year, winning it twice. Zebrowski was named the Wisconsin Football Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and the FootballScoop.com Division III Coordinator of the Year in 2009. Most recently, Zebrowski served on Leipold's staff at Buffalo from 2017-2020.

In 2004, he became the head coach at Lakeland University and led the Muskies to a 28-12 record over four seasons. He led Lakeland to a pair of Illini-Badger Conference championships and advanced to the Division III playoffs for the first time in school history.

Zebrowski and his wife, Heather, who was named Female Athlete of the Year during her volleyball playing days at Southern Illinois, have two children, Zachary and Lauren. His son, Zach, is a quarterback at Central Missouri.

Jim Zebrowski is in his third season as the quarterbacks coach at Kansas under head coach Lance Leipold. Following the 2023 regular season, Zebrowski was promoted to Co-Offensive Coordinator for the Jayhawks.

Zebrowski has helped the Jayhawks to back-to-back bowl games for only the second time in program history, following an 8-4 record in 2023 as KU secured a winning record for the first time since 2008.

Zebrowski has mentored quarterbacks Jalon Daniels and Jason Bean to breakout campaigns, leading to Zebrowski's nomination for the Broyles Award in 2023 – awarded to the best assistant coach in college football. His leadership helped Bean step into the starting role in 2023, and led Kansas to

OFFENSIVE LINE

Scott Fuchs is in his third season at Kansas after joining the football staff in May 2021 as offensive line coach.

In his time at Kansas, Fuchs has tutored seven All-Big 12 selections, including Dominick Puni, who was a two-time All-Big 12 selection and earned First Team honors in 2023. Center Mike Novitsky has earned All-Big honors in each of his three seasons at Kansas, while Earl Bostick Jr. was a two-time All-Big 12 selection before signing with the NFL's Dallas Cowboys following the 2023 NFL Draft.

The 2023 season was another step forward for Kansas Football as the Jayhawks had a two-win improvement in the regular season, finishing 8-4 to secure a winning record for the first time since 2008. The eight wins are the most by KU in the regular season since 2007 and the Jayhawks secured consecutive bowl berths for only the second time in program history. In 2023, the Kansas offensive line paved the way for the No. 4 rushing offense in the Big 12 as the Jayhawks ran for an average of 211.3 yards per game and a league-leading 31 touchdowns. KU also allowed 15 sacks, which ranked fourth in the conference.

In his second season at KU, Fuchs assisted as the Jayhawks qualified for a bowl game for the first time since 2008 and reached the Associated Press Top 25 for the first time since 2009. Kansas started the season 5-0 and hosted ESPN's College Gameday for the first time in program history.

Fuchs' offensive line helped pave the way for third-highest scoring offense in school history as the Jayhawks scored 35.6 points per game in 2022. Three of his players earned All-Big 12 honors, led by center Mike Novitsky who earned second team honors. Earl Bostick, Jr., and Dominick Puni both received honorable mention from the conference in 2022.

Fuchs is a 31-year veteran of college coaching and came to KU after coaching for two seasons at Buffalo. He previously worked with Kansas head coach Lance Leipold at various stops, including Buffalo and Nebraska-Omaha from 2004-06.

While at Buffalo, Fuchs has helped build the offensive line into one of the strongest units on the team. In 2020, Buffalo ranked second in the nation in rushing yards per game (287.4) and allowed only one sack on the season, which tied for the fewest in the country. Three of the Bulls' starting offensive linemen were named All-MAC, including Kayode Awosika who in 2021 signed an NFL free agent contract to play for the Philadelphia Eagles. Awosika was second-team All-American by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA).

Under Fuchs, in 2019 and 2020, the Bulls were semifinalists for the Joe Moore Award, given annually to the best offensive line unit in the nation. In 2020, Fuchs was named one of five finalists for the FootballScoop Offensive Line Coach of the Year Award. He was also nominated for the 2020 Broyles Award, given to the top assistant coach in college football.

Prior to Buffalo, Fuchs spent five seasons at Wyoming from 2014-18. While at Wyoming, Fuchs developed All-American center Chase Roullier who went on to start for the Washington Football Team in the NFL. Fuchs helped design a blocking scheme for Wyoming running back Brian Hall who rushed for a school-record 4,287 over his career and helping coach an offense that ranked second in the nation in redzone offense in 2017. In 2016, Fuchs helped coach the Cowboy offense average 35.9 points per game, which ranked No. 2 in the Mountain West and No. 25 in the nation.

Fuchs coached the offensive line at North Dakota State, his alma mater, from 2009-13 before being hired at Wyoming. He helped lead the Bison to an astounding 43-2 record and three national titles between 2011 and 2013. In 2012 and 2013, Fuchs coached Consensus First Team All-America offensive tackle Billy Turner. Turner was selected in the third round of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Miami Dolphins. All total, Fuchs has coached nine All-Americans and 38 all-conference performers during his career.

Prior to returning to his alma mater, Fuchs coached one season at Southern Illinois in 2008. That team tied for the conference title and advanced to the first round of the FCS Playoffs. He also coached at Grand Valley State (2007), Nebraska-Omaha (2003-06), Minnesota-Crookston (2000-02), Wisconsin-Eau Claire (1999) and Valley City State (1997-98). The only school Fuchs did not coach the offensive line was his one season at Wisconsin-Eau Claire when he coached the defensive line.

As a player, Fuchs was named to the 1993 Kodak/American Football Coaches Association first-team All-America squad as a senior offensive guard at North Dakota State. NDSU won three consecutive North Central Conference rushing titles during his three years as a starter. Fuchs was part of three North Central Conference Championship teams at NDSU in 1990, 1991 and 1992. In 1990 the Bison captured the NCAA Division II National Championship.

Taiwo Onatolu is in his second season as an assistant coach at Kansas and third on the Jayhawks' staff in 2023. He works with the defensive ends and special teams under head coach Lance Leipold.

Onatolu has tutored three players who have earned All-Big 12 recognition at Kansas, including 2023 Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year Austin Booker. Booker, who was also an All-Big 12 First Team selection, ranked third in the league in sacks and sixth in tackles for loss. Jerome Robinson also received honorable mention honors in 2023 and Lonnie Phelps Jr., was an All-Big 12 Second Team selection in 2022 before joining the Cleveland Browns as an undrafted free agent following the 2023 NFL Draft.

The 2023 season was another step forward for Kansas Football as the Jayhawks had a two-win improvement in the regular season, finishing 8-4 to secure a winning record for the first time since 2008. The eight wins are the most by KU in the regular season since 2007 and the Jayhawks have claimed consecutive bowl berths for only the second time in program history.

In his first season as an on-field assistant coach, Onatolu assisted as the Jayhawks qualified for a bowl game for the first time since 2008 and reached the Associated Press Top 25 for the first time since 2009. Kansas started the season 5-0 and hosted ESPN's College Gameday for the first time in program history. That season, he tutored All-Big 12 Second Team selection Lonnie Phelps, Jr., who finished the season with 11.5 tackles for loss and seven sacks with six quarterback hurries.

Onatolu spent the 2021 season as an analyst on the Jayhawks' staff, before being promoted to an assistant coach in 2021. Onatolu previously worked at Buffalo as the defensive ends coach for three seasons and the cornerbacks coach for four seasons. While with the Bulls, he also coaches the specialists and had a stint as the director of player personnel.

During the 2020 season, Onatolu guided UB's defensive ends to record 12.5 of UB's 20 sacks to lead the MAC. Malcolm Koonce led the way with five sacks en route to earning All-MAC First Team honors for the second-straight season.

Under the guidance from Onatolu, the defensive unit was one of UB's strongest in 2019 as UB players ranked 1-2-3 in the MAC in sacks on the season behind Malcolm Koonce's (9), Taylor Riggins' (8.5) and Ledarius Mack's (8) stellar seasons. Koonce and Riggins were named to the All-MAC First Team and Mack was a second-team selection. Defensive ends accounted for 27.5 of the school-record 43 sacks the Bulls registered in 2019.

In 2018, Buffalo ranked fifth in the Mid-American Conference in pass defense, allowing 194 yards passing per game. The Bulls recorded 14 interceptions, eight of which came from cornerbacks. Cameron Lewis was named All-MAC Second Team after posting three interceptions and six pass breakups on the year.

While working with the corners, Onatolu helped lead Buffalo to be ranked fifth in the Mid-American Conference in pass defense in 2017, allowing 205 yards per game and added eight interceptions. In 2016, UB's defense led the MAC and ranked 13th in the nation in pass defense – allowing 181.5 yards per game.

Prior to his stint at Buffalo, Onatolu spent five seasons at Missouri State working as an inside linebackers coach. In his first season at Missouri State in 2011, guided senior in David Ingram and a redshirt freshman in Andrew Beisel to outstanding seasons. Beisel went on to record a team-high 84 tackles, becoming the first MSU freshman since 1998 to lead the team in total stops and earned MVFC All-Newcomer Team distinctions. Ingram, who started all 11 games, tallied 77 tackles and finished third on the squad.

A native of Papillion, NE, Onatolu served as an assistant at his alma mater from 2007-10 at the University of Nebraska-Omaha.

As a student-athlete, Onatolu was a standout linebacker at UNO, starting four seasons for the Mavericks, earning All-NCC First Team honors three times and All-America First Team honors in 2004. He was the North Central Conference's Most Valuable Linebacker in 2004 after posting 98 tackles and five interceptions. He was in on 71 tackles as a senior, helping him earn All-America second and third-team honors by different agencies.

Onatolu finished his four-year stint at ONU as the program's No. 2 all-time tackler with 371 total stops. He also tallied 46.5 tackles for loss, 12.5 sacks, seven interceptions and 182 solo tackles in 44 games. He helped the Mavericks to a pair of NCC titles and a 2005 playoff appearance.

After completing his degree in communications, public affairs and community service from UNO in 2006, Onatolu stayed at UNO for two years as a graduate assistant coach, working with the team's linebackers.

Onatolu has a twin brother, Kenny, who has enjoyed a professional career that began with the Edmonton Eskimos in the Canadian Football League and included stints with the Minnesota Vikings and Carolina Panthers. He was also an All-NCC linebacker.

Onatolu and his wife, Jennifer, have a son, Isaiah.

JIM PANAGOS

DEFENSIVE TACKLES

Jim Panagos is in his second season as the defensive tackles coach at Kansas after joining Lance Leipold's staff on February 1, 2022.

The 2023 season was another step forward for Kansas Football as the Jayhawks had a two-win improvement in the regular season, finishing 8-4 to secure a winning record for the first time since 2008. The eight wins are the most by KU in the regular season since 2007 and the Jayhawks have claimed consecutive bowl berths for only the second time in program history.

In his first season at Kansas, Panagos assisted as the Jayhawks qualified for a bowl game for the first time since 2008 and reached the Associated Press Top 25 for the first time since 2009. Kansas started the season 5-0 and hosted ESPN's College Gameday for the first time in program history.

His veteran group finished with 9.0 sacks and 22.5 tackles for loss on the season. Following the year, Caleb Sampson signed as an undrafted free agent with the NFL's Indianapolis Colts.

Panagos came to Kansas with more than 20 years of collegiate and NFL coaching experience. He spent the past two seasons at Rutgers, coaching the defensive line. He has also coached the defensive line at Minnesota, Temple and UCF, in addition to spending four seasons with the Minnesota Vikings.

The 2009 FootballScoop National Defensive Line Coach of the Year and a former Broyles Award nominee, Panagos has coached more than 20 future NFL players during his time as a college coach.

In 2020 at Rutgers, the Scarlet Knights led the Big Ten and ranked No. 11 nationally in tackles-for-loss per game at 7.8. Three Rutgers defensive linemen earned honorable mention All-Big Ten in Michael Dwumfour, Julius Turner and Mike Tverdob. The Rutgers defense also forced 19 turnovers, which marked the program's most in a season since 2012. This past season, Turner earned honorable mention All-Big Ten honors again as the Rutgers defense totaled 73 tackles-for-loss.

Panagos spent the 2019 season at Minnesota, helping the Gophers to a 10-2 record and a spot in the Outback Bowl. Prior to that, the veteran defensive line coach spent two seasons at Temple, first as the defensive line coach and the second as the assistant head coach/run game coordinator. In 2018, Panagos helped the Temple defense rank among

the top three nationally in defensive touchdowns, forced turnovers and fumble recoveries. The Owls also ranked second in the American Athletic Conference in total defense, passing defense and three-and-outs.

In 2017, Panagos earned a nomination for the Broyles Award, given to the nation's top assistant coach annually. That season, the Owls recorded 39 sacks and 92 tackles-for-loss, while Sharif Finch (15.5 TFLs, 8.5 sacks) and Jacob Martin (11 TFLs and 8 sacks) had breakout seasons, each earning second-team All-AAC honors.

Panagos spent the 2016 season as a defensive consultant at Pittsburgh. Before that, he had his first stint at Rutgers, leading the defensive line from 2012 to 2015. In his first season, the Rutgers defense finished fourth in scoring defense and 10th in total defense. Additionally, defensive tackle Scott Vallone had a career-high 52 tackles and earned first-team All-Big East honors.

In 2014, Panagos tutored defensive tackle Darius Hamilton and defensive end Kemoko Turay to all-conference honors as Rutgers transitioned to the Big Ten. Turay was a second-round draft pick of the Indianapolis Colts, and just finished his fourth season in the NFL and has 12 career sacks.

Before arriving at Rutgers, Panagos spent five seasons as the defensive line coach at UCF. He helped the program reach three bowl games, including a win in the 2010 Liberty Bowl over Georgia. In his first season at UCF in 2007, the Knights recorded 39 sacks, which ranked 15th in the country. In 2009, he was named the National Defensive Line Coach of the Year by FootballScoop, while Jarvis Geathers (11) reached double digits in sacks. Also that year, Torell Troup was a second-round pick of the Buffalo Bills.

In 2011, UCF's defense ranked fourth in the country behind Florida State, South Carolina and Alabama.

Before his time in the college ranks, Panagos spent four seasons with the Minnesota Vikings as an assistant defensive line coach and defensive and offensive quality control.

He got his start in the coaching profession as a defensive line assistant at Maryland in 1993, where he graduated with a degree in criminal justice.

Panagos, a native of East Islip, N.Y., has a wife, Maureen, a daughter, Olivia, and two sons, Jack and Hayden.

TERRENCE SAMUEL WIDE RECEIVERS

Terrence Samuel is in his second season as the wide receivers coach at Kansas after joining the staff of Lance Leipold in December 2021.

Samuel has helped the Jayhawks to back-to-back bowl games for only the second time in program history, as the 2023 season was another step forward for Kansas Football. The Jayhawks had a two-win improvement in the regular season, finishing 8-4 to secure a winning record for the first time since 2008, while the eight wins are the most by KU in the regular season since 2007.

Kansas had the No. 4 scoring offense and No. 7 total offense in the Big 12 in 2023, with six different wide receivers combining for 11 touchdown receptions. Two of KU's veteran receivers – Lawrence Arnold and Luke Grimm – have also moved into the top 10 of multiple career categories at Kansas, including receptions, receiving yards and touchdowns.

In his first season in Lawrence, Samuel assisted as the Jayhawks qualified for a bowl game for the first time since 2008 and reached the Associated Press Top 25 for the first time since 2009. Kansas started the season 5-0 and hosted ESPN's College Gameday for the first time in program history.

KU's offense had the third-highest scoring average in school history in 2022, averaging 35.6 points per game. The Jayhawks averaged 254.4 yards per game through the air, with wide receivers accounting for 144 receptions for more than 2,000 yards and 15 touchdowns.

Samuel came to Kansas with 24 years of college football coaching experience, serving most recently as the wide receivers coach at Syracuse, and has also spent time at Michigan State, UNLV, Central Michigan, Arizona, North Dakota State, Southeast Missouri State and Nebraska-Omaha, where he worked alongside Leipold.

This past season at Syracuse, Samuel oversaw a young Syracuse receivers room, whose top three pass catchers were all freshmen or sophomores. The team's leading receiver, redshirt freshman Courtney Jackson, had his best game in his final game, catching eight passes for 92 yards and two touchdowns.

Samuel spent the 2020 season at UNLV, where the Rebels played just six games due to the COVID-19 pandemic. In that one season, receiver Kyle Williams set the program record with 5.8 receptions per game and went on to earn freshman All-America honors and was named the Mountain West Freshman of the Year.

Prior to his one season at UNLV, Samuel spent nine seasons at Michigan State. During his time with the

Spartans, Samuel mentored two Big 10 Receivers of the Year in Tony Lippett (2014) and Aaron Burbridge (2015), while his receivers garnered All-Big Ten recognition eight times. Samuel also helped produce five NFL draft picks and another six players who made active NFL rosters.

Lippett and Burbridge were both first-team all-conference selections while B.J. Cunningham, R.J. Shelton and Felton Davis III all earned second-team honors under Samuel's tutelage. Cunningham, Lippett and Burbridge were all draft picks as was Keshawn Martin (2012) and Keith Mumphy (2015). In addition, Bennie Fowler played six seasons in the NFL as an undrafted free agent.

From Houston, Texas, Samuel was a part of eight bowl teams during his nine seasons with Michigan State. The Spartans earned trips to two New Year's Six bowls (Rose Bowl and Cotton Bowl) and a trip to the College Football Playoff in 2015, in addition to an Outback Bowl appearance and a Holiday Bowl appearance, among others.

Before spending nearly a decade at Michigan State, Samuel spent the 2010 season at Central Michigan. During that season with the Chippewas, wide receiver Cody Wilson recorded just the sixth 1,000-yard season in program history, tallying 83 receptions for 1,137 yards.

Samuel spent two seasons at North Dakota State from 2008-09, prior to his time at Central Michigan. In 2007, Samuel served as the offensive coordinator at Nebraska-Omaha, where he took over for Leipold, who served in that role for the previous three seasons. During that 2007 season, the Mavericks won a conference championship and posted a 10-1 record.

Samuel's time at Nebraska-Omaha in 2007 was his third time on staff there as he also served as the defensive backs coach in 2003 and 2004 and the outside linebackers coach and special teams coordinator in 2005. Leipold was on staff for two of those seasons on the other side of the ball. Samuel was also a graduate assistant there from 1998-2000, in addition to serving as a graduate assistant at Arizona in 2001 and 2002.

Samuel is a 1995 graduate of Purdue, where he was a four-year letter winner for the Boilermakers. He was awarded the 1994 Kiwanis Citizenship Award, which is presented to a Purdue player who excels most in the combined roles of player, student and community volunteer.

He has a wife, Jaclyn, a daughter, Brooklyn and a son, Draven.

Chris Simpson is in his third season at Kansas, coaching linebackers for the Jayhawks on head coach Lance Leipold's staff.

Simpson has helped the Jayhawks to back-to-back bowl games for only the second time in program history, as the 2023 season was another step forward for Kansas Football. The Jayhawks had a two-win improvement in the regular season, finishing 8-4 to secure a winning record for the first time since 2008, while the eight wins are the most by KU in the regular season since 2007.

In 2023, Simpson's linebacker room was led by senior Rich Miller, who ranked second on the team with 56 tackles, 4.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks, and newcomer JB Brown, who was close behind with 54 stops, 6.0 tackles for loss and two sacks.

In 2022, Simpson assisted as the Jayhawks qualified for a bowl game for the first time since 2008 and reached the Associated Press Top 25 for the first time since 2009. Kansas started the season 5-0 and hosted ESPN's College Gameday for the first time in program history.

Leading his linebacker group in 2022 was Rich Miller, who ranked second on the team with 94 tackles, while also totaling three tackles for loss, one sack and one interception.

Simpson came to Kansas from Buffalo where he was on Leipold's staff for six seasons, also coaching linebackers. In 2020, he was promoted to co-defensive coordinator.

Under Simpson, Buffalo linebackers were one of the most consistent units on the team. At least one linebacker has been named All-MAC in each of Simpson's six seasons at Buffalo. In 2020, Buffalo middle linebacker James Patterson was a first-team All-MAC selection after leading the team in tackles and captaining a UB squad that led the MAC in total defense. In 2019, outside linebacker Kadofi Wright was an All-MAC Third Team selection. Middle linebacker Matt Otwinowski was named Academic All-MAC for the third time in 2019. The Bulls defense finished the season ranked seventh nationally in total defense and fourth nationally in rushing defense.

Simpson helped develop Khalil Hodge, arguably the best middle linebacker to ever play at Buffalo. In only three seasons, Hodge recorded 421 tackles, the third-highest total in school history. In 2018, three of the team's four leading tacklers were linebackers, including Hodge (144), James Patterson (77) and Jordan Collier (56).

In 2017, Hodge had one of the finest seasons by a linebacker in school history. The junior middle linebacker had an FBS-era record 154 tackles on the year to lead the MAC and rank second in the nation. Hodge was named All-MAC First Team for his efforts.

In 2016, for the second-straight season, Simpson's linebackers were the top three leading tacklers on the team. Hodge had a huge season for the Bulls, finishing with 123 tackles, the eighth most in school history for a single season and the second most in Buffalo's FBS era.

In 2015, Simpson's first season, the top three tacklers on the team were linebackers and for the first time since

2008, the Bulls had two different players with more than 100 tackles as Nick Gilbo finished with 113 and Brandon Berry had 104. Berry was named All-MAC Second Team and Okezie Alozie was named third-team all-league.

Prior to Buffalo, Simpson was the outside linebackers coach at Eastern Michigan in 2014.

Before his stop at EMU, Simpson spent the previous four seasons as linebackers coach at Grand Valley State in in Allendale, Mich.. Grand Valley posted a 39-11 record and four Division II playoff victories. Simpson also tutored six All-Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) performers during that span.

Grand Valley closed the 2013 football campaign ranked third in the final American Football Coaches Association poll. The Lakers advanced to the NCAA DII National Semifinals for the eighth time after knocking off undefeated and No. 3 ranked Colorado State University-Pueblo.

His 2011 linebacking unit was a key component in a Laker defense that ended the year among the GLIAC leaders. GVSU led the league in tackles for loss (93) and sacks (36), while ranking second in scoring defense (20.2). GVSU limited opponents to 15.5 points per game in its last five games that season. Simpson's linebacking unit helped the Laker defense rank nationally in several categories, including the top 20 in tackles for loss and sacks in 2010. Ware and Justin Victor earned All-GLIAC accolades during the 2010 campaign.

Simpson arrived at GVSU following a two-year stint at the University of Nebraska-Omaha, where he coached the defensive line. The Mavericks were 14-9 with one appearance in the NCAA DII playoffs during his time on the staff.

Simpson spent five years at Division III national power Wisconsin-Whitewater where he was an assistant coach in charge of the linebackers. UWW was 42-3 his final three seasons with three-straight NCAA DIII National Championship game appearances and three Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference crowns. The Warhawks claimed the 2007 National Championship in Leipold's first year at the school.

In addition, Simpson coached two years (1999-2000) at Waunakee (Wis.) High School, one year (2001) at Loras College in Dubuque, Iowa, as a graduate assistant and one year (2002) at Wisconsin-Platteville. In the summer of 2006, Simpson was selected as a participant at the NCAA Men's Football Coaches Academy.

He also has received an NFL Minority Coaching Internship on six occasions, from the Green Bay Packers for defensive line and special teams in the summer of 2006, in 2007 with the Dallas Cowboys, in 2008 with the Carolina Panthers, in 2009 with the Minnesota Vikings and Cleveland Browns and in 2013 with the Detroit Lions.

Simpson and his wife, Nicole, have three children: Jarryn, Riley and Noah. Riley currently plays defensive back at Grand Valley State.



JONATHAN WALLACE RUNNING BACKS

Jonathan Wallace is in his fourth season at Kansas after joining the coaching staff in February of 2020. He currently serves as KU's running backs coach on head coach Lance Leipold's staff.

Wallace continues to draw recognition for his work in Lawrence, most recently being selected for the AFCA 35 Under 35 Coaches Leadership Institute in December 2023. Prior to the season, he was recognized as one of college football's rising stars in 2023, earning a spot on 247Sports' 30Under30 list heading into the season.

During the 2023 season, Kansas had one of the top running back rooms in the nation, led by junior Devin Neal, an All-Big 12 Second Team selection. Neal ranked fifth in the Big 12 with 1,209 yards on the ground, third in the league with 15 rushing touchdowns and an average of 6.6 yards per carry.

Neal and Daniel Hishaw Jr. have been a dynamic duo in the backfield, rushing for a combined 1,808 yards, which ranked fourth among FBS programs during the regular season. Hishaw ran for 599 yards and eight touchdowns on 116 carries, averaging 5.2 yards per carry. In KU's 51-22 victory over UCF on Oct. 7, Neal and Hishaw led the way as Kansas rushed for 399 yards and five touchdowns. The duo combined for 288 yards and three touchdowns, with both players rushing for more than 130 yards, marking the fourth time in KU history and first time since 1995 that two players rushed for 130+ yards in the same game.

In 2022, Wallace assisted as the Jayhawks qualified for a bowl game for the first time since 2008 and reached the Associated Press Top 25 for the first time since 2009. Kansas started the season 5-0 and hosted ESPN's College Gameday for the first time in program history.

Led by All-Big 12 honorable mention selection Devin Neal, Kansas rushed for 2,395 yards – an average of 184.2 per game – and scored 29 rushing touchdowns. Neal rushed for 1,090 yards and nine touchdowns on 180 carries, averaging 6.1 yards per carry and 83.8 yards per game as he became the first Jayhawk to rush for over 1,000 yards since 2019. He was also the first Jayhawk since June Henley in 1996 to rush for at least 190 yards in back-to-back games after rushing for 224 yards against Oklahoma State and 190 yards against Texas Tech. For his efforts against OSU, Neal was named the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week.

Wallace came to Lawrence after spending the 2019 season coaching the tight ends at Air Force and the 2018 season on the staff at Bethel.

In his first season in Lawrence, Wallace oversaw the Kansas rushing unit, which consisted of Pooka Williams Jr., and Velton Gardner and freshmen Daniel Hishaw Jr., and Amauri Pesek-Hickson. As true freshmen, Hishaw and Pesek-Hickson combined for more than 400 yards rushing and two touchdowns on just over 90 carries.

Wallace spent the 2019 campaign at Air Force, helping lead the Falcons to an 11-2 overall mark and a win over Washington State in the Cheez-It Bowl. Air Force posted a 7-1 record in the Mountain West, a school record for conference wins, and finished the year in the Top 25 national rankings for the first time since 1998. Wallace's tight ends were instrumental in blocking for the FBS' second-ranked rushing offense, while the Falcons led the nation in fewest sacks allowed.

Wallace joined the Academy from Bethel, where he was wide receivers coach and director of football operations in 2018. He and Dearmon led the Wildcats to a 10-1 overall record and a conference championship.

Wallace was an offensive graduate assistant coach at Auburn from 2016-17 working with quarterbacks and wide receivers during the 2017 season. He helped the Tigers to a pair of bowl games and Southeastern Conference championship game appearance in his two seasons on the staff.

Wallace lettered as a quarterback at Auburn from 2012-14 and wide receiver in 2015 during his playing career. He started at quarterback the final four games of his freshman season and set an Auburn record for quarterback efficiency (139.60) Wallace also helped Auburn to the SEC title in 2013 and was part of the national championship run when Auburn finished the season 12-1. He was selected as a team captain in 2015 and earned the Unsung Hero Award. In addition, he was a selected as a member of the All-State Good Works team.

A native of Phenix City, Alabama, Wallace helped lead Central High School to a 12-2 record and the 6A AHSAA semifinals as a senior. He graduated from Auburn with a bachelor's in physical education in 2015 and a master's in adult education in 2017. He is married to Ashley Koter, a former Auburn soccer student-athlete and former member of the Mexico national soccer team.

MIAMI - Their hopes blasted by a heartbreaking last-minute fumble by Quarterback Lynne McNutt, the Kansas Jayhawkers bowed to the Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets 14 to 20 in a spectacular grid battle in Miami's Orange Bowl this afternoon.

Faced with a 6-point deficit, Kansas recovered a fumble on the Tech 44 and moved to the 23-yard line where McNutt pitched to Otto Schnellbacher who raced down the sideline for what looked like a touchdown. The officials ruled the Jayhawker end stepped out of bounds on the 10, however, and All-America Ray Evans plunged to the two. The fateful fumble occurred on the next play with a minute and 10

seconds to go and Tech stalled until the final gun.

First Quarter

Georgia Tech won the toss and elected to receive. Matthews took Evans' kickoff on the goal line and returned to the 21. Tech lost 9 yards in two plays and Williams' partially blocked punt was taken by Evans on the 45 and returned to the 40. Kansas lost three yards in three tries and Pattee was thrown on the 40 yard-line trying to run on a fourth down bad pass from center.

Tech chalked up a first down in two running plays and an 8-yard pass. Still to Castleberry, on the Kansas 37, Kansas held and Bowen punted into the end zone. Pattee skirted right end for four yards and Evans picked up a first down on the 36 with a 12-yard plunge thru center. Kansas lost two yards on a running play and two passes and Pattee punted out 40 yards to Petit on the Tech 26 from where the ball was returned to the 35. Three plays failed to produce a first down and Williams booted a 58-yard punt out of bounds on the Kansas 4 yard line. The Jayhawkers picked up four yards and Scott punted out to Petit who was nailed on the Kansas 47. Tech picked up a first down, but K.U. stiffened as the first quarter ended.

Second Quarter

Kansas smeared Matthews for a 10 yard loss and Williams punted to the Kansas 6. Bertuzzi and Evans drove to the 15 and Pattee punted 40 yards to the Tech 45. Tech lost three yards and Williams punted to Evans who returned to the 12. Kansas was penalized to the one-half yard line. Patee punted to Mathews who returned to the Kansas 26. After a futile line plunge and an incomplete pass, Still rifled to Patton for the first touchdown of the game. Bowen's try for extra point was good and Tech led 7 to 0.

French took the kickoff and raced it back 20 yards to the Kansas 35. Evans pitched to Schnellbacher for 18 yards. Griffith slashed a 12 yard path around left end for 12 yards. Evans skirted right end for five. Griffith tucked in 6 yards in two plunges and Hogan rifled 17 yards to French. Taking a hand-off from Hogan, all-American Evans ripped the center of the Tech line for 13 yards and a Kansas touchdown. Fambrough's try for extra point was good, knotting the score at 7 all. Petit took Evans kickoff and returned to the 12. Checked for a 3-yard gain, Williams batted to Scott who returned to the Tech 45. Kansas gained 1 yard in 3 tries and Pattee kicked out on the Tech 20. Tech lost two yards and Still punted out on the Kansas 46. Evans faded to pass and lost 11 yards. A Hogan to Schnellbacher pass was incomplete, and Schmidt caught a pitch from Evans out of bounds, but got a first down on the Tech 43 on an interference penalty. Griffith and Evans plunged for 16 yards in three plays as the half ended. Score, Kansas 7,

Georgia Tech 7.

Third Quarter

McCoy returned Evans kickoff to the Tech 15. Sparked by Still's perfect pitches, Tech moved to the Kansas 15 where Still rifled to Queen who went over for the second touchdown. Bowen's try for extra point was good and Tech went out in front 14 to 7. Evans took Jordan's long kickoff boot in the end zone and returned to the Kansas 20. Kansas was held for two yards and Pattee booted out to Mathews who stopped at the Tech 40. Bowen and McCoy ran for 9 yards and Still pitched a long pass to Jordan who went over the goal line, but the gain was nullified by in off sides penalty.

Williams punted out on the Kansas 21. Evans hit center for 4 but Scott's pass was intercepted by Smith on the K.U. 35. On 5 running plays and a 12-yard toss from Still to Broadnax, Tech moved to the Kansas 4 where Still passed to Patton who outran Schnellbacher for the third marker. Bowen's try for the extra point was wide. Griffith caught Jordan's kickoff and ran back to the 20. Evans failed on two pass attempts to Schnellbacher and McNutt and then heaved a 34-yard toss to End Bryan Sperry who made a great catch the closely guarded. Score Georgia Tech 20, Kansas 7.

Fourth Quarter

Kansas gained a yard and Scott punted into the end zone. Tech got and automatic first down on a holding penalty, but failed to gain and Williams punted to Hogan on the Kansas 44. Scott smashed center for 3 yards, Hogan passed to Sperry for seven yards. Pattee gained ten yards and Hogan passed to Pattee for 8. Kansas picked up five yards and Hogan rifled a pass to Sperry who was thrown on the Tech 12. Scott dropped a backward pass for a 6-yard loss. Tech was penalized five yards and All-America Ray Evans took a 13-yard pass from Hogan for a touchdown. Bowen hit center for 2. Queen broke loose but fumbled and K.U. recovered on Tech 42. French and Evans made five to the 42 after a delay penalty on Kansas. McNutt passed to Schnellbacher who was ruled out on Tech 10. Evans hit center for 8. The Yellow Jackets were penalized to the one. McNutt fumbled and Tech recovered on the two. Georgia Tech froze the ball the remaining minute with the quarterback holding the ball.

The bowl spectacle got under way at 2 p.m. when bands from the University of Kansas, Miami and other surrounding communities massed on the playing field to play the national anthem. Under a clear sky with temperatures in the upper 70's, the 60,000 fans packed into the huge bowl let out a great cheer as the music ended and the game got underway.

HOUSTON - Kansas ran Rice University ragged with double reverses and the power of Ken Coleman Saturday as the Jayhawks crushed the favored Owls 33-7 in the third annual Bluebonnet Bowl football game.

Coleman, a 201 pound sophomore, scored twice while grinding out 107 yards in 18 carries. Roger McFarland got two more on neatly executed double reverses. John Hadl, who Friday denied charges he had signed a pro contract, directed all five Kansas scoring drives and set up one of Coleman's touchdowns: with a 41 yard scamper on a faked fourth down punt.

Immediately after the game, a scout for the San Diego Chargers of the American Football League met Hadl under the south goalpost and signed the Kansas star to a 1962 contract.

Rice took a brief 7-0 lead with 6 yard drive late in the first period, but Hadl's beautiful run fed the Kansas comeback and the Owls made only one other serious threat.

A light rain that fell throughout the nationally televised game cut attendance at the 70,000-seat Rice Stadium to 52,000. Bluebonnet officials, however, said that 61,000 tickets had been sold.

Rice had been favored by 3 points to score its fifth victory in seven postseason bowl games. Kansas was making its first bowl appearance since losing to Georgia Tech 14-20 in the 1948 Orange Bowl.

Coleman was voted the game's most outstanding back. Elvin Basham, chunky Kansas guard was the outstanding lineman.

Rice's touchdown came on a five-yard pass from Randy Kerbow to Johnny Burrell.

The Kansas scoring drives covered 59, 65, 50, 36 and 69 yards. After Coleman had scored the first two touchdowns, Curtis McClinton ran the Jayhawk lead to 19-7 by carrying over from the four.

McFarland's touchdown runs caught Rice flatfooted and covered 9 and 12 yards each. Hadl, who completed seven of 10 passes for 64 yards, started the first Kansas drive with a 14 yard pass to McFarland. Coleman then took over and moved 32 yards to the Rice four in four carries.

Gary Poage started Rice toward its only score with a 21 yard run to the Kansas 48. Kerbow passed 11 yards to Burrell and Butch Blume put the Owls within striking distance with an: 18-yard run to the 12. Blume also kicked the extra point.

Hadl's 41-yard run carried to the Rice 19 midway in the second period. On the next play Coleman ran over three Rice defenders while powering 18 yards to the one. He plunged over on the next play. In the last 28 seconds of the half, Kerbow completed three passes that moved Rice 61 yards. Bob Wayt caught a 35-yarder at the Kansas five as the halftime gun sounded.

Coleman and McFarland accounted for all but McClinton's four yard touchdown run on the 50-yard drive.

Late in the period, Fred Eisman recovered a Rice fumble at the Owl 36 and McFarland got his first double reverse six-pointer 11 plays later. A 13-yard pass from Hadl to Tony Leiker moved it to the 14, the only pass of the drive.

Kansas stayed on the ground all the way on its final drive, with Coleman contributing 21 of the 69 yards in four carries.

Kansas quarterback John Hadl on his memory of the 1961 bowl game:

"On a fourth down, I faked a punt and ran (41 yards to the Rice 19-yardline) right before the half. That turned the momentum around and we were able to beat them. After the game I signed my contract with the San Diego Chargers under the goalpost." Kansas quarterback John

What was funny was that Curtis McClinton signed his too (with the Dallas Texans - now the Kansas City Chiefs). He had a bonus check with him coming off the field, and he accidentally stuck the check in the locker next to his, thinking it was his locker. He went crazy looking for that check. I think it was 10 grand at the time. I remember that clearly because everybody in the locker room was looking for that check."

MIAMI - Penn State, getting life when Kansas had 12 men on the field during a two-point conversion attempt, converted the extra try into a 15-14 victory over KU in the 35th Orange Bowl football classic.

Kansas forced Penn State to punt with 2:04 left in the game. The Jayhawks needed to run out the clock to earn the victory. They couldn't do it. Twice 204-pound tackle Mike Reid threw KU quarterback Bobby Douglass for loses and, with fourth and 23, the Jays were forced to punt.

Kicker Billy Bell's punt was deflected by safety Neal Smith and rolled dead at the 50. Only 1:16 remained. Penn State wasted no time. Quarterback Chuck Burkhart lofted the ball high to halfback Bob Campbell who caught it in front of Tommy Anderson and rambled to the three before the KU safety could bring him down. Twice fullback Tom Cherry tried to rip up the middle, but was stopped successively by Dave Morgan and Pat Hutchens. Then Burkhart kept the ball, sweeping around left end for the touchdown that made it 14-13. Just 15 seconds were left. It was two-point conversion time and Burkhart swept to his right, flung the ball to Campbell and watched as Anderson and Dave Morgan battle the pass away for what looked like a thrilling climax to a KU victory.

Hardly a jubilant Kansas fan saw and official wave a red flag. The Jays had 12 men on the field and were charged with illegal procedure. It was like being handed a million dollars, then discovering it was counterfeit money. Seconds later, the two teams lined up again and Burkhart sent Campbell roaring to the end zone to give an Eastern team its first Orange Bowl victory in nine tries. It was a finish as one person said, that will go down in history and be debated for as long as they play football. It also dulled Kansas' finest defensive effort of the season. In the first half, the Jayhawks gave up twice as many first downs and twice as much total yardage as the Nittany Lions. But, in the clutch Kansas defenders had it.

Four Penn State errors kept the Jays alive while they tried to get something going offensively. Micky Doyle's interception the only one of the year for the senior linebacker stopped an early PSU drive. Just minutes later, linebacker sidekick Emery Hicks covered a Don Abbey fumble at the KU 35. Both times, however, the Jayhawks couldn't get going. Finally, still in the first quarter another linebacker this time Pat Hutchens swiped a Burkhart aerial and it led to a score. Gobbling up 45 yards in nine plays Mike Reeves bulled in from the two with 3:08 left until the second stanza. The Jays stayed on the ground in the drive. Fullback John Riggins ripped off the longest gain 12 yards. Donnie Shanklin, the miniature 168-pound tailback who was the be named most valuable player in the game, produced two runs good for 15 yards. For Reeves, who alternated at fullback with John Riggins much of the year, it was ironically his only score of the season.

Unable to move early in the second quarter, Bell punted from the 12 and PSU started from the KU 47. Just six plays later, the Lions pushed over to knot the count at 7-7. Speedster halfback Charlie Pittman stormed up the middle for the last 13 practically untouched with 11:08 until halftime. A 42-yard pass from Douglass to Shanklin carried KU to the Penn State 35 on the next series of downs, but the drive petered out as Mike Reid and Steve Smear, the other tackle, dropped Douglass for a four-yard loss and Shanklin for a five-yard setback. After an exchange of punts Douglass passed from his own 12 intending the ball for Junior Riggins. Linebackers Dennis Onkotz deflected the pass into the arms of cornerback Mike Smith at the 35 and the 185-pound sophomore raced to the 11 before being bumped out of bounds. A Campbell run moved the ball to the nine and Doyle made another defensive gem. He hit fullback Cherry, forcing a fumble that end Vernon. Vanoy leaped on at the six.

For the Jayhawks, it was still no go, and the ball changed hands three times before Bob Garthwaite's 31-yard field goal attempt went far wide right on the last play of the half. Halftime in the stands and the press box, was spent discussing what happened to the predicted wild offensive show. Eastern writers grumbled that Penn State should have been far ahead. Midwestern writers whistled a sigh of relief. Penn State, no one would argue, looked like the better team. Those mistakes. That's what hurt the Nittany Lions. As the second half opened, the unbeaten Pennsylvanians set out to prove it. KU received the kickoff, but it took only three plays before Bell had to toe the ball again. Starting on its own 33, Penn State began to creep along. Two Burkhart passes, good for 40 yards to All-American Ted Kwalick and a 12-yarder to end Greg Edmonds, were the big gainers as the Lions streamrolled to the Kansas five.

A touchdown appeared inevitable. The KU defense, maligned oftentimes for giving up a lot of points, stood poised. What ensued was the finest hour for that underrated defense all season. Cherry, a 220-pound battering ram, rumbled to the two. On second down he was stopped at the one by Morgan. On third down, Cherry again toled and he was stopped at the half-yard line by middle guard Al Jakobeic and Vanoy. On fourth and goal, Hicks burst in to dump Pittman on the two as he tried to slice off left tackle. Apparently the gutsy goaline stand was all the dormant Kansas offense needed. Beginning at the two, the Jays strung up four straight first downs to their own 35.

Passes to George McGowan (16 yards) and wingback John Jackson (19 yards) penetrated to the P-State 31. A five-yard wingback reverse by Jackson went to the 26. Seconds later, Bell tried a 42-yard field goal after the drive fizzled. His kick fell far short. The quarter ended scoreless, but for the first time, the Jays knew they could move. Yet, early in the fourth quarter, it took the play that helped Shanklin earn the MVP honor to put the Jays on top 14-7.

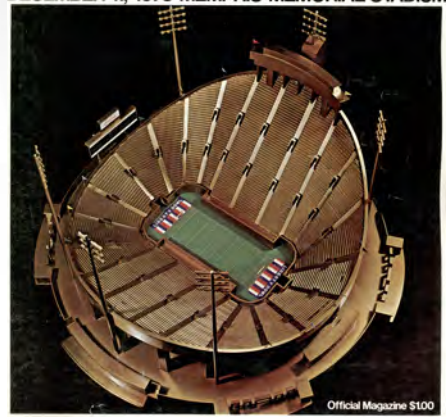
With fourth and an inch or so to go at their own 14, the Lions punted. Shanklin fielded it on the KU 47, got a timely block from Hicks and skirted down the south sidelines, reversed his field, spun off a would-be tackler and finally was lassoed from behind by Pittman on the seven. Big John Riggins burst through the one and scored on the next play with 12:38 remaining. Bell's kick was good, but the Lions had plenty of time. The KU defense, however, stopped them at their own 36. After Steve Brezna's punt, KU began a march from its own 38. It resulted in what will be remembered as the second most discussed happening in a game full of happenings. Two Douglass passes to Mosier and a piling-on call helped moved the ball all the way to PSU's 14 before Shanklin leaped and skipped off tackle to the seven. It was third and three when Shanklin advanced the ball to the five to make it fourth and one.

A field goal would have given Kansas a 17-7 lead, but coach Pepper Rodgers, in an ultimate fateful decision, decided to go for the first down. John Riggins was stacked up at the line of scrimmage and Penn State took over. And again the Kansas defense forced to punt. With 6:25 left, the Jays managed a first down but also had to kick. Penn State had the ball with 3:32 yet to tick off. And, would you believe, again the Jays stopped the powerful Lion attack after three plays setting the stage for those climactic two minutes that will be discussed, rehearsed and wept over for many moons. Campbell led the Lions in rushing with 104 yards in 18 carries while John Riggins paced KU with just 52 in 18 tries. Penn State finished 11-0 on the season and Kansas ends at 9-2. Before the game, the Lions were installed as a half point favorite. They didn't miss by much.

MEMPHIS (Lawrence Journal World) - A national television audience and a crowd of 50,011, which braved freezing temperatures, saw the Jayhawks whip North Carolina State in first downs and total offense.

But the Wolfpack won the game, 31-18, to make KU 1-3 in its post season bowl appearances. The only Kansas bowl win came in 1961, a 31-7 rout of Rice in the Bluebonnet Bowl.

In retrospect, it was probably Kansas' kicking game, or lack of it, which caused the most trouble Monday. Time and again poor kickoff coverage, mediocre punting and shaky kick receiving put the Jayhawks in bad field position. Kansas never once started a drive in State territory. The Jayhawks had to march 70 yards for a first quarter score, from their own 18 to State's 11 for a field goal and 74 yards for a last-gasp TD in the final period.

Although out-first downed 24-17 and out-offended 348 yards to 274, the Pack needed to go only 52 yards for its first score, 19 for its second TD, and NCSU got another when freshman defensive tackle Jim Henderson intercepted a Dave Jaynes pass and carried it 31 yards for the tally which made it 31-10.

Even though Kansas had impressive offensive statistics, the Jayhawks never really appeared that sharp. Fullback Robert Miller enjoyed the best game of his career in rushing for 104 yards. Jaynes threw 24 completions in 38 attempts for 218 yards and Bruce Adams had several spectacular catches among his eight receptions.

Yet there were a lot of dropped passes by Kansas players, too. Defensively, Kansas never surrendered a huge gainer but at the same time forced only one turnover Kurt Knoff's third quarter interception.

"I'd like to compliment North Carolina State," said KU coach Don Fambrough in the locker room. "They have a very fine football team and they deserved the win."

"They came back in the second half and controlled the ball. We were not sharp on offense. We were dropping balls and doing things you just can't do. Of course, they had a lot to do with that. We didn't get a fumble recovery and threw a couple of interceptions which hurt."

At halftime, the score was deadlocked at 10. State broke the ice when Adams, KU's deep man on punts, stumbled (Adams claimed and TV reruns showed he was tripped) while trying to field a punt. When he fell the ball hit his leg and the Pack took possession on KU's 19.

Adams came up fast signaling a fair catch, but tripped over a Carolinian and missed the ball. NC State safety Ralph Stringer plucked the loose ball and ran into the end zone, but officials

said it was a fumble recovery at the KU 19.

Adams and other Jayhawks protested. "I was looking up at the ball," Adams said. "I asked one official what was the rule about me tripping over someone. He said, 'I wasn't down there.' I tried to get an explanation from another official but he just turned and walked away."

Two plays later fullback Stan Fritts went in from the eight and State had a 17-10 lead.

Early in the final stanza, KU drove to the Wolfpack 23, but Mike Love, who had booted a 28-yard field goal in the second quarter, missed from 40 yards out and State followed with the drive that broke KU's back.

More than eight minutes of clock time was erased as the Pack went 80 yards in 17 plays. Only one play was a pass. Longest of the 16 runs was Charley Young's 12-yard TD dash at 4:50. Young's tally made it 24-10. Four KU plays later, Henderson snatched the pass which iced it.

"We are a better football team than the way we played tonight," Fambrough said. "But at the same time, that is in no way meant to take anything from North Carolina State. Tonight they were the better team."

State coach Lou Holtz, as one might expect, was ecstatic.

"We were tired of hearing things that belittled the Atlantic Coast Conference," he said. "I don't want to take anything away from Kansas, but I think we showed some folks that we do play good football in our league."

"We're not real fancy. We just try to run at people, and I feel we do a pretty good job of that. We wanted to do several things. We wanted to punish their receivers, not give the deep one, force Jaynes to go to his secondary receivers and keep him contained."

One thing Kansas maintained Monday night was its string of injuries. Linebacker Dean Baird and defensive tackle Fedro Dillon both left in the first quarter with knee wounds and each will require surgery. Those ailments brought to 14 the number of serious injuries which struck Kansas this season.

Also hurt Monday night were running back Delvin Williams who missed the last quarter with a back injury and tight end Ken Saathoff who took a blow to the head. Neither injury was believed serious, however.

EL PASO - Pittsburgh gave Kansas a painful lesson in how to run the football here today and posted an impressive 33-19 victory over the Jayhawks before a capacity crowd of over 30,000 the first sellout in the 41-year history of the game.

The Panthers beat down two early Jayhawk threats to surge to a 19-0 halftime lead on the running of quarterback Robert Haygood, fullback Elliott Walker and All-American tailback Tony Dorsett. And the Pitt defense seemed always equal to the challenge of the Kansas Wishbone offense when it counted.

Kansas' hopes of victory were badly weakened by penalties, too many errors, and poor tackling and defensive lapses that often let Panther backs drive for added yardage after it appeared they had been stopped.

Haygood, Walker and Dorsett all rushed for well over 100 yards each and it wasn't until the second half that Kansas really got into contention following a costly slump following its early thrusts.

Walker and Dorsett each scored two touchdowns for Pitt, and Kansas running star Laverne Smith scored on runs of 56 and 15 yards in the second half in a gallant effort to spark a Jayhawk rally. The final KU score came on a 38-yard scoring pass from substitute quarterback Scott McMichael to reserve halfback Skip Sharp.

Kansas made too many costly errors in the first half, to let the game get beyond reach. Adjustments at the half projected the Jayhawks back in to the battle after intermission, but the Panthers had far too much momentum.

The Jayhawk offense was badly hindered by the lack of a productive passing attack. Quarterback Nolan Cromwell either overthrew or couldn't locate receivers, and the only type of aerial threat came when McMichael, the passer, replaced Cromwell, the runner, in the dying moments.

The McMichael-Sharp touchdown play came with 2:02 to go in the game.

It was KU's fourth loss in five bowl tries, the only victory coming in 1961 against Rice, 33-7, in the Bluebonnet Bowl in Houston.

Kansas went to the dressing room trailing 19-0 at the half following a close officiating call deep in Pitt territory, a long run by Walker, a short Pitt drive after KU interfered with a punt receiver and a Kansas fumble set up a Panther scoring punch just before intermission.

Kansas was plagued by penalties and ball-handling miscues, but Pitt also had penalty problems and might have led by a wider halftime margin but for infractions.

On its first possession following reception of the opening kickoff, Kansas scored on an 82-yard play that involved an option run by Cromwell and a pitch to Bill Campfield who raced untouched into the end zone. But Cromwell's pitch was ruled an illegal forward pass and the touchdown was erased.

With 9:40 left in the first quarter, the Jayhawks got the ball on their 20 after a 57-yard Carson Long field goal fell short and drove to the Pitt 16 for fourth and inches. Cromwell, fullback Norris Banks and Skip Sharp did the bulk of the running in the Jayhawk wishbone.

On fourth down, Cromwell thrust himself ahead on a sneak and seemed to have the first down. But the officials ruled Pitt held, did not bother to measure despite protests from KU coach Bud Moore and Pitt flew back to score.

The Panthers took a 7-0 lead on a pitch from quarterback Haygood to fullback Walker that covered 60-yards. It amounted to a 14-point play because the fourth-down call cost Kansas a touchdown, then Pitt scored.

Pitt had to drive only about 35 yards for its second touchdown when Kansas interfered with a receiver on a punt. All-American Dorsett exploded the final six yards and Long's kick was wide.

With 4:04 to go in the half, Kansas had the ball at its own 49 in good field position. But the Cromwell-Banks handoff misfired. Pitt recovered and the Panthers used most of the rest of the time to drive to paydirt.

Dorsett pounded in from the two with 26 seconds left. A conversion pass try was intercepted to hold the count to 19-0.

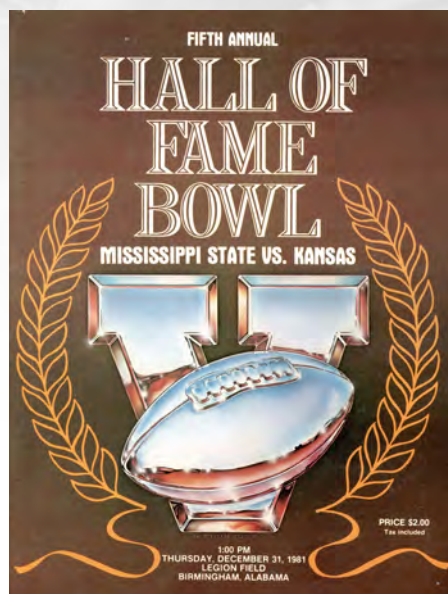
At halftime, Pittsburgh had 302 total yards to KU's 116, and out-first-downed the Jayhawks 12-6.

Dorsett had 112 yards in 15 carries, with two touchdowns; Walker had 96 in five tries and one score; Haygood was 13-70 in rushing. Cromwell had 32 yards on 11 carries in the first half.

BIRMINGHAM (Lawrence Journal World) - The Jayhawks wrapped up the old year with a 10-0 loss to Mississippi State, but 1982 has arrived and so, perhaps, has Mike Frederick.

Frederick is a 6-1, 165-pound freshman quarterback for the Jayhawks who received his college football baptismal against the Bulldogs.

Oh, Frederick had played a couple of minutes against Colorado during the regular season, but Thursday was his first real opportunity under fire.

"I was nervous all right," said the young Miami native, "but coach Don Fambrough gave him another chance with 1:29 remaining in the game.

He almost led the Jayhawks to a touchdown. First, he hit Wayne Capers for 45 yards and then connected with Bob Johnson for 19 and eight yards on successive plays.

Moment's later, Frederick passed to Garfield Taylor for nine yards to the MSU five. Time ran out as he was sacked on the next play, but Mississippi State had too many men on the field and the ball was moved to the two-yard line for one more play with :00 on the scoreboard.

Frederick tried to hit Johnson in the corner of the end zone. He missed.

"He (Johnson) ran an out pattern and he was supposed to run a fade," Frederick explained, "so I just threw the ball and it went in the ground."

No, the Jayhawks didn't score, but Frederick showed enough stuff to attract Fambrough's attention.

I wouldn't criticize him, no way," Fambrough said. "All he needs is to play. I feel good about having him and Seurer (Frank) next year."

With Seurer sidelined with a bad elbow, Fambrough had moved Frederick, a junior varsity signal-caller this season, up behind veteran Steve Smith.

Smith struggled so Fambrough went to Frederick.

"I was just trying to establish some offense," the KU coach said. "It was obvious we didn't have anything going. Frederick's just a freshman and it wouldn't have surprised me if he'd thrown his first pass into the press box."

Frederick missed the press box by plenty, completing seven of nine aerals for 110 yards. His only problem was waiting too

long to throw at times. He was sacked on five occasions.

If Frederick is KU's New Year's baby, then Smith, a fifth-year senior, was Old Man 1981. His career ended Thursday and, it goes without saying, not in the fashion he preferred.

"For me, this was something more than another game," Smith said softly.

"Later we'll look back on it and not feel too bad, but that doesn't help me right now."

Offensive guard David Lawrence, Smith's roommate for the last five years, knew what was racing through his friend's mind.

"I really feel for him," Lawrence said, looking over toward where Smith was dressing. "He didn't up any more than the offensive linemen, the running backs or the receivers. He just stands out because he plays quarterback.

"I'll tell you, no one is a better leader or person than Steve Smith and I think everyone in Lawrence, Kansas, knows that."

HONOLULU (Lawrence Journal World) - Judging from how well their Christmas went, Kansas' football players and coaches must have been very good boys this year.

The Jayhawks awoke Friday and ran over to Aloha Stadium and unwrapped a 23-20 win over Brigham Young in the Aloha Bowl.

A bowl win isn't just another fruitcake for KU's football program. This was the first in 31 years.

"Needless to say, we're ecstatic," coach Glen Mason said. "We're not a program that's spoiled yet. We get excited about every little thing, except this pouring water on the old coach is getting a little old."

During their 8-4 season, players doused Mason with coolers of water after wins over Kansas State and Oklahoma. They got him again after beating BYU.

"They threw two buckets on me today," Mason said. "I read in the paper it can cause heart attacks."

It should do his heart good to think that the Jayhawks' reliable old weapon, kicker Dan Eichloff, has a year's eligibility left, and that KU has found a new weapon in sophomore Rodney Harris.

Harris moved from tight end to wide receiver during practice for the Aloha Bowl. On Friday, he caught four passes for 142 yards, including a 74-yarder for a touchdown and a 48-yarder to spark Kansas out of a case of third-quarter doldrums and out of a 20-12 hole.

Eichloff no bum hit two of two field goals. His kick from 48 yards out with 2:57 left provided KU's winning margin.

Kansas actually trailed twice, and the first time it took just 13 seconds. Hema Heimuli fielded Eichloff's opening kickoff and returned it 94 yards for a touchdown.

It took the Jayhawks 18 seconds to tie it. Their first play was a six-yard naked reverse by quarterback Chip Hilleary. On second down at the KU 26, Hilleary lateraled to wide receiver Matt Gay, and Gay, under pressure, lofted a pass to Harris, who ran it in untouched.

"We had that planned," Mason said. "We were going to do that in the first two plays of the game."

The pass was designed to go to tight end Dwayne Chandler. Harris was Gay's second option as a receiver.

"It didn't work exactly the way we worked on it, but Rodney was a heck of a lot more open than we ever worked on it," Mason said.

By halftime, the Jayhawks had a field goal and a safety defensive tackle Chris Maumalanga nailed BYU's Jamal Willis in the end zone and had rolled up 208 yards offense to 144 for Brigham Young. But they trailed, 14-12.

The cougars owned the third quarter, outgaining KU, 187-33, but only managed to stretch their lead to 20-12. One of three missed field goals by kicker David Lauder came in that span.

That left the door open. With 12 minutes left, Kansas made its first first down in 11:46, and on the next play, Hilleary scored two plays later on a one-yard option keeper, and he ran a naked reverse for the two-point conversion and a 20-all tie.

On their next possession, after converting a crucial fourth down at midfield, the Jayhawks went ahead on Eichloff's last field goal.

With 2:11 left, Charley Bowen intercepted a pass by Cougar quarterback Tom Young, and KU needed one first down to guarantee a win.

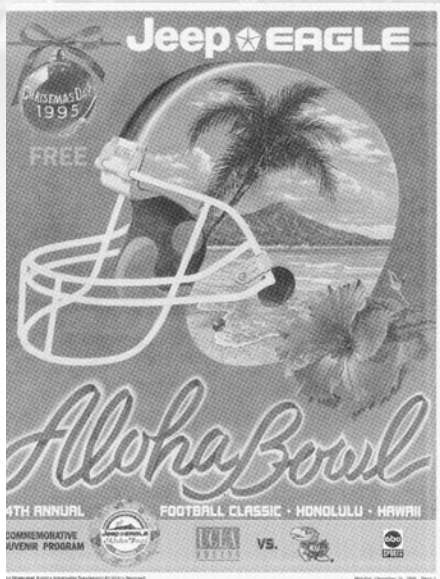
Deja vu. One late first down against Colorado, and the Jayhawks would have won that one, too.

HONOLULU - Kansas' football team went to the Aloha Bowl looking for a shootout, but it was hit and miss for UCLA.

A comparison of the respective quarterbacks tells the story of which gunslinger was quicker to the draw. Kansas senior quarterback Mark Williams completed 18 of his 27 pass attempts for 288 yards and three touchdowns.

"If I had to say what the difference in the game was, I thought Williams at quarterback was absolutely outstanding," UCLA football coach Terry Donahue said.

The Jayhawks built a 23-0 lead before the Bruins finally got on the scoreboard. With 7:40 remaining in the third quarter, UCLA freshman quarterback Cade McNown hit freshman split end Brad Melsby on a quick slant for an eight-yard touchdown.

McNown was inconsistent all game, though, completing only 13 of 34 passes for 121 yards. Although he did manage three touchdowns, they came late in the game.

"We didn't really get it going," McNown said. "We were just inconsistent the whole first half."

The closest the Bruins came to catching the Jayhawks was a 37-22 deficit with 12:43 remaining in the contest. This was made possible by freshman free safety Vito Clemente, who recovered an onside punch kick following McNown's second touchdown pass.

After UCLA recovered the ball on the Kansas 30-yard line, it only took five plays and 1:01 to get into the end zone. Junior talkback Karim Abdul-Jabbar started left at the five yard line and then turned upfield for the score.

Abdul-Jabbar did his part for the Bruins, as he had all year, finishing with 152 yards rushing and a touchdown on 26 carries. He also had four receptions for 34 yards.

On the ensuing drive, the Jayhawks marched down to the Bruins' 21-yard line before UCLA junior cornerback Paul Guidry intercepted a Williams pass.

UCLA took possession of the ball on its own five-yard line with a chance to cut into the 15-point Kansas lead, but couldn't convert a first down. Abdul-Jabbar was stopped for no gain on third down and one and freshman tailback Akil Davis was stopped for a four-yard loss on fourth down.

"We didn't let up in the second half," McNown said. "Even though the score didn't indicate it, we all came away winners."

Kansas added to its lead three players later, as Williams used

a play-action fake and rolled out to his left. Putting a move on UCLA junior free safety Anthony Cobbs, Williams ran in for a six-yard score with 4:30 to play.

Both teams added a touchdown in the closing minutes and the Jayhawks held on for 51-30 victory.

"We thought we could make as many big plays as they could," UCLA junior outside linebacker Abdul McCullough said. "The big difference was their playmakers made plays and ours didn't."

Donahue, who is retiring to work as an analyst for CBS, came a full circle as he coached in his first bowl game for Kansas and coached in his last bowl game against the Jayhawks.

The finale is one he would just as soon not remember.

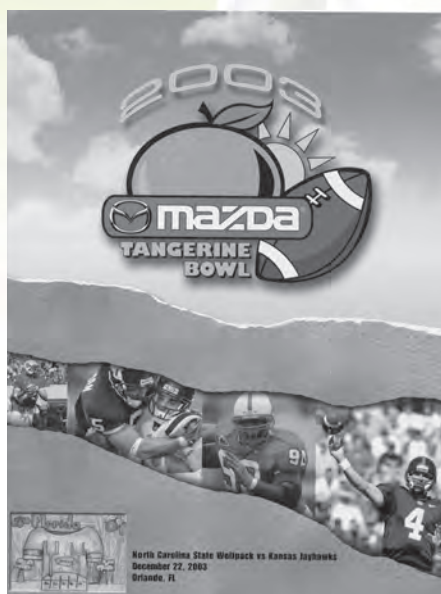

ORLANDO (Lawrence Journal World) - Kansas University's football team had nearly a month to prepare for Philip Rivers.

It wasn't enough.

Rivers set North Carolina State and Tangerine Bowl records Monday night at Florida Citrus Bowl for completions (37), completion percentage (82.2), passing yards (475), touchdown passes (five) and total offense (495 yards).

Tangerine Bowl officials had billed their game as a high-scoring duel between Rivers and KU's Bill Whittemore. Both senior quarterbacks delivered, but it was Rivers who came out on the winning end of a 56-26 blowout.

"You never know if you're going to be able to blow the door open," said Rivers, who finished 37-of-45 and at one point completed 16 consecutive passes. "We thought going in we'd have the opportunity to make some plays. We felt like there were some holes right behind their linebackers, and that's where we attacked."

Rivers set KU opponent records for completions and was one yard shy of matching the 476 passing yards Utah's Mike Fouts struck the Jayhawks for in a 1996 game. N.C. State's 481 passing yards, however, was a record.

"We didn't get anything done," KU coach Mark Mangino said of his defense, which had finished the regular season allowing averages of 392.6 total yards and 28.3 points.

The Wolfpack's 56 points were the most by a KU opponent this season, as were their 653 total yards. N.C. State scored on eight of its 11 drives.

"We didn't play well on defense at all," Mangino said. "There's no excuses. We should be better. We should play better. We should tackle better. We should cover better. We should play the run better, and we didn't."

Rivers was unstoppable in the first half, completing 21 of 24 passes for 268 yards and three touchdowns. It took N.C. State (8-5) only three plays and 62 seconds to take the lead. Rivers completed a 45-yard touchdown pass to Richard Washington to begin the onslaught.

Kansas (6-7) countered with a nine-play scoring drive, capped by Whittemore's 23-yard TD pass to Charles Gordon, but Rivers and the Wolfpack answered with another quick strike. Rivers hooked up with Washington for a 14-yard TD at the end of a scoring drive that took just 1:58 off the clock.

N.C. State had controlled the ball for only three minutes but

already had 14 points on the board with 8:43 to go in the first quarter.

Kansas was able to move the ball against N.C. State's maligned defense, but the Jayhawks netted only three points the rest of the first half. KU's next drive stalled at the NCSU 33, and Kansas opted to punt on fourth-and-15.

"It's always frustrating when you have a long drive and you're not able to finish," offensive lineman Adrian Jones said. "We always talk about finishing, but we didn't finish."

Senior Curtis Ansel pinned the Pack down on their own three, but NCSU simply mounted a 97-yard scoring drive. Rivers completed five of six passes for 72 yards, and T.A. McLendon made it 21-7 with a one-yard run.

Kansas again drove into Pack territory at the 35, but A.J. Davis picked off a Whittemore pass and returned it 48 yards to the KU 39. N.C. State kicker Adam Kiker later missed a 49-yard field-goal attempt — marking the only time the Wolfpack failed to score in the first half.

Jerod Brooks made a 28-yard field goal for Kansas with 4:05 remaining, but McLendon tacked on a three-yard TD reception with 45 seconds left in the half.

Kansas opened the second half with a nine-play scoring drive capped by Whittemore's 11-yard shovel pass to Clark Green, which cut the deficit to 28-17.

Whittemore passed for 243 yards and two touchdowns in his final college game. He also ran for a TD and set a Tangerine Bowl record for rushing yards by a quarterback with 84.

Rivers added a 40-yard TD to Brian Clark, and Reggie Davis added a 10-yard touchdown run. By the time Johnny Beck kicked a 39-yard field goal for KU with 3:42 left in the third quarter, the game's outcome wasn't in question.

After Whittemore's nine-yard TD run pulled KU within 42-26, N.C. State added a 21 yard TD reception by Jericho Cotchery — who caught 13 passes for 171 yards — and a 26-yard TD run by McLendon.

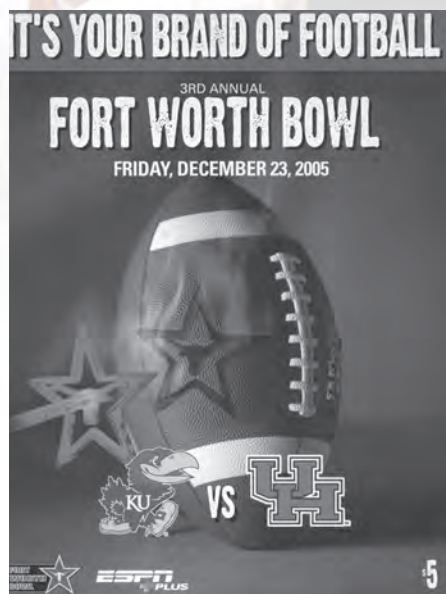
Mangino wasn't concerned with the Wolfpack piling on late. And the coach said he had no problem with Amato showcasing Rivers for a national television audience. The quarterback left the game, along with Cotchery, with 8:10 remaining.

Mangino's offense, meanwhile, finished with 463 total yards.

FORT WORTH - The University of Kansas closed out the 2005 season with a 42-13 victory over Houston in the Fort Worth Bowl Friday night at Amon G. Carter Stadium. The win gave the Jayhawks their first bowl victory since winning the 1995 Aloha Bowl and the most wins (seven) in a decade.

Junior Brian Murph put Kansas (7-5) on the board early when he returned a Houston punt 85 yards for a touchdown. The punt return for a touchdown was the first of Murph's career and KU's longest of the season. Sophomore Scott Webb kicked the extra point to give the Jayhawks a 7-0 lead 10:26 into the game.

Houston (6-6) scored its first points of the game in the second quarter (14:22) when freshman Ben Bell kicked a 32-yard field goal. Kansas answered on the ensuing possession with a five-play, 60-yard drive that resulted in a 13-yard shovel pass from senior Jason Swanson to junior Jon Cornish for a touchdown. Webb converted on the extra point to give KU a 14-3 lead.

The Cougars capped a 42-yard, seven-play drive with a touchdown when junior Kevin Kolb scored on a one-yard keeper with 57 seconds remaining in the half. Bell's extra point brought UH within four, and KU headed into the break leading 14-10.

The KU defense struck early in the second half when senior Theo Baines intercepted a Kolb pass and ran it 16 yards to KU's 30-yard line. Two plays later, Cornish took another shovel pass from Swanson (12:43) 30 yards for his second touchdown of the day and 11th of the season. Webb's kick gave the Jayhawks a 21-10 advantage.

After a 44-yard field goal by Houston's T.J. Lawrence, Swanson connected with senior Mark Simmons on a 32-yard pass to top off an 80-yard, 3:32 scoring drive. The TD and extra point (Webb) gave KU a 28-13 lead with 4:57 left in the third stanza.

KU pulled away when senior Charlton Keith picked off a Kolb pass at the Jayhawks' 14-yard line 2:37 into the fourth quarter and ran it in for a touchdown. The interception was Keith's first and marked his second career touchdown. Just over a minute later, Baines nabbed his second interception of the day, giving KU the ball on the UH 46-yard line.

Murph scored his second touchdown of the day in the fourth quarter, a 48-yard pass from Swanson, to give the Jayhawks a 42-13 advantage.

Swanson threw for four touchdowns and had 19 completions on 29 attempts for 307 yards in the final game of his career. Swanson joined Kolb as the teams' 2005 Fort Worth Bowl MVPs.

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. - Sophomore quarterback Todd Reesing threw a touchdown pass and ran for another, while Orange Bowl Most Valuable Player Aqib Talib returned an interception 60 yards for a touchdown as the eighth-ranked Jayhawks earned a 24-21 FedEx Orange Bowl triumph over No. 3 Virginia Tech Thursday at Dolphin Stadium.

It marked KU's second bowl victory in the last three seasons, and its first Bowl Championship Series win. The Jayhawks (12-1) finished perhaps their greatest season with a school record 12 victories.

In a game that was billed to be a clash between KU's offense and Virginia Tech's defense, it was the Jayhawk defense and special teams that led the way.

KU matched a bowl game record with three interceptions, while five different Jayhawks collected quarterback sacks. Of the three interceptions, none was bigger than Talib's first quarter pick that he returned 60 yards to give Kansas a 7-0 advantage. It was KU's first defensive touchdown since Talib returned an interception 100 yards against Florida International earlier this season.

Senior place kicker Scott Webb stretched KU's lead to 10-0 with 12 minutes remaining in the first half. After Chris Harris picked off Tech's Sean Glennon, the Jayhawks capitalized with a 32-yard field goal from the left hash mark.

KU took a 17-0 advantage when Reesing led the Jayhawks on a 10-play, 59-yard drive that culminated with a 13-yard strike to Marcus Henry on a slant across the middle. It marked Reesing's 36th career touchdown pass, giving him the top total in team history.

Virginia Tech answered the Reesing touchdown with a 13-play, 52-yard drive that ended with a one-yard plunge by Brandon Ore. It made the score 17-7 going into halftime.

The Hokies cut the lead to 17-14 on an 86-yard punt return by Justin Harper early in the second half. Harper received a pitch from the original punt receiver Eddie Royal on a reverse, and scampered 86 yards down the near sideline for a touchdown.

Tech threatened again in the third quarter, but KU held onto its lead when junior Joe Mortensen blocked a 25-yard field goal. It was the Jayhawks' first field goal block of the season.

The Jayhawks took advantage of another Hokie turnover early in the fourth quarter. Following a Justin Thornton interception deep in Tech territory, Reesing stretched the KU lead to 24-14 with a two-yard run on a bootleg to the near side. It was the quarterback's third rushing touchdown of the season.

Tech again fought back to within one score on a 21-yard pass from Glennon to Harper with three minutes remaining. The Hokies held Kansas on a fourth down try from the Tech 23 and marched the ball 77 yards on 14 plays.

After the score, the Hokies tried an onside kick, but were negated possession when Raimond Pendleton recovered the ball at Tech's 43-yardline. From there, the Jayhawks moved the ball down to the Hokie one-yard line to run out the final two minutes, 59 seconds of the contest.

Reesing finished the game with 227 yards on 20-of-37 passing. He had one touchdown and one interception. Eight different Jayhawks hauled in passes, including junior Dexton Fields who finished with seven catches for 101 yards. Henry had two catches for 20 yards.

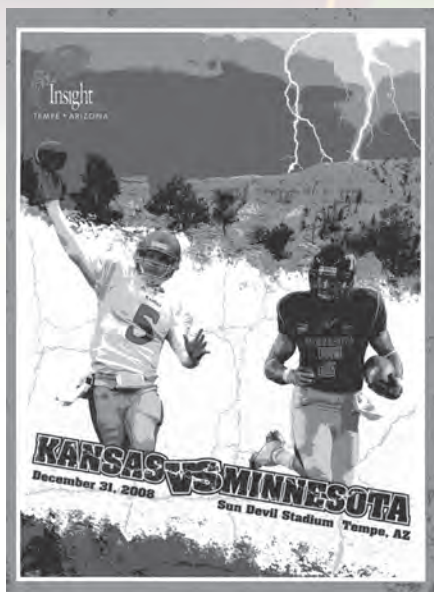
Senior Brandon McAnderson carried the ball 15 times for 75 yards, including a handful of big runs to keep the clock moving late in the fourth quarter. He also completed a pass attempt on a fake punt late in the third stanza.

Junior Mike Rivera led KU's defense with seven solo tackles and five assisted tackles as well as a tackle for a loss.

TEMPE, Ariz. – Todd Reesing threw for 313 yards, while Dezmon Briscoe recorded 201 yards in receptions to lead Kansas football to a 42-21 victory against Minnesota in the 20th Insight Bowl on Wednesday.

Kansas improved to 8-5 on the season, while Minnesota dropped to 7-6. The victory gave the Jayhawks their third straight bowl win in the past four seasons – all under head coach Mark Mangino – as well as their fifth bowl victory in their last six games.

Reesing completed 27 of 35 passes for 313 yards and four touchdowns, while Briscoe pulled in 14 catches for 201 yards and three scores. Kerry Meier added 10 receptions for 113 yards and one touchdown, and also threw for one touchdown.

Briscoe's 14 catches tied Meier's school record for a single-game, while his 201 yards rank as the fifth-best day in school history. Meier's 10 catches tied for the eighth best day in school history as he went over the 100-yard mark for the fifth time this year.

On defense KU's trio of senior linebackers shined. Mike Rivera matched a career high with 14 tackles, while Joe Mortensen also tied his career best with 13 stops. Linebacker mate James Holt added eight tackles, with four for loss, including three sacks. The three sacks were the most by a Jayhawk since David McMillan had three at Missouri in 2004. Holt finished the year with at least one sack in six straight games.

Briscoe was named the game's most valuable offensive player while Holt was tabbed the game's top defender.

Kansas struck first scoring on a 60-yard pass play from Reesing to Briscoe on the game's opening play from scrimmage. The 60-yard scoring toss was the longest for the Jayhawks since Briscoe scored on a 69-yard reception at Oklahoma back on Oct. 18.

The score was the quickest for the Jayhawks since Greg Heaggans returned the opening kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown against Southwest Missouri State in 2002.

However, Minnesota responded on its first possession, as the Gophers threw a 75-yard pass on their opening play to set up a quick touchdown. The 75-yard pass was the longest allowed by the Jayhawks this season by 20 yards.

Trailing 14-7, in the first quarter, Kansas scored the game's next 28 points to take a 35-14 lead in the third period.

The Jayhawks scored on four of their first five possessions, while shutting Minnesota down after the Gophers scored the first two times they had the ball. After that UM's next six

possessions results in four punts, a fumble and a drive ended on downs at the one yard line.

Reesing was nearly flawless in the first half throwing four touchdown passes and at one point completing a school-record 14 straight passes. His 14 straight completions beat the old school mark of 12 by two different players – Mark Williams vs. Iowa State in 1995 and Mike Norseth vs. Florida State in 1985. He finished the first 30 minutes hitting 19 of 23 passes for 221 yards and the four scores.

In the first half, Briscoe had 10 catches for 147 yards and two scores, while Meier added five receptions for 43 yards and a touchdown. Johnathan Wilson added the other first-half touchdown reception.

The Jayhawks also rushed for 86 yards in the first half, as Jake Sharp had 54 yards on 11 carries and Reesing added 32 yards on six rushing attempts.

KU produced 307 yards of total offense in the first half, while the Jayhawk defense limited the Minnesota offense to 194 yards. Eighty-seven of the Gophers first-half yards came on their first drive of the game.

Midway through the second quarter Briscoe had reached the 100-yard receiving mark for the fourth straight game, setting a new school record for consecutive 100-yard games. The sophomore had two touchdown receptions among his first six catches for 106 yards.

Reesing continued his record-setting career as he threw for a touchdown pass for the 18th consecutive game. He became the school's all-time pass attempt leader as well, moving ahead of Frank Seurer.

With four touchdown tosses, Reesing finished the year with 32, one shy of his school mark set last season. He also threw for 300 yards for the 13th time in his career and eighth time this season.

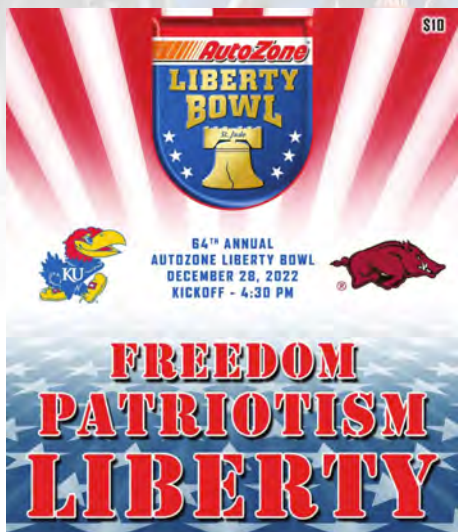

MEMPHIS, Tenn. – Kansas came back from a 25-point deficit to force overtime in the 64th AutoZone Liberty Bowl, but came up short in three overtimes, falling 55-53 to Arkansas in a thriller.

Kansas quarterback Jalon Daniels set a plethora of single-game and KU bowl records, leading the Jayhawks back from a 25-point deficit to force overtime. Kansas scored the last 25 points of regulation, including an 18-0 advantage in the fourth quarter to force overtime after trailing 38-13 with 8:43 to play in the third quarter. The Jayhawks forced a turnover, recovered an onside kick and scored two touchdowns in the final 1:05 to tie the game at 38-all.

Daniels, who became the first Kansas quarterback to ever top the 500-yard mark, set the Kansas single-game school record for passing yards (544) and yards of total offense (565), setting new AutoZone Liberty Bowl records for both as well. Daniels also set the Liberty Bowl record for touchdown passes with five, which is a KU bowl record and matches the second-most in school history for a single game. Daniels finished the game 37-for-55 for 544 yards and five touchdowns while adding 21 yards and a touchdown on 14 rushing attempts.

Daniels was named KU's Outstanding Offensive Player, while OJ Burroughs, with eight tackles and an interception, earned the Outstanding Defensive Player honor.

Arkansas scored midway through the third quarter to go up 38-13, but momentum swung the way of the Jayhawks after that. KU covered 86 yards in just five plays on its next drive, using long receptions from wide receiver Luke Grimm and Mason Fairchild to get into position for running back Ky Thomas to score on a two-yard touchdown run. The touchdown from Thomas, his second score of the game and second rushing touchdown of the season, put the Jayhawks down 38-20 at the end of the third quarter.

Kansas had possession near the Arkansas red zone at the start of the fourth quarter and ended the drive with a 37-yard field goal from Owen Piepergerdes, which made it 38-23 with 14:07 to play. Things appeared bleak for the Jayhawks after they turned it over on downs with 3:52 to play, but the defense came up big with a turnover to again swing momentum. Marvin Grant forced a fumble that was recovered by Cobee Bryant and returned 37 yards, giving the Jayhawks new life with 2:43 to play.

Daniels led the Jayhawks down the field in seven plays and found Douglas Emilien for a 10-yard touchdown to make it 38-30 with 1:05 to play. On the ensuing kickoff, safety Kenny Logan made the onside recovery for the Jayhawks, giving KU a chance to tie the game in the final minute. That's exactly what happened as Daniels again led his team right down the

field and scored on a 21-yard touchdown pass to Grimm with 41 seconds to play. Needing a two-point conversion to tie the game, the Jayhawks went for it and Daniels found Lawrence Arnold for the conversion to complete the comeback.

Arkansas had time for five plays, but they only crossed midfield on the final play as time ran out in regulation.

In overtime, Kansas got the ball first and scored on fourth and goal from the two-yard line as Daniels found Jared Casey to give the Jayhawks a 45-38 lead, KU's first lead since 7-3 in the first quarter. Arkansas needed just two plays to tie the game at 45-all, sending the game into a second overtime.

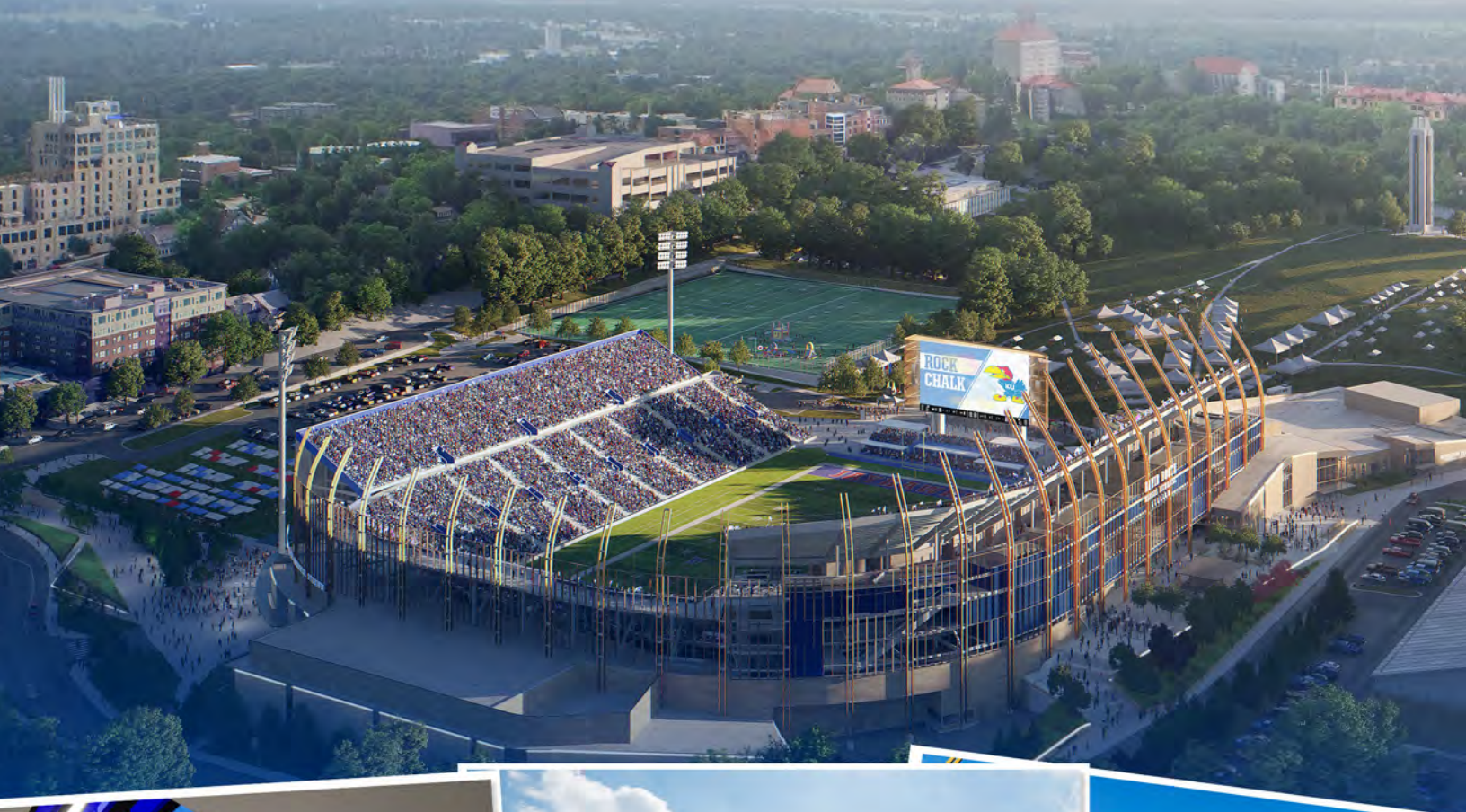
The Razorbacks got the ball first in double overtime and again scored in two plays, taking a 53-45 lead after a successful two-point conversion. Daniels scored on a two-yard touchdown run, setting up for a crucial two-point play to tie the game. On KU's attempt, Daniels again rushed the ball and was stopped short, but Arkansas was flagged for targeting, giving the Jayhawks a second chance. KU made the most of it as Daniels again found Casey in the flat to tie the game at 53-53.

Triple overtime meant two-point attempts only, with Arkansas going first. The Razorbacks were successful on their attempt, while Kansas' fell incomplete to end the Jayhawks longest bowl game in history.

Kansas set new bowl game records for first downs (32), pass attempts (56), pass completions (37), touchdown passes (5), total offense plays (90), and total offense yards (603).

Daniels led the way offensively with a single-game school record 544 passing yards and five passing touchdowns, breaking the previous record of 498 yards by Todd Reesing against Missouri on Nov. 28, 2009. He also set a new single-game school record with 565 yards of total offense, surpassing the mark of 509 set by Mike Norseth against Vanderbilt on Sept. 9, 1985.

Kansas had two receivers over the century mark as Grimm had career-highs of 10 receptions and 167 yards and a touchdown, while Lawrence Arnold had eight receptions for 119 yards. Fairchild, Thomas, Casey and Emilien each had touchdown receptions as 11 different Jayhawks caught a pass from Daniels in the win.
