#### THE KU WIN...

- Extended its win streak to 15-straight games against Missouri in Allen Fieldhouse (since 2000).
- Gave Kansas its fifth-straight win against Missouri and made the series 176-95 in favor of the Jayhawks.
- Marked Kansas' 10th win in the last 11 games and 15th victory in the last 17 against Missouri dating back to March 6, 2006.
- Made Kansas 9-1 or better for the third-straight season and the fifth time in the last six seasons beginning in 2018-19.
- Gave Kansas 11-straight wins in Allen Fieldhouse, including 6-0 this season, 846-117 all-time in the venue and 305-17 under Bill Self.
- Made Self 151-6 against non-conference opponents in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made Bill Self 574-133 while at Kansas, 781-238 overall and 19-4 against Missouri.
- Made Kansas 2,379-886 all-time.

### **TEAM NOTES**

- Kansas held a 42-25 edge on rebounds. Kansas has won 58-straight games when it outrebounds its opponent. The streak started on Feb 8, 2021 and is the longest active streak in the nation.
- Kansas had season highs of 13 offensive rebounds and 17 second chance points.
- Kansas shot a season-high 87.0 percent (20-of-23) from the free throw line. The Jayhawks shot a perfect 8-of-8 in the first half.
- Kansas did not allow Missouri to have a second-chance point.
- Kansas finished the first half on a 14-0 run over the last 3:59 of the half and a 20-2 run over the final 5:54 of the period. The 14-0 run was the longest by Kansas this season. Kansas held Missouri without a point for the final 4:26 of the first half.
- Kansas is now 7-0 this season when leading at the half.

#### **INDIVIDUAL NOTES**

- Senior Hunter Dickinson recorded his sixth double-double of the season (37th career) with 13 points and a game-high 16 rebounds in 35 minutes. Dickinson has pulled down 10 or more rebounds in four of his last five games and six times this season. His 16 rebounds are the most by a player in the Kansas-Missouri rivalry since Cole Aldrich on Jan. 25, 2010 in Lawrence (16 rebounds).
- Graduate senior Kevin McCullar Jr. had a team-high-tying 17 points, nine rebounds, four assists and a season-high-tying three steals in 39 minutes.
- Junior KJ Adams Jr. finished with 17 points and five assists in 37 minutes. Adams has scored in doubles figures in five straight games and in eight of 10 games this season.
- Freshman Elmarko Jackson added a career-high 11 points in 26 minutes. The 11 points marked his first career double-digit scoring game.
- Redshirt-senior Dajuan Harris Jr. moved into a tie for 13th with Jerod Haase on the KU all-time career steals list with 174 for his career.
